RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

-Agriculture-

1. That C. A. Eckberg be appointed assistant in agricultural bacteriology from February 1, 1924, to the close of the second semester of 1923-24; salary, at the rate of \$58.66 a month; to be charged to balance on salary of C. M. Gere, resigned.

- 2. That Elizabeth M. Salter be appointed assistant leader,
 Boys' and Girls' Club work, for the second semester of 1923-24;
 salary, \$70 a month, to be charged to balance on salary of Mildred Hagerty, resigned. (Miss Salter also will receive \$100 a month from U. S. Department of Agriculture.)

- 3. That John S. Klinka be appointed county agricultural representative for Trempealeau County, beginning February 1, 1924; salary, \$2500 per annum, to be charged as follows: \$1700 to the University (12 months' basis), and \$800 to the County.

- 4. That Harry F. Clements be appointed part-time assistant in agronomy, for four and one-half months, beginning February 1, 1924; salary, at the rate of \$45 a month; to be charged to special fund furnished by the Flax Development Committee.

1. That Emil R. White be appointed research assistant in hydraulic laboratory for three months, beginning February 1,1924; salary, \$\pi\$100 a month, to be charged to Research lA.

2. That L. T. Sogard be appointed student assistant (research) in hydraulic laboratory, beginning February 1, 1924; to be paid at the rate of 45 cents an hour; charged to Research lA.
