Turning Out Steel Office Furniture For The Federal Government

The Invincible Metal Furniture company is running at capacity turning out steel desks, steel filing equipment and similar office furniture for the federal government.

George Alter, vice-president of the company, said Tuesday that all production for civilian needs has been discontinued so the company could center its productive facilities for turning out this material, badly needed in various federal agencies and in camps and cantonments, in stepped-up war production.

All-Time Peak

Company officials said employment at the Invincible company has reached an all-time peak and it is necessary to run double shifts in some departments to turn-out rush orders.

The government requirements has resulted in the Invincible company utilizing all the second-floor space in the factory on South 26th street, formerly used by the Paragon Electric company. The latter company moved to Two Rivers late last year.

The Manitowoc firm has been receiving a series of continuing contracts from various departments in Washington covering all types of steel office equipment. A large warehouse in the nation's capital is used by the company to stock desks and filing equipment, from which the government agencies draw the equipment as needed.

Maintains Contacts

The Invincible company still maintains contacts with its various jobbers and sales agencies, who often negotiate contracts for equipment with federal agencies. The necessary steel to fill the government orders comes through on priorities.
