ABOVE PATENT NUMBERS MUST NOT BE COVERED

TO UNLOCK the book, raise cover to be unlocked to a vertical position, and pull rod out as far as it will come.

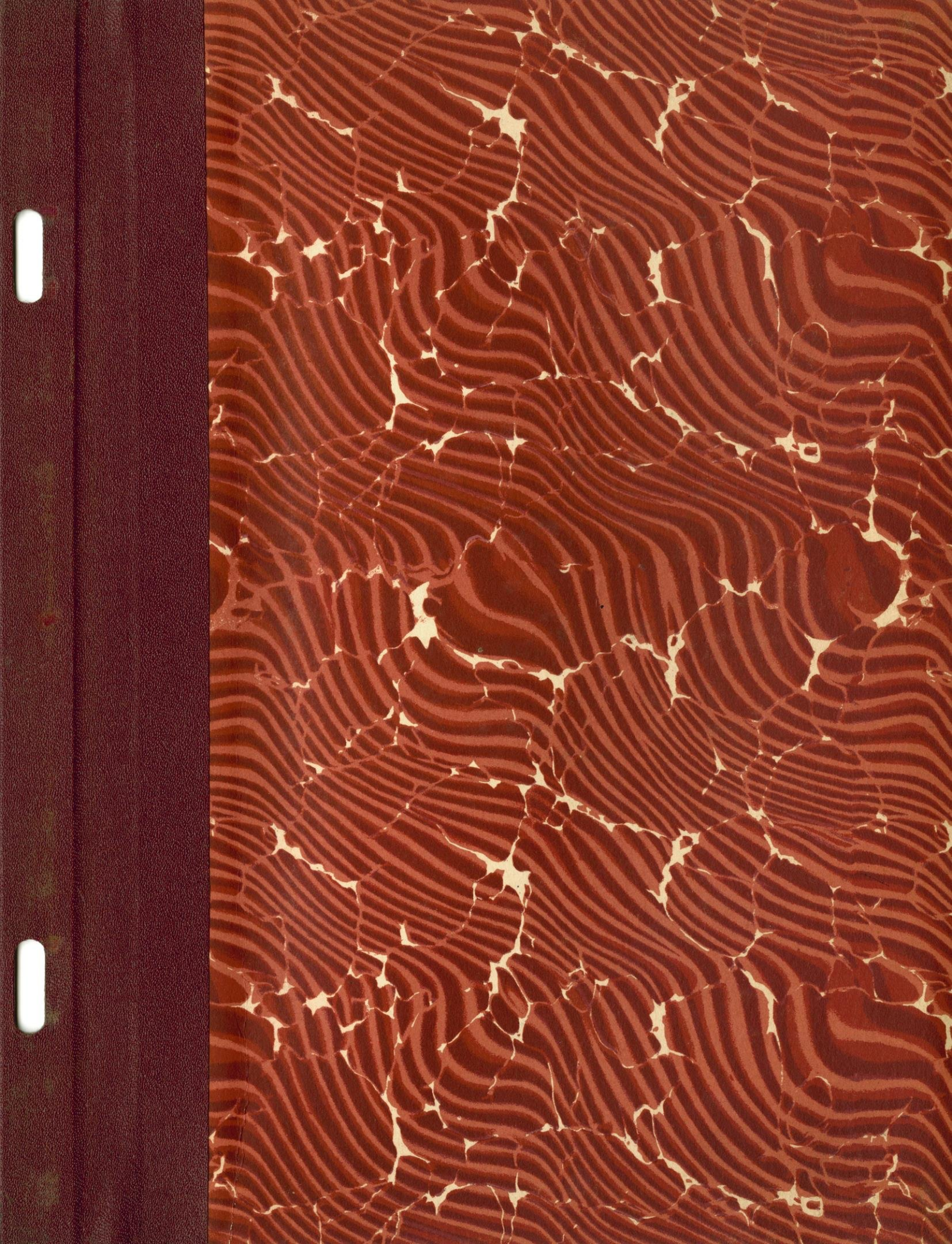
TO LOCK —Adjust the cover back into position so the notches in the cover fit over the posts then push in rod.

Do not attempt to unlock either cover unless opposite cover is locked, as posts should always be held in one of the covers.

TO LOCK BOOK PERMANENTLY—This is only to be done when all the sheets are written up and placed in the binder, for once permanently locked, it is impossible to unlock or open it.

For this purpose two permanent locking buttons are furnished. Insert these sealing buttons into the round holes near end of locking case so that the slot in the Sealing Button runs lengthwise with the binder. Then drive in button with sufficient force to turn the ends of split button. This permanently locks and seals the book.

The following Motion as introduced by Trustee Russell G. Stenseth was read in full:

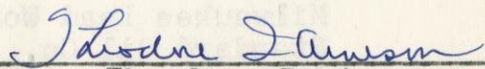

"Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

SECTION 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).

(3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.

(4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.

(5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.

(6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.

In the Matter of An Appeal Filed With the State Superintendent of Public Instruction on Date of March 26, 1956, Signed by Gaylord Hill, Harold Rue and John Duerst Appealing from the Refusal of the Municipal Boards of the Village of Barneveld and Towns of Brigham and Ridgeway, County of Iowa, State of Wisconsin, to Issue an Order Altering the Boundaries of School District No. 12 Town of Brigham and Joint School District No. 15, Village of Barneveld and Towns of Brigham and Ridgeway, State of Wisconsin.

FINDINGS OF FACT

AND

O R D E R

The record in the above matter is as follows:

On March 26, 1956, an appeal was filed with the State Superintendent of Public Instruction signed by Gaylord Hill, Harold Rue and John Duerst appealing from the refusal of the municipal boards of the Village of Barneveld and Towns of Brigham and Ridgeway to issue an order detaching certain described territory from School District No. 12, Town of Brigham, and attaching said described territory to Joint School District No. 15 of the Village of Barneveld and Towns of Brigham and Ridgeway as petitioned to do on or about February 28, 1956.

On date of April 27, 1956, Mr. John Duerst withdrew his name from the appeal after having been informed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction that in the absence of children whose educational welfare would be affected the State Superintendent could not give favorable consideration to his appeal.

On date of March 23, 1956, the municipal boards held a hearing on the petition herein referred to. The minutes of that hearing as submitted over the signature of Anton S. Arneson Jr., Secretary, do not indicate that any consideration was given to the question of educational welfare of children.

The State Superintendent of Public Instruction held an informal conference on the appeal by Gaylord Hill, et al., at the school house at Barneveld, Wisconsin, on date of August 16, 1956.

CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

SECTION 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

SECTION 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.

(3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.

(4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.

(5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.

(6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.

(7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employe of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

SECTION 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

SECTION 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.

(3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.

(4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.

(6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.

(7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

LIBRARY REPORT * JANUARY 8, 1959

The Library Board recently met with John C. Frantz, State Public Library Consultant and discussed several problems pertinent to our library.

12/1/58 Done
Mr. Frantz, first of all, called our attention to the fact that to function as a public library, we should according to the State Statute (43.26) be a legal identity of the village as ^{an} all properly run libraries in the state. Second, he discussed with us a state plan creating a library processing center for Southwestern Wisconsin. The center would be organized to aid the participating libraries in (1) the purchasing of new books at a greater discount; (2) advising libraries; (3) making exchange of books between libraries possible; and (4) processing new books that have been purchased from the center that otherwise had been done by each individual library. The Library Board has signed this agreement which makes us a participating library.

Third, he made a recommendation that we catalog and reference our books in accordance with state library standards. He stated that a state librarian would help in this task. The Board hopes to carry out this plan in the near future.

Fourth, Mr. Frantz strongly recommended that we attempt to find a better location where our quarters would be more centrally located and more accessible to the public.

Since the majority of these problems directly concerned the Village Board, the Library Board went before the Village Board and they have seen fit to recognize us as a legal body of the Village and appointed the present board to act as the Village Library Board, effective time of office, July 1, 1958. They also have appropriated \$50.00 for ~~us~~ ^{THE} to purchase ^{of} new books in 1959.

We presented them with the possibility of moving to new quarters. This action is in keeping with the recommendation of Mr. Frantz. At the present time this problem is still in the investigation stage and no definite solution is yet available.

LIBRARY REPORT - JANUARY 8, 1959

The Library Board recently met with John C. Francis, State Public Library Consultant and discussed several problems pertaining to our library.

Mr. Francis, first of all, called our attention to the fact that to function as a public library, we should according to the State Statute (W.S. 26) be a legal entity of the village as well as properly tax levied in the state. Second, he discussed with us a plan of creating a library processing center for Northwestern Wisconsin. The center would be organized to aid the participating libraries in (1) the purchasing of new books at a greater discount; (2) analyzing libraries; (3) making exchange of books between libraries; and (4) processing new books that have been purchased from the center that otherwise had been done by each individual library. The Library Board has signed this agreement which makes us a participating library.

Third, he made a recommendation that we catalog and reference our books in accordance with state library standards. He stated that a state librarian would help in this task. The Board hopes to carry out this plan in the near future.

Fourth, Mr. Francis strongly recommended that we attempt to find a better location where our quarters would be more centrally located and more accessible to the public.

Since the majority of these problems directly concerned the Village Board, the Library Board went before the Village Board and they have seen fit to recognize us as a legal body of the Village and appointed the present board to act as the Village Library Board, effective time of office, July 1, 1958. They also have appropriated \$50.00 for us to purchase new books in 1959.

We proposed that with this possibility of moving to new quarters, this action is in keeping with the recommendation of Mr. Francis. At the present time this problem is still in the investigation stage and no definite solution is yet available.

Mr. Turk, with Mr. Reynolds and Mr. Potter, of Sparta, Division of Assessments, came before the board with information relative to re-assessment of the village taxable property. Mr. Turk explained how a re-assessment would put all property taxpayers on an equal basis and that therefore each would only be paying his fair share of taxes levied. CHAPTER 341 LAWS OF 1953

SECTION 1. 34.01 (7) of the statutes is amended to read:

34.01 (7) "Treasurer" shall mean any duly elected, appointed or acting official of the state or of any county, city, village, town, drainage district, power district, school district, sewer district, or of any commission, committee, board or any officer or employee of any governmental subdivision of the state, or the clerk of any court in this state, whose duties require that he receive and account for public moneys.

SECTION 2. 34.105 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

34.105 WITHDRAWAL OF PUBLIC FUNDS. (1) Withdrawal or disbursement by a treasurer of any county, city, village, town or school district of moneys deposited in a public depository shall be made as provided by s. 66.042 (1) to (5). "Treasurer" as used herein means only the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district and does not include all of the other persons within the definition of that term in s. 34.01 (7). This section shall not affect the provisions of s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository by treasurers as defined in s. 34.01 (7), except those mentioned in sub. (1) of 34.105 shall be as provided in s. 66.042 (6).

SECTION 3. 66.042 of the statutes is repealed and recreated to read:

66.042 DISBURSEMENT FROM LOCAL TREASURY. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subs. (2), (3), (4) and (5), in every county, city, village, town and school district, all disbursements from the treasury shall be made by the treasurer thereof upon the written order of the county, city, village, town or school clerk after proper vouchers have been filed in the office of the clerk; and in all cases where the statutes provide for payment by the treasurer without an order of the clerk, it shall hereafter be the duty of the clerk to draw and deliver to the treasurer an order therefor before or at the time when such payment is required to be made by the treasurer. The provisions of this section shall apply to all special and general provisions of the statutes relative to the disbursement of money from the county, city, village, town or school district treasury except s. 67.10 (2).

(2) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, a county having a population of 500,000 may, by ordinance, adopt any other method of allowing vouchers, disbursing funds, reconciling outstanding county orders, reconciling bank accounts, examining county orders, and accounting therefor consistent with accepted accounting and auditing practices, provided that such ordinance shall prior to its adoption be submitted to the state department of audit, which department shall submit its recommendations with respect thereto to the county board of supervisors.

(3) Except in cities of the first class and counties having a population of 500,000 or more, disbursements from the county, city, village, town or school treasury shall be by order check. No such order check shall be released to the payee, nor shall such be valid, unless signed by the clerk and treasurer. Unless otherwise directed by ordinance adopted by the governing body, certified copy of which shall be filed with the public depository or depositories concerned, the chairman of the county board, mayor, village president, town chairman or director of the school district, as the case may be, shall counter-sign all order checks. The governing body may also by ordinance authorize additional signatures. In lieu of the personal signatures of the clerk and treasurer and such other signature as may be required, there may be affixed on such order check the facsimile signatures of such persons adopted by them and approved by the governing body concerned but the use of such facsimile signature shall not relieve any such official from any liability to which he is otherwise subject, including the unauthorized use thereof. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment on any check bearing such facsimile notwithstanding that the same may have been placed thereon without the authority of the designated persons.

(4) Whenever any board, commission or committee of any county, city, village, town or school district is vested by statute with exclusive control and management of a fund, including the audit and approval of payments therefrom, independently of the governing body, such payments shall be made by order checks issued by the county, city, village, town or school clerk upon the filing with him of certified bills, vouchers or schedules signed by the proper officers of such board, commission or committee, giving the name of the claimant or payee, and the amount and nature of each payment.

(5) In cities of the first class, municipal disbursements of public moneys shall be by order, check or order check. Checks shall be signed by the treasurer and countersigned by the comptroller. Orders shall be signed by the mayor and clerk and countersigned by the comptroller, as provided in the charter of such city. Disbursements of school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 38.16 (2). Disbursements of vocational school moneys shall be in the manner provided by s. 41.16 (5), except that such orders or checks shall be signed by a person authorized by the board of vocational and adult education and countersigned by the city comptroller.

(6) Withdrawal or disbursement of moneys deposited in a public depository as defined in s. 34.01 (2) by a treasurer as defined in s. 34.01 (7), other than the elected, appointed or acting official treasurer of a county, city, village, town or school district, shall be by check signed by the person or persons designated by written authorization of the governing board as defined in s. 34.01 (4). Any such authorization shall conform to any specific statutory provision covering the disbursement of such funds. Any public depository shall be fully warranted and protected in making payment in accordance with the latest authorization on file therewith.

(7) No order shall be issued by the city or village clerk in excess of funds available or appropriated for the purposes for which such order is drawn, unless authorized by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of a majority of all members of the governing body of such city or village.

As of this date, the Village is currently indebted for water improvements to the Barneveld State Bank in the amount of \$5,000 which was borrowed for the purpose of erecting and paying for the addition to the municipal water utility, namely, the water storage reservoir and pumps for which the Village is currently obligated to raise \$1,000 principal and interest each year.

2. The Water Utility, due to the borrowing of the Village is currently indebted to the Village General Fund \$11,000 for which it has in the last several years repaid \$1,000 of principal per year by transferring from the Bond Account \$1,000 principal plus interest on its unpaid balance at four per cent each year.

Therefore, if the payment of approximately \$2,500 for the current repairs to the Turban Pump located in the well are made from the municipal water funds during 1959, it does not appear financially sound that an additional \$1,000 principal be paid to the Village on their reservoir loan and that in order to accomplish the repair as is currently recommended and required, that the Village be prepared in its budget session to raise as required by Resolution the \$1,000 principal due on its loan on the 1959 tax roll.

It is the feeling of the committee that this will not create a hardship to the taxpayers or substantially increase the tax rate required by the Village, and will not place the water utility in jeopardy concerning the payment of its bond obligation which are required to be paid by ordinance each year on a pre-determined schedule of approximately \$1,500 principal plus interest at three per cent annually.

It is therefore the recommendation of the Water Committee that the contract with Walter Strahota of the Service & Parts Company of Cobb, Wisconsin, be accepted by the Village of Barneveld for the continued efficient operation of the water supply and the water pumping facility of the Barneveld Municipal Water Utility.

Dear Mr. Stenseth:

I want to thank you and the other members of the Village Board for the courteous and objective consideration you have given the personal property tax protest of Mr. Watson and the Consolidated Construction Company.

I feel confident this protest can be easily concluded in a manner satisfactory to both parties. I know you, as a public official, are interested in seeing that tax matters are fairly administered. As a business man I know you appreciate one of the most difficult tax problems facing the assessor is "fair market value" of personal property.

I am certain Mr. Trine has tried to do his best in evaluating the personal property of Consolidated Construction Company and has been handicapped by a lack of experience in assessing construction machinery. At best, it is a very difficult task and calls for consideration of many factors.

Enclosed is a letter from Mr. Forrest W. Gillett, director of the property tax division for the State of Wisconsin. Mr. Gillett has 20 years of experience in evaluating personal property and states that it has been his experience that construction equipment depreciates in actual or market value much faster than it does on the books of the owners.

Mr. Gillett states this is particularly true of the small contractors like we have in this case. The reason for this stems from the fact small contractors invariably have to purchase used equipment (because they cannot afford the tremendous price for new machinery) at the height of a construction project. Invariably, the need for a special piece of equipment (grader, scraper, etc.) arises suddenly when old machinery breaks down or weather delays force an all-out effort to complete a project within a specified time to avoid penalty. Good used machinery is difficult to locate at such times and those who possess it and can afford to sell it

quickly recognize their opportunity to exact better than the actual value price for the equipment. Thus, the purchase price is not a true reflection of value and the owner should not be penalized (in the determination of his personal property tax) for his inability to afford new equipment sold at regular market prices or below.

Mr. Gillett states depreciation schedules should only be a starting point for assessors. He further states that in using depreciation schedules assessors should give the owner the benefit of all depreciation up to the May 1st assessment date and from this point of beginning consider the foregoing factors relative to value.

Mr. Gillett has asked that you call him directly if you, the Board, or Mr. Trine have further questions as to the evaluation of construction equipment. He can be reached at Alpine 6-4411, extension 489.

Also enclosed per request of the board is a depreciation schedule prepared by Baillies and Newman, Certified Public Accountants, showing the depreciation value or book value of Consolidated's equipment on May 1, 1959. This figure of \$214,872.39 should thus be the starting point from which actual market value of the equipment is determined. It is the belief of Mr. Watson and Mr. Baumgardt that this equipment has a true market value of \$150,000. to \$160,000. They respectfully request the board to reduce the assessment accordingly.

As I stated to the board on April 5th, in its discretion the board may elect to admit the error in the 1959 assessment and refund the excess under authority of Section 74.135 of the Wisconsin Statutes. The alternative procedure is set forth in Section 70.43 of the Wisconsin Statutes and would require the board to direct the assessor to subtract the excessive 1959 assessment from his 1960 assessment figure, after first subtracting all other corrections such as the one made necessary by the overall excess of the 1959 assessment when compared to the recommended state valuation. Mr. Watson and Mr. Baumgardt respectfully urge that a refund be granted as they need such funds to apply on the other expenses and taxes of Consolidated Construction Co.

Again thanking you for your open-minded consideration of this matter and trusting we will be advised as agreed not later than April 15, 1960, I remain,

Dear Mr. Thomas:

You have asked for a statement of the customary procedure and recommendations followed in the valuation of road construction equipment.

This type of equipment carries a very maximum depreciation ordinarily, because of the very nature of the use to which it is put. Road equipment ordinarily when used, is used at its maximum capacity. Conditions under which it is used are also a contributing factor to a maximum depreciation by virtue of the fact that it is subjected to the weather and to the hazards of dirt, grit and uneven terrain. It is obvious that a depreciation under those conditions would be greater than on machines that are stationary and under cover away from the weather, dust and dirt.

The customer's cost of used equipment also is an item that should be tempered with judgment, taking into consideration new cost less depreciation for obsolescence and wear, rather than the cost paid by a purchaser by virtue of the fact that he was obliged to "pay the price" in order to obtain used equipment in order to fulfill the terms of a contract.

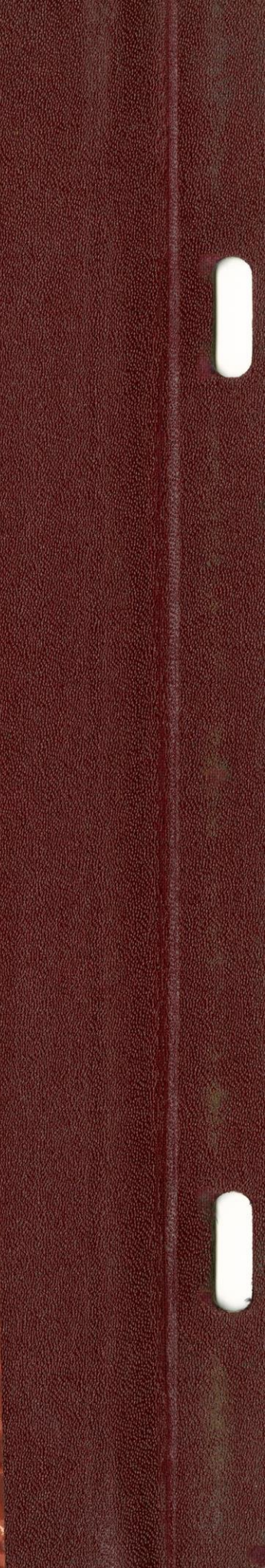
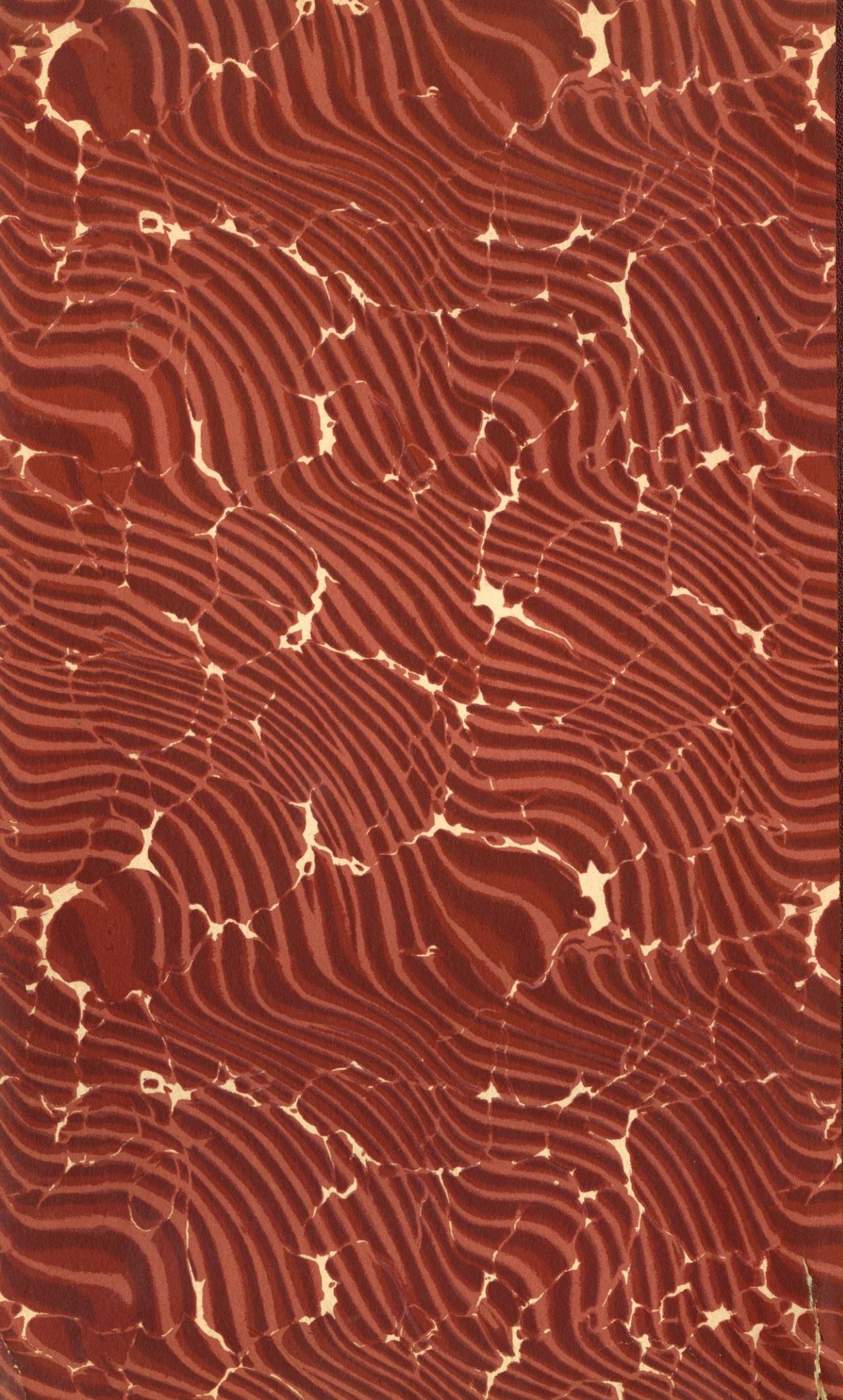
2. The committee recommends that, due to figures now presented by accountants for Consolidated Construction Co., the 1959 assessment of \$237,000.00 be reduced \$27,000.00 to the corrected assessment figure of \$210,000.00.

Following the presentation, Trustee T.I. Arneson moved for the adoption as read. Following further discussion by the Board as a whole, Trustee M. E. Arneson seconded the motion which carried unanimously.

Minutes of the Finance Committee meetings in regard to the Consolidated Construction Co. tax protest attached hereto and made a part of these minutes.

There being no further business to be taken up at this meeting, the special meeting was adjourned at 8:20 PM.
