Partial refund of semester tuition and fees is authorized on the following basis to students withdrawing from the University: withdrawal within two weeks from the first day of instruction, 80% refund; within four weeks, 60%; within six weeks, 40%; within eight weeks, 20%; after eight weeks, no refund.

(This is identical with the regulation which prevails on the campus at Madison and at the Milwaukee Extension Division.)

The budget for 1937-38 was then taken up for consideration and explained to the Regents by President Dykstra. A salary reduction scale for members of the staff receiving in excess of \$3000 was presented. This is based upon the following plan and applies to prior base salaries:

No cut on first \$3000 of any salary Any part of 4th \$1000 of each salary is cut 15% Any part of 5th \$1000 of each salary is cut 20% Remainder over 5th \$1000 of each salary is cut 25%

Regent Callahan moved, seconded by Regent Gates, that the budget for 1937-38, totaling \$8,934,731, including all funds, specified and revolving, be adopted, provided that the approval of the budget and all appointments is subject to the reservation by the Regents of the right to modify any of the provisions of the budget or appointments as may become necessary in view of the actual funds which are available for carrying out the budget and the appointments, including any modifications which may become necessary by reason of any action or lack of action by the Emergency Board.

Before the vote was taken President Dykstra presented the following amendment affecting the Medical School:

Reduce item for assistant clerk, bacteriology, p. 119, by \$450.

Reduce item for Kurtz in Medicine, p. 120, from full time to part time at a saving of \$1042.

Eliminate the item for instructor in clinical pathology, p. 121, at a saving of \$2500.

Increase the salary of Dr. M. Harrison Seevers from \$3850 to \$4000, at a cost of \$150.

Increase the salary of Dr. Raymond C. Herrin from \$3000 to \$3500, at a cost of \$500.

These items constitute a net saving of \$3342, to be transferred to Regents' Unassigned.

Upon motion of Regent Brown it was VOTED, That the recommendation of Regent Gates be approved.

VOTED, That a committee consisting of Regent Gates, Business Manager Phillips (or Mr. Peterson in the absence of Mr. Phillips), Superintendent Gallistel, Director Halverson and Dean Greeley be appointed to aid in preparing plans for new dormitories.

At the request of Regent Brown, Chairman of the Educational Committee, the matter of the study of the situation in the English department was postponed to the next meeting of the Board.

Reference was made to Bill 309 S, authorizing the Regents to reduce non-resident tuition fees in certain cases and action on this matter was postponed to the next meeting of the Board.

Consideration of a communication from Hoyt Trowbridge which was previously referred to the Educational Committee was postponed to the next meeting of the Board.

President Dykstra reported upon the request of Professor F. D. Cheydleur for an appropriation of \$2000 per annum to provide for placement and attainment examinations. Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Brown, it was

VOTED, That one-half of this amount, \$1000, be appropriated at this time, charged to Regents' Unassigned. (This leaves open for the present the matter of whether an additional \$1000 may be received later.)

Upon recommendation of President Dykstra and upon motion of Regent Christopherson, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was papersVOTED, That \$500 be appropriated for the publication of research/in mathematics and physics.

Upon recommendation of President Dykstra and upon motion of Regent Glover, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was VOTED, That Joseph Audley Sharpe be appointed assistant professor of geology for the year 1937-38 at a salary of \$3200.

Upon recommendation of the President and upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Combs, it was

VOTED, That a grant of \$300 from the American Medical Association for work by Dr. F. Hellebrandt in the Department of Physiology be accepted.

Upon motion of Regent Callahan, seconded by Regent Combs, it

VOTED, That the renewal of the grant of \$1500 from E. R. Squibbs & Sons Company for research work in cyclopropone be approved. Regents Grady and Brown wished to be recorded as voting "No" because they believed the fund to be solicited. Regents Runge and Wilkie stated that they were voting "Aye" because they believed the fund was not solicited.

It was VOTED, That the position of housing inspectress be changed from half time to full time and that the salary be increased to \$100 per month on the ten-month basis.

The Secretary reported that the trustees of the M. W. McArdle Estate were meeting to discuss the matter of the sale of the remaining property, the hotel known as Maxwelton Braes, near Sturgeon Bay, and that the trustees would meet at the hotel on July 14. The Regents have a one-fifth interest in the property. Upon motion of Regent Brown it was

VOTED, That the Executive Committee be authorized to act for the Regents in concluding the sale.

President Wilkie announced that the Regents would now go into executive session.

The matter of the salaries of deans was discussed and it was voted to vote vote at the next meeting of the Board.

Jackson of the Madison Foundation telephoned the Regents that the Sons of Veterans of the Civil War wished to present to the Regents a bronze tablet containing the Lincoln Gettysburg address, at the time of the G.A.R. Reunion, Upon motion of Regent Brown, seconded by Regent Callahan, it was

by Regent Callahan, it was
VOTED, That the gift be accepted. (See also Ex Com. aug 24/37, p.17)

The minutes of the executive session of the Regents held on June 16, 1936, relating to the status of Dr. W. E. Meanwell, which were deleted from the minutes of the meeting held on that date, were read to the Board. Upon motion of Regent Gates, seconded by Regent Brown, it

VOTED, That Dr. Meanwell be continued in his present status until the next meeting of the Board, at which time the matter is to be considered in open session, and Dr. Lorenz requested to be present.

# At this point the Regents arose from executive ses-

Upon motion of Regent Brown, seconded by Regent Gates, it VOTED, That all matters passed by the Regents while in executive session be now approved by the Board.

The meeting adjourned at 2:15 P.M., subject to the call of the President.
