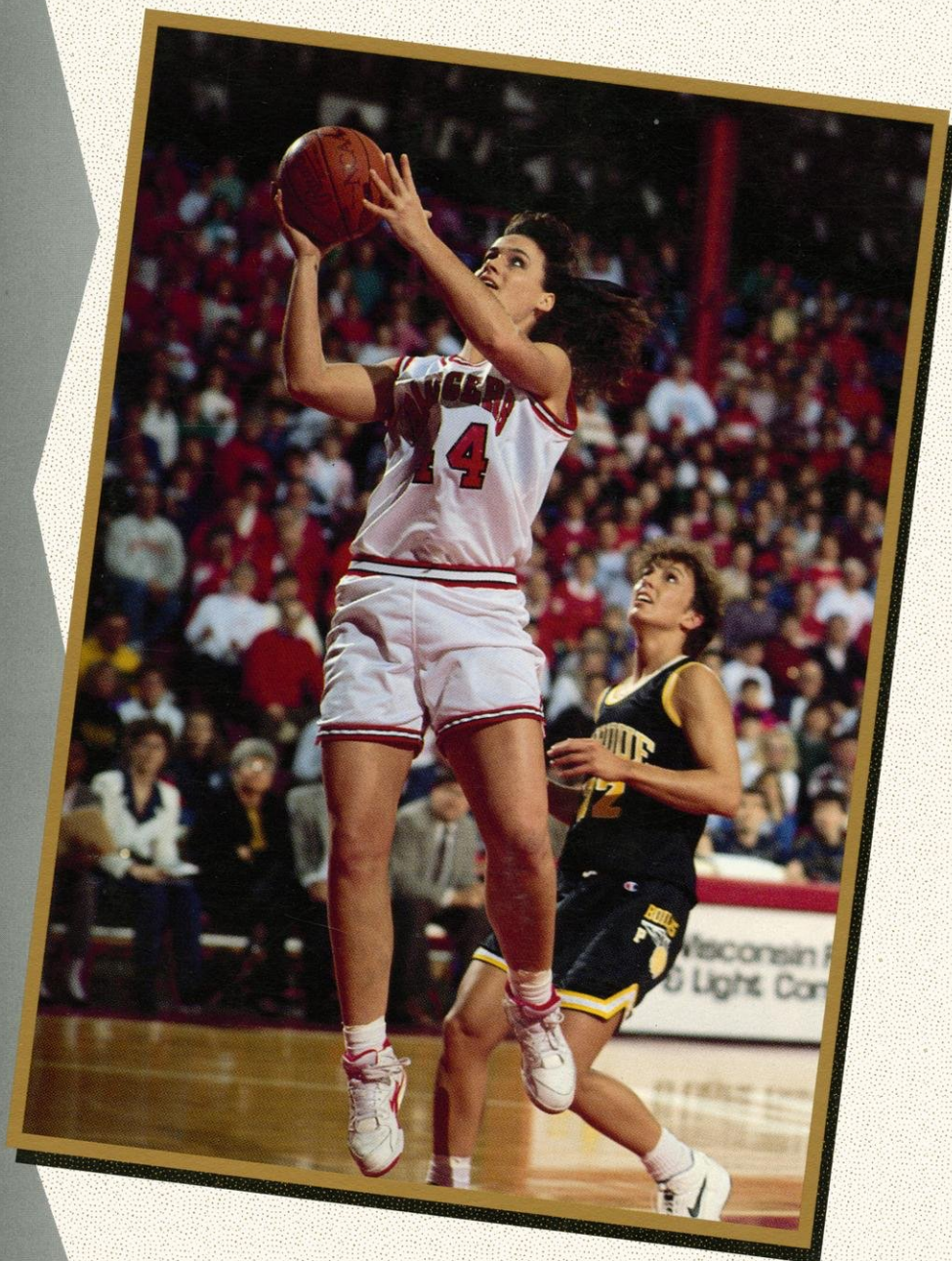

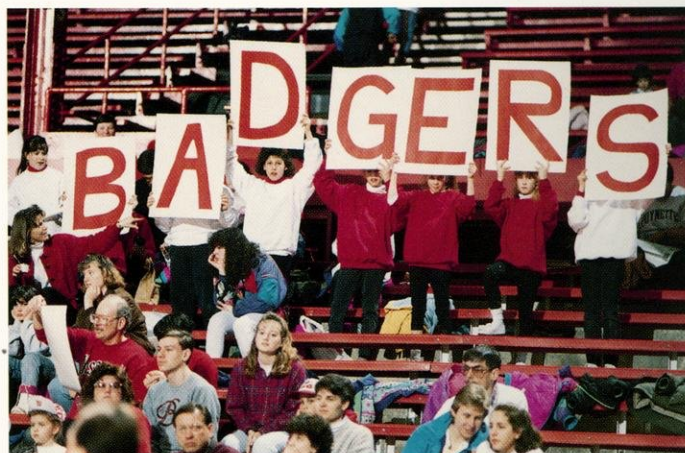

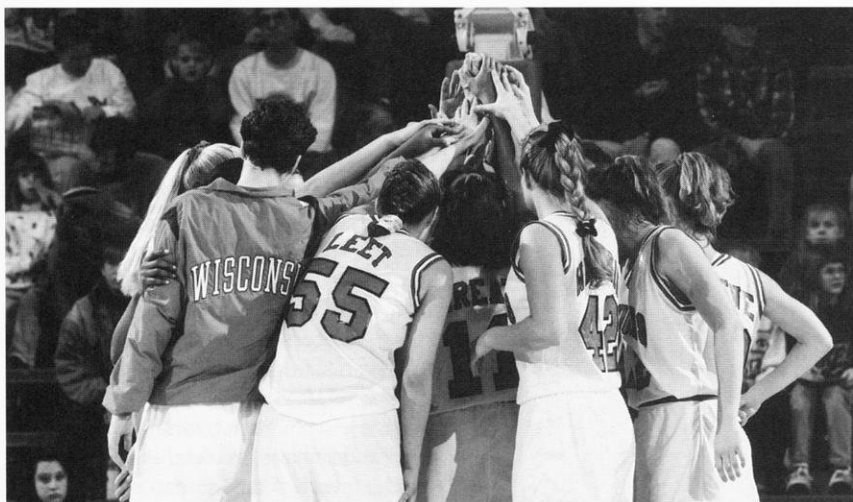

Head Coach Mary Murphy

The 1992 Big Ten Coach of the Year, Mary Murphy begins her eighth year as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin. A Chicago native, Murphy was named the third head coach at Wisconsin in 1986. Since then, she has revitalized the Wisconsin program and brought it into national prominence.

Murphy began her career with just seven returning letterwinners on the team. Due to the lateness of her appointment, the team finished that season with six walk-ons, compiling a 9-19 record. Rebuilding each year, Wisconsin made the leap during the 1991-92 season, when it earned its first-ever national ranking.

The Badgers were ranked as high as 22nd in the Associate Press poll during the 1991-92 season and ended the regular season in the 25th spot. That ranking and a 20-9 record, the second best in program history, gave Wisconsin its first-ever NCAA tournament bid.

The Badgers also finished third in the Big Ten Conference in 1992—the best conference finish since 1984—with a 13-5 record. For her team's achievements, Murphy was named the Big Ten Coach of the Year and also earned Converse District IV Coach of the Year honors.



The Badgers were hoping for similar success in 1992-93 with the return of preseason all-Americans Robin Threatt and Barb Franke. But injuries took their toll on Wisconsin as Franke tore a knee ligament during a preseason exhibition and missed the entire season. In addition, two Badgers

players suffered concussions during the season. The team struggled to a 7-20 record.

Despite the down season, Murphy's style of play remained popular not only with her players but also with spectators. Wisconsin has set attendance records in five of Murphy's seven years, including averaging more than 3,000 per Big Ten game and 2,759 for all games during the 1991-92 season. The Badgers also set a single game attendance record of 8,353 when Wisconsin played host to Montana in a first-round NCAA game.

Since Murphy took over the program, nine individuals have received all-Big Ten honors by a vote of conference coaches. In 1992-93 Robin Threatt earned her second consecutive first-team honor. In 1991-92 the Badgers landed three athletes on the honor team with Threatt earning first-team honors, Mynette Clark second-team laurels, and Michele Kozelka honorable mention honors. In addition, Barb Franke was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Year, marking the second such honor under Murphy.

Murphy has not neglected the academic responsibilities of her student-athletes. Wisconsin has made up 20 percent of the all-Big Ten basketball academic team mem-



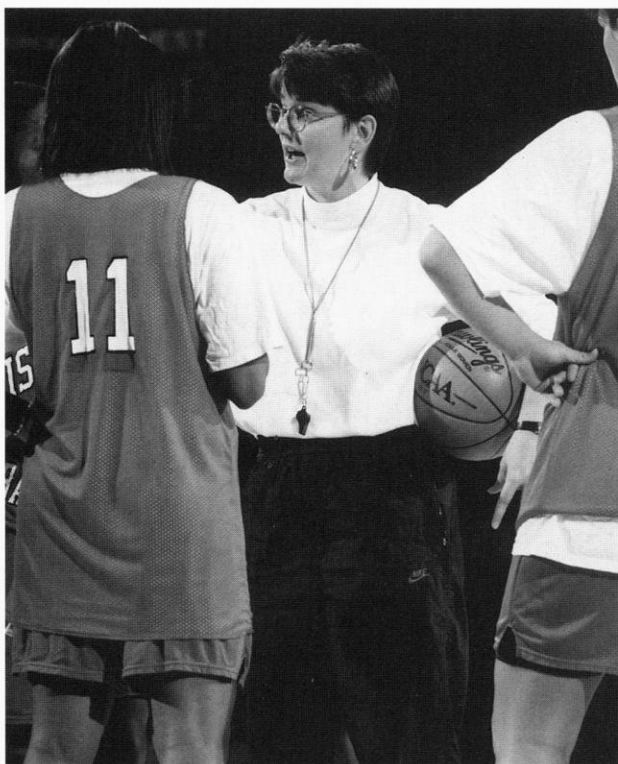
bers since 1989. The 1992-93 Badger team had three Academic all-Big Ten team members in Dolly Rademaker, Peggy Shreve and Jen Waterman. In 1990-91, Wisconsin made up one-third of the Academic all-Big Ten team with seven Badgers among the 21 members. In the past five years, Wisconsin's 21 representatives on the academic teams has numbered more than any other Big Ten men's or women's basketball program.

In addition, Kay Fredrickson became Wisconsin's first women's basketball CoSIDA/GTE Academic all-America District team member. Murphy's emphasis on the court and in the classroom is: "To be the best that you can be." The results of that philosophy are evident.

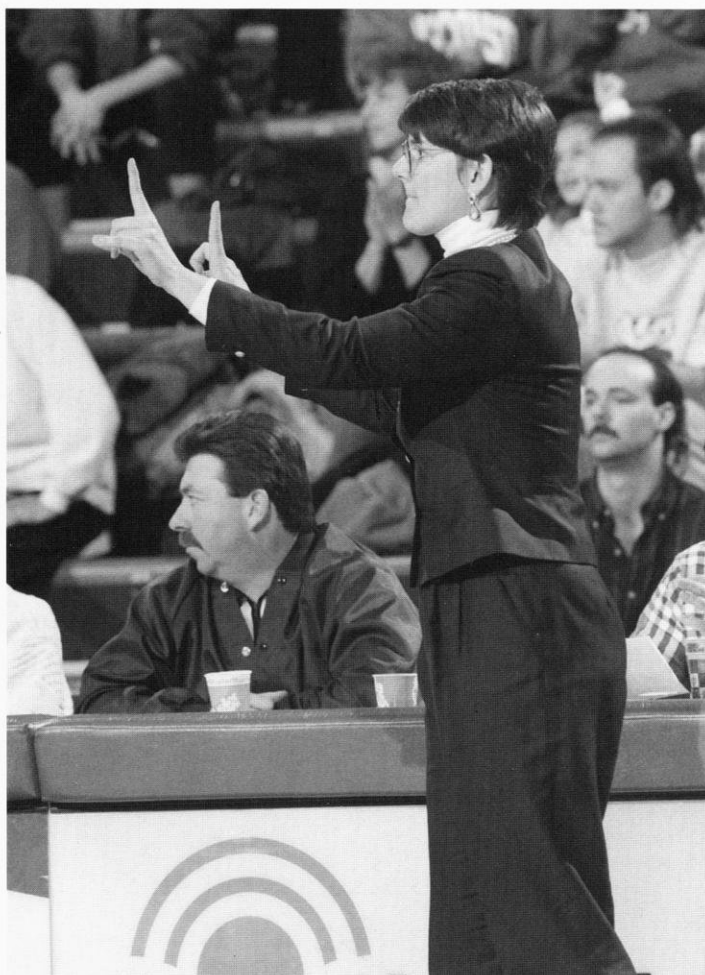
Murphy's reconstruction of the Badger program has included an infusion of youth, most of whom come from the state of Wisconsin. Her 1993-94 team includes three Wisconsin *Associated Press* Players of the Year: Dolly Rademaker (1991), Katie Voigt (1992), and Jennah Burkholder (1993). Murphy and her staff have proven experience in recruiting that has brought about the revitalization of the Badger program.

Murphy is a 1980 graduate of Northwestern University in public administration/public policy. She was a four-year starting guard for Northwestern and a co-captain her final two seasons. She guided the Wildcats to consecutive Big Ten and Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women Championships in 1979 and 1980. The Wildcats went to the quarterfinals of the 1980 AIAW National Basketball Tournament. She was also selected a Wade Trophy finalist in 1980, an annual award given to the nation's outstanding female college basketball player.

After completing her playing career, Murphy accepted a graduate assistant coaching position at Notre Dame. She earned a master's degree in business administration from Notre Dame in 1982. Murphy served as a head assistant and recruiting coordinator at Notre Dame for six years prior to being named to her first head coaching appointment at Wisconsin.

Assistant Coaches

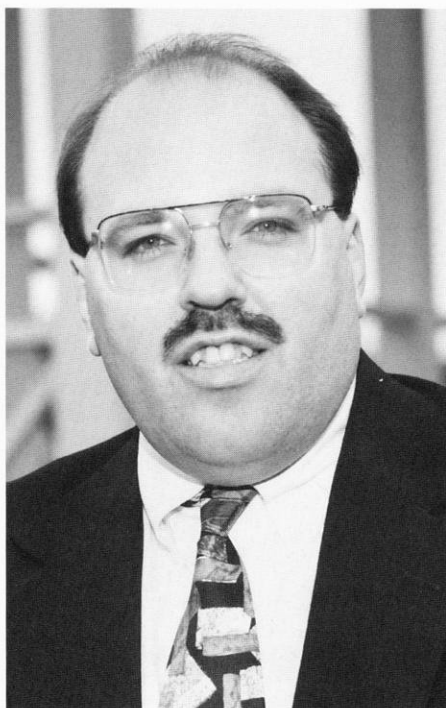


Donna Freitag

Donna Freitag begins her third season as the Badger's first assistant coach. The team's defensive coordinator, she is also in charge of coaching the post players. A native of Oregon, Wis., Donna returned to Wisconsin in 1986 as second assistant, and was named the first assistant in 1991.

Freitag earned most valuable player honors at the University of Wisconsin-Platteville for two years before transferring to the University of Iowa. At Iowa, she was named team MVP and captain during the 1982-83 season. Freitag also won the All-Around Athlete award in 1983 and was named to the all-tournament team at the Sun Dial Classic.

A 1983 graduate of Iowa in physical education and health, Freitag has worked at numerous basketball camps as well as coached at the high school level. She played in Ireland with the women's semi-professional basketball league for two years prior to her appointment at Wisconsin.



Jon Cain

Jon Cain begins his third season with the Badger women's basketball program. The Badger's recruiting and scouting coordinator, Jon also assists with practice and on-court coaching.

A native of Wisconsin, Jon served as the only assistant women's basketball coach at Baylor University for two years prior to coming to Wisconsin. He assisted in all areas of coaching including recruiting and player evaluation, organizing practices, on-court coaching, scheduling, and monitoring the academic progress of the athletes.

Prior to his position at Baylor, Jon served as a coach and teacher at Concordia Lutheran High School in Tomball, Texas. He compiled a two-year record of 55-8 as girls basketball coach. Jon also served as the football coach and athletic director.

A native of Milwaukee, Jon graduated from Milwaukee Lutheran High School in 1980 where he lettered in football and wrestling. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Valparaiso University in 1984 and a master's degree in education from Baylor in 1989.



Mynette Clark

Former Badger Mynette Clark begins her first season as a part-time assistant coach after graduating in August of 1993 in Recreation Resources Management. Clark served as a volunteer coach for the Badgers in 1992-93.

Clark was the Badgers' second leading scorer in 1991-92 with a 13.5 points-per-game average. She led the team in three-point field goals averaging five attempts per game and hitting .348 percent. She also led the team in assists, dishing out 93 on the season.

Clark completed her career with 1,017 points for ninth on the UW career list. She leads the three-point field goal list hitting 130 of 393 attempts in her career.

1993-94 Badgers Look Promising

In her seven years as the head coach at the University of Wisconsin, Mary Murphy has been dealt a number of hands. From her first season when the team finished with six walk-ons, to her 1992 team that qualified for the NCAA Championship, Murphy has learned to play with the hands she's been dealt.

"Overall, I'm pleased with what we have developed and what we have going," says Murphy.

What Murphy has going in 1993-94 is one of her most promising teams. Murphy also had a bright outlook in 1992-93, but she quickly learned what injuries can do to a season.

"Our style of play won't change. We'll push the ball up the floor, toe the three-point line, have an aggressive, stifling defense, and baffle our opponents on how to stop our potent inside-outside game."

Coming off the great success of 1992 where Murphy brought Wisconsin from nearly last in the Big Ten Conference to a team in contention for the title, it was easy to imagine the same scenario for last season. The Badgers finished third in the conference in 1992 with a 13-5 record behind league champion Iowa and second-place Purdue. Wisconsin earned its first-ever bid to the NCAA tournament with a 20-9 record, but chances of a repeat appearance were dashed in the season opening exhibition.

Although graduating two starters from the 1992 squad, Wisconsin returned *Street & Smith* preseason all-America **Robin Threatt** and honorable mention all-America **Barb Franke**. Wisconsin's potent inside-outside threat was one of the reasons for the team's prior success.

But Franke, the 1992 Big Ten Freshman of the Year, tore her anterior cruciate ligament in the opening exhibition and was out for the season. Franke's loss removed the strong inside game the Badgers were counting on and put the pressure on Threatt. Threatt, a 5-7 guard, responded well with a 19-point scoring average while smashing the Wisconsin all-time career

scoring record for men and women with 1,901 points. Threatt received help from sophomore **Camille Williams**, who stepped into a starting role averaging 12.3 points and 5.3 rebounds.

But the Badgers suffered more injuries, including three concussions, and the team struggled to a 7-20 record while dropping to 4-14 in the conference and a 10th-place finish. Threatt, whose spectacular play was a season highlight, completed her career earning first-team all-conference honors.

As much as last season fell short of Murphy's expectations, it's not hard to have great aspirations for 1993-94 when you consider the return of Franke, the improved play of Williams and **Tracy Winkler**, and the infusion of a very talented freshmen class.

The 6-0 Williams was Wisconsin's representative on the Big Ten all-star team which toured Europe in August. A native of Waterloo, Iowa, she started 25 of 27 games as a sophomore and showed moments of brilliance in setting single game career highs of 24 points and 11 rebounds.

"Camille needs to show more consistency," Murphy says, "and I'm confident she will. We love the way she can play. She's become more comfortable playing outside. Her other talents are her quickness in the post, speed getting down the floor, and her rebounding ability. That gives us a lot of versatility."

Franke returns stronger than ever after a year of vigorous rehabilitation, and is expected to lead the Badger team at the post position.

In her initial season, the 6-2 Franke showed her strength in the paint averaging 11.3 points and 6.9 rebounds while hitting just shy of a school record .542 percent of her shots (128-236). A native of Cedar Falls, Iowa, she made the 1992 U.S. Junior

Select team which played five games in Canada and led the team with 16 points per game. Although invited to try out for the junior national squad in 1993, and invited to play at the 1993 U.S. Olympic Festival, Franke opted to wait and continue rehabilitation on her knee over the summer.

"Barb's (Franke) return coupled with the improved play of Tracy Winkler and the addition of Jennah Burkholder gives us some great combinations in the middle," Murphy says. "That part of our game where we were so vulnerable last year, will become our strength this season."

Sophomore Winkler spent part of her summer in San Antonio playing on the North team at the U.S. Olympic Festival. Winkler was one of 12 selected from over 100 who tried out last May.

As a freshman, the 6-2 Winkler played in 27 games starting five. Although averaging just 3.2 points, Winkler saw extensive playing time averaging 15 minutes per game, which should pay dividends this year.

"Tracy's basketball education was severely hampered when Barb went out with the knee injury," Murphy recounted. "New players learn from veterans, and we didn't have anyone to train Tracy. This summer was a good learning experience

for her and that should really help us this season."

Wisconsin will need the help after graduating three starters in point guard Peggy Shreve, center Jen Waterman, and Threalt, as well as reserve forward Heather Bostrom and 6-5 center Amber Landrigan.

Ready to step into a starting position is senior **Dolly Rademaker**. Rademaker, a 5-10 guard from Thorp, Wis., became a starter in the latter part of the last season playing in all 27 games and starting 15. The three-point shooting specialist averaged 6.9 points while hitting .293 percent of her treys. Rademaker holds the three-point



shooting school season record .405 (47-116) set her freshman year.

Junior **Sharon Johnson** played in 24 games starting the first eight of the season at point. Johnson and Shreve shared duties at point with each lending a different style to the Badger team. Johnson, a 5-8 guard from Memphis, Tenn., had career highs of 17 points, eight rebounds and six assists last year.

"Sharon can create havoc defensively with her quickness, and she's been working on her shot religiously," Murphy said. Johnson was one of two players who suffered concussions that slowed their contributions to the team last season.

Redshirt sophomore **Karie Cattanch** returns from knee surgery last year to have her collegiate basketball debut. Cattanch, a 5-10 swing player from Markesan, Wis., averaged 22 points while a high school senior and specializes in the three-point goal.

Another redshirt sophomore, **Kesa Dillon** from Oakland, Calif., played sparingly in 15 games last season recording career highs of four points and three rebounds.

Senior **Rebecca Leet** will redshirt this season due to post concussive syndrome. Last season, Leet suffered a second concussion in February sidelined her

for the season. Leet, who averaged 4.7 points and 3.7 rebounds, hit her head on the floor going for a rebound on Jan. 24, and sat out for three weeks. The 6-2 forward returned to play one game before duplicating the injury on Feb. 12.

Also not retruning is redshirt junior **Kim Martin**, who will take a medical departure from the UW team after a third knee surgery this past summer. Kim played in five games last year after returning from ACL surgeries on both knees.

With five players lost to graduation and two others not returning for medical reasons, Murphy's team is comprised of just seven returnees plus four freshmen.

"Everyone will have to play like a veteran," Murphy said. "Fortunately with our freshmen class, we'll have people that can step right in and do that."

Highlighting Murphy's recruiting class, all from the State of Wisconsin, is 6-1 guard **Katie Voigt** from Minocqua. Voigt, perhaps one of the best players ever from the state of Wisconsin, was the 1993 *Milwaukee Journal* Player of the Year and dominated the high school scene while leading her team to 52 straight wins, one state championship, and one runner-up title.

A renowned scorer and ball-handler, Voigt also rebounded 10 per game, and averaged five assists. She has a reputation for versatility that allows her to hit three-pointers, penetrate on the drive, or dish to her teammates. Voigt averaged over 21 points per game the last two years and was named a fourth-team *Parade* all-American. The 1992 *Associated Press* Player of the Year, she earned AP first-team all-state honors for the second year in 1993.

The Badgers also recruited the 1993 AP player of the year in a 6-0 forward **Jennah Burkholder** of Janesville. Burkholder led Parker High School to four straight Division 1 state championship appearances including the team title in 1993. While a four-year starter, she contributed to Janesville's 95-8 record since 1989. A tenacious defender and awesome rebounder,

Burkholder has also been known to bring the ball up the court and penetrate from the perimeter. She averaged 19.1 points as a senior, and 25 points and 14 rebounds per game as a junior.

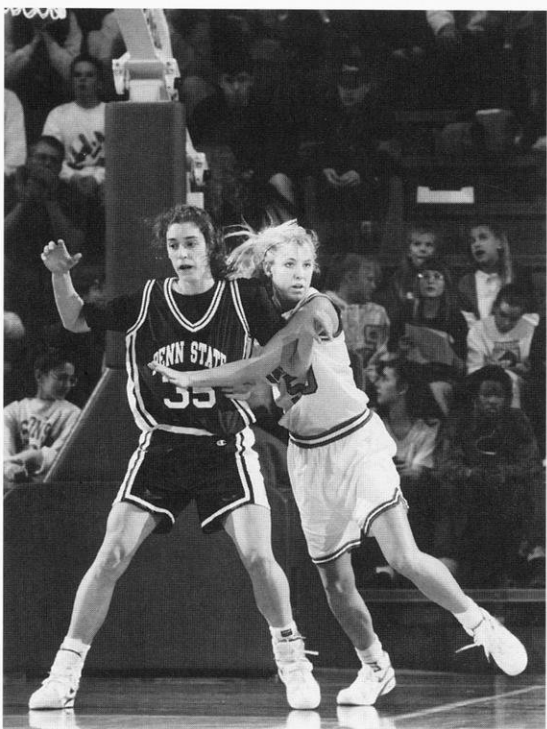
Stacy Riemer will rejoin her former teammate, Tracy Winkler, when she arrives this fall. Riemer, a 5-7 point guard, is Chilton High School's career assist leader with 350. She averaged 4.1 assists and 3.2 steals as a senior while leading her team to three conference championships and the state Division III title in 1992.

The Badger roster will also include **Jenny Rhodes** of Milwaukee Lutheran High School. The 6-1 forward averaged 9.4 points and 12.3 rebounds per game while earning all-conference honors as a senior.

Although there are several variables in the Wisconsin outlook due to injuries, Murphy can be assured that a bright future is ahead for her players and the program.

"I'm looking for my experienced people to pick up where they left off, and for us to continue to improve in specific areas," Murphy said. "We need to be better rebounders, we need to be a better free throw shooting team, and we need to stay healthy."

As a postscript, Murphy might add, and we need to keep our expectations in line with the hand we are dealt.

The University of Wisconsin benefits from the interest and media exposure associated with the Big Ten Conference, one of the premier athletic conferences in the nation. Big Ten women's athletics programs take pride in leading the nation in basketball and volleyball attendance and in receiving more network and cable television exposure than any conference in the nation.

Begun in 1895, the Intercollegiate Conference of Faculty Representatives (popularly known as the Big Ten) has changed little from its original philosophy of faculty control of athletics with emphasis on the student-athlete.

The women's athletics programs became affiliated with the Conference officially in 1981, although unofficial conference championships had been held among the member institutions since 1972. Penn State became the 11th university to join the conference in 1991.

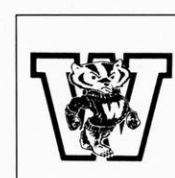
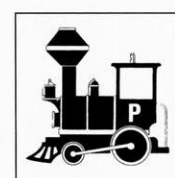
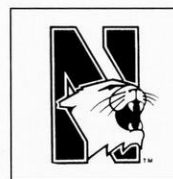
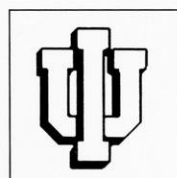
As a Big Ten school, Wisconsin women athletes compete in conference championships in basketball, cross country, golf, swimming and diving, tennis, indoor and outdoor track and field, and vol-

leyball. A conference women's soccer championship will be added in 1994.

The Big Ten Conference basketball champion is determined by the game record within the conference. The teams play a total of 18 games playing nine teams twice and two teams once.

The conference champion earns an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. In 1993, the Big Ten Conference was represented by four universities in the NCAA Basketball Championship. Iowa and Ohio State advanced to the Final Four with the Hawkeyes finishing second in the nation.

For four consecutive years, the Big Ten Conference has led the nation in volleyball attendance. Five schools finished in the top 19 in attendance, and overall the league averages 1,055 spectators per match. The league also leads the nation in basketball attendance with an average of over 2,500 spectators per game. Wisconsin is among the leaders in the Big Ten in both volleyball and basketball attendance, and has been the site of record-breaking crowds of 10,935 in volleyball, and 8,353 in basketball.

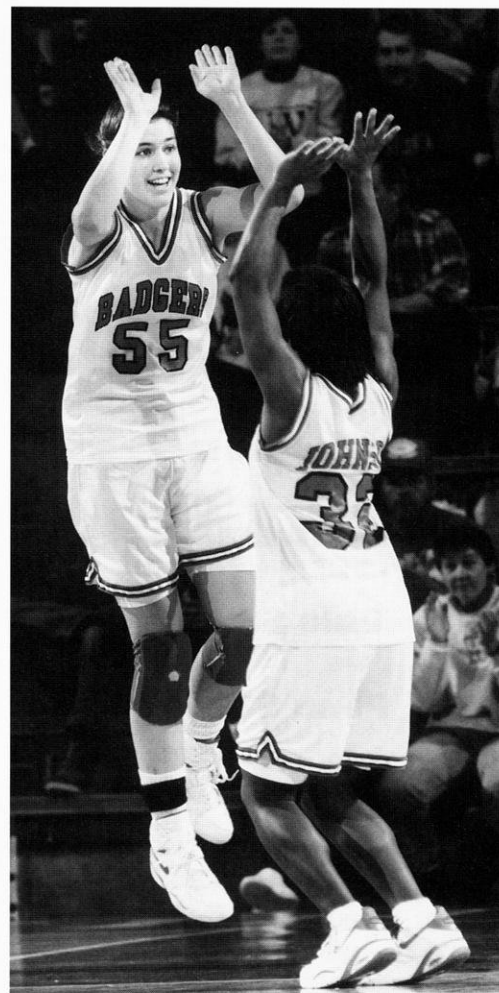

A World-Class University

The University of Wisconsin-Madison, one of the nation's leading institutions of higher education, is dedicated to the support of academic freedom.

Established in 1848, the first class of 17 students enrolled February 5, 1849. Today, UW-Madison ranks as the nation's fifth largest university with 41,948 students. The student body is one of the most diverse in the country with students coming from every state in the country. Wisconsin also ranks fourth in the nation for foreign student enrollment.

More than 4,470 courses and 12,832 sections are offered in UW-Madison's 12 schools and colleges. Majors are available in 156 bachelor's, 184 master's, and 125 doctoral and professional degree programs.

Wisconsin has ranked among the top 10 universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910. The quality of its undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized around the world.

One recent survey rated 49 different undergraduate programs at UW-Madison among the top 10 in the nation. Among those ranked include sociology, German, chemical engineering, geography, statistics, plant pathology, molecular biology, biochemistry, Spanish, Portuguese, zoology, political science, chemistry, economics, mathematics, and history.

Much of the University's international academic reputation stems from the quality of its faculty. UW-Madison faculty or alumni have been awarded 12 Nobel Prizes and 17 Pulitzer Prizes. Many other faculty are leaders in their field being members of the National Academy of Sciences, National Academy of Engineering, and National Academy of Education. The university is also ranked fourth in the nation in research and development expenditures.

UW-Madison is one of the nation's first land-grant colleges, establishing a tradition of research in agriculture and the life science. The founders of the university developed the "Wisconsin Idea" as making "the beneficent influence of the university available to every home in the state."

UW-Madison is the largest institution in the University of Wisconsin System. It has the only public law and medical schools in the state as well as the only school of veterinary medicine.

A Scenic Campus

One of the most picturesque college campuses in the country, UW-Madison lies along the beautiful shores of Lake Mendota.

One mile from the capitol, traveling down historic State Street, the city was designed so the University and state would be linked, signifying the interrelated nature of the academic and political life of Wisconsin.

Madison's lakes, rolling hills, architecture, parks and arboretum have enhanced

UW-Madison's reputation for scenic beauty. Two major films, including the 1986 summer hit *Back To School* starring Rodney Dangerfield, have been shot on the picturesque campus.

Tree-lined Bascom Hill, which features a bronze statue of Abraham Lincoln, is one of the University's most famous landmarks. Others include North Hall, the first building on campus; the Carillon Tower in front of the Social Science building; the Library Mall, with its clock tower and fountain; and Picnic Point, a 129-acre peninsula complete with hiking and biking trails—one of the most romantic spots on campus.



A favorite area for UW students to congregate is the Memorial Union and its lakeside terrace. Here students can study or socialize against a backdrop of sailboats, canoes, sailboards, kayaks and swimmers, while enjoying the sunshine and cool breezes from Lake Mendota.

The Student Body

Over 41,000 students populate the 900-acre UW campus, including more than 10,414 graduate students in numerous fields.

Although a UW Board of Regents policy limits undergraduate enrollment from outside the state to 25 percent, the University still maintains one of the nation's most diverse student bodies.

Students hail from every county in the state and every state in the nation, as well as from approximately 115 foreign countries. UW-Madison ranks fourth in the nation for total foreign student enrollment.

A greater effort is also being made to recruit and retain minority students and faculty. In 1992-93, African-Americans, Hispanics, Native Americans and other minority groups accounted for 7.64 percent of the student body.

The Community

Located in southern Wisconsin, Madison is the home of the University of Wisconsin and the state capital. Considered one of the Midwest's most vibrant communities, it offers an endearing quality of life for full-time residents and students.

With a diverse population of 194,591, Madison offers the "big city" spheres of politics, arts and entertainment, as well as the attributes of a small town. It is a family, action-oriented community that promotes participation in government, education, the arts, sports, and recreational activities.

The May 1989 issue of *Outside* magazine rated Madison as one of the top 15 "great sports towns" in the country, based on quantity and quality of outdoor activities, the surrounding environment, and the participation of its population in various sports and recreation.

Madison was also listed as the eighth most livable city in the nation in a 1991 *Money* magazine survey.

Where Wisconsin Ranks

Since 1910, the University of Wisconsin has ranked on the top ten lists in every objective national faculty reputational survey. The quality of Wisconsin's undergraduate, graduate and research programs is recognized worldwide.

The *Fiske Guide to Colleges 1993*, the best-selling guide to colleges, gives the UW-Madison its highest academic ranking. In fact, UW-Madison is one of only eight public universities to receive the five-star rating.

One recent survey rated 49 undergraduate programs at the UW-Madison among the top ten in the nation. The university has also ranked fourth for the last several years in research funding among the nation's universities.

Academic, financial, and other rankings are summarized below to offer a flavor of the quality at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.



Funding

► **Federal Grants:** UW-Madison ranked ninth nationally in 1990, receiving 1.2 percent of the federal budget for research.

► **Research and Development Funds:** UW-Madison ranked fourth in the country for research and development expenditures in 1990, with \$326.4 million, according to the National Science Foundation.

► **Tuition:** Over the last ten years, tuition for resident undergraduates at the UW-Madison has been consistently lower than the average for public Big Ten schools. The UW-Madison has the second-lowest resident undergraduate tuition, behind the University of Iowa, and the third-lowest nonresident undergraduate tuition of the public Big Ten institutions.

► **Private Support:** UW-Madison ranked sixth in the nation, and first among public institutions in 1990-91 by receiving \$128 million in private support.

Research and Programs

► **Research Activity Index:** In 1986, the UW-Madison ranked second in a new multidimensional study that evaluated research activity at U.S. universities.

► **Doctoral Degrees:** Between the school's founding and 1992, the University of Wisconsin-Madison awarded 29,033 Ph.D.s. Few institutions in the world can match this record.

Departmental Academic Rankings

► **Business:** The School of Business real estate program ranks first in the nation in 1993, according to *U.S. News and World Report*. The faculty's scholarly output ranks first among business schools at public institutions.

► **Education:** The School of Education is the nation's best according to a survey by the University of Illinois released in 1990. The UW's educational administration and educational policy studies rank second.

► **College of Agricultural and Life Sciences:** In 1993, the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences is one of the top 10 agricultural schools in the country according to *Farm Futures* magazine.

► **Journalism and Mass Communication:** The faculty at the School of Journalism and Mass Communication was

rated first in the nation in research productivity in 1988 by *Journalism Quarterly*.

► **Science Programs:** According to *U.S. News and World Report's* annual graduate school ratings, published in March 1993, six UW-Madison science programs ranked in the top 12: computer science, tied for eighth; biology, tied for ninth; chemistry, 10th; nursing, tied for 11th; health-sciences administration, tied for 12th; and engineering, 12th.

► **Libraries:** The UW-Madison has the 13th largest university library system in the United States, with 5.3 million books in 28 locations across campus.

► **Graduates:** According to a 1987 *Wall Street Journal* survey, UW-Madison produced the third highest percentage of CEOs at Fortune 500 industrial companies and at 350 Fortune 500 service companies.

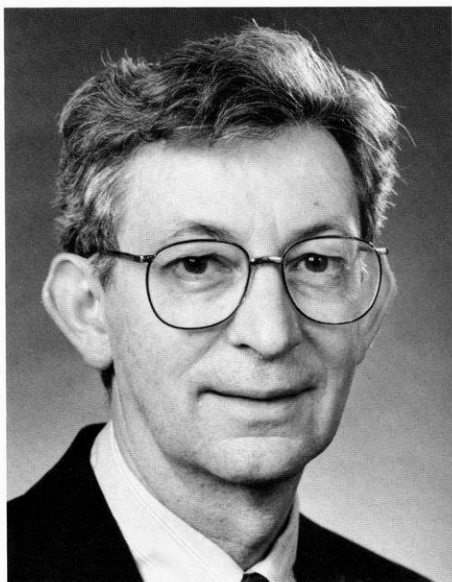
- ▶ with the oldest Scandinavian studies (1875), psychology (1888), agricultural economics (1909) and genetics (1910) departments in the United States
- ▶ in discovering Vitamins A and B
- ▶ with the oldest radio station in the nation—WHA—which began broadcasting in 1917
- ▶ as the Memorial Union became the first public university union to serve beer in 1933
- ▶ in finding in 1937 that niacin supplementation prevents pellagra, a deadly disease that killed 5,000 people a year
- ▶ with the nation's first department of wildlife management in 1939
- ▶ in the synthesizing of genes. Biochemistry professor Har Gobind Khorana synthesizes the first gene, for which he later receives the Nobel Prize in 1968
- ▶ in finding which wavelength of ultraviolet light produces skin cancer
- ▶ in discovering the anti-cancer drug, fluorouracil
- ▶ as Elizabeth and James Miller, UW Medical School professor of oncology and professor emeritus of oncology, were the first to identify characteristics among chemicals that cause cancer
- ▶ with the Orbiting Astronomical Observatory, the world's first true observatory in space
- ▶ in revolutionizing brain surgery, as Dr. Manucher Javid, UW Medical School professor of surgery, became the first neurosurgeon to use a solution from the age-old compound area during brain surgery on a human
- ▶ in developing tests for phenylketonuria (PKU), a congenital disease of children
- ▶ as UW-Madison researchers describe the atomic structure of a common cold virus
- ▶ in developing new techniques to measure bone tissue loss, known as osteoporosis
- ▶ with the Biotron, a research building that can control environmental conditions for experimental purposes
- ▶ with bone marrow transplants. Using techniques developed at UW-Madison, the first bone marrow transplant in the U.S. was done at UW Hospital. Today, more than 10,000 transplants are performed yearly, giving new hope to patients with leukemia and immune deficiency diseases



- ▶ in finding evidence linking cancer in laboratory animals with saccharine and cyclamates
- ▶ in finding that the anti-estrogen drug tamoxifen can prevent breast cancer from recurring in certain women who have had cancer previously
- ▶ as UW Hospital and Clinics develop the nation's first Mobile Critical Care Unit, which duplicates facilities of a hospital intensive care unit and laboratories



- ▶ with the first and only medical physics department in the nation to exist within a medical school
- ▶ with the establishment of the Center for Dairy Research, the nation's first such center to be established at a university
- ▶ in organ preservation breakthroughs. In 1987, Dr. Folkert Belzer used a cold storage preservation solution to preserve dog livers up to 36 hours and dog pancreases up to 72 hours. Clinical use of this new solution decreases the need for emergency transplantation, increases the number of livers and pancreases available to people who need transplants, and improves organ sharing among transplant centers
- ▶ with Dr. Howard M. Temin of McArdle Laboratory and his coworker discovering reverse transcriptase (Independently discovered by Dr. David Baltimore). This enzyme explains how retroviruses cause cancer and AIDS. Temin's work in this field led to his selection as a co-recipient of the 1975 Nobel Prize in Medicine.



Chancellor David Ward

David Ward was named the chancellor of the University of Wisconsin-Madison in June, 1993. He replaced Donna E. Shalala, who resigned to become the secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services.

The former vice chancellor for academic affairs and UW-Madison provost, Ward continues in efforts to improve the quality of undergraduate education. He is also coordinating the efforts to enhance the diversity of the UW campus and restoring support for the university's infrastructure.

A native of Manchester, England, Ward received his bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of Leeds. He earned a Fulbright Travel award to the United States in 1960, and received a doctorate from Wisconsin in 1963. Ward served on the faculty at Carleton University in Ottawa and the University of British Columbia before joining the UW-Madison geography faculty in 1966.

Athletics at the UW

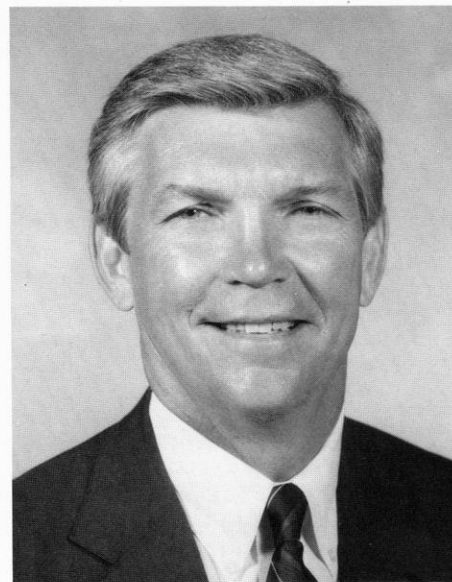
The University of Wisconsin-Madison offers its students one of the most diversified intercollegiate athletic programs in the country.

A member of the prestigious Big Ten Conference, Wisconsin offers its student-athletes the best in education, opportunities, coaching and on-field competition at the NCAA Division I level.

Men's teams compete in football, basketball, ice hockey, track and field, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, rowing, wrestling, cross country, and golf. Women's sports are basketball, track and field, cross country, volleyball, tennis, soccer, swimming and diving, rowing, and golf.

In 1992, Wisconsin had the sixth most successful athletic department in the nation according to a survey conducted by *USA Today*. The women's department was rated eighth nationally and the men's program was 10th in the all-sports ranking.

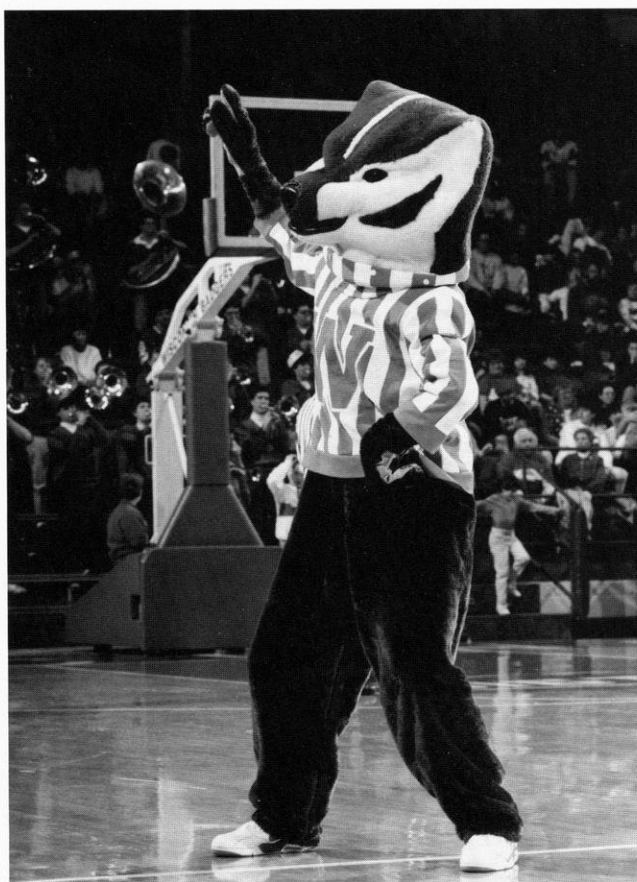
Athletic Director Pat Richter

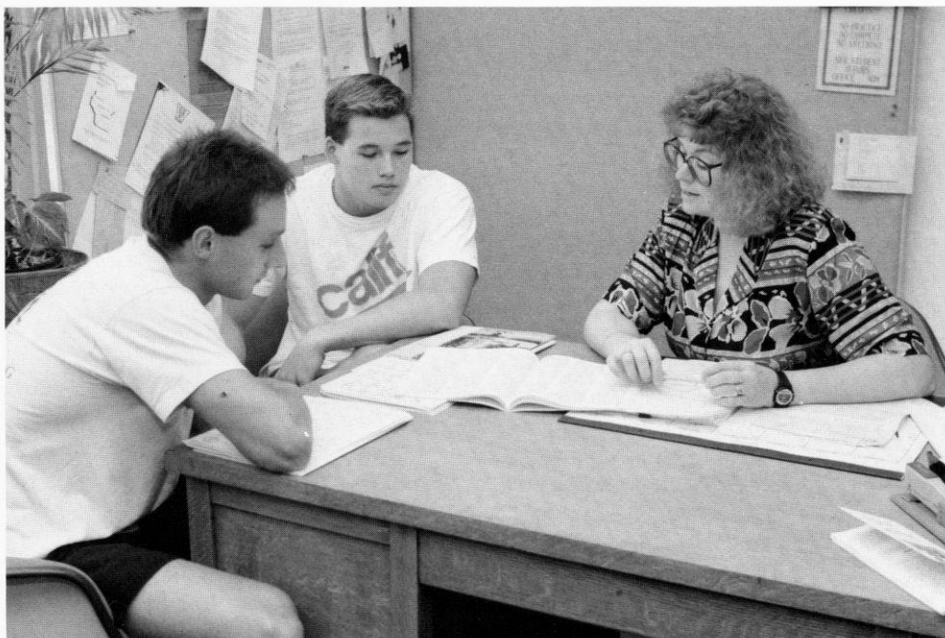


Academic & Student Affairs/Grant-In-Aid

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the student-athletes.

Four full-time staff conduct the Wisconsin Student Affairs program offered to the nearly 800 UW student-athletes. The advising staff has a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all University departments.

For those athletes who request assistance, counseling sessions are offered on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. 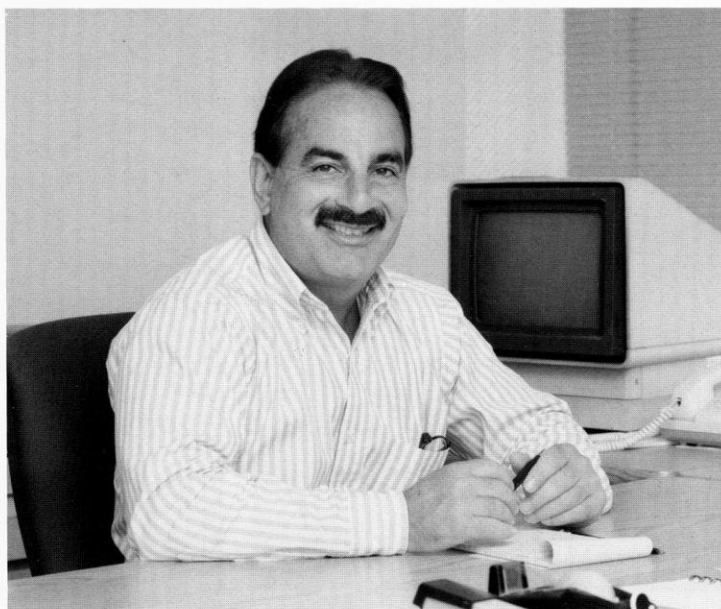
Scholarships

UW-Madison is proud to offer to its prospective student-athletes one of the most comprehensive athletic scholarship programs in the nation. As a Division I member of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), scholarships are awarded to athletes on a one-year basis, renewable yearly if scholastic and athletic commitment are maintained.

Full and partial scholarships are available in all varsity sports with the exception of rowing, which does not grant schol-

arships. Full scholarships include the cost of room and board in addition to tuition and fees. The selection of scholarship recipients is based on athletic ability and projected academic success at the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

Wisconsin Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from outstanding sports facilities. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well-equipped facilities for its athletes.

The Wisconsin Field House, which seats 11,500, is the practice and competitive facility for the Badger basketball and volleyball teams. It is also used as a competitive arena for wrestling. The Field House features four locker rooms, an athletic training area and state-of-the-art scoreboard, sound and lighting systems.

The Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center or Shell, located next to Camp Randall Football Stadium, is a multi-purpose facility used by all students. A 200-meter Mondo rubber track surrounds four basketball or volleyball courts that double as throwing and jumping areas for indoor track meets. With a seating capacity of 2,500, the Shell is the site of numerous track meets including the 1992 Big Ten Men's Track Championship.

One of the most versatile facilities is the McClain Athletic Facility. Over 76,000 square feet of artificial turf offers the ideal indoor practice facility for football, soccer and track. The lower level features the headquarters of the Badgers Sports Medicine facility and a fully-equipped weight room. Locker rooms for football and men's and women's track are also located on the lower level.

The Wisconsin tennis teams have a competitive advantage to play year-round at one of the best college facilities in the United States—the Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The stadium features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, one squash doubles court, and

seats 1,500 spectators. The stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system. Nielsen captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916 to 1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

The newest facility at Wisconsin is the outdoor track and soccer complex located at the west end of campus. The Dan McClimon Memorial Track, named for the former UW coach, features a newly resurfaced 400-meter, Martin rubber outdoor track. The track surrounds the Olympic size, natural grass Bill Reddan Soccer Field. The facility was completed during the summer of 1992 with lighting to be added during the fall of 1993. Building permanent seating with locker rooms and press box area is scheduled to begin in the near future.

The swimming and diving teams have the luxury of two pools for practice and competition—the Natatorium and Southeast Recreational Facility. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with an automatic Colorado Timing

System and digital readout score board. The 50' x 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The SERF facility

features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

Situated between five lakes, Madison is the perfect location for a rowing program. The Badger crews are headquartered in the boat house, situated on Lake Mendota. The boat house provides the Badger crews with an indoor rowing tank during the winter season. During the warm months, crews can often be seen any one of the five lakes.

With the opening of University Ridge in 1991, UW golfers now have the opportunity to compete on the new UW golf course. The par 72, 18-hole course was designed by Robert Trent Jones Jr. The facility also features a 15,000 square foot practice green and 5,000 square foot chipping green.

The Wisconsin strength and conditioning program is a sophisticated blend of science, technology and one-on-one attention to each athlete. Weight training areas in the McClain Center and Camp Randall Stadium feature Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in spacious, carpeted rooms. Several full-time weight training instructors monitor and advise all Wisconsin student-athletes. The UW also offers a sports nutrition program to assist athletes in meeting their nutritional demands and body composition goals.

The care, prevention, and treatment of injuries to Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a staff of N.A.T.A.-certified athletic trainers. Wisconsin's Sports Medicine program features start-of-the-art facilities and

the services of leading sports medicine and health care professionals.

The Sports Medicine program focuses on injury prevention. Staff members utilize Cybex strength-testing devices, provide dietary analysis, measure physiological capacity and outline programs to improve flexibility. Should an injury occur, athletes are seen immediately by team physicians affiliated with the UW Hospitals and Clinics.

In addition to the headquarters in the McClain Athletic Facility, auxiliary training rooms are located in the Stadium, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Field house. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.
