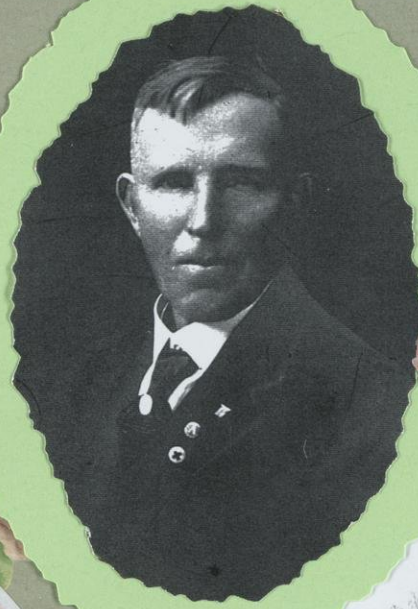

Top left - 1929 - Mom was a sophomore in high school.

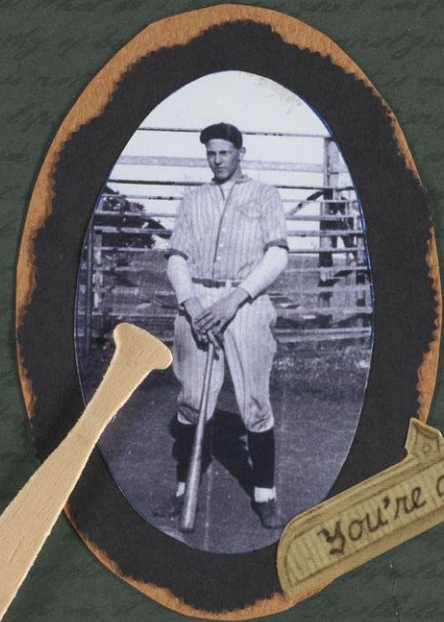

Below right - My favorite picture of mom. What a flirt. She was about 18 in this shot!

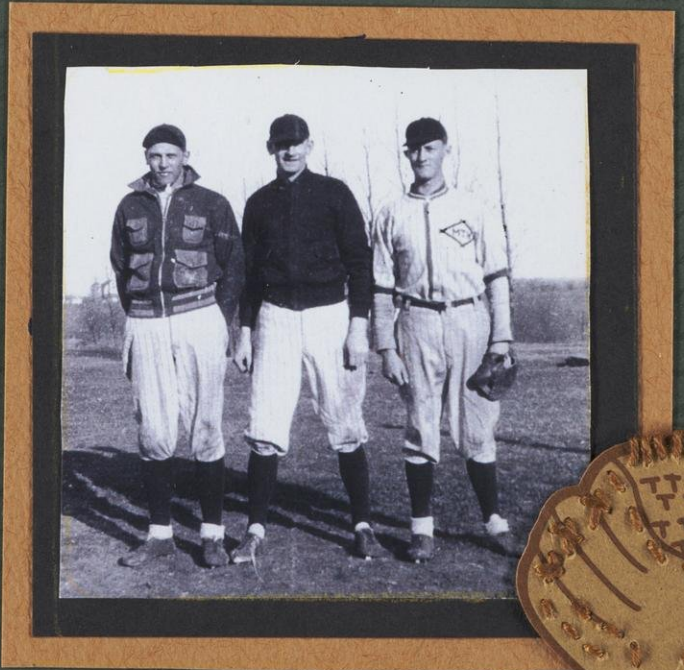


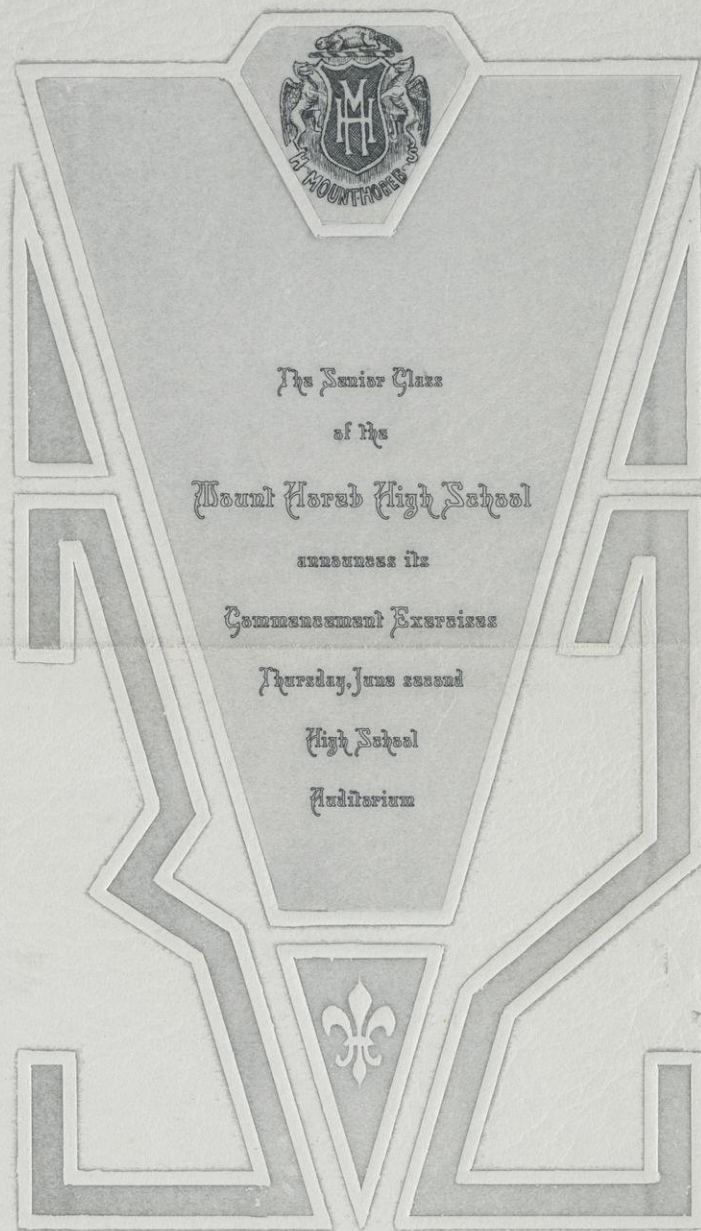

ready to come home.

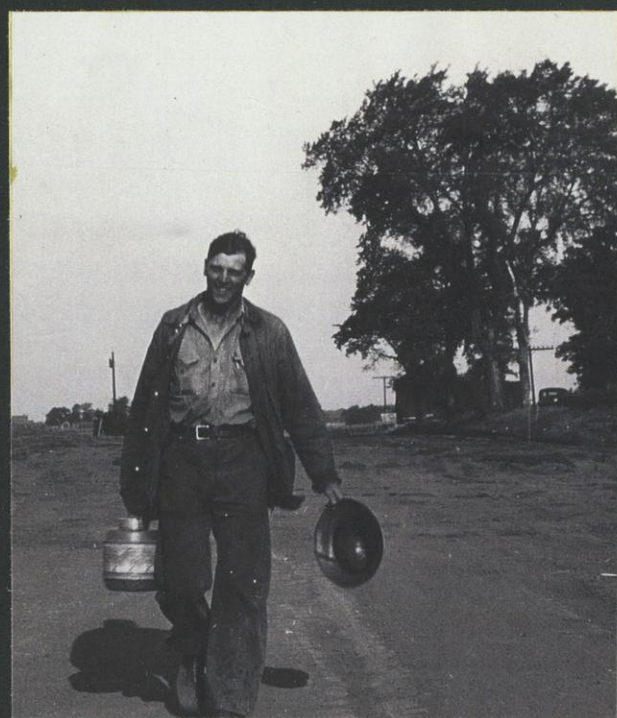

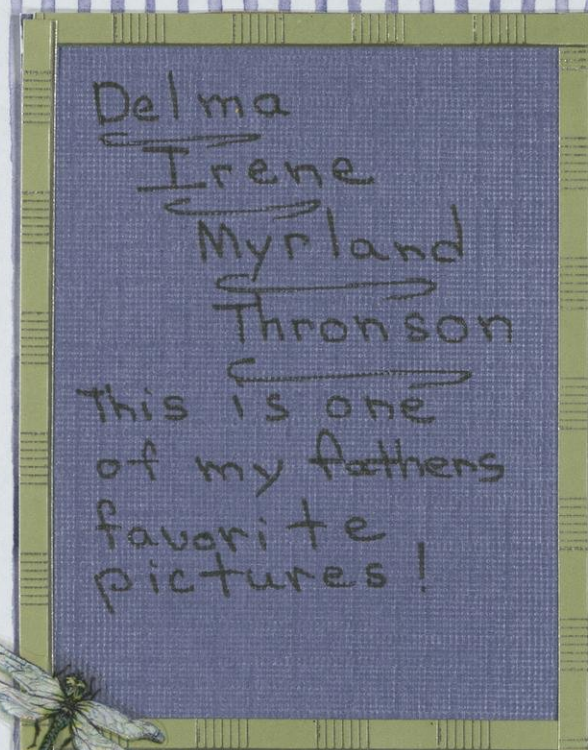

No spires miraculously arise.

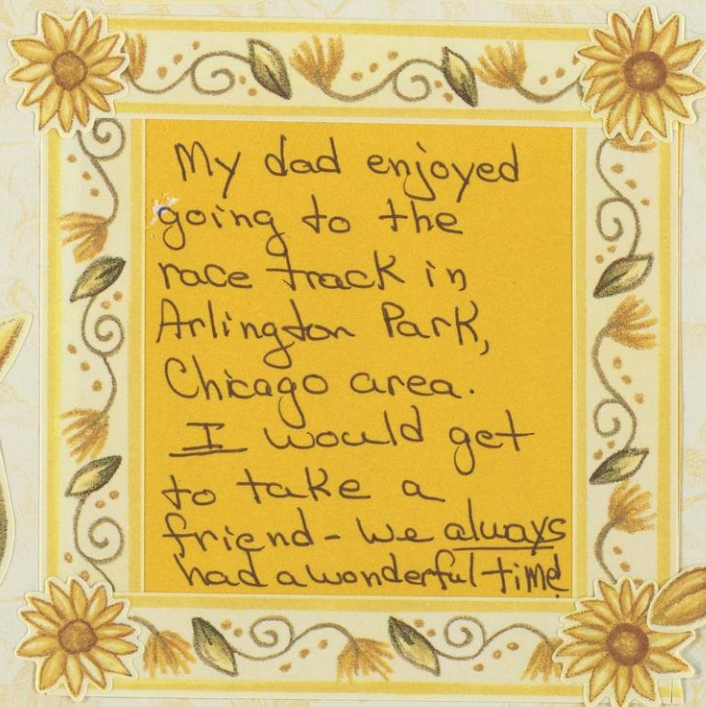
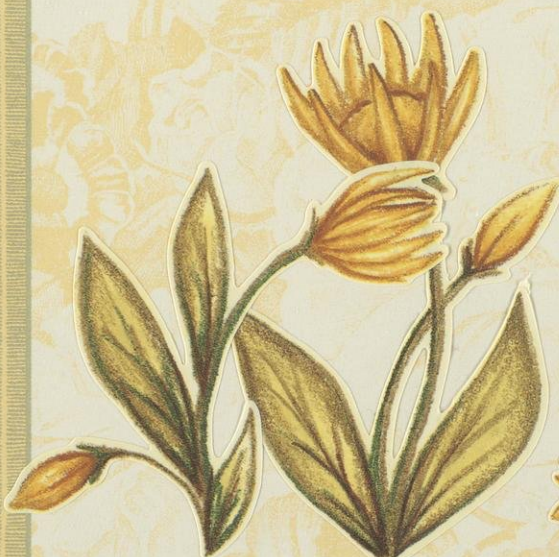
No little missions from the skies

In human toil and sacrifice.

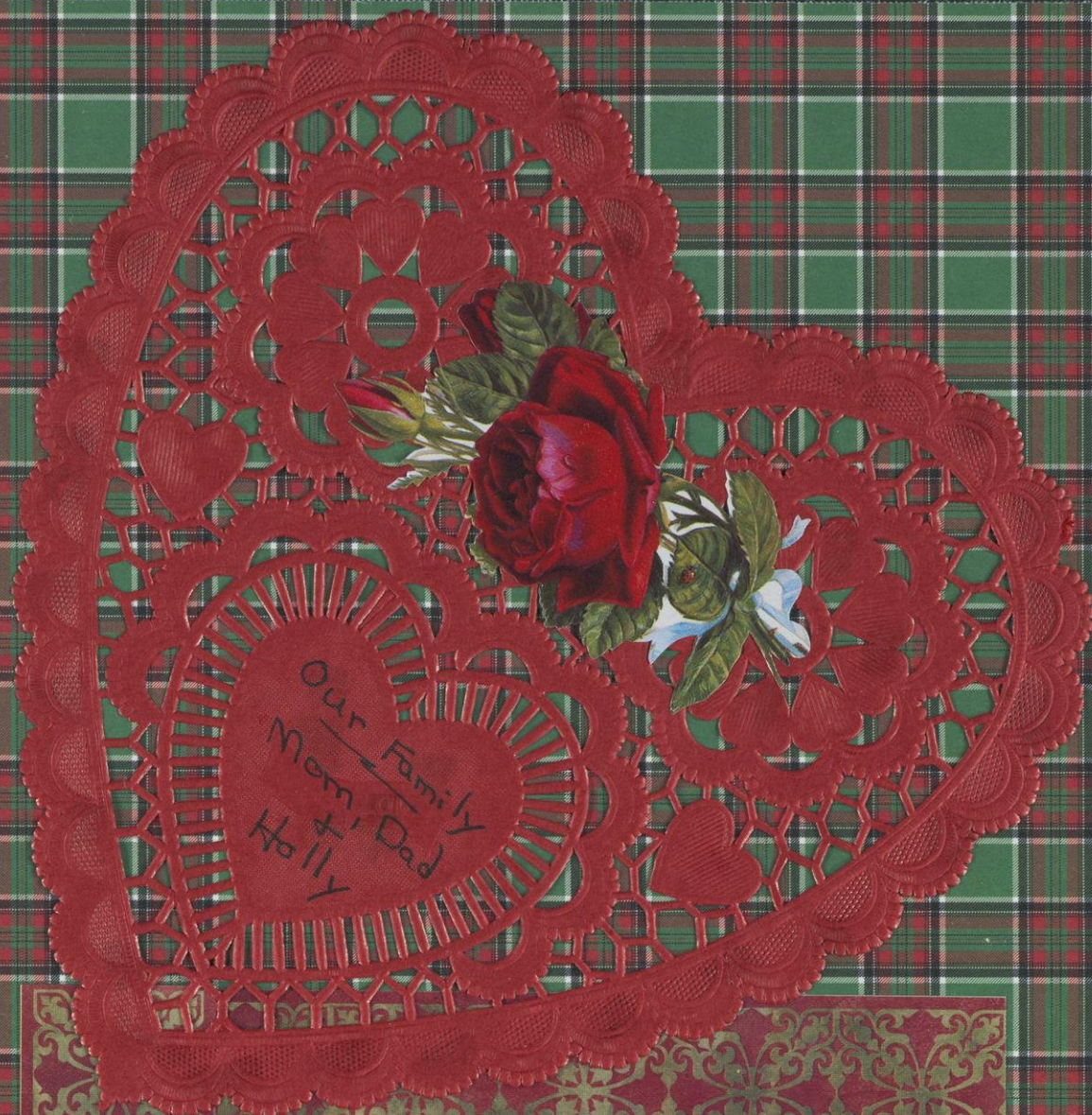
The humblest spire in mortal ken

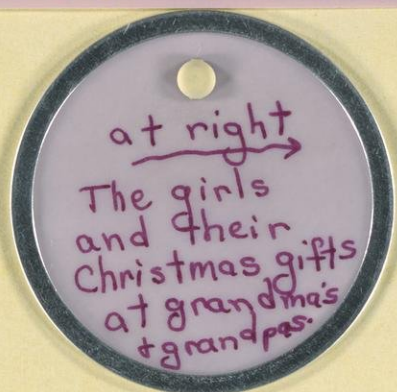
