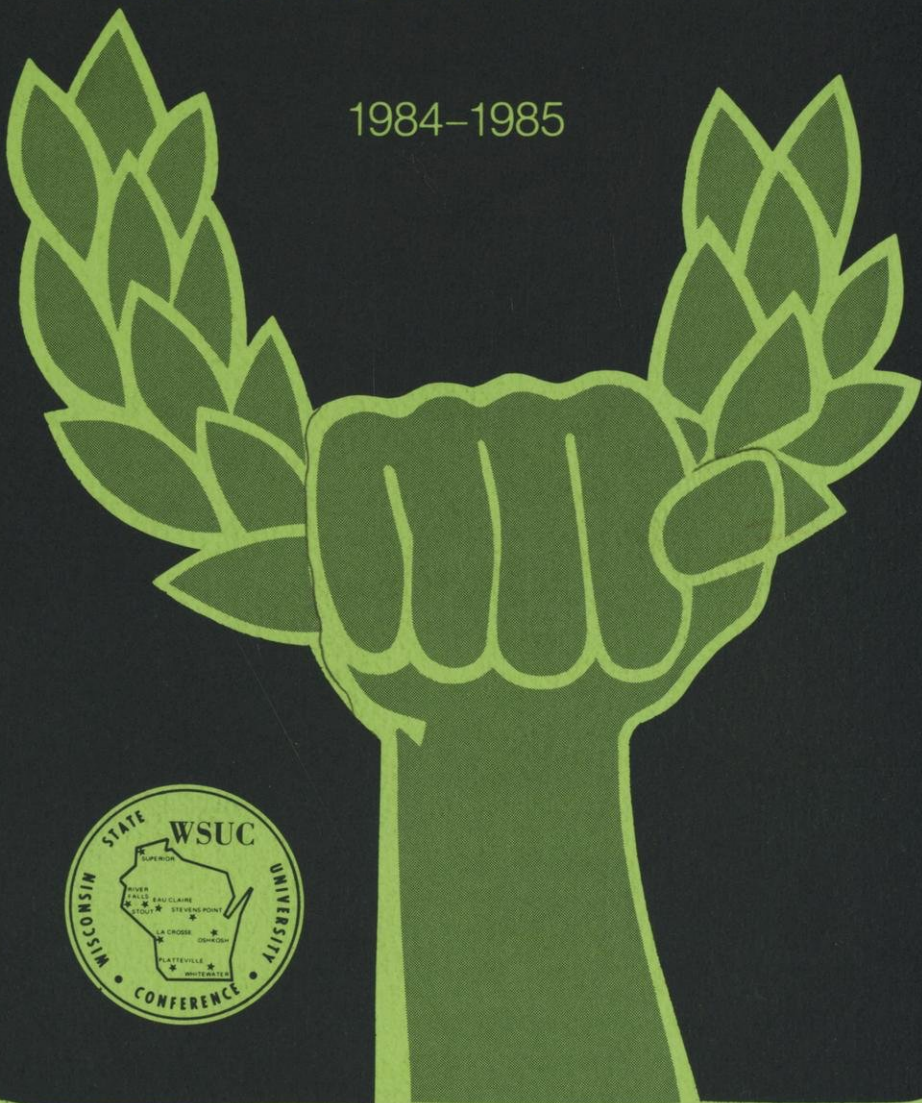

## THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its thirteenth anniversary in the fall of 1984. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only thirteen years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He has been there since.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials. Gene Calhoun will continue as supervisor of football officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

ISELIN TOP WRESTLING COACH

Platteville's Walter Iselin was named the 1984 WSUC wrestling "coach of the year" after guiding his Pioneers to second place in the annual conference meet. River Falls repeated as team champion with 90-1/2 points. Platteville finished second at 58 points without an individual champion.

JAREMKO ALL-AMERICAN AGAIN

Oshkosh outfielder Tom Jaremko was named to the NCAA Division III All-American baseball team for the second consecutive season in 1984. Titan second baseman Dan Wnuk made the second team. Jaremko finished the season with a .459 batting average, while also hitting 15 home runs and 12 doubles and knocking in 44 runs.

PREVIEW OF 1984 FOOTBALL SEASONWISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The WSUC gets stronger and more competitive with each year. It reached unbelievable heights in basketball last season and football always produces a balance that's the envy of many conferences.

Last year was no exception. Four teams remained in contention up to the final Saturday. Eau Claire won the championships with its 7-1 record with La Crosse second at 6-1-1. River Falls and Whitewater tied for third at 6-2.

La Crosse earned a berth in the NCAA Division III playoffs and shaded Occidental (Calif.) in Los Angeles, 43-42, with a brilliant fourth-quarter comeback in the Western Regional. The Indians eventually lost to Augustana (Ill.), 21-15, in the semi-finals.

There's no clearcut favorite this year, although Eau Claire rates the "team-to-beat" tag on its reputation. The Blugolds are defending champions and most coaches figure a team is king of the hill until somebody else knocks it off that perch.

Coach Link Walker's Blugolds will be tough to dislodge. They start with the conference's premier running back in Lee Weigel and all-league quarterback Jess Cole, who proved himself in the Big Ten at UW-Madison as well as in the WSUC last season. He's a daring quarterback who is at his best in tough situations.

Eau Claire sustained some graduation losses but Walker has built a formidable program and should find adequate replacements. Cole and a winning attitude that produced a 21-3 conference record over the past three seasons make a strong combination that bodes well for the Blugolds.

Most observers lump La Crosse and Whitewater in a nice neat package with Eau Claire when discussing leading contenders. Coach Roger Harring has a strong nucleus of veterans returning from a team that just missed the title a year ago. The Indians are big, strong, quick and experienced. They are bred in a winning tradition and aim to keep it that way.

Whitewater, too, boasts a strong contingent of returnees that Coach Forrest Perkins hopes can give the Warhawks another championship. They are particularly gifted in the offensive backfield with quarterback Jim Stoppenbach, running backs Mike Miller and Jeff Jagodzinski and flanker Kelly Silha.

River Falls lost some key people from its strong "wishbone" offense but Coach Mike Farley has a knack of finding adequate replacements. Most opponents expect the Falcons to be challenging at the end because they say Farley's coaching always makes them competitive.

Stevens Point and Stout are placed in the darkhouse category because the potential is there and could produce a winner under the right circumstances.

The Pointers still have the conference's premier passer in Dave Geissler, who heads into his junior season with two passing and total offense notches on his belt already. Coach D. J. LeRoy hopes to complement Geissler with an adequate running attack this fall.

Stout went from an 8-2 record in 1982 to a 2-9 last season and most rival coaches figure Bob Kamish won't let that happen again. Last year they couldn't get untracked but this is another season and Kamish does have some horses.

Coach George Chryst is searching for consistency at Platteville, where his Pioneers slumped to 4-6 last year, 3-5 in the conference. Consistency on offense is his main goal and that means improved line play.

Oshkosh and Superior are question marks because of new coaches. Ron Cardo has taken the reins of the Titans and Gil Krueger assumes command at Superior. These could be trying years for them but don't bet on it. The WSUC has demonstrated many times in the past that anything can happen and the unusual is routine.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

Basketball used to overshadow football along the shores of the Chippewa River but no more. Blugold Coach Link Walker has built something of a grid dynasty that produced 21 victories in 24 conference games over the past three seasons. This winning attitude will be a factor as the Blugolds bid for their third WSUC championship in four years this fall.

Experienced offensive and defensive backs give Walker a positive feeling going into his 17th season at Eau Claire. He also has the services of 27 of last year's 39 lettermen, including nine offensive starters and seven from the defense.

The Blugolds led the conference in scoring and total offense last season and have over 3,000 yards in total offense returning in running backs Lee Weigel and Ken Heffel, quarterback Jess Cole and receivers Tom Saskowski and Darryl Goehring. Cole and Weigel made the all-conference team.

Losses included Jeff Wilson, a first team all-American offensive tackle, and Jeff Gospodarek, a first team all-WSUC flanker in 1982 who made the second unit a year ago. The defense will be without linebackers Dennis Schahczenski and John McBride, tackle Dave Verhagen and cornerback Grant Bashore. McBride and Bashore were all-conference.

Consistency marked Eau Claire's offense last fall. Only once were the Blugolds held to less than 22 points and their top production was 41 points. In fact, for four consecutive weeks the Blugolds scored exactly 28 points. Walker will be aiming to recapture that consistency this season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

A 21-21 tie with Oshkosh prevented the Indians from sharing the conference championship with Eau Claire last fall. Of course, La Crosse lost to the Blugolds, 25-3, on the way to its 6-1-1 record and Coach Roger Harring can figure his date with the Blugolds in November at La Crosse will be a key in the WSUC race.

The big loss for the Indians comes on defense where tackle Jim Byrne anchored the line so successfully for four years. The three-time all-conference and all-American performer will be difficult, if not impossible, to replace. Also missing from the defense is all-WSUC back Rik Parker.

Offensively the Indians appear in solid shape with the return of quarterback Bob Krepfle, who demonstrated his prowess in the final game of the regular season by passing for a WSUC record 509 yards in a 28-7 victory over River Falls. He also threw for 371 yards as the Indians nipped Occidental in Los Angeles, 43-42, in the NCAA Division III playoffs. They eventually bowed to Augustana (Ill.), 21-15, in the semi-finals. But, this bodes well for 1984.

Krepfle will be throwing to all-conference tight end Don Kindt, Jr., a 6-7, 250-pounder, and split end Stan Johnson, who made a school record 12 receptions for 221 yards against Occidental. Also returning are guard Tom Newberry and tackle Jay Thorpe from the offensive line and linebacker Joe Weber as well as Dan Lowney, who led the conference in punting last season.

The playoff experience should prove invaluable, especially in view of Krepfle's remarkable resurgence from a shoulder separation that sidelined him from October 1 until November 5 a year ago.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

An aura of optimism pervades the football scene at Oshkosh as new Coach Ron Cardo inaugurates what he hopes will be a successful run at his alma mater. Cardo, 38, was a running star for the Titans in the 1960s. He owns 11 school records and was inducted into the Titan Hall of Fame last year.

Cardo inherits a team that finished 5-4-1 last season, 3-4-1 in the conference. The Titans suffered some key personnel losses but enough young players return with experience that Cardo calls this an important element in his building plans.

The most critical losses in the defense are end Steve Jorgensen and back Jeff Treslley, both all-conference performers. Offensively, Brad Westphal and Jim Wild are gone. Wild, a first team all-conference wide receiver and punter, caught 38 passes in the league and had the best reception average of 20.4 yards. Westphal was the Titans' leading rusher.

The offensive line needs shoring, too, but tackle Tim Dahlke is a solid returnee. Quarterback should be manned by veteran Mark Baalke and sophomore Kevin Reichardt. The latter started three games as a freshman a year ago, and showed remarkable poise as Oshkosh's baseball shortstop during the spring. Coaches liked his versatility and athletic ability, which they figure bodes well for his future at quarterback.

Oshkosh fans haven't seen their team figure in a WSUC championship in eight years and they're hungry. They hope Cardo can lead them out of the woods. He's been down the title path before. The Titans shared the 1968 crown with an all-conference sophomore running back named Ron Cardo.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

The Pioneers need improvement in practically every area of their play in order to fight back up among WSUC contenders this Fall. Coach George Chryst, starting his sixth season at the helm, would like to regain the magic that enabled the Pioneers to gain a piece of the title in his second year guiding the blue and orange.

The loss of 6-5, 273-pound tackle Scott Herrman, end Mike Kissling and cornerback Brian Gobin from the defense leaves serious voids. But, Chryst believes the addition of nose guard Ray Gilliland will be a good place to start rebuilding the defensive line.

Improved strength and quickness are pluses heading into the season, and Marty Sturzl gives the Pioneers a good, steady running back. He gained 548 yards in 1983 and finished fourth in conference rushing. Junior Fred Partlo and sophomore Dale Jacobs are expected to vie for the starting quarterback job.

This year sophomore tackle Dave Viaene, a strong 6-4 and 220 pounds, could emerge as one of the premier linemen in the WSUC.

"To be a consistent winner, we still need better overall team speed," Chryst observed. "And, for Platteville to improve its conference standing, we must develop a more consistent offense. The key to this is improved line play. The return of 1982 lettermen Paul Gruner and Curt Mellem could be significant here."

The Chicago Bears will conduct an early training camp on the Pioneer practice fields in July, so that could have a positive influence on the school's football program. But Chryst quipped, "Platteville will be improved if one or two of the Bears get lost during their training camp here."

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

Mike Farley, who is starting his 15th season at River Falls, has built the Falcons into a perennial contender. He fashioned his success with tantalizing "wishbone" offense and a rugged defense that traditionally has been tough against the run. Most opponents expect River Falls to be a factor again this season.

The losses are critical but not devastating from the team that compiled an 8-2 record last Fall, including a 6-2 conference mark. Gone are guards Dick Waak and Brad Tvedt, tackle Gordy Ziebart and fullback Dave Bednarek from the offense. Also gone are defensive backs Miles Strain, Ron Brenner and Rick Bednarek as well as linebacker Mike McCoy. All eight players received some kind of all-conference recognition a year ago.

Among the Falcon strengths are two fine quarterbacks in Mike Farley and Doug Derginer and a defensive front five that includes ends Mike Annis and Don Stark, tackle Chip Kintopf and Brad Pease and nose guard Kent Gray.

Farley, the coach's son, earned all-conference recognition as a placekicker in 1983, when he led the WSUC in scoring with three touchdowns, 14 conversions and eight field goals in 12 attempts for 56 points.

Bednarek leaves a serious void from the "wishbone" because he accounted for most of the Falcons' rushing yards. He gained 706 yards in eight games, finishing second to Eau Claire's Lee Weigel.

Replacing the three defensive backs could be a project because so many WSUC opponents throw the football effectively. Filling those voids and finding adequate replacements in the offensive line will determine whether or not Farley continues the tradition.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

Coach D. J. Leroy's first class of recruits are juniors this fall and he will be depending on them more and more for leadership. Heading the list is quarterback Dave Geissler, who has led the conference in passing and total offense two straight years. He also ranked third in NAIA passing a year ago.

Missing, though, will be his two top receivers from last season, Mike Gaab and Tim Lau. Gaab, who caught 50 of Geissler's throws in eight WSUC games, was an all-conference running back, too. Lau caught 45 passes in conference competition. Others who won't be around for the 1984 season are all-conference defensive tackle Mike Evenson, cornerback Ron Whitmore and punter and placekicker John Kleinschmidt.

Guards Mark Rietveld and Ron Hintz head a group of nine offensive starters returning, along with Geissler. LeRoy has depended on the pass a majority of the time since he took the Point reins but plans to emphasize the run more this season. Fullback Mike Reuteman, a transfer from the University of Minnesota, could bolster this part of the attack.

Defense will be the key. The Pointers finished dead last in rushing and overall defense last season and they must improve in order to make any kind of a run for the title. Two other transfers could help here. They are LeRoy Huckle, a linebacker from Mankato State, and Breck Loos, a defensive back from Augustana (S.D.).

LeRoy wants to control the ball more and in order to accomplish this his Pointers must shore up their defense, especially against the run, and beef up their own ground attack that produced only 58 yards a game last season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

With last year's nightmarish season behind them, Coach Bob Kamish and his Blue Devils can't imagine anything but improvement in their fortunes this Fall. Following a solid 8-3 record in 1982, they slumped to 2-9 last season, 2-6 in the conference, and never did get untracked.

Quarterback Glen Majszak, who performed so consistently two years ago, struggled like the rest of his teammates in 1983. After averaging 128 yards in total offense during the '82 campaign, he managed only 54.7 last season. He also threw only one touchdown pass last Fall compared with eight the year before.

Kamish is hoping Majszak can return to his old form as a senior and that there will be enough experienced people among the 32 returning lettermen to ease the way. The most dependable offensive lineman returning is 6-2, 230-pound tackle Jeff Hayes. Another senior who could help is center John Goodnetter.

Most critical losses were tackle Mark Sharkey and wide receiver Mike Kraimer from the offensive and tackle Dan Schneider and back Rick DesJarlais from the defense.

Opponents caught up with Stout's "radar" defense last season but Kamish is hoping linebackers Brian Kellett and Todd Schuh as well as defensive end Keith Jurek can rev up this fall and boost the Blue Devils back up among the conference leaders again.

Inconsistency stalked the Blue Devils last season. They lost by only three points to a tough Dayton University team but were blanked by River Falls two weeks later. They shaded Oshkosh, 24-21, and then lost their season finale a week later to Platteville, 21-13.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

Veteran Coach Gil Krueger will try to pump new life into the Yellowjacket football program and the rehabilitation project could be the most demanding of his career. Superior hasn't had a winning season since Monte Charles guided the Yellowjackets to a 6-4 record in 1971.

Krueger is no stranger to the state or the WSUC. He graduated from Marquette University and coached at Stoughton High School. He also guided UW-Platteville for five years, 1969-73, and during that span the Pioneers figured in three conference championships. He also coached at Macalester College in St. Paul, Northern Michigan and New Mexico State.

The Yellowjackets seldom have been able to put together a strong offense and defense at the same time. Last season Coach Mertz Mortorelli developed one of the strongest defensive units in the conference but then the offense failed to jell. They were shut out in four of 11 games and never scored more than seven points in any of their outings.

The heart of that strong defensive unit won't be around to help Krueger, though. Nose guard Larry Banks and tackle Jim Viaene are gone. Both were all-conference performers. Also missing are linebacker John Danzyk and end Russ Hagen.

Quarterback Steve Hendry also is gone, so Krueger starts almost from scratch.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984

This could be the year of the Warhawks. Forrest Perkins, the dean of WSUC coaches, has been denied the championship for two straight years and that's uncharacteristic. The Warhawks finished just one game out of first place last season with a 6-2 record, 6-5 overall with a rugged non-conference schedule.

Perkins has two solid quarterbacks returning in senior Jim Stoppenbach and sophomore Lance Leipold. Ironically both hail from Jefferson. Rounding out the backfield are all-conference running back Mike Miller, fullback Jeff Jagodzinski and flanker Kelly Silha. Miller finished second in WSUC rushing with 116 yards a game and Jagodzinski was fifth at 60. Silha caught 32 passes in the conference.

Anchoring the defense will be tackle Bill Lobenstein and backs Tim McNeil and Chris Heller. Additional help is expected from two transfer linebackers -- Bill Callagan from Dakota Wesleyan and Jerry Dudzik from UW-Madison. The Warhawks need help on this side of the ball because of losing linebackers Dan Turelli and Curt Chybowski and end Tom Polzin. Turelli was all-conference and Chybowski Whitewater's most valuable player.

Much will depend this fall on how well the Warhawks come out of three extremely demanding non-conference games against NAIA power Hillsdale, NCAA Division II Mankato and NCAA Division I-AA Northern Iowa. Always tough La Crosse follows the first two games against Mankato and Hillsdale. Whitewater's title potential will be thoroughly tested by September 15.

BASKETBALL ALL-AMERICANS

Stevens Point's Terry Porter and Eau Claire's Chester Smith were named to the 1984 NAIA basketball All-American first team, while Whitewater's Andre McKoy was selected to the NCAA Division III All-American second team.

PREVIEW OF THE 1984-85 BASKETBALL SEASON  
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The Wisconsin State University Conference reached unprecedented heights in basketball last season when its co-champions reached the finals of two national tournaments. Whitewater won the NCAA Division III championship, while Stevens Point bowed in the NAIA title game at Kansas City.

These two teams figure to be strong again and Eau Claire is expected to regain the kind of excellence that enabled Ken Anderson's Blugolds to claim at least a share of 11 WSUC championships over a 15-year span.

Eau Claire missed sharing the title last season because of a 52-51 loss to Stout in the final regular season game. Anderson has most of that talent returning, including forward Chester Smith, who made the NAIA All-American first team, and swingman Tom Saxelby, the Blugolds' most valuable player in 1982.

Coach Dick Bennett's Pointers led the nation defensively for the fourth straight year and the cream of that squad, Terry Porter, returns. They gained valuable experience in their drive for the national championship at Kansas City and Porter attained additional stature as one of the final cuts in the Olympic trials in Bloomington, Ind.

While Bennett was "coach of the year" in the NAIA, Whitewater's Dave Vander Meulen received a similar citation in NCAA Division III voting. Vander Meulen, whose Warhawks averaged 21 victories over the last five seasons, has the nucleus of another fine squad, even though he lost starting guards Andre McKoy and Anthony Brazzel. Center Mark Linde heads a group of talented returnees.

Two teams have new coaches, Jim McGrath at Oshkosh and William "Bo" Ryan at Platteville. The Titans and Pioneers had the two worst records overall in the conference last season, so extensive rebuilding jobs are in order at both institutions.

Teams in the middle of the conference could be improved over a year ago but they are caught in a "basketball league" that has been described as the toughest non-scholarship conference in the country.

La Crosse could be a "load" for any opponent if Coach Burt McDonald's big people like 6-9 Paul Denny, 6-8 Lee Stahl and 6-8 Paul Kuske progress as expected following good sophomore years. River Falls has four starters back, but the one gone, John Williams, leaves a void Coach Stan Jack will have a tough time filling.

Stout looks for brighter days in its program. The Blue Devils showed signs last season but never found the consistency to become a factor in the race. Coach Dwain Mintz loses his top man, Dale Nerison, but he can call on more experienced performers than in several seasons and that bodes well for the fortunes at Menomonie.

Superior came up with a pesky club that surprised many people last season and added maturity could make the Yellowjackets a factor in the coming race. Coach Chris Ritchey started almost from scratch a year ago but now he has molded a competent nucleus.

The team or teams that wind up on top in the WSUC in February again will be able to hold their own in national competition. Last season Eau Claire beat St. John's, an NAIA tournament participant; Nebraska-Omaha, the NCAA Division II North Central Conference champion; and NCAA Division I UW-Green Bay. Yet, the Blugolds didn't win the WSUC championship.

This could become another banner year in the WSUC, but such has been the case for such a long time and everybody expects it. Jack of River Falls summed up the feeling in the conference with this thought: "We know about this area. My hope is other people know or will find out what a great league we have. Stevens Point has great tradition going. They will be tough to beat with their great experience at Kansas City. The same goes for Whitewater. Eau Claire is never out of it. Oshkosh and Platteville have new coaches. The rest of us are really not that far behind."

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

For the first time since Ken Anderson became coach the Blugolds have gone two successive seasons without winning the WSUC championship. But, don't feel sorry for Anderson and the Blugolds too long because they have the material to make a strong run for the title this season. They lost only 7-foot Jeff Dorschner, who averaged 10 points and 6.7 rebounds last season.

Heading the list of returnees are three all-conference performers--6-7 Chester Smith, 6-4 Tom Saxelby and 6-0 Rick Dahl. Smith finished fourth in WSUC scoring with a 22.8 average in 1983-84, Saxelby made over 80 percent of his free throws and Dahl led the conference with 5.5 assists a game. Smith also made the NAIA All-American first team.

Anderson also has available another starter, 6-8 1/2 Brian Krueger, 6-1 redshirt guard Joe Carnevale and 6-9 sophomore Bruce Johnason, who lettered two years ago but sat out last season with an ankle injury. Anderson has recruited 6-5 forward Sean Shelton from Eastern Arizona Junior College and 6-1 guard Bronson McNeal from Minneapolis North High School. Both should help.

The Blugolds missed sharing the title last season because of a one-point loss to Stout in the finale. They beat co-champions Stevens Point and Whitewater once each, so there is great optimism in the Eau Claire camp.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

Coach Burt McDonald has enough returning experience to make life miserable for the frontrunners in the WSUC. Stevens Point, Whitewater and Eau Claire rule as pre-season favorites but the Indians have a good nucleus from last season's 15-13 club to make a run at the title. The most critical loss is play-making guard Tim Buss.

Heading the list of returnees is 6-9 junior Paul Denny, who averaged 13.4 points a game last season along with 5.6 rebounds. Also back are Lee Stahl and Paul Kuske, a couple of 6-8 forwards. Stahl averaged 10.3 points and Kuske 9.2 in the conference last season.

Seniors Steve and David Coenen, Joel Hammond and Mike Reinhart and junior Bruce Conner will be battling for starting assignments in the backcourt. The Indians averaged almost 33 rebounds a game last season and they should improve on that with Denny, Stahl and Kuske a year older.

McDonald will be searching for more consistency this season from a group that blew hot and cold too frequently a year ago. They also need a scorer who can provide 17 to 20 points a game. The Indians ranked third in field goal accuracy with .499 last season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

The theme on the Oshkosh campus this year is "a new beginning" with a changing of the guard in the football and basketball programs. The new Titan basketball coach, Jim McGrath, inherits a program that finished last in the WSUC with a 2-14 record and was 8-18 overall. The Titans last won the WSUC championship in 1978.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

William "Bo" Ryan, an assistant coach at the UW-Madison for eight years, now gets a chance to build and nurture his own program in the home of the Pioneers. He was a popular Badger assistant, who recruited effectively and was credited with holding the program together during a lengthy and difficult search for a new coach two years ago.

His mission is somewhat similar to that at Madison. The Pioneers finished with the poorest record among WSUC teams last season, winning only six of 26 games. They did manage to escape the conference cellar with some surprise victories but need a general overhauling to become contenders again. Departing Coach Dick Wadewitz last guided the Pioneers to a share of the title in 1975.

Platteville's biggest losses were two-time conference scoring champion Mike Ehler and 6-5 forward Tom Steinhaus, the Pioneers' most valuable player. They led in team scoring last season. Ehler averaged 14.7 points and Steinhaus 11.8 in the conference. Ryan must find somebody who can replace those statistics.

The nucleus of his first team probably will be 6-1 guard Tim Hill, who averaged 11.2 points and 3.6 assists a game, and Derrick Johnson with an 11-point scoring average. The Pioneers need rebounding strength and Ryan hit the recruiting trail immediately after landing the job, searching for the best prep talent available.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

The Falcons have four starters returning but their one loss, forward John Williams, is a big one. He led the WSUC in scoring last season with a 25.9 average and ranked fifth in rebounding with 7.4 caroms a game. He made the all-conference team and was voted the Falcons' most valuable player. Where they can pick up those lost statistics is of great concern to Coach Stan Jack.

Returning starters include 6-8 Brian Jass, 6-1 Jeff Bloomer, 6-1 Steve Combs and 6-4 Bob Kotecki. All saw plenty of action last season and should be better prepared to face the kind of opposition they'll encounter in the coming months. Bloomer is a good outside shooter who averaged 11.7 points a game last season and played solid defense.

Jass is the big man of the group who averaged 7.3 rebounds. He needs to beef up his scoring and play more aggressively around the glass. If he does, the Falcons could improve on their 14-12 record and 6-10 finish in the conference. Jass is a natural forward, though, and Jack still needs a big man in the middle who can score and rebound with the WSUC's tough inside people. The Falcons also need a point guard to run the offense. This would free Bloomer to become more of a scoring threat.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

The Pointer dynasty shows no signs of deterioration as Coach Dick Bennett starts his ninth year at the helm. His teams have figured in three straight WSUC championships and led the nation in defense four consecutive seasons. And, no one in this bustling Wisconsin River city can forget the near miss at Kansas City last March when the Pointers lost the NAIA championship by two points in overtime.

Bennett's current edition looks as capable as the last. The Pointers lose only Brad Soderberg and Tim Lazarcik, although both leave big voids. Soderberg was all-conference and Lazarcik was named to the all-tournament team at Kansas City. Soderberg as point guard became the stable influence in Bennett's patient offense, while Lazarcik provided strength inside.

A strong contingent remains, including 6-3 guard Terry Porter, who did everything any coach could ask last season and was so impressive he was invited to the Olympic tryout camp in Bloomington, Ind. Besides being co-most valuable player in the WSUC, he earned first team NAIA All-American honors and was all-tournament and MVP at the national meet.

Other key returnees are 6-6 Keith Kulas, 6-7 Tim Naegeli, 6-0 Craig Hawley and 6-1 Keith Fenderson. Bennett also expects help from UW-Green Bay transfer Kirby Kulas and freshmen Dimitric Roseboro, Todd Christianson and Darien Brown.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

Veteran Coach Dwain Mintz is searching for the maturity and stability that marked his Blue Devils in the late 1960s and early '70s. He hopes to find those attributes in the nine returning lettermen on his 1984-85 roster. This group includes 6-3 forward Kurt Stellpflug, who averaged 9.9 points and 6-1 rebounds in the conference last season.

Missing, though, are 6-7 forward Dale Nerison, who led the Blue Devils in scoring and rebounding last season, and 6-2 guard Randy Mery. Mintz says, "Stellpflug is a tough, strong player when it counts," and the coach is counting on this type of play from his veterans. This attitude could solve one of the problems for which Mintz shows concern--weak team leadership.

Stout also will depend heavily on 6-6 forward Mark Stevens and 6-0 sophomore guard Ron Hunter as Mintz strives for the consistency he covets in his style of basketball. The guards in particular were "error prone" last season and he needs a more stable backcourt to improve on last year's 14-12 record, 5-11 in the WSUC.

The Blue Devils played "spoiler" last season, capping the campaign with a 52-51 victory over Eau Claire that knocked the Blugolds out of the championship. Mintz hopes that success will carry over into this season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

The Yellowjackets were not a team any opponent could take lightly last season and they could develop into an even more formidable foe during the coming months. Coach Chris Ritchey guided his club to a 10-17 season in his second year in the Twin Ports. The Yellowjackets were 6-10 in the conference and tied for fifth place with River Falls.

He did that with only two returning lettermen. Now he has five and can call "experience" as one of this team's strengths. Among returnees is 6-5 forward Terry Harris, who finished third in conference scoring with 23.2 points a game. He also averaged 7.5 rebounds to finish third in that category.

PROSPECTS FOR 1984-85

The 1984-85 Warhawks have a tough act to follow. Last year's team shared the WSUC crown with Stevens Point and went on to win the NCAA Division III championship at Grand Rapids, Mich. It was the first national basketball title ever won by a WSUC team.

Coach Dave Vander Meulen's major project now is finding replacements for last season's starting guards Andre McKoy and Anthony Brazzel. McKoy, who finished as Whitewater's leading career scorer, earned all kinds of honors last season, including second team All-American. Brazzel, like McKoy was all-conference, and led the Warhawks in assists with 4.2 a game.

The front line is sold with 6-8 Mark Linde, 6-7 James Wilson and 6-4 Gary Ruch returning. Linde, a two-time all-conference center, averaged 18.2 points and 9.2 rebounds a game in the conference. Wilson's 9.3 rebounds a game led the WSUC. Ruch improved with each outing and averaged nine points in five NCAA tournament games.

Sophomores Duane Vance, Bob Zenz and Scott Thompson figure to vie for starting guard spots, although 6-7 Randy Maerz, a transfer from UW-Madison, is capable of playing in the backcourt as well as the front line.
