



## The President's Report

WE ARE a family—we who serve and are served by the University of Wisconsin. Alumni. Students. Faculty. President. Regents. Governor. Legislature. Citizens. Once in a while, some one section of this family gets to thinking it is the whole family that *it* is the University. Whenever that happens the sky is stormy and we get that familiar thing in Wisconsin—a erisis.

The Alumni are not the University.

The Students are not the University.

The Professors are not the University.

The President is not the University.

The Regents are not the University.

The Governor is not the University.

The Legislature is not the University.

The Citizens of the State are not the University.

All of these together—not any one or any limited combination of them—make up the family of a state university.

Technically and legally, I suppose the citizens have the last word about a state university, then the legislature, then the Governor, then the Regents, then the President, then the faculty, then the students, and finally the alumni.

But I don't want to talk technically or

legally tonight. I want to talk about what strikes me as essential in the building and preserving of a great university which can best serve the state and its youth and, through them, best serve the nation.

I want to talk about this larger picture in order to define, if I can, what part the alumni *should* play in the life of their Alma Mater.

And I want also to say something about the cir-

Alumni must play active, loyal part in the affairs of the University

#### by Howard I. Potter, '16 Retiring President

cumstances under which alone the alumni can render the largest possible service to their Alma Mater when it is a state university.

I am going to change the figure of speech with which I began, when I said alumni, students, faculty, President, Regents, Governor, legislature, and citizens—in their relation to the University—are a *family*. Let me say, rather, that we are a *community* with the University as the central common interest of this community of forces. Let me apply the figure of the *family* just to the alumni tonight.

YOU know it is sometimes necessary for the members of a family to gather in the home and talk over among themselves some things that may make or break the family's fortune and well-being. I like to think of this alumni meeting tonight as that sort of family council. And, as one who has for the past two years been officially a spokesman for this family, I'll

take the responsibility for starting the family discussion.

This University is very near and very dear to all of us. It took us when we were young and gawky and inexperienced and some of us with no material resources. It disciplined our powers. It opened up new worlds of ideas and opportunity. It helped us meet life and, in varying degrees, to conquer it. We owe it to this University to give it the best we have. And this University needs us-now. It needs our material support, as we are able to give it. Yes, but beyond that it needs the service of the best and most disinterested judgment we can bring to bear on the broad problems of its future.

If, as the corporate body of Wisconsin's graduates, the time ever comes that our counsel is not sought nor considered valuable in the charting and safeguarding of the University's future, then one of two things has happened—either the University failed us in the training it gave us when we were here or we have failed the University in what we have let happen to our brains and attitudes since we left its care.

Robert E. Doherty, President of Carnegie Tech, said: "No College or University Ever Became Truly Great Without the Aid of Its Alumni."

What is it, that we, as alumni, can do to discharge our full duty to this University and best serve its future?

No single answer can be made to that question. The answers can be as varied as the character and mind and position and resources of the 95,000 former students themselves. But there are a few simple and, to me, elementary things that can be said in answer to this ques-

tion—things that apply to all alumni and to all the other forces that have to do with the governing and administering of this University.

The first and biggest obligation of every alumnus of this University is to act the part of an educated man in his own community, his own business, his own profession, his own trade. Nothing we can do, by way of giving or raising money or coming to the aid of this or that university situation or emergency, can make up for a failure on our part to be good trustees of the University's *ideals*.

**B**UT that goes without saying. That's general. Let me be specific. There are a few things that are imperative in a state university—a few things a state university must cling to if its future is to be secure.

Well do I realize that it is not pleasant at a family gathering to throw the search light into dark corners in quest of lurking specters, but I might be remiss if I did not give you a frank expression of my observations in a final accounting of my stewardship.

A state university must be kept free from political and pressure exploitation. If a state university becomes the open or disguised tool of any particular creed or race or political party, its day as a great university is over. This University—to be specific—is supported by the taxes of Democrats and Republicans and Progressives and Socialists and a lot of unhaltered Badgers, by the taxes of Catholics and Protestants, by the taxes of Jews and

Gentiles. For that reason, if for no deeper reason, it cannot long survive if it is bent to the will and purpose of any political party or any special interest — whether that special interest is economic or racial or religious.

Any alumnus, any alumni organization, any board of regents, any governor, any legislature that bends this University to any special interest—personal or political or economic or racial or religious — strikes a devastating blow at the University.

This has happened in the life of other state universities. We have seen governing bodies of state universi-

ties—in more than one instance—become political tools. We have seen them take orders from political leadership rather than attempt themselves to give educational leadership. We have seen governing bodies so controlled hound out of their universities servants who had brought distinction and honor to the institution because the servants in question did not fit into their political picture.

**B**ECAUSE of all this, there are some who think the future of state universities is dark, that today—when politics more and more invade every phase of life and when we are so much at the mercy of self-interested groups—it is impossible to keep a state university free from partisan and class control a rather hopeless outlook! Has faith been broken somewhere along the line with the pioneer founders? Have we failed in our trust?

I don't believe it. I believe a state university, this state university, our Alma Mater, has been in the past and can be today the

freest and most productive influence in the state's life if everybody concerned - alumni, faculty, administration, regents, governor, legislature, and citizens generally-play ball in harmony and complete lovalty to the ideal of a free university, free to train youth to honest thinking, free to prosecute the search for truth, hewing to the line and letting the chips fall where they may, and free to put the truth it finds at the disposal of the state.

But the freedom of state universities cannot be insured by good wishes and afterdinner speeches. We must deliberately organize our universities and the powers that govern them against domination by pressure groups. It will be a great day for our state universities — our own included — when the boards of regents or trustees or curators that govern them are so constituted by law that no political leader, whether radical or liberal or conservative, can be tempted or induced to pack them with henchmen and become, in effect, even if for but a brief time, the dictator of their policies and their personnel.

**O**NE of the obligations that rests upon us is to be sure that we conduct the affairs and activities of our own alumni organization in keeping with the spirit of a free and nonpolitical university. Let's have no distinction drawn among ourselves on grounds of our dif-

fering political or economic beliefs. And let's not allow anyone else to draw any such distinctions regarding our leadership and our activities from year to year. The password to membership or to leadership in the Wisconsin Alumni Association must be devotion and zeal for service to the University of Wisconsin and its ideals, and nothing else. Let's not play to the gallery of any group. Let's keep alumni leadership open to any

worthy and loyal alumnus whether he is in the ranks of labor or big business, whether we agree with his politics or not. Let's resist every attempt to color this institution with class distinctions.

It is only in this spirit that the difficult problems that lie ahead for state universities can be solved. In this spirit, we shall find solution for these problems.

May I in conclusion at this family gathering throw out one more suggestion. As administrative head of this University, the President, in his endeavor to keep our University in the lead as an education institution, must make recommendations, from time to time, which involve changes, which may call for material and moral support. Let us *always* keep in mind that these recommendations have been carefully studied and weighed in the light of betterment of this institution. Thus, further, let us, the alumni, *always*, as these rec-*(Concluded on page 303)*

## ... It's Fun to Do What You

And that's just what these three adventurous alumnae have discovered when they made their own jobs

JEAN LACKEY, the Vagabond Co-ed, is home at last. You know who she is,—the girl who was traveling around the world, earning her way as she

went. Our newspapers have been showing rotogravure pictures of her for two and a half years; and so have more than 300 of them from London to Calcutta and from Cuba to Japan—in dozens of languages.

Jean's story is so amazing that her adventures rank easily with those of Marco Polo and Jules Verne, and though many of them are almost as fantastic and unbelievable, she has proof for every one of them. It would take a book to tell them all and she is now writing that book, "Bum Voyage." For the present, it is the young woman herself, and her ingenious system of making her way that interests us especially.

TAKE her experience in Cuba, for instance. Landing in Havana in November of 1936 with scarcely a cent to her name, she registered at once at one of the best hotels, following as usual, her belief that if you are aiming for a big job and want to impress big men, you can't live in an unimpressive manner. A bit panicky as she thought about the day of reckoning when her bill would be presented to her, she realized that her \$15-a-day room was not completely satisfactory. She thought of a number of things that she, as a visitor in Havana, did not like and she began to jot down suggestions for ways in which Cuba could improve its tourist service. Before the day was over she was hired by the head of the government bureau, and at the end of three

weeks — with her room paid for—she had enough money to take her back to the United States, across the continent to Vancouver, and on to Honolulu.

Jean Lackey was not totally unprepared, however, to meet just such panicky situations. When she graduated from the Delavan, Wisconsin, high school at the age of 15—well up toward the top of her class, and winner of second place in the state high school typewriting trials—she mapped out her entire life, and unemployment did not enter into it.

Feeling that she should have one life goal and drive steadily toward it, she wrote down a list of the things that interested her, hoping ultimately to find a single objective. She wanted to be a musician, an actress on both stage and screen, a radio star, a writer, designer, artist. She wanted to be a manufacturer, an economist, a politician, and a philanthropist. And because she did not care to give up any of these ambitions, she planned to take them all in her stride and fulfill them one by one as the years went along. From the age of 80 on, she had no definite schedule.

SHE was to devote the years from 20 to 25 to a trip around the world, using only money that she herself had earned; from 15 to 20 she was to provide the proper working background to fit her for this trip. Before she was 16 she had written and produced a church operetta, designed the costumes and made the scenery. She had found that she could hold a job as a book-keeper, a waitress, and a teacher. At the University of Wisconsin she continued her activities in dramatics and, further, went into radio work, not only performing in the skits, but writing them.

And here is a story about Jean that must be told. In her room at Madison she often sat

before her goldfish bowl observing the private lives of her pets. A bubble-blower one of them was, a waster of time, she thought. Then one day she was fired with an idea. She, too, would become a blower of bubbles; fish technique was what she needed. And though it took her weeks to learn the trick, the day finally came when she was able not only to

waft a tiny bubble out into the air, but by smoking a cigarette while shaping it, she could float it across the room to burst as a minature smoke bomb. It seems silly, doesn't it, but she really had something. The first time she tried out her trick, professionally, a booker for a Texas carnival hired her; and after a week or two with the company, she retired from sideshow life, satisfied that she could put over her bomb act in a successful manner.

T WAS not until she was half over her earnas-you-go trip around the world, however, that she again fell back on her trick as a means of support. Arriving at Sydney, Australia, where she was met at the dock by reporters, the Vagabond Co-ed was a celebrity almost over night. But one does not make money just being a celebrity. So Jean wrote an advertising movie scenario for a large tobacco company, working into the plot the smoke bomb and the company's special brand of eigarette, was hired to direct the picture and to appear in it. Speedily produced, it made a big hit, and Jean was paying her expenses.

Before this work was over, she had a job with Australian Airways, criticising service and suggesting means for improvement, han-



dling advertising and promotion. She made so much money during her four months in Australia that she had to pay an income tax before leaving for Java and Singapore.

At Singapore she paid her way by putting on advertising stunts. Her expenses to Borneo and adjacent islands were paid for by a Holland steamship line who hired her to better their service. At Calcutta, where she landed without funds, she registered as usual at the most expensive hotel, and after making straight for the six biggest companies in the city, talking with the six biggest officials, and after being offered six jobs, she chose one with a tobacco company. Hired at an amazingly large salary, she was sent on a tour of India, all expenses paid—and provided with a guide and an interpreter. For five months she talked in nearly every movie house in the land and gave away samples of cigarettes.

A ND how did she get this profitable work in India? She showed the tobacco officials her University of Wisconsin goldfish smoke bomb trick.

She told them she could get attention on any stage and that she could promote the sales of their eigarettes anywhere. Thus did Wisconsin's Vagabond Co-ed make her way through Egypt, England, and all of Europe.

And what are Jean Lackey's plans for the next ten years? Five years at law, five years at medicine—all the time studying economics. By the time she is 35 she hopes to be ready for politics, prepared to do something toward bettering labor conditions. By the time she is 40? Well, she is worth watching!

**T**RUE to the tradition of the theater, Agnes Samuels, class of 1921, changed her name the first time it appeared on a theatre program. This momentous occasion was a small part in the New York production of *The Devil's Disciple* at the famous Garrick Theatre, the old home of the Theatre Guild, two years after her graduation from Wisconsin. Since then she has been known only as Kathryn Mulholland.

A founder and charter member at Wisconsin of both the National Collegiate Players and Orchesis, the national dancing sorority, and an active member of Red Domino, dramatic society, all through college, she embarked upon a career in dramatics immediately upon graduation. She taught speech for two years in the High School at Hibbing, Minnesota, and then set out for New York where she enrolled in the American Academy of Dramatic Art and studied with the famous Mr. Sargent the last days of his life. The fall of 1923 she went on tour with the first Theatre Guild Repertory Company, and after this, she had a season on tour in the comedy, "Meet the Wife," then musical comedy, vaudeville, stock, a Shakesperian Repertory Company, and the New York production of John Gay's opera, "Polly."

**F**INDING the economic struggle to survive in the theatre too overwhelming. Miss Mulholland departed for California where she taught dramatics in Dominican College. Two years later she was back in New York, not, however, as a member of Eva Le Gallienne's repertory company, as she had anticipated, but as a teacher of dramatics at Hunter College.

In 1930 she gained an M. A. from Columbia. She studied at the University of Vienna the summer of 1931, made a study of the theatre abroad in succeeding summers, and gained a Ph. D. from New York University in 1934. She is now Assistant Professor of Speech and Dramatics at Brooklyn College where she has been since 1930 when Brooklyn College technically separated from Hunter. At the head of the department is Professor James M. O'Neill, who held the same position at Wisconsin when Miss Mulholland was a student here. She has been a lecturer in the graduate school since 1935.

**M** ISS Mulholland feels that her activities in college were a very real preparation for her later work. Two tremendous things happened to her as a freshman. The first was to be placed in the Advanced English class of Professor William Ellery Leonard, whom she considers the greatest teacher she ever had; the second was to be elected to Red Domino. Her intensive work in dramatics and dancing under Professor Gertrude E. Johnson and Professor Margaret H'Doubler she considers her greatest joy throughout her four years.

She went on tour to other universities and colleges with Miss H'Doubler's group of dancers, won dancing honors, and was official Head of Dancing under W.A.A. By winning the W.A.A. and the Red Domino scholarships and several others, she was able to gain her B. A. degree.

At present, she contemplates a sabbatical leave beginning the end of January, 1940, and expects to study in Italy and France and later at the London School of Speech. There she will specialize in the study of acting and interpretation under the famous teacher of acting—Elsie Fogarty.

A IMEE ZILLMER, class of 1911, is known in high schools throughout the state of Wisconsin as "the lady who talks to girls." As lecturer on social hygiene for the Wisconsin State board of health, as a teacher of teenage girls and as a confidant of their parents, she has made a name for herself not only locally but nationally. According to the Milwaukee Journal "she has done more to bring an awareness of high standards in health to young people than any other woman in the state,-perhaps in the country." At the last meeting of the National P. T. A., her work was recognized as of outstanding significance by Dr. Snow, Chairman of the Health Committee of the League of Nations and President of the American Social Hygiene Association.

A year ago when the educational department of the Memorial Union at Madison experimented with a course for women on "Friendship and Marriage", Miss Zillmer's series of lectures, the first to be sponsored, was so tremendously popular that it gave impetus to the continuance of such a series at the University for this year and the future, and to the development of a four-talk course in many cities of Wisconsin under the auspices of Y. W. C. A's. This work is to be Aimee Zillmer's greatest hobby from now on—to the great good luck of the young women of Wisconsin.

TO ASK anyone of her colleagues for an opinion of her influence upon the women students who heard her series last year is to be deluged with responses of rare enthusiasm. To begin with, Miss Zillmer is a vibrant personality, "quick on the trigger, smart and intelligent, sincere and always earnest in her work." She has a marvelous capacity for having a jolly time with a group of girls, and they become so absorbed in her interest in them that they forget the difference in age, and she becomes a good friend in no time. As we were told by one person, "she just has something which is contagious to youth."

It takes courage to study the problems of young people and then talk to them as

frankly, fluently, and directly as she can on subjects that to many people are difficult. After her lectures of last year, it was felt by the Union that the students had received something from her that would prove invaluable to them in making their decisions both in college and in married life. They had at last found someone who didn't hedge about anything, and who cleared up problems for them which had been bothering them for years.

And Aimee Zillmer doesn't feel that her own education is over. After graduation from Wisconsin, she took her master's degree at Simmons at Boston, and since then has been working toward her Ph. D.

In private life, she is Mrs. E. L. Wilde, recently widowed, of Watertown, Wisconsin. Her home, looking much like a small country club, stands on a generous acre of land on the banks of the Rock river and—typically characteristic of Aimee Zillmer—is equipped for picnics with fire place and table, and a pier to swim from. The house was built by Fred Keck, builder of the House of Tomorrow at the Century of Progress, and has been written up in several architectural magazines. "It is interesting to me," we have heard her say, "though perhaps nobody else would want it."

THE out-of-doors in general is her hobby and Sunday is her day to putter around her garden. Pienics, she says, are a disease with her. She loves to swim, ride horseback, and climb mountains. On the last of her three trips to Europe, she climbed Yungfrau Mountain with the same guide the King of Belgium had on his fatal trip. She admits that she has a secret passion for writing worthless poetry but we noticed in the last bulletin of the National League of American Pen Women that she is one of the newest members to be admitted, going in as "lecturer and writer of articles."

She feels that the greatest honor accorded her is the faith that Wisconsin parents have in her when they let her talk to their daughters, and the faith of these same daughters who come back to her later as young parents, asking her for help with their children.

LOUIS LOCHNER, '09 "Fill take democracy"

**D**UIS P. LOCHNER, '09, who has become one of America's foremost foreign correspondents, subjected Hitler's Nazi Germany to a searching scrutiny and concluded, "T'll take democracy," in a dinner speech which wound up the activities of the Fourth Annual Alumni Institute on June 16. About 400 persons, an overflow crowd, attended the event. Lochner, chief of the Berlin bureau of the Associated Press, returned to Madison after 18 years in Germany.

The speaker, a member of the reuning class of 1909, discussed the rise of Germany under Hitler, the *fuehrer's* methods and accomplishments, and the costs of Naziism to the German people. He was very well received, for included in the audience were many of his former classmates and professors as well as local persons who had known him as the youthful editor of the Wisconsin Alumni magazine in the five years after his graduation and as a participant in German-American affairs in Madison until he left for Berlin.

**L** OCHNER was the only speaker of the dinner program. He was introduced by Myron Harshaw, '12, of Chicago, past president of the Wisconsin Alumni Association. Lochner was accompanied by his wife and son, Robert W., the latter a recent graduate of the University of Chicago.

"I have to be somewhat guarded in my statements because I have a round trip ticket in my pocket," Lochner said in his opening remarks, but he thereafter frankly discussed Hitler and the Nazi state, emphasizing the accomplishments no more than the costs in personal and economic freedom which the nation has paid for the Hitler regime.

## The 4th Annual Alumni Institute

Hitler got his chance, Lochner said, because stupid foreign diplomats thwarted the Weimar republic in post-war Germany.

"The Weimar republic never had a chance because of the great stupidity of foreign diplomats, which explains why an unknown soldier of the World war could rise to the position now occupied by Adolf Hitler," Lochner said.

Tracing Hitler's rise, the newspaperman gave the Nazi dictator credit for an astute diagnosis of the German people and creation of a government that would be completely appealing to them.

"Hitler believes in his divine selection by Providence to lead Germany to a position where it can dominate Europe for the next 500 years," Lochner said in his discussion of this diagnosis. "He knows the German mentality will respond to such appeals as a claim that the Allied powers sought to ruin Germany and that every man must efface himself for the good of the nation.

**COLOR** ITLER realized the concrete aid of sym-

bols, so he introduced numerous flags, symbols and standards and even has built himself into one. I have heard that he believes no religion lasts longer than 2,000 years and feels Christianity is on the wane, so he is answering the German interest in philosophy by stressing the state philosophy that is a new religion. He needed someone to fight against so he picked out the Jews and the Communists, and by a stroke of genius he combined two terms not generally united to get 'National Socialism,' a belief that can stress either nationalism or socialism, depending on the attitude of any individual.

"The German has three great loves that Hitler played on—uniforms, decorations and titles. Hitler made, all these plentiful and the move was extremely successful."

Lochner then listed eight major achievements of the Hitler government and 11 "costs' which he said were not offered in criticism but rather as factual reporting of conditions as they exist.

In his recitation of Hitler's achievements, Lochner said:

"There have never been so many jobs in

Germany. I don't say the jobs are productive or the wages good, but unemployment is at the lowest it has ever been. National unity has completely erased state lines and made Germany a single state. 'Ersatz' or research for substitutes is being pushed to make Germany independent of all imports. Super-highways have been constructed throughout the nation.

"The 'Strength through Joy' movement provides Germans with inexpensive, regimented vacations that they like. An effort is made to give dignity to labor. Hitler, by a series of bold strokes, has torn the Versailles treaty to shreds and gained the respect of doubting conservatives in Germany.

"A ND perhaps most important of all, Hitler can claim a unique position in history for achieving his goals by bloodless conquests. The people now believe he can get anything without war and welcome this."

Lochner then noted 11 costs of Naziism:

"Germany has the largest military establishment per capita in the world. This costs money and as a result there is a huge financial burden. There is no such thing as personal liberty in Germany now. Economic liberty is greatly controlled.

"No man is certain at any time that he will be a free man at the end of the day. A friend may denounce him and off he goes to a concentration camp that is beyond the law. The party is considered above the state, so the state

is undermined and political opportunism prevails. Justice as we know it does not exist, for each case is decided on the basis of expediency to the Nazi party.

"There is no public control of funds and no hesitancy to mortgage the future, for Germany believes future generations will reap huge benefits from present work and so should pay for the benefits. The Nazi state, anxious to have manpower, is not squeamish about the legitimacy of children. Constant government interruption of education has retarded the scientific training of students. Foreign travel has been reduced to keep money in the country, so Germans are becoming more and more narrow in their outlook as they lose contact with other nations.

"In the authoritarian states, food pleasures are materially reduced. There are plenty of potatoes and spinach, but even the sauerkraut supply has been exhausted. Fruits are not being imported and coffee is strictly rationed. Butter, cream and good flour are scarce, so the art of home baking is disappearing."

Lochner's conclusion of his discussion showed his preference for his homeland.

"Democracy may be expensive, but of all the things I've seen in Europe, Ill still take it," he said. "And of all the countries I have seen, the United States is still the most beautiful."

A<sup>N</sup> AMERICAN capitalist would squirm under the tax rate even the lowest laborer has to pay in Italy, according to Robert L. Reynolds, University history professor, who spoke at the morning Alumni Institute meeting.

Talking in a "be glad you live in America" attitude and on the subject, "An American Looks at the Fascist State," Reynolds commented on his three months' stay in Genoa, Italy, where last year he conducted historical research.

Also speaking on this morning's program was Prof. Helen White, of the University

English department, on the subject, "The Writing of an Historical Novel." Current misconceptions concerning fiction writers center around their great financial success or idealistic poverty, Miss White declared.

Changes in Italian life have been distinct in the past 15 years, Reynolds averred. They include an increase in public buildings construction, in the philosophy of Fascist supporters, and a perceptible change in the personal discipline.

"Instead of the small group of fanatics who once were the heart of Fascism in Italy, the organization now is composed of everyone, from professional men to common laborers," Reynolds said.

"No leading figure in Italy can possibly be working against the regime, simply because he's worked for it so hard all day he's going to have to sleep at night. A university professor I know had to put more time on party affairs, committee meetings, and the like than he could on his academic work.

"It isn't a case of a man having to join the Rotary club, but once he does, he's a member of an organization—and all organizations are working for the party.

It's that way all over the country, in all classes, and with all clubs and groups of any kind."

Direct taxes take 50 to 55 per cent of the average man's income, Reynolds asserted. It is from them, and from the "gifts" to party enterprises, that the noticeable changes in Italian life have come.

"Why, once ships in the Italian navy used to have washing hanging from the captain's deck, and soot all over everything," Reynolds laughed. "It's not that way any more—Italians have a navy of which they are justifiably proud."

Whatever the Italian thinks of the Fascist government or its administration, he is definitely under the spell of Mussolini, the speaker declared. "It's not just cheering and shouting when Il Duce passes in a parade—it's insane enthusiasm," he said.

"Italians don't like Germany, and they don't like Hitler," Reynolds claimed. "What they would like is a war to last about a week or 10 days, resulting in the Italian occupation of Paris, London, and related countries—and that without any Nazi help."

**E** XPANSION of the educational system to thoroughly inform the adult population is the next necessary step in American democracy, declared Dean Frank O. Holt in discussing with registrar Curtis Merriman, "How Much Education Does Democracy Need?"

"In Communism, Naziism and Fascism,

final truth is in the dictator," said Holt. "In a democracy, we take the stand that we never reach final truth, but that we approach it through research.

"In America we have pursued an educational system which teaches the young the fundamentals. But we need a new conception of education. We need an adequately informed public to cope with the issues of the 50 years ahead. That means that we must extend education to the adult level.

"I want my boy and girl in college to be permitted to discuss all isms under thoroughly trained instructors who have no axes to

grind and no formula to indoctrinate. Similarly, I want information to go out to adults throughout the state under the trained direction of instructors in the extension division.

"More than 50,000 high school graduates of the last five years in Wisconsin are not only unemployed but unoccupied. The University must be taken to them.

"The gravest danger from isms in this country today is that of pessimism and defeatism. We must overcome that first if we are to successfully meet our problems."

**P**ROF. PHILO M. BUCK, who has spent much time in India, told his alumni listeners about "The New India."

"India is working out its own form of democracy, somewhat slowly, but non-the-less surely," said Prof. Buck. "It will be different from our democracy, but it will be democracy. All we can do is to give encouragement.

"China is probably going to be lost as a democracy if it succumbs to the aggressiveness of Japan. We cannot afford to lose eastern Asia. Too much of Asia is already under absolute monarchs. If India is encouraged to grow in democracy under British leadership, it will be our hostage in Asia and stand between us and the dangers of personal rule.

"The party in India which was violently anti-British five years ago is now in control and working harmoniously with the British, working out the democratic destiny of the new India."

## Regents Pass \$9,319,763 Budget

(The following is the official University news release covering the passage of the current University budget by the Board of Regents. The release was prepared by the University's publicity office.—Ed.)

THE board of regents last month gave final approval to the University's budget, totaling \$9,319,763, for the 1939-40 fiscal year. Presented to the regents by Pres. C. A. Dykstra, the budget provides for an increase in student fees of \$5 per semester, of which \$3.50 is to go into the University's operating funds, and \$1.50 is to go into a fund for additional library facilities, one of the greatest needs of the University at the present time.

The fee increase was necessary to balance the budget, President Dykstra explained. The only other alternative was further slashing of faculty salaries, which it was felt by both the president and the regents should be avoided at all costs.

The total budget of \$9,319,763 provides not only for on-campus work of instruction and departmental /research and organized activities relating to instruction, but also for the University's off-campus work of research, extension, and public service to the people of the state, and for the University's auxiliary enterprises and activities, such as dormitories and commons, the Wisconsin Union, and intercollegiate athletics. Of the total budget, the funds for research, extension work, and public services and the auxiliary enterprises and activities total almost \$3,000,000 or close to one-third of the total budget.

ONLY 39 per cent of the total budget for 1939-40 comes from state appropriations, President Dykstra revealed, while 61 per cent comes from direct receipts earned by the University itself, or from federal grants and other gifts.

Comparative figures presented by President Dykstra revealed that the total budget figure for 1939-40 is increased \$193,684 over the total University budget of \$9,126,079 for the last fiscal year which ended last July 1. All of this net increase, however, is in receipts earned by the University under its auxiliary enterprises and activities, especially dormitories and commons and intercollegiate athletics. In the 1939-40 budget, the total for education and general University expenses shows a decrease of \$59,299 from the 1938-39 level, the figures revealed.

Under the 1939-40 budget, the cost to the state of running the University for the next 12 months is \$456,095 less than last year, President Dykstra said. This decrease in the University's cost to the state is the result of the slash of about \$1,000,000 in the state appropriation to the University for the 1939-40 biennium.

Under this large slash in state appropriations, the University's operating fund for 1939-40 suffered a decrease of \$323,619. It is from this fund that staff salaries and other operating costs are paid. To make up this large cut in the 1-A operating fund of the University, the 1939-40 budget provides for cuts in operating costs totaling \$123,000; use of a supplemental allotment by the state emergency board totaling \$100,-000; and use of \$3.50 of the \$5 increase in student fees to make a total of \$100,000.

THE 1939-40 budget also makes use of a fund of \$95,000, given to the University by the legislature in the state appropriation, to provide for increases in staff, promotions, and adjustments on old salary cuts which have been in effect since the depression days of 1932. The salary restorations thus made still to not restore all salary waivers imposed on staff members six years ago. President Dykstra estimated that another \$100,-000 would be necessary before full restorations could be made.

In presenting the budget, President Dykstra read a four page statement to the regents concerning it. In the statement President Dykstra said:

"Cutting the budget of a going and growing educational institution is a difficult undertaking. Cuts in expenditures are not always economies in the business sense and may lower the level of service and accomplishment in a University. Having no alternative this year and with deficits facing the University of Wisconsin, certain normal expenses have been eliminated and certain services curtailed. It is hoped that what has been done to meet our financial situation will be well received by the people of Wisconsin and their official representatives.

"Most members of this board and the president along with them naturally hesitate to increase fees even slightly. There is a deep-rooted feeling against this procedure. We owe it to the state and the students as well, however, to keep up the quality of University work and of our faculty by every possible means. This budget proposes roughly to absorb the cut by a three-fold arrangement—to cut operating costs, and have the state and the students pick up the balance. This three-way split seems to be the only way to maintain the University at somewhere near its current level of excellence."

The board of regents approved Pres. Dykstra's statement concerning the budget, and also gave approval to a resolution explaining the regents' stand on the budget, presented by Regent Robert V. Baker, Jr., Kenosha. In this resolution, the regents expressed the hope that the increase in student fees would only be temporary, and then declared:

"We feel that some of the reductions in expenditures in this budget are undesirable and do not represent any real economy. However, the policy has been adopted of reducing the expenditure where it will do the least harm. It is our desire that the University should be made as useful as possible to the people of this state and that its high reputation as an institution of higher learning and of research should be maintained. We are fully convinced that to continue to do so, and supply the services which the people of this state desire, increasing financial support to the University will be essential."

## State Senator Suggests "Adjusted" Tuition Fees

**A**N ANALYSIS of the University of Wisconsin and its present day finances, as well as some thought as to the future support of the University was issued in June in pamphlet form by State Senator Harry W. Bolens, Port Washington Democrat.

Senator Bolens devoted the major part of the survey to a presentation of facts about the University today, the number of students from Wisconsin as compared with those from out-of-state, tuition charged students compared with the tuition at other state institutions of higher learning, the number of taxpayers who are contributing to the support of the University and how much. The latter part is a list of suggestions for future policy.

Of the greatest importance to the future

of the University, declares Senator Bolens, is the fact that the University now more than ever before is competing with "three insistent, powerful, pressure groups with great, popular, urgent demands for appropriations" from the state. These three groups are those seeking direct relief by cash or projects, social security, and old age pensions. He sees the taxpayer also faced with the burdens of elementary education and all the other state functions which demand more and more money, and from a practical political standpoint he asks whether the University can continue to demand such large support from the taxpayer.

The average annual cost to the taxpayer of each of these Wisconsin students at the University is \$337.28, Mr. Bolens figures. (A figure contested by A. W. Peterson, University comptroller. See below.—Ed.)

Most startling suggestion in Bolens' pamphlet is that of "deferred tuition," a proposal that in the future students at the University pay, in addition to cash tuition, a sum equal to \$250 for each year they spend at the University. Payment would be made by promissory note of \$250 executed at the beginning of each school year, drawing interest at 1 per cent per year from the time the student graduates until maturity, and six per cent thereafter. Payment on the first year note would be due on or before nine years from the date of execution. Other maturity periods would graduate from 10 and one-half years on the second year note to 13 years on the fourth year note.

Senator Bolens would also apply this proposal to alumni already graduated from the University, called "adjusted compensation." An organized approach would be made to the 25,000 graduates of the University to contribute \$250 for each year they spent on the campus.

The senator figures thus a maximum return of 25 million dollars and sets the minimum return at five millions. The payment could be made in cash or on notes bearing one per cent interest for a period of ten years.

Second most important suggestion is for the appointing of a new Governing Board of the University consisting of the chief justice of the state supreme court, a U. S. district judge, alternating between the western and eastern U. S. districts of Wisconsin for six year terms, a resident Wisconsin alumna

from among its graduate women, a resident Wisconsin alumnus from among its graduate men, a circuit judge from Wisconsin for a six year term, the state superintendent of schools, and three members appointed by the governor.

Senator Bolens also suggests a nominal increase in tuition at the University to bring it in line with other such institutions. He suggests raising the resident student fee to \$90. This would increase the University income annually by \$338,975, he claims. He sets the non-resident

fee at \$200. His statistics show that at the present time Wisconsin's tuition is the lowest of any such institution in the country with the exception of two or three very small state supported colleges. And the tendency elsewhere is to increase tuitions, he says.

## University Officer Refutes Senator's Figures on Costs

VALUE of any figure purporting to show the average cost per pupil of the University was questioned by A. W. Peterson, University comptroller, in a letter to Sen. Bolens shortly after the release of his pamphlet.

Peterson replied at length to Bolens' estimated cost of \$337 per pupil to taxpayers of the state.

"Would such a figure measure the efficiency or value of the University to the people of the state?" Peterson asked. "Would you say, for instance, that the value of the legislature to the people of Wisconsin would be measured by the average cost per bill passed in any given session?

"The legislature gives much time to considerations that are not finally enacted into laws, and in addition to teaching more than 11,000 students in residence, the University serves the state by such functions as:

1. University extension courses to some 26,000 persons.

- 2. Hospital service to more than 600 patients a day.
- 3. More than 90,000 tests annually in the state laboratory of hygiene.
- 4. More than 100,000 tests annually in the psychiatric institute.
- 5. More than 100,000 individual farmers participating in one or more of the agg r i c u l t u r a l improvement programs or meetings sponsored by the agricultural extension service last year."

"Obviously it is impossible to set up a simple bookkeeping system for such a complicated service structure. Sufficient study of the factual data presented by the University to the governor and the finance committee should have convinced the most skeptical mind that the University makes a complete and honest accounting of the funds entrusted to it."



This is the third year the Association has presented these awards to members of the 50th anniversary class.

Checks for \$100 were presented to Miss Sue Poston and Robert Des Jarlais as winners of the Association's outstanding Junior student awards. Ralph Moeller was presented with a check for \$100 as winner of the Walter Alex-

ander award, given annually to some outstanding Junior student who has high scholarship, leadership abilities, and has taken part in at least one intercollegiate sport. Mr. Alexander, '97, has underwritten the award for five years. Because the award was not available in time to be given at the annual Parents' Weekend celebration in May, Walter Bietila was given the annual Western Conference medal at the dinner. Bietila was a member of the baseball team for two seasons and was one of the outstanding collegiate and amateur skiers in the country. This award is given for outstanding scholarship and athletic ability.

Howard Greene, incoming president of the Association, was introduced and spoke briefly about the problems of the year ahead. He urged all alumni to become more active in the affairs of their University and Association as one of the means to bring about greater progress. George I. Haight gave a stirring plea for membership in the Association, emphasizing the small number of alumni who now belong to the Association and stressing the need for greater membership if the Association is to accomplish the things it is capable of doing.

Howard Potter, retiring president, presented his annual report which is printed in full on page 304 of this issue. His clear-cut definition of present problems and his appeal to the alumni for continued and increased support was well received by the 600 alumni who crowded the hall.

A ND last, but by no means least, President C. A. Dykstra gave one of his interesting and to-the-point talks. Left but little time due to the many other speeches, President Dykstra spoke only briefly. He renewed his plea to alumni to "all sail in the same boat" and to work toward only one goal, a better university. He stated that contrary to rumors, published and otherwise, he intended to stay at the University for sometime to come. He has but started his job, he said, and his "hand is to the plow and there is much work to be done."

And thus, with the final singing of "Varsity", did one of the most successful of all alumni days come to a happy close.

## **Pulitzer Prize Winners**

**T**WO university graduates, Marjorie Kinnan Rawlings, '18, and Louis P. Lochner, '09, were awarded Pulitzer prizes for distinguished work in their respective fields.

Mrs. Rawlings was awarded a \$1000 prize for the most distinguished novel of 1938. The award was given for her best seller, "The Yearling". Her book, "South Moon Under", was her first full length novel and attracted considerable attention. "The Yearling" has been a best seller from the time it hit the news stands and continues in high favor today.

Louis Lochner, former secretary of the Alumni Association and editor of the ALUM-NUS, was awarded \$1000 for distinguished service as a foreign correspondent during 1938. Mr. Lochner is chief of the Associated Press Bureau at Berlin, Germany, an office in which he has played an important role for more than a decade. His scoops have been numerous and his treatment of difficult foreign news, impeccable.

## **Alumni Association Members**

R EFLECTING the steady upward growth of the Association for the past three years, this Directory brings you the largest roster of members since the early days of the depression. Association membership reached its low point in the early part of 1936 with only 2,481 members. Since that time membership in the Association has climbed steadily upward with today's membership totaling 6,131.

Most of this increase is in the intermediate membership field which is open to alumni for the first five years after graduation. The last three classes ('37, '38 and '39) have more members in the Association than any other three classes. Nearly one out of every eight members now in the Association comes from these three classes. True, these classes are larger than earlier classes. On the other hand, this splendid support from the younger classes is extremely gratifying and important. Membership from these classes is bringing "young blood" into the Association-an essential factor, in every growing organization. Equally important, these younger alumni will eventually become the "backbone" of the Association. As a matter of fact, they are already playing a very important part in the Association's activities because Caryl Morse, '36, Richard Brazeau, '37, and George Rooney, '38, are all members of the Board of Directors. The candidate from the class of '39, unfortunately, lost out in this year's election.

**M**UCH of the credit for the Association's consistent growth belongs to three loyal alumni who have served as chairmen of the membership committee during the last three years: William Kies, Harry Bullis and Albert Goedjen. All three recognized the fact that the Association must regain the ground lost during the depression in order to serve the University effectively and to make membership in the Association increasingly valuable to alumni. All three emphasized the need of a strong Association in promoting the best interests of the University of Wisconsin. With Basil I. Peterson as chairman of this important committee for the coming year we can expect continued growth in membership and alumni interest. Basil won the Wm. S. Kies Trophy in the Diamond Jubilee Membership Campaign two years ago by getting more new members in the Association than any other alumnus. With his experience and leadership, this year's membership committee should set a new mark for achievement.

**\*B** E A full-time Badger" is the slogan for this year's membership campaign, A full-time Badger is one who cooperates with the Wisconsin Alumni Association in carrying out this objective: To promote, by organized effort, the best interests of the University of Wisconsin. Such organized effort is best effected through membership in the Association. Your influence is then combined with that of thousands of fellow alumni—all interested in maintaining Wisconsin's leadership among American universities. Scattered alumni working alone can do but little; thousands working together can do much for our Alma Mater.

This 1939 Directory is built on the geographical basis. The last one, published two years ago, was arranged according to classes. Several factors were instrumental in this change, the chief one being a demand from Alumni Clubs for a directory which would help these clubs in carrying on their local activities and membership campaigns. The increase in the number of Alumni Clubs is even greater than the growth in Association mem-We now have seventy-seven clubs bership. scattered from New York to Honolulu-more than three times as many as there were in 1936. Very shortly this Club frontier will be extended; Badger alumni in Boston are planning to organize an Alumni Club there this fall and Badgers in Manila are also planning to organize. A Wisconsin alumnus, Bienvenido M. Gonzalez, has just been elected to the the the University of presidency of Philippines.







# NOVERSOTY how to live. If we deny freedom in a univer-

SUPPORTED by stalwart temperance advocates, Assemblyman Theodore Swanson last month recommended vigorously an investigation of the use of intoxicants and a bill to forbid the sale of beer on the University campus, before a recent assembly committee hearing.

Attended by the WCTU, the Anti-Saloon league, and other temperance workers, Mr. Swanson maintained that the 3.2 per cent beer sold in the Memorial Union rathskeller and the men's refectory was an intoxicating beverage. He also claimed that rumors of drinking at unchaperoned student parties should be investigated.

Consternation was rampant in the committee ranks when a carton formerly containing 24 bottles of beer was discovered in a wastepaper receptacle in the room. Chairman William H. Goldthorpe disowned the box, denying knowledge of from where it came.

Madison newspapermen were assailed for their condemnation of the proposals by Mr. Swanson. He declared that he did not believe a large percentage of the students were drinkers. He advocated the investigation to quell those who might become too "rambunctious."

The committee voted rejection of the Swanson resolution for a regent's investigation of the use of liquor on the campus. No action was taken on the bill to prohibit sale of beer on the University grounds.

Mr. Swanson criticized a letter received by a Madison newspaper from a former University pastor and director of Wesley foundation, protesting the investigation. The Rev. Edward W. Blakeman, Ann Arbor, Mich., declared his objections "to the methods which have been used to hamper, molest, discredit, and hinder the good work and great scholarship of the University."

Expressing himself as an alumnus and a lifelong dry, the Rev. Blakeman said, "Universities are not factories where control is everything. They are not asylums nor orphanages whose inmates have to be regimented. Rather they are young men and women, under guidance of free ideas, experimenting how to live. If we deny freedom in a university, we stop the very work which the regents and faculties are employed to conduct."

Assembly Refuses Fee Increase \$15 or more a year by a 62 to 29 vote. An outgrowth of the \$1,000,000 University appropriation cut, the measure was suggested as a means of additional revenue.

Demanding rejection of the proposal, Assemblyman Paul Alfonsi declared, "As a member who during the consideration of the budget voted for more funds for the University, I am not going to vote to pass the buck on to the regents to boost fees. If you vote for this it shows you knew when the budget was up that the University appropriation was not sufficient."

Assemblyman Alfred Ludvigsen speaking for the resolution said, "We have 12,000 students here now. Someday we're going to have to draw the line, either through entrance standards or in some other way."

Assemblyman Elmer Genzmer declared, "No poor student is going to say 'Genzmer put a \$15 increase on my shoulders. I'd rather vote for a sales tax."

**Pres. Dykstra Answers Critics** desire to magnify itself or to multiply its activities, Pres. Clarence A. Dykstra declared at the annual parents' week-end dinner.

Although he did not allude to the charges of Gov. Heil that the teaching staff was playing politics and that the University had ambition to become the largest in America, President Dykstra's speech was construed as being a reply to them.

Pointing out that the University has been the object of criticism and attack in every decade of its existence, Dykstra asserted, "No adversity kills a firmly rooted university. This institution is what you make and require of it because it merely responds to the demands of the citizens."

Quoting the late Prof. Sterling, "The University is for all time," Dykstra dubbed the remark as an anchor to windward when storms have blown.

# ACTIVITIES

House Owners Protest Against New Dormitories OPPOSING the University dormitory housing program, Edward 1. Crowley, Madison attorney, appeared before the board of regents in behalf of the Madison Taxpayers assn., to protest the entrance of the University into the housing field on a large scale.

Asserting that the movement inflicted inevitable hardships upon Madison taxpayers, Mr. Crowley asked the regents to consider some form of compensation. He inquired of the future dormitory building program, whether the construction of graduate units was being considered, and what was being done to better classroom and library facilities.

Replying to Mr. Crowley, President Dykstra declared that every year in spite of any dormitories at the University the landlords and landladies have a larger student body from which to draw.

"It is an unfair assumption to build an argument upon the theory that the University brings students to Madison for the purpose of providing roomers and boarders for the inhabitants of the city. For many years this has been a by-product of University attendance and it may well be stated that it will continue to be throughout the history of the University," President Dykstra said.

Pointing out that the dormitories have a very definite educational purpose, President Dykstra declared, "When all of the housing units on the campus, now under construction, are completed, the University will have provided for not more than 20 per cent of the increase in the numbers of its student body in the last few years."

No graduate dormitories are planned by the regents, President Dykstra said.

\$150,000 THE University's \$1,000,000 Fund Added budget cut was reduced \$150,000 by the passage and signing of a bill directing residue emergency board funds into the school's appropriation.

Introduced by Assemblyman Mark Catlin

'33, the measure provides \$100,000 additional for general administration, \$30,000 for the extension division, and \$20,000 to be used by the regents to match any federal aids available.

Previously the board of regents threw responsibility for making up one-third of the University appropriation deficiency upon the state emergency board. They pledged themselves to furnish the other two-thirds by raising student fees and initiating drastic economies in the organization and operation of the University.

Harold Wilkie Regent President HAROLD M. WILKIE, '13, Madison attorney, was reelected president of the board of regents for the fourth consecutive year at the board's annual meeting held recently. Mrs. Jessie C. Combs, Oshkosh, was reelected vice president of the board for the third consecutive year.

M. E. McCaffrey, Madison, was reelected secretary of the board for the 33rd consecutive year.

Mr. McCaffrey's long period of faithful service to the University and the state stretches back over 33 years to July, 1906, when he came to the University as assistant secretary of the regents. On Dec. 3, 1906, he was named acting secretary, and the following year was made secretary upon the retirement of his predecessor.

gifts from eight different sources was accepted by the board of regents at its recent annual meeting.

The largest of the gifts, amounting to \$8,000, given by Thomas E. Brittingham, Jr. from the Rockefeller Foundation. This great the establishment of an associate professorship in the School of Music for two years. Gunnar Johansen, noted pianist, was appointed to the position.

A second gift, amounting to \$2.640, was from the Rockefeller foundation. This grant will be used to aid in financing exploratory studies of Wisconsin individual income tax data for 1929-36. Other gifts accepted by the regents and the purposes for which they are to be used are:

2. A gift of \$400 from the Wisconsin Home Economics Alumnae association for the establishment of the Hazel Manning student loan fund, from which loans are to be made to any deserving students in the junior and senior years in home economics.

3. A contribution of \$100 from the Wisconsin Alumnae club of Minneapolis to establish a student loan fund to aid needy worthy women students.

4. A contribution of \$25 from the Wisconsin Alumni club of Marshfield, Wis., to be credited to the graduating class loan fund.

5. A gift of \$385 from Marguerite Davis for researches in botany in which her father, the late J. J. Davis, curator of the botany museum, was interested.


6. An anonymous gift of \$300 to be used by a graduate student in geography to pay part of his travel expenses while doing graduate research work in his major field of study.


**Dykstra Welcomes** INVESTIGATION of State Investigation the administration and costs of the University will be welcomed by President Clarence A. Dykstra, he said recently in response to a newspaper interview in which Gov. Heil said that his new departmental research bureau would start investigation of the school.

"I dont know how we compare with the teachers' colleges, but some consideration should be given to the likelihood that the college plants will have to be increased to accommodate the increased enrollment, and additional instructors probably will

Band THE senate refused overwhelmingly last month to appropriate Home \$25,000 to send the University band to New York and San Francisco to give Wisconsin representation at world fairs now in progress in those cities.

The proposal was killed, 23 to 4, after Senator Otto Mueller, chairman of the joint finance committee, declared the money could be used to better advantage. He said the finance

committee disapproved. Senator Milton T. Mur-

senator Milton T. Murray, Milwaukee, one of the four favoring the appropriation, argued it would be cheaper to send the band than to set up Wisconsin exhibits. He contended Wisconsin "should have some kind of representation."

Others who voted for the appropriation were Senators Risser, Madison; Nelson, Maple; and Young, Milwaukee.

Although Governor Heil was represented as favoring the proposal, Senator Conrad Shearer, Kenosha, recalled that the chief executive vetoed a \$10,000 appropriation to complete promotional work of the state department of commerce, now abolished.

"This is supposed to be an economy administration," Shearer said.

#### Shoemaker Resigns Post

MISS ALICE SHOEMAK-ER, assistant director of the University school

for workers in industry, resigned her position, effective June 30. The resignation was submitted and accepted about two months ago.

E. E. Schwartztrauber, director of the school for workers, said that Miss Shoemaker's resignation was taken in contemplation of legislature's apparent determination to abolish the school. No provision for the school was made in the joint finance committee's proposed budget.

Miss Shoemaker is also director of the summer school for workers in industry, not affected by the legislature, and which the regents indicated last month they wished to continue.

#### One Out of 11 Students Are Alumni Children

Alumni Children the University of Wisconsin during the past semester can boast of being sons or daughters of former students of that institution according to figures recently released by the Wisconsin Alumni Records office.

There were 1,020 students of the net enrollment of 11,416 during the past semester

> whose parents are listed in the alumni records files. The percentages remain fairly even throughout the University classes with the exception of the Graduate and Medical schools where, because of the limited enrollments, the average fails to hold. The freshman class of 1938 had the exact average of the entire group, 8.9 per cent. The other classifications were as follows:

> Sophomore, 9.3 per cent; Junior, 9.9 per cent; Senior, 9 per cent; Medical School, 6.6 per cent; Law School, 9.1 per cent; Graduate School, 5.1 per cent.

> The Alumni Records Office anticipated an increase in this percentage during the next few years. There are few alumni of the pe-

riod since 1920 who have children in school. It was during this period that the University classes began to grow rapidly so it is probable that as the children of this group become of age, the University will have more and more children of its sons and daughters attending its classes.

#### Faculty Men Honored

REWARDED for their outstanding work in education and public adminis-

tration, four members of the University faculty have been granted honorary degrees by other institutions of higher learning during the past few months.

Those on whom the honorary degrees have been conferred are Pres. C. A. Dykstra, who was granted the honorary degree of doctor of laws by Northwestern University; Prof. Charles F. Gillen, of the French department, who received the degree of doctor of letters

NINE per cent of the students enrolled in from St. Joseph University in New Brunswick, Canada; Prof. Chester P. Higby, of the History department, who received the degree of doctor of laws from Bucknell University at Lewisburg, Pa.; and C. J. Anderson, dean of the school of education, who received an honorary doctor of laws at the Ripon College exercises.

In conferring the degree, Northwestern University official cited Pres. Dykstra as "a man of vision but never a visionary; a courageous but always constructive critic of governmental

forms and political practices; a scholar who has scholarship linked with political and social actions; a man whose kindliness and tolerance have never been a cloak for timidity; a public administrator who by his work as well as by his words has pushed forward the conception of efficient public administration as essential to the success of political democracy; a man who in all his connections and positions, whether public or private, has been and remains fundamentally an educator."

Prof. Gillen was awarded the doctor of letters de-

gree by St. Joseph University, from which he graduated in 1900, for his many years of outstanding work as a teacher and scholar of Latin, Greek, French, and English literature in both Canadian and American universities.

In receiving his degree, Prof. Higby was cited by Bucknell University officials as "a brilliant student of history and an inspiring teacher in one of America's finest universities." Prof. Higby graduated from Bucknell in 1909.

#### Faculty Condemns Race Discrimination in Athletic Contests

THE University faculty in June approved the re-

port of the athletic board on race discrimination in athletics, gave its approval to the amended constitution for the Wisconsin Union, and approved a new rule permitting freshmen and transfers in their first semester to live in a fraternity house provided active members of the chapter concerned have achieved a scholastic average of 1.3 grade points. The athletic board's report on race discrimination in athletics was in response to a resolution adopted by the faculty at its prior meeting, after Ed Smith, a Negro member of the Wisconsin track team, was barred from competing in a meeting at the University of Missouri by the latter school. The meet was canceled several days after the faculty action, but the resolution also requested the athletic board to define its policy in regard to race discrimination in athletics, and how to avoid such situations in the future.



The athletic board also informed the faculty that in the future, before a scheduled contest is performed with a competing university whose policy differs from Wisconsin's, its officials will be notified

of the Wisconsin policy and action taken accordingly.

#### Engineering Bldg. Goes "Sissy"

**Goes "Sissy"** Wisconsin's old engineering building, which squats along the side of the hill directly opposite from the law building, is to undergo a transformation that will make it the engineering building no more.

Plans announced by Pres. Clarence A. Dykstra for its remodeling will turn its laboratories, drawing rooms, lecture hall and classrooms into meeting places for letters and science students. Purpose of the change is to provide more room for growing classes of liberal arts students.

Experimental machinery, surveying equipment and the engineering library will be moved to the mechanical engineering building, on Camp Randall field. It is here the engineering campus of the future will be created as building funds are made available.

Except for two small buildings on the lake

From the standpoint of convenience for engineering students, President Dykstra and other University officials feel the move will be a wise one, concentrating most of the college's facilities in a single area. At present students must walk the distance of half a mile or more between classes to get from one building to the other.

For some years facilities of the engineering building have been used when available for liberal arts courses in drawing. These classes and others will have more space available to them as a result, it was pointed out.

**Prof. Ogg Retires as Dept. Head** University, Prof. Frederick A. Ogg resigned that post in order to devote his energies entirely to his teaching and writing. His resignation has been accepted and Prof. John M. Gaus has been selected to succeed him as head of the department.

One of the most respected members of the faculty, Prof. Ogg's efforts have been rewarded with a number of unusual honors throughout a teaching career dating back nearly 35 years. A graduate of DePauw and Indiana universities, Prof. Ogg received his doctorate at Harvard in 1904. After teaching there and at Simmons college, he came to Wisconsin as an associate professor of political science in 1914. Three years later he was appointed to the post from which he has just resigned.

During his career at Wisconsin Prof. Ogg has written frequent articles within his field, some of which attracted considerable public notice. For some time he has been editor of the American Political Science Review, and it is known that he has contemplated tendering his resignation as head of the department for some months in order to devote himself to editing this publication. He is expected to be on leave from the University during the second part of the next academic year.

Prof. J. J. Schlicher, member of the faculty since 1919, retired on pension at the end of the past semester. Prof. Schlicher has been a Latin teacher in the classics department, and reached the age of retirement at the end of the second semester.

#### **Medical School**

A LUMNI Day and Student Field Day were held on May 25 and 26 respectively. The program for the former was arranged by the faculty, and about 175 Alumni of the Medical School returned to enjoy the same. The annual banquet was held in the Park Hotel.

The 16th Annual Student Field Day was by all measures of the quality of the program, demonstrations of research work, and enthusiastic reception of the audience the most successful meeting to date. This activity, now so distinctly a part of the Medical School life, is the lineal descendant of the Undergraduate Medical Association at the University of Pennsylvania from which it was transplanted to Wisconsin in 1924 largely through the enthusiastic efforts of Dr. Chaundey D. Leake working through Sigma Sigma. With passing years the program has lost nothing in quality, and the responsibility of responsible students for the effectiveness of the program has borne fruit in the increasing scientific interest of the student body at large. The guest speaker, Dr. Frank Mann of the Mayo Clinic, was an important contributor to the success of this meeting. The Medical School Faculty baseball team enjoyed the unusual distinction of defeating the team of Junior-Senior medical students.

Faculty DR. WILLIAM SNOW MILLER has News been elected an emeritus life member of the American Association for the Advancement of Science.

Dr. Elmer L. Sevringhaus has been made a member of the Council on Pharmacy and Chemistry of the American Medical Association.

Dr. Walter J. Meek has been reelected to the Chairmanship of the Board of Publication Trustees responsible for the publication of the American Journal of Physiology and Physiological Reviews.

Dr. Hans H. Reese was appointed Examiner to the American Board of Neurology and Psychiatry by the Section on Nervous and Mental Diseases of the American Medical Association.

Dr. John W. Harris participated in the postgraduate course of the University of Minnesota Continuation Center on certain problems in Obstetrics.

#### Law School

THE new law school library building is in process of erection and should be ready for accupancy late in the fall. It will be a large building, fully the size of the present building, and will be attached as a wing to the present building on the side facing Music Hall. It will house the entire library and will contain a splendid reading room, a seminar room, and a number of offices. The portions of the old building now devoted to the library will be converted into additional offices and class rooms.

The new building will be of yellow sandstone harmonizing with the older buildings of the campus, and the hope is that ultimately the present building may be torn down and replaced by a yellow sandstone structure with space for the social science departments as well as the law school. But, inadequate as the present building is in many respects, it has some excellent features, and the erection of the new wing will solve all of the problems of space under which the school has been laboring for so many years.

The new building will contain a large wall space at one end of the reading room, which will be 37 feet wide, 11 feet high at the sides and 14 feet high at the top, the top being slightly arching. John Steuart Curry has agreed to cover this space with a mural. a sketch of which is reproduced below. The photograph gives no idea of the warm and glowing colors which the artist has projected. The mural symbolizes the Emancipation Proclamation, and at the base of the mural there will be set forth in appropriate lettering the last sentence of the Proclamation reading as follows: "And upon this act, sincerely believed to be an act of justice, warranted by the Constitution upon military necessity, I invoke the considerate judgment of mankind and the blessing of Almighty God." Curry, artist in residence at the University, is universally regarded as one of the very foremost painters of his time. He has done some striking murals for the Department of Justice and the Department of Interior and has been commissioned to cover an enormous amount of space in the State Capitol in Kansas with scenes depicting the historical development of Kansas, his native state. Curry paintings are to be found in most of the principal museums, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. Curry, Grant Wood, and Thomas Benton are regarded as the three greatest exponents of regional art, expressive of the Middle West.

The sketch of the mural for the law building was originally made for the Department of Justice, but another Curry design was selected in its place because of the fear that the topic might possibly cause racial dissention in the city of Washington. Curry regards the sketch as his greatest conception and is very anxious to do the work. In shape, dimensions, setting and lighting the available space in the new law building is ideal, and all who have seen the sketch believe that it will come to be regarded as one of the greatest murals painted in this country.

The costs of erecting the mural will be raised from private sources. No funds have yet been definitely secured, and any alumnus who would be interested in contributing to this superb work or in donating it to the University is urged to communicate with Dean Lloyd K. Garrison. Faculty PROF. ALFRED L. GAUSEWITZ Changes has been on leave of absence during the past semester. He and his family have been enjoying the peace and quiet of sunny Italy, Germany, etc. He expects to return in July and then will spend the coming school year teaching at the University of Arizona Law School. By that time "das heimweh" will presumably have become so strong that he will return here never no more to roam. Glen Bell, '25, one of Madison's well-known practicing attorneys, will teach Evidence next year during Prof. Gausewitz's absence. Frank A. Ross, also of Madison, who has been teaching Criminal Law this year in Prof. Gausewitz's place, will continue with the same subject next year.

Two other members of the faculty will also be on leave of absence next year. Professor William Gorham Rice, Jr., will be in Washington, D. C., working with the Department of Labor the first semester and possibly the second. Assistant Professor John C. Stedman has been awarded a research grant by Columbia University in New York City and will spend the year there doing work in the patent law field.

Willard Hurst, Assistant Professor of Law, is teaching a course in Trade Regulation at Northwestern University Law School this summer.

A new position of Graduate Assistant has been created for the coming year, and Paul W. Schuette has been appointed. Mr. Schuette graduated from the Law School last June; he stood second in his class and was editor-in-chief of the Wisconsin Law Review. His duties will be a combination of research and administrative work, and he will take over the duties other than teaching of the professors who will be on leave.

Law Honors Announced THE annual law school banquet was held on Thursday, April 27, with George I. Haight the principal speaker. Mr. Haight spoke on the subject of effective appellate argument. He illustrated the importance of clarity, accuracy, organization and persuasiveness in oral and written argument by giving a talk which contained these qualities to an almost unprecedented degree.

FOUR emeritus members of the faculty of the College were honored at an engineering dinner recently. Dean Emeritus Frederick E. Turneaure, Professors Emeritus Edward R. Mauer, Daniel W. Mead, and Olive P. Watts were those eited for their long service on the faculty.

Personally presenting the scrolls citing the four veteran educators, Pres. Dykstra said, "It's a great pleasure, a great honor and privilege for a new-comer like me to participate in this old-timers' ceremony."

Also speaking at the dinner were Edward A. Birge, president emeritus of the University, Dean F. Ellis Johnson, toastmaster, and the four emeritus members of the faculty.

"It takes everything to make a world," commented Dean Turneaure in his speech entitled "Fifty Years of Storm and Strain." "The university has a great deal of resilience. It will be abe to withstand the storm and strain of the next few years."

President Birge, recalling the early days of the college of engineering, told of the starting of the College whose staff had originally consisted of one man, detailed by the war department to teach military science and engineering.

**Camera Aids** Diesel Motor Research University engineering experts have made significant discoveries in Diesel engine operation which they believe will bring the day of the Diesel powered automobile and airplane a step closer.

Working on combustion and fuel problems which hitherto have hampered engineers striving to adapt such high speed engines to economical use in planes and cars have been Profs. R. A. Rose and G. C. Wilson and Instructor Alex F. Robertson.

Object of their research has been data dealing with the proper timing of explosions in Diesel engines, which use cheap oils instead of gasoline and fire by compression instead of an electric spark. A camera capable of recording important engine data in such a way that timing can be measured within a hundred-thousandth of a second was devised for these studies by Prof. R. R. Benedict.

Professor Rose pointed out that smoke, noise, and roughness of combustion have hitherto limited use of Diesel engines in automotive and aviation fields. Lack of knowledge on the best time in the engine cycle to inject the fuel has resulted in bearings being knocked out and cylinder heads cracked.

The investigators have experimented since 1927. Their studies have shown fuels thought less desirable can be successfully exploded if timing is properly adjusted.

### Radio

WISCONSIN'S Senators and Representatives air their views on business of the state and nation in daily broadcasts over WHA. By mutual

agreement they arranged a broadcasting schedule in which all have participated.

In the capitol in Washington is a studio in which the men speak. Their voices are recorded on transcriptions for broadcasting. These are rushed by air express to Madison and used on the radio.

The program is on the air at 6:30 each evening on WHA. During the summer months when sunset is late the station is able to remain on the air after the dinner hour, instead of signing off at 4:30 as required in the winter.

Radio Appeal in Hands of Legislature broadcasting station for non-commercial state service is scheduled for hearing before the Federal Communications Commission on July 31. Unless legislation now pending in the Legislature is passed the application will have to be withdrawn for lack of funds to prosecute the case.

Bill 622A, introduced by the Assembly Com-

mittee on Education, provides for funds to press the application, and to make such improvements as granted by the F. C. C. The bill was recommended for passage after a joint hearing by the Assembly and Senate Education Committees. The Joint Committee on Finance also heard the bill but no report has been made on it.

No opposition appeared against the measure at either hearing, though private radio inter-

> ests are known to oppose the plan for a state-wide station.

Professor Edward Bennett, technical director of WHA, offered a possible way of raising the funds needed for financing the radio activity. A tax on domestic electric power consumption equal to 10 per cent of the value of the current used to operate radio receivers, would amount to about two cents per month for each domestic customer. The tax would be collected directly from the power companies and so would be relatively inexpensive to handle.

#### Air College To Open September 25


THE Wisconsin College of the Air will open the seventh year of broad-

casting on September 25th with a full schedule. The courses run for thirty weeks, with each class period on the air a half hour in length.

The College of the Air is intended to provide continuing, guided educational opportunities for out-of-school youth and adults. It brings the ideal of education-for-all a step closer by making the talents of master teachers available in all communities without charge.

The curriculum includes courses in agriculture, home economics, literature, economics, citizenship, government, vocational guidance and other generally useful subjects.

The broadcasts are heard over WHA and WLBL at 1:30 and 3:00 each school-day afternoon. Course outlines are free and there is no tuition charge or fee of any kind required for participation.

### Music

**G**UNNAR JOHANSEN, noted Danish-American pianist who is considered by many to be the logical successor to the great Paderewski, was appointed an associate professor in the School of Music by the board of regents at its recent meeting.

Mr. Johansen's salary will be paid from a gift of \$8,000 given to the University from the Brittingham trust fund and accepted by the regents at the meeting. Mr. Johansen's appointment is for two years. The gift was given to the University by Thomas E. Brittingham, Jr.

The appointment of Mr. Johansen to the Music school faculty brings to the Wisconsin campus one of the most important of living artists. Mr. Johansen was born in Denmark

in 1906, and displayed unusual talent in music at an early age. After studying as a child in his own country, he was sent in his youth to Germany to study with Egon Petri, who gave him the great musical and pianistic traditions of Busoni.

Mr. Johansen came to this country in his early twenties to settle in California, where he taught in San Francisco for some years, at the same time filling many concert and recital engagements. He became an American citizen during this period. For the past five years he has been associated with the musical activities of the Elizabeth Sprague Coolidge foundation, whose musical center for summers has been Music mountain in the Berkshires. He has also been playing throughout the East with the foremost string quartets. He has been soloist with the Chicago Symphony orchestra, and is a composer of rank.

**Music Students** REYNOLD MCKEOWN, Win High Honors music major from Green Bay, became the first student in the School of Music to be awarded the Theodore Herfurth Efficiency Award, one of the highest honors that can be granted to a graduating male student at the University. The award was made as the climax to the annual banquet of Parents-Weekend, on May 20 at the Memorial Union. McKeown has won further distinction by earning both his Bachelor of Music and Master of Arts degrees this June under the Fish Plan, and also by being elected to Phi Kappa Phi and Phi Beta Kappa societies. He is also a member of Phi Mu Alpha

Sinfonia, professional music fraternity.

An unusual number of students in the School of Music were included in the list of elections to honor societies this spring. Phi Beta Kappa honored Reynold McKeown, Green Bay, and Wayne Hugoboom, Dorchester. To Phi Kappa Phi were elected: Reynold McKeown, Green Bay, Virginia Bennie, Ruth Stauffer, Betty Schadauer, William Schempf, all of Madison, and Howard Krueger, Ripon.

Graduate degrees in music were awarded in the June Commencement as follows: Master of Music, Howard B. Waltz, Owatonna, Minn., Maury C. Jones, Dallas, Texas; Master of Arts, with major in Music, Reynold D. McKeown, Green Bay, and Max G. Miranda, Beloit.

### **Extension** Division

NEW possibilities for curriculum enrichment of high schools were presented in the announcement by the Extension Division of nine supervised correspondence-study courses of high school grade. These courses are designed for fitting into the curriculum of any Wisconsin high school, particularly the small school where some of the vocational subjects may be lacking, and can be adapted to the needs of the individual. The courses first to be offered for supervised study are in business subjects, intended to meet an increasing need of high school students for business training. By this plan they are to be studied under the supervision of a teacher and the assignments corrected and graded at the University. They may be taken for credit toward high school graduation or university entrance. The subjects include two in first-year bookkeeping, two in second-year bookkeeping, two in business training, and one each in retail marketing and merchandising, business law, and business correspondence.

New Courses for Home Study ness Ethics to be taught by the correspondence method, referred to in the April Alumnus, was announced by the Extension Division in May. This subject treats of fair dealing in business and of the rights of seller and of consumer under highly competitive conditions. It is offered for credit for qualified students or for other purposes.

To the list of correspondence-study courses also has been added a course in the principles of air conditioning. This is an elementary course for young men, in or out of high school, who have a serious interest in learning something about the scientific foundations upon which the air conditioning industry is built and about the practical application of the principles.

**Extension Classes** AN ILLUSTRATION of **Enroll Thousands** the large development of University instruction provided in class centers throughout the state is furnished in figures on the Extension class program for the year ending in June. In the first semester 174 classes were conducted in 43 cities, with 4,017 registrations; in the second semester, 158 classes in 37 cities, with 2.880 registrations. Of the 332 classes held during the school year, 274 were for college The figures are significant of the credit. growth of an idea in education now widely realized in Wisconsin: The offering of a substantial portion of a college degree program for worthy young people, in their home towns, without loss of academic efficiency and at a large financial saving.

**Training for the Industrial Worker** ing experience in several large industries, a counselling and guidance service has been set up by the Extension Division for the benefit of employes in Wisconsin industries.

Paralleling employetraining through University Extension study courses, the new service is planned to help employes to select courses most suitable for their special training and to secure the best results from these studies. A bulletin has been published to describe the subjects, academic and technical, that are of special value for workers in industrial plants. A counsellor supervisor named by the plant management is the connecting link be-

tween the employe and the University, and a University counsellor makes regular visits to plants and follows closely the work of employe-students.

#### Assistant Dean Joins Chicago U.

DR. JOHN L. BERG-STRESSER, '25, assistant dean of the

Extension Division, has left Wisconsin to undertake important educational surveys at the University of Chicago. Dr. Bergstresser's work with the Extension Division has been notable for the contribution he made to the development of a counseling and guidance service at the class centers throughout the state. These activities included the preparation of a handbook of information for the guidance of freshman and sophomore students; the organization of a mid-semester grade report plan; studies of the academic achievements of Extension students; and advisory work with individual students through personal visits to every class center. One of many fruitful results of these visits

was the inducement for many young people to continue their education at institutions of higher learning.

Before his connection with the Extension Division Dr. Bergstresser was active in the counselling services of the University as assistant dean of the College of Letters and Science. At Chicago he will direct a survey of cooperative studies for the University's school of education.

#### Youthful Speakers Awarded Honors

THE state of Wisconsin's most ac-

complished public speakers in high school ranks came to Madison May 8-9 to compete in the finals of the annual forensic contests sponsored by the Extension Division (department of debating and public discussion) and the state forensic association. Eighty-eight young people participated in five branches of the forensic art - oration, humorous declamation, nonhumorous declamation. extemporaneous reading, extemporaneous and speaking. Judges award-

ed 25 A's, 39 B's, and 24 C's. These contests closed a brilliant season of forensic activity in high schools. Earlier contests had brought state title awards to contestants in debate and in dramatics.



Simonson and E. H. Gardner, member of the Memorial Union building committee who was instrumental in starting the Union project 20 years ago, addressed the group. Harold G. Pickering, well known New York attorney, presided.

### The Milwaukee Center

ON SATURDAY, June 3, the Milwaukee Center of the University of Wisconsin Extension Division granted thirty-three certificates to adult evening school students. These certificates are granted after a student has completed twelve evening school courses, each one semester in length, in a chosen field of study.

Certificates in Real Estate are granted by the Milwaukee Real Estate Board and sponsored by the University Extension Division.

Since 1928 and including the present year, 385 certificates have been granted in the various fields.

theater. March, who received his first training in campus dramatics, came to the aftertheater dance to give his alma mater's new theater a send-off and greet his fellow alumni. The send-off consisted of a personal contribution of \$500 which was matched by Roy Tomlinson of the National Biscuit Co.

In June the "Wisconsin Youngsters" of the New York Club (classes of 1929 to 1939) staged an old fashioned Wisconsin beer party on the Piccadilly Hotel Roof Garden and turned the proceeds over to the switchboard fund. Ted Wadsworth '32, former president of the Union, did the honors as chairman.

The New York gift to the Union's theater will bring the campus student-alumni center to near-completion. Launched by former Governor Walter Kohler, F. H. Clausen, '97, of Horicon, E. H. Gardner, and others as a memorial to the University men and women who served in the war, the Union is the largest single gift undertaking of alumni and friends. Almost 19,000 have contributed more than \$1,000,000 to the project; no state funds have been used.

The new theater addition is financed in part by a federal grant. Only \$16,000 for equipment is still needed to open the building next fall.

Set Up New House Directorate source of membership of Union Council and the addition of a House Directorate composed of the chairmen of all standing committees and clubs organized under the Union.

Briefly the function of the directorate, as specified in the constitution of the Wisconsin Union shall be "to correlate the work of the several house committees and clubs, discuss common problems, study the techniques of effective group work and community service, and formulate social and educational programs and policies for recommendation to the Union Council." It was evident at its first meeting that the unity which such an organizational set-up can give to the presentation of an unified and adequate Union program will be extremely valuable.

Under the new constitution, four of the student government board members automatically become members of the Council, and the four remaining students of the Council are selected from the house chairmen, the president of the Graduate Club becoming a member of the Council by virtue of his position.

The Council has under its jurisdiction the determination of broad general policies affecting the Union; the Directorate carries out the specific duties necessary to the operation of the Union, regulated by the policies determined by the Council.

Through the Directorate various views can be presented to and approved by the Council, and a cooperative program embracing the all-inclusive interests which the Union represents can be effected.

Projects and problems pending for the consideration of the Union Directorate are numerous. Besides deciding methods of correlating committee work with services of "group work practice" students, methods of utilizing assisting staff with the best possible results, and the spacing public events to avoid conflicts and competition for publicity and patronage, many administrative problems will be settled by the Directorate.

The completion of the new wing presents new and interesting problems to which the Directorate is looking forward. It is believed that the coordination which will be possible through the joint consideration of problems will make for an enlarged and successful year for 1940 for the Wisconsin Union.

### **Intercollegiate Athletics**

UNIVERSITY of Wisconsin athletic teams finished the spring sports season with a good general average of success and rounded out a year of intercollegiate athletic competition which, while it brought but one championship in boxing to Madison, certainly did not impair Badger athletic prestige.

Coach Tom Jones' Wisconsin track team surprised the experts by finishing a strong second to Michigan in the outdoor Big Ten championship meet at Ann Arbor. The Wolverines, prohibitive favorites, came through with 64 3/4 points, which was about as expected. The Badgers were an easy second with 45 5/12, followed by Indiana, 28 2/3; Ohio State, 28; Purdue, 13; Minnesota, 12; Illinois, 10; Chicago, 9; Northwestern, 8 1/2; and Iowa, 6 1/12.

Leading scorers for Wisconsin were Captain Walter Mehl, who won the mile in 4:14.3 and finished second in the 2-mile; Ed Buxton, surprise victor in the 880 in 1:53.9; Milt Padway, second in the pole vault; Riley Best, second in the broad jump and tied for fourth in the high jump; Ken Carlson and Jerry Siefert, second and third, respectively, in the javelin; and Ed Smith, second in the 120 yard hurdles. Other Badgers who picked up points were Francis Kaufmann in the 100; Alfred Harrer and Don Timmerman in the high jump; Bob Petrie, 880; Bill Farin in the 2-mile and Bob Gardner, pole vault.

**Baseball** For the first time in the Finishes three years during which With .500 Lowell (Fuzzy) Douglas has coached the Wisconsin baseball nine, the Badgers finished out of the first division, ending the season with six conference wins and six defeats. The team, however, played smart, hustling baseball and was really much better than the final ranking suggests. After the early weeks of the season, they were -with big Bob Henrich's pitching-probably the best club in the league. Henrichs won 10 out of 11 games he pitched and was the most sought player in the conference by major league clubs. He eventually signed with the New York Giants after considering offers from five other teams.

Under the plan now general in the Big

Ten of playing two games on successive days against most conference opponents, only a team with two first class pitchers has much chance for high ranking. Coach Douglas' second string hurlers were not equal to the task, so the Badgers' .500 percentage, which gave them a tie with Purdue for sixth place was considered creditable. Iowa, which won 8 and lost 3 games, was a real championship outfit. Wisconsin's loss of two games to Indiana at the start of the season, when the Badgers had really had no outdoor practice, practically doomed them to a low ranking.

**Crew Best** in Years WISCONSIN crew enthusiasts were well pleased with the showing of Coach Ralph Hunn's Badger varsity eight, which, despite the fact that it finished sixth in a field of seven at Poughkeepsie, leading only Columbia to the finish line, was well up with the leaders all the way and was undoubtedly the fastest Wisconsin eight ever turned out, for four miles, rowing the race in 18:43 under highly adverse conditions.

Wisconsin's varsity lost a close 3-mile race to Syracuse, enroute to Poughkeepsie. The Badgers led most of the way and while Hunn and his oarsmen refused to alibi, New York reporters covering the race stated that but for being nearly swamped by the swell of launches racing past the crews, near the finish, the Badgers might well have won. Open water barely showed between the shells at the finish.

This year, for the first time in ten years, Wisconsin's freshman crew also competed at Poughkeepsie and though the Badger youngsters finished in last place, they covered the course in good form and creditable time and the experience they gained will add to their contribution to the varsity next year. The frosh had previously beaten St. John's Military academy and lost a close race to an exceptionally strong Culver academy eight.

The Badger golf and tennis teams had just "so-so" seasons this spring. The golf team, weakened by the withdrawal of two erack sophomores immediately after the first 1939 match, had much to do with the record of five defeats and three wins in dual meets. In the conference tournament, Wisconsin finished in a tie with Purdue and Ohio State, one rung above the bottom of the ladder.

Prospects in both sports look better than fair for next year.


