Dear Sir: In compliance with law, we have the honor to submit this, our report of the transactions of this department for the biennial fiscal term ended June 30, 1916.

The action of the Commissioners on July 12, 1913, to withhold state lands from sale, as authorized by Section 207, Paragraph 2, Wisconsin Statutes, and in obedience to injunction by the State Supreme Court issued May 28, 1914, and later decision of said court, has continued in force throughout the fiscal years, June 30, 1914 to June 30, 1916. No state lands have been sold during the term except as directed by legislative action, or on account of forfeitures of contracts. See Exhibit B herewith for such sales.

Although the Supreme Court decision referred to seems to class all the unsold so-called swamp lands of the state (161,714.59 acres), with others, as belonging to the trust funds and under control of Commissioners of the Public Lands, with power to sell as heretofore, we have not acted thereon, preferring to await prospective legislation on the subject.

The office has been called upon for clerical labor in connection with the Supreme Court decision affecting the status of state lands and funds, far greater than has ordinarily been required when there were large sales and transfers.

Calls for loans from trust funds to school districts continue to increase. During the term covered by this report, loans of this class aggregate, as

shown by Exhibit H, \$1,336,623.75, which is more than the total invested in such loans ten years ago. Total of loans to school districts June 30, 1906, was \$1,297,519.47. The total at this date is \$3,033,822.74. The amount available for loans has been augmented by about \$100,000, dues from fines, etc., collected from Milwaukee county, and payment of \$100,000 of old war time state certificates of indebtedness provided for by Chapter 477, Laws of 1915. These unusual additions to the funds available for loans, have enabled us to accommodate many school districts which otherwise could not have been.

It is believed that with the Exhibits A to K and appendices 1 to 4, inclusive, herewith, a sufficient showing of the transactions and activities of the department is presented.
