



## THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System is marking its twelfth anniversary in the fall of 1983. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only twelve years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Fort Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B. A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He has been there since.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is the new supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials. He succeeds Gene Calhoun, who will continue as supervisor of football officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B. S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 12 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

Tom Weatherspoon and Steve Brilowski of Stevens Point won championships at the 1983 NCAA Division III outdoor track and field meet at Naperville, Ill.

Weatherspoon, a junior from Brookfield became the Pointers' first ever double national champion when he won the long and triple jumps. His distance of 24 feet 11-3/4 inches in the long jump was more than a foot ahead of the second place finisher and his 50-1 3/4 in the triple jump represents his career best.

Brilowski, a senior from Stevens Point Area Senior High School, breezed to the 800-meter title with a time of 1:49.30. A year ago he finished second in that event but left little doubt who was best in the 1983 meet. He grabbed the lead at the gun and never relinquished it.

Their performances enabled the Pointers to finish sixth in the team competition, the best performance ever for the school. Glasboro State (N.J.) won the meet with 97 points and was followed by Hamline (Minn.) 94, Mount Union (N.Y.) 82, Lincoln University (Washington, D.C.) 65½, California-Pomona 64, and Stevens Point 60.

La Crosse finished 27th with 19½ points, Stout 28th (18), Whitewater 29th (12) and Oshkosh 45th (10).

PREVIEW OF 1983 FOOTBALL SEASONWISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

If pre-season comments by coaches are any indication, the Wisconsin State University Conference football race in 1983 should develop into one of the most interesting in many years. A favorite? No one team ever is mentioned. Usually two or three get the nod and one source even suggested seven contenders could slug it out till the end.

La Crosse is defending champion but even the Indians faltered last season when Whitewater shocked them in the second last Saturday of the campaign. Coach Roger Harring's club again figures to present a contending lineup with exceptional depth throughout, including NAIA All-American defensive tackle Jim Byrne.

Almost everyone, though, will focus on Eau Claire, where Coach Link Walker has assembled an impressive array of talent, including quarterback candidate Jess Cole of Mondovi, who led the UW-Madison to its first bowl appearance in 19 years two seasons ago. Cole became disenchanted at Camp Randall last fall, when Randy Wright wrested the starting spot from him, and transferred to Eau Claire.

Still, Cole will have to share the spotlight on the banks of the Chippewa with a stable of high-powered offensive performers. Jeff Gospodarek has been the WSUC's leading receiver the past two seasons in yards per catch, and running back Lee Weigel led the league in rushing with 128 yards per game for the five outings in which he participated.

Platteville Coach George Chryst says the strength of the conference will be found at Eau Claire, La Crosse, Whitewater and River Falls this year. "Eau Claire has great talent and depth and has done exceptional recruiting in recent years," Chryst emphasizes.

"River Falls has over 40 players returning in its two-deep offensively and defensively, and La Crosse and Whitewater are always deep and sound. The rest of us will slug it out with an occasional upset now and then," the Pioneer coach adds.

Forrest Perkins has relinquished his athletic director duties at Whitewater and will concentrate on molding a football contender. He possesses a wealth of talent, including several injured returnees and transfers who figure to challenge for starting positions.

Perkins has lined up an extremely demanding non-conference schedule in the hopes of preparing for the rigors of WSUC competition. The Warhawks will face two NCAA Division II schools, Augustana and Mankato, plus Division I-A Western Illinois. The veteran coach hopes the experience will help his charges, but frets how a rash of injuries might affect the Warhawks later.

River Falls shared second place with Eau Claire last season, but Coach Mike Farley hopes to avoid the kind of mid-season slump that cost his club a year ago, when the Falcons lost successive games to La Crosse and Whitewater. Farley, who is starting his 14th year at River Falls, says of 1983, "We have no great starts, but some depth at all positions."

Stevens Point still is searching for that elusive formula that carried the Pointers to an undisputed championship six years ago. Second-year Coach D. J. LeRoy starts with the conference's premier passer in Dave Geissler and a stable of quality receivers. If he can find some running punch and beef up the defense, the Pointers might find themselves right up with the heavyweights at the end.

Oshkosh also yearns for past glories but the Titans will be hard-pressed to challenge this fall because teams above them a year ago remain solid. "A great deal will depend upon the success of our recruiting and the development of some of our young people," Coach Dave Hochtritt says. "We believe that we have some talented individuals, but experience is definitely lacking."

Coach Bob Kamish has some big holes to fill at Stout, especially at running back. But, the Blue Devils start with more experience on defense and that's where games are won.

Superior has struggled in the second division for years, but Coach Mertz Mortorelli feels more confident with his 1983 squad than any he has tutored for years. "We will turn things around in '83 based on a team with total experience, size and good speed," he predicts.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

All eyes will focus on Eau Claire this season where veteran Coach Link Walker is blessed with two outstanding option quarterbacks in Dermot Fitzgerald, who directed the Blugolds last fall, and transfer Jess Cole, who led Wisconsin's Badgers to the Garden State Bowl in 1981.

The Blugolds will be without some talented performers from a year ago, including offensive guard Craig King, defensive backs Mike March and Dave Hellestad, versatile Glenn Nelson, linebacker Dave Jensen, defensive tackle Todd Brigman and placekicker Bob Leffler. But, enough veterans remain to assure continuity.

Among returnees besides Fitzgerald are defensive end Brian McQuillan and wide receiver Jeff Gospodarek, both all-conference performers; John McBride, who made the all-league second team at linebacker; running back Lee Weigel; and Tom Saskowski, another talented wide receiver.

Walker figures with some adequate replacements in the offensive line, the Blugolds could produce a "fairly potent" offense this season. Either Cole or Fitzgerald can do the job at quarterback, Weigel is a powerful and quick running back who gained 640 yards rushing in five conference games last fall, while Gospodarek and Saskowski combined for 77 pass receptions and 1,163 yards in 1982.

Depth at quarterback has been a key factor for the Blugolds in each of the past two seasons. They needed Kevin Bohlig and Kevin Haag in their 1981 title drive and Haag and Fitzgerald last season. Walker is banking on Cole and Fitzgerald to do the job this year.

1982 Results (8-2)PROSPECTS FOR 1983

The Indians will bid for a repeat championship with one of the most experienced teams in Coach Roger Harring's 14-year tenure at La Crosse. Heading the list of 16 returning starters is All-Conference quarterback Tony Klein and defensive tackle Jim Byrne, who was chosen on the NAIA All-American first team last fall.

Harring still has some major obstacles to overcome while building this season's Indian edition. He must replace defensive back Mark Gruen, linebacker Rick Ver Duin, offensive tackle Torkel Leum and running back Reggie Rabb. All won their share of honors as collegians. Rabb was a four-year starter who became the school's second all-time leading rusher with 2,811 yards. He missed but one game in his career and led the Indians in rushing all four years.

Byrne, a 6-3, 265-pound senior from Brooklyn, N.Y., has been called a bona fide National Football League prospect by all who have seen him play. He heads the defense with linebacker Joe Weber, a 6-2, 220-pound junior.

Offensively, Harring is looking for some running punch to replace Rabb. Klein is a competent passer who should experience a solid senior year. He has a fine target in split end Ken Schmidt, who caught 32 passes last fall, including 26 in the conference. Another valuable cog is placekicker Tom Hermes, who booted 20 out of 21 conversions in 1982 and six field goals in as many attempts.

The Indians were ranked 11th in the final NAIA Division I poll last fall on the strength of their 8-2 record, 7-1 in the WSUC. Experience will be their forte this year as Harring's club bids for its 14th straight winning season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

The Titans are trying to pull themselves out of a slump that resulted in a tumble to the bottom of the WSUC last fall. They shared that spot with Superior, which downed the Titans, 23-16, on the second last weekend of the season. Oshkosh salvaged some respect by whipping Whitewater, 25-15, in the 1982 finale.

That victory was encouraging, but so much more needs to be done, particularly on defense and at the quarterback spot. Brad Hitt, the third ranked passer in the conference, is gone, leaving junior Mark Baalke with the only experience at that position. Running back Brad Westphal and wide receiver Jim Wild are two skilled returnees. Wild also is an outstanding punter.

Offense presents particular problems because the line must be rebuilt almost from scratch. Among returning lettermen looking to start in that area are Bob Conklin, Tim Dahlke, Glenn Schachtner, Jim Schramek and Ted Tornow.

Ends Steve Jorgensen and Tom Schuessler anchor the defensive line, but the Titans must shore up the forward wall after finishing last in the conference against the rush last fall. Coach Dave Hochtritt expects a good year from sophomore tackle Scott Rucynski, who was impressive as a freshman in 1982.

"We will have to recruit more physical people," Hochtritt said. "We need players who can really hit on defense and are good size. Looking at the situation, I would say that we need help at the linebacker and defensive secondary positions especially."

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

Some young people have to develop quickly if the Pioneers are to achieve their goal of improving on last year's 5-5 record, 3-5 in the conference. The squad is plagued by inexperience and lack of depth generally. A solid receiving corps, headed by split end Kevin Devenport, and good competition at most positions are pluses Coach George Chryst hopes can offset some of the deficiencies.

Chryst must replace some quality players, including all-conference tackle Phil Micech and cornerback Chuck Raasch from the defense. The latter was the Pioneers' most valuable player. Also gone is defensive back Stuart Anders, who intercepted eight passes last fall, and quarterback Mark Rowley.

Leading returnees are tackle Scott Herrman and halfback Brian Gobin on defense, along with Devenport and running back Jeff Dower on offense. The defense will not be as big as in the past and will depend on mobility and consistent aggressiveness. Mike Kissling at end or linebacker, Steve Lewis at tackle and Bill Weichman at linebacker should bolster the young defense.

Chryst expects improvement on offense with Dower and fullback Marty Sturzl providing solid running and blocking. Tight end is covered adequately if Larry Brown stays healthy. Tackles Paul Gruner and Russ Feine are experienced, but the guards spots are wide open. Bob Cleland returns at center.

"Overall, it will be a building year for the Pioneers," Chryst said, "with our success dependent on how well our young players develop during the course of the season."

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

Mike Farley starts his 14th year as head coach of the Falcons with 37 returning lettermen off a team that shared second place last season and compiled a 7-2-1 record overall. Nine of those returnees are offensive starters, including quarterback Clark Luessman and hard-running fullback Dave Bednarek.

"No great stars but some depth at all positions" is the way Farley describes his 1983 Falcons. This list of solid performers includes all-conference offensive guard Dick Waak, standout punter Mike Farley and offensive tackle Gordy Ziebart. The defense is bolstered by nose guard Tom Draeger and cornerback Ron Brenner.

This isn't to say Farley doesn't face some problems. One of the biggest is replacing linebacker Roland Hall, the WSUC's most valuable player last fall. Also gone are tight end Paul Micech and offensive tackle Brad Nielsen along with end Tom Metsa and backs Todd Strain and Tim Crowley from the defense.

Farley again can be expected to build a strong running game with an offense that features the "wishbone" and variations of the wing-T. Last fall the Falcons led the conference with an average of 213 yards a game rushing, but they threw only 59 passes in eight league games for an average of 46 yards through the air.

River Falls again figures to challenge conference favorites and the race could be decided in the final two weeks of the season when the Falcons face Whitewater and La Crosse. They also meet dangerous Stevens Point the week before the Warhawks but the key game could come on the third week of the season at Eau Claire.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

An ineligibility spoiled D. J. LeRoy's debut as head coach last fall, costing the Pointers the three victories and it's difficult to assess how much other damage was done before they got back on track midway through the season.

Three victories, including one over conference opponent Whitewater, were washed out at the start of the season, when it was discovered one of Point's players had used up his eligibility.

The strength of the Pointers this year centers around an offense triggered by quarterback Dave Geissler, who led the WSUC in passing and total offense last fall as a freshman. The Chippewa Falls slingshot averaged 250 yards a game passing. He threw 14 touchdown passes and had a completion percentage of .611.

Geissler will throw to a strong cast of receivers, including split end Tim Lau, who caught 46 passes in the conference last season, and Mike Gaab, who grabbed 25 aerials and led the league in scoring with 48 points.

Among the problem areas are running backs and the kicking game. Backs Rod Mayer and Gerry O'Connor are missing from the offense. Mayer was Point's leading rusher besides topping the conference with 51 pass receptions.

LeRoy also must find a replacement for placekicker Randy Ryskoski, who booted five field goals and 16 conversions last fall.

LeRoy was an outstanding running back himself during his undergraduate years at UW-Eau Claire, and the Pointers figure to run more in the future. But, the presence of Geissler assures that passing will predominate again this season.

1982 Results (8-3)PROSPECTS FOR 1983

The Blue Devils got off to a flying start last season with six straight victories but faltered at the end, losing successive games to Eau Claire and River Falls. Two of those first six victories were overtime decisions and, incredibly, Stout played a third overtime but lost that one to the Blugolds.

Coach Bob Kamish will have eight of his 11 offensive starters back this fall. Unfortunately, among the missing are running backs Bob Johnson and Tod Zimmerman, who provided the Blue Devils with a solid one-two punch on the ground. Johnson led conference rushers with 677 yards and Zimmerman added 452.

Ten defensive starters return and Kamish's toughest job here will be replacing end Maurice Britts. Spearheading this unit will be Rick Des Jarlais, an all-conference defensive back last fall. The defense will be experienced, though, especially the secondary. Also, Kamish expects another strong performance out of linebacker Kurt Wenzel.

Despite the loss of Johnson and Zimmerman, the offense should be able to move the football with more experience at quarterback and a solid offensive line. Quarterback Glen Majszak earned second team all-conference honors last fall and he will be throwing again to talented wide receiver Mike Kraimer, who averaged 23 yards per reception in 1982, best in the WSUC.

One of the biggest voids on the team was left by the departure of placekicker Clay Vajgrt, who finished third in conference scoring a year ago, making 11 of 14 extra points and 10 of 12 field goal attempts. But, Kamish says, "Barring any major injuries, we should be a factor in the conference race."

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

Confidence is bubbling on the shores of Lake Superior, where Yellowjacket Coach Mertz Mortorelli expects to field the school's most experienced and promising team in a decade. One of the reasons is the return of veteran quarterback Steve Hendry, who has been a quality WSUC performer for three years.

Hendry again will trigger Mortorelli's run and shoot offense with a little veer mixed in. Hendry can pass with the best in the league and has two excellent targets in tight end Dennis Palmberg and wide receiver Garrett Hagan, who caught 24 and 23 passes, respectively, last season. Center Matt Gidley anchors a strong offensive line and newcomer Jim Menz could provide Hendry with some relief at quarterback.

Defense should be Superior's forte. Starting with tackles Jim (6-3, 271) and Tom (6-3, 266) Viaene, that's a load for any opposing offense. Jim was all-everything last fall and then polished off his school year by winning the WSUC heavyweight wrestling championship. The linebacking corps is headed by senior John Danczyk, called the "best in the league" by his coach.

Mortorelli still is searching for some missing pieces to assure the Yellowjackets of their finest season in years. He needs a kicker to replace Rob Olton and could use a defensive back with speed, size and strength.

Still, the veteran coach says his squad has "experience, depth, talent, much more speed and is bigger, stronger and wiser" this time around. "We should be in the thick of the championship," he adds.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983

Veteran Coach Forrest Perkins has some big holes to fill this season, but 35 returning lettermen and a host of promising newcomers and transfer students could vault the Warhawks into a contending position.

Among those expected to report are offensive guard Tony Ash, who sat out last season with an injury, and tight end Jack Deichl, who decided to forego football in 1982 and concentrate on basketball. He also could help in the placekicking and punting departments as well as a pass receiver.

Despite some quality returnees, it won't be easy replacing defensive ends Al Adler and Daryl Schliem, strong safety Tim Patterson and cornerback Andy Shroble, quarterback Doug Brown, wide receiver Joe Gerlach and tight end Jon Miller. Brown ranked second in conference passing efficiency last fall, while Gerlach caught 41 passes in WSUC competition.

The quarterback position could be strong if Jim Stoppenbach can shake the injury bugaboo that plagued him for the past two seasons, and Tim Bishop develops as expected. The latter earned all-state recognition at Milwaukee (Thomas More) in 1981.

The linebacking corps is strong with Dan Turelli, Curt Chybowski, Brian Frantl and Jed Frank all returning. Replacing Patterson and Shroble in the secondary won't be easy, but the most glaring voids are at the defensive end positions and that could present a problem.

Consistency is a goal of the 1983 Warhawks. Perkins wants to avoid the type of 1982 lapse that saw the Warhawks lose to Eau Claire, beat River Falls and eventual champion La Crosse and then bow to Oshkosh in a four-week stretch.

La Crosse runners accomplished the incredible by winning the school's 12th WSUC cross country championship in the last 15 years in 1983. The Indians scored an amazing 19 points by taking five of the first six places, headed by winner Jerry Husz with a time of 25 minutes, two seconds. POINT LEADS NATION IN DEFENSE

Stevens Point's basketball team led the nation in defense for the third straight year, according to the NAIA. The Pointers, who compiled a 26-4 record in 1982-83, allowed opponents only 53.7 points a game. NAIA National Champion Charleston, S.C., ranked second at 54.2.

Coach Dick Bennett's Pointers led NCAA Division III in team defense in 1980-81 and 1981-82, allowing 53.6 and 53.3 points a game, respectively. Point was No. 2 nationally in NCAA Division III this season behind Ohio Northern at 53.6.

PREVIEW OF THE 1983-84 BASKETBALL SEASON  
WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Stevens Point has emerged as the team-to-beat in the Wisconsin State University Conference after Eau Claire dominated that position for so many years. Still, the Pointers face a tough road in their bid for a third straight championship.

Coach Dick Bennett has lost three starters at Stevens Point, including All-Conference John Mack, the WSUC's most valuable player last season. Some people will have to fill the void left by Mack's departure, as well as Fred Stemmeler and Brian Koch, who also are gone.

No team figures to dominate conference basketball as Coach Ken Anderson's Eau Claire Blugolds did for the better part of 13 years. Jim Thies, River Falls sports information director, summed it up recently when he said, "Now there are four or five teams which can play well every night. This makes the conference stronger and more exciting for players, coaches and fans."

Some talented redshirt players and experienced returnees should boost Eau Claire back into contention this season. Tim Petermann, Blugold SID, notes that while the 15-12 record last season was below Anderson's standards, his team was out of only three of its losses.

"Having played in 12 games decided by six or fewer points should benefit the players for next season," Petermann reasons. "The Blugolds did beat two teams--Loras College and St. John's University--which participated in the NAIA Nationals last season," he adds.

The general consensus has Whitewater, Stevens Point, Eau Claire, La Crosse and River Falls battling for the top spot. Whitewater SID Tom Fick believes, "Recruiting will be crucial. If anyone gets a player that can make a major contribution this year, it could tip the balance."

"Also, we may see the best game situation coaches with an edge, making the most of the talent on hand," Fick adds.

The Warhawks are one of the clubs where a player here or there could make a difference. Coach Dave Vander Meulen lost heavily, but he also has a nucleus of strong returnees, battle-hardened by NCAA tournament experience. All-Conference guard Andre McKoy heads this group.

La Crosse's Burt McDonald earned the "coach of the year" citation from his peers for guiding the Indians to a 20-7 season and share of second place in the WSUC. He starts with a strong floor leader in guard Tim Buss and could mold another contender this season.

River Falls lost talented starting guards but it's doubtful Coach Stan Jack will permit much of a letdown after the successful rejuvenation he began two years ago. He can build around two top flight forwards in John Williams and Brian Jass.

Nobody dares count out Stout even though the Blue Devils aren't listed among the leading contenders. Coach Dewey Mintz has a history of building solid clubs with unheralded players. He coached many contenders and three champions in 21 years at Menomonie.

This could be the darkhorse and Mintz says, "The team is on its way back. We have more speed, more shooting and better rebounding in our young players. And, we've had a good recruiting year."

He speaks for the four schools that indirectly are labeled as "also-rans" by their mere elimination from the list of contenders. But, if Oshkosh could perk up its scoring and add a player or two, and Superior finds a big man, there's always the element of surprise. And, remember, Platteville still starts with two-time scoring champion Mike Ehler and that is not a bad way to begin.

One of the charms of a non-scholarship league like the WSUC is that nothing can be taken for granted. One or two players can turn a program into a winner overnight.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983-84

After dominating WSUC basketball for the better part of 13 years, the Blugolds slipped to fifth place last season. That unfamiliar territory was due mainly to a lack of experience. Coach Ken Anderson lost just too many quality players from the year before.

Eau Claire will lose four lettermen from last season but only one, freshman starter Michael Clinton, played in more than half the games. Some quality players return, including All-Conference Tom Saxelby, the team's most valuable player, and Rick Dahl, a deadly outside shooter. Mike Blair, a 6-2 guard who led Mayville to the WIAA state Class B championship last March, has committed to Anderson, and he will add depth to the backcourt.

The Blugolds need a physical player inside and Anderson also is looking for a take-charge team leader on the floor. Keith Knutson led the team in rebounding last season with a 5.5 average, which is the lowest total to lead the Blugolds since Anderson became head coach.

Burt McDonald, who earned "coach of the year" honors with his superb job last season, finds himself in the midst of a rebuilding project that includes searching for an entire new front line. Gone are Bob Wissing, Eric Nordstrom and Mark Bambenek, who headed the Indians in scoring, rebounds and field goal percentage last season.

The strength is in the backcourt where returnees include seniors Tim Buss, Joel Hammond and Dale Tompkins and juniors Mike Reinhart and David Coenen. Buss averaged 10 points and 4.1 assists a game last season. Experience in the backcourt should provide some stability as the frontline matures.

PROSPECTS FOR 1983-84

The key to Oshkosh's success this season is the center spot, where veteran Coach Bob White must find a replacement for All-Conference Kevin Ziegler. Ziegler left as the school's fifth all-time leading scorer and he topped the conference in rebounding last season.

We're a darkhorse team."

No one works harder to turn a program around than Yellowjacket Coach Chris Ritchey and he is continuing the search for excellence this season. The ranks are thin, but he does have two quality returnees in 6-6 center Clendon Gustafson and 6-2 guard Ken Frierson.

These two returning lettermen form the nucleus around whom Ritchey hopes to build a respectable team that can escape the WSUC cellar. Gustafson averaged 14.9 points and eight rebounds a game in the conference last season, while Frierson contributed 12.1 points. Help is expected from 6-8 junior forward Joe Olson from Marinette, who transferred from the University of North Dakota.

"I do not know how to characterize my team at this point," Ritchey says. "It is very incomplete. If I can find two or three good players with experience to go along with the three I have, we could have a winning season."

PROSPECTS FOR 1983-84

The Warhawks enjoyed a banner season in 1982-83, sharing second place in the WSUC, compiling a 25-6 record and qualifying for the NCAA Division III Final Four. Five of Coach Dave Vander Meulen's top eight players are gone, so the rebuilding process must begin immediately.

He starts with a strong nucleus, though, including 6-2 guard Andre McKoy and 6-8 center Mark Linde, both All-Conference performers. McKoy finished third in conference scoring last season (19.8) and he will team in the backcourt with 5-9 Anthony Brazzel, a cat-quick speedster who makes the Warhawks dangerous in the transition game.

Although Vander Meulen must find two quality forwards, the presence of Linde, McKoy and Brazzel should make the Warhawks a prime contender again. McKoy needs 250 points this season to become the school's all-time leading scorer. The veterans still are chasing that elusive brass ring and this is a pivotal season.
