ADJOURNED MEETING OF THE BOARD OF REGENTS

Madison, Wisconsin

July 7, 1921, 5:00 p.m.

President Kohler presiding.

PRESENT: Regents Birge, Buckstaff, Butler, Faast, Hammond, Kohler, Perkins, Seaman.

ABSENT: Regents Callahan, Eimon, Horlick, Jones, Mahoney, Miller, Trottman.

A letter was received from Regent Eimon explaining that business appointments would prevent his attendance at the meeting.

President Birge advised that he had a letter from Regent Trottman explaining that important appointments would prevent his attendance at the meeting.

A letter was received from Regent Mahoney explaining that he could not come on account of important matters pending before his court.

President Birge explained that Regent Callahan was absent attending the Regional Citizens' Conference called by the U. S. Commissioner of Education at Des Moines, Iowa.

Telephone communications were received from Regent Horlick and Regent Miller in explanation of their absence.

Dean Goodnight, Director of the Summer Session, appeared before the regents and presented modifications of the summer session budget aggregating \$4,257.12, increase over the original budget; this increase to be charged against the \$5,000 contingent in the budget.

On motion of Regent Perkins, seconded by Regent Faast, it was VOTED, That the amendments to the summer session budget be approved as presented. (Copy attached).

The report of the finance committee on the Budget for 1921-1921-22 was taken up for consideration.

It has not been the practice of the regents to consider the budget before the appropriations are available, but, as Business Manager Thorkelson found it necessary to leave at once, it was deemed desirable to have the finance committee and the board meet before he leaves and approve the budget tentatively.

The secretary was authorized to insert in the budget the appointments, reappointments, promotions, and leaves of absence for the year 1921-22, as shown in Exhibit A. (Copy attached).

Budget adopted

On motion of Regent Hammond, seconded by Regent Faast it was VOTED, That the budget for 1921-22 as amended by the finance committee be adopted, subject to the approval of the appropriation bill by Governor Blaine.

Called vote was taken, all regents present voting, and voting "aye".

Ext. Fees

On motion of Regent Faast, seconded by Regent Kohler, it was VOTED, That the matter of fees for the Extension Division be referred to the University Extension Committee and the President of the University.

On motion of Regent Kohler, seconded by Regent Butler, it was VOTED, That the matter of issuing certificates of courses completed in the University Extension Division be referred to the University Extension Committee and the President of the University.

It was VOTED, That the gift of \$2,250 from Dr. H. C. Bradley be accepted and that President Birge be requested to make acknowledgment to Dr. Bradley.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

-Letters and Science-

1. That the following persons be appointed professorial assistants to the executive committee of letters and science for the second semester of 1920-21, at a compensation in each case of \$50 for the semester, to be charged to administration - letters and science: C. D. Cool, L. W. Dowling, George Wagner.

2. That George F. Forster be appointed research assistant in zoology for three months during the summer of 1921 at a compensation of \$100 a month; also that he be appointed research assistant for the year 1921-22, at a salary of \$800 for the year; both sums to be charged to university research fund.

3. That Leroy D. Edwards be appointed garden assistant in the Pharmaceutical Experiment Station for the months of July, August, and September, 1921, at a salary of \$50 a month; charge to balance of Experiment Station fund.

4. That the following men be appointed special assistants in physics for the summer period, June 23, to September 1, 1921, at the compensation indicated in each case; charged to unassigned instruction and special grants:

5. That N. G. E. Sharp be appointed special assistant in physics for the period of the summer session at compensation of \$75, charged to unassigned instruction and special grants.

1. That Clarence W. Muehlberger be appointed research assistant in chemistry, at a salary of \$200 for the summer of 1921 and \$600 for the year 1921-22; charge to amount allotted to Professor Lenher for this position from the university research fund.

Adopted.

-Engineering-

1. That R. O. Ruble be appointed research assistant in hydraulic engineering for two months during the summer of 1921, at a salary of \$125 a month, service to begin July 1, 1921; charge to research engineering.

Adopted.

-Extension-

1. That Maude McHenry be appointed assistant recorder for the months of July and August, salary at the rate of \$1650 for eleven months; provided in the budget. (If satisfactory will be appointed for year).

Adopted.

2. That Elsie Sell be appointed vacation substitute for Miss Jensen in home economics, on half time for two months during the summer of 1921, at a salary of \$50 a month; charge to additional instruction.

Adopted.

On motion of Regent Faast, seconded by Regent Perkins, recommendations of the president were adopted.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

Coal contracts rescinded
1. That the action of June 21 regarding the award of coal contracts be rescinded. The market on screenings has dropped and new bids will be taken by the State Engineer July 8th.

2. That the Executive Committee be authorized to award coal contracts for 1921-22 in accordance with later recommendations of the State Engineer.
Adopted.

Contract concrete seats to Nelson
3. That the contract for the construction in concrete of four sections (28 rows - about 4,000 seats), at the new stadium be awarded to George Nelson of Madison, Wisconsin for \$24,872, and that the work of removing the necessary portion of the present wooden grandstand be delegated to the University Superintendent of Buildings and Grounds. The entire cost to be charged to Athletic Council funds, (Balance July 1, 1921 - \$35,596.69.) *(contract on file Bldg contracts # 26)*
Adopted.

4. That in accordance with the recommendation of Dean Russell "the University guarantee to the government the payment to the M. J. Connelly Company for the cartridging of 10 carloads of "picric acid" minimum weight 200,000 lbs. @ 6¢ per lb., or \$12,000". This arrangement will insure the preparation for sale of this material and any expenditure should be entirely repaid by October or November.

Adopted.

5. That the request of the Madison Orchestral Association for the use of the gymnasium for an orchestral concert ~~Wednesday~~ *Tuesday*, November 1, 1921 be granted on the usual terms.

Adopted.

6. That \$50 rent be refunded to the University Employees' Store in exchange for shelving, counter, and case.
Adopted.

7. That the Emergency Board be requested to authorize the exchange of the Dodge touring car used by the Clinic for a new Dodge roadster of a net cost of \$590, chargeable to 20-41 (1)(d). Physical Plant.

Gift* 8. That on recommendation of Dean Reber a gift of \$50 by a Mr. McMillan to the University for aiding worthy students in the Extension Division be accepted and placed in the loan fund for this purpose.
Adopted.

On motion of Regent Buckstaff, seconded by Regent Faast, recommendations of the business manager were adopted.

The business manager explained that the University Extension Division was unable to meet some of the salaries and bills for the year 1920-21, on account of difficulty in collecting their accounts, and recommended that a temporary loan be made.

\$6,000* On motion of Regent Butler, seconded by Regent Faast, it was VOTED, That the business manager and secretary be authorized to sign a note at a local bank for \$6,000; this note to be taken up as soon as funds are available.

On motion of Regent Butler, it was VOTED, That the reading of the minutes of the June 21 meeting of the regents be dispensed with and that they be approved as sent out to the regents, except that the following amendment be made:

Page 19: paragraph relating to the meeting of the finance committee and the board meeting, insert the word "adjourned" where the board meeting is referred to. The paragraph as amended reads:

"Inasmuch as the regents had given such careful consideration to the legislative recommendations, and in view of the fact that the appropriations are substantially the same in amount as those submitted to the legislature, the regents felt that the FINANCE COMMITTEE of the regents WILL NOT BE REQUIRED TO SEND THE BUDGET TO THE REGENTS TEN DAYS BEFORE THE ADJOURNED BOARD MEETING. It was left to the President of the University to arrange for the finance committee meeting and the adjourned meeting of the Board for the adoption of the budget, with the understanding that the adjourned Board meeting will be concluded before July 20."

Dear President Birge,

Attached please find for submission to the Regents alterations of the Summer Session budget, which have been rendered necessary by the increase in registrations over what was expected. We are now sure of over 4400 paid registrations as against a total of less than 3600 last year. Fortunately, however, the increases are pretty well distributed, so that by adding a few readers and instructors the work is adequately taken care of without greatly increased expense. The increases shown in this list plus those shown in the budget revision of June 18th, total \$4,237.12. This is amply covered by the \$5,000 for contingent instruction contained in the original budget; hence we are well within the original appropriation of \$105,000. Of this \$105,000, at least \$10,000 to \$12,000 in leave-of-absence elections will not be required in cash. Our cash receipts ought to approximate \$90,000, so that our cash expense beyond receipts ought not to be more than \$3,000 to \$5,000.

Trusting that you will find the appended budget alterations satisfactory and will recommend them to the Executive Committee of the Regents for approval, I am
