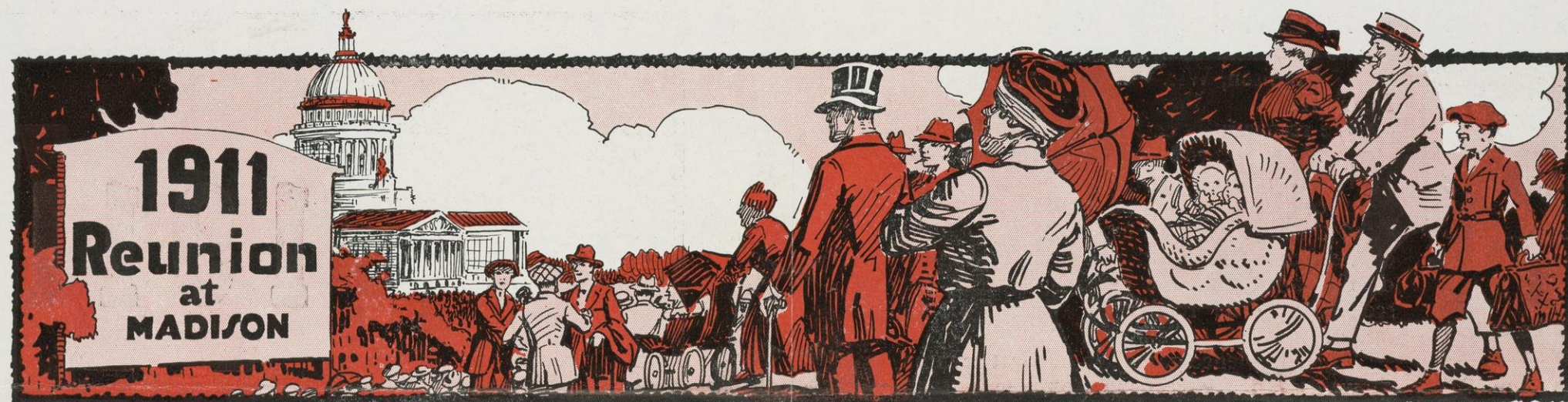

Roy Phipps writes from Tokyo that his rickshaw is in the garage, but that flying will have to be pretty bad to keep him at home in June.

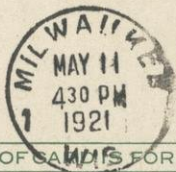
Colonel Julius Olsen and staff will direct the big Military Review. Come out and fall in line.
