# RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

- Letters and Science -

 That W. H. Twenhofel, professor of geology, on leave of absence, be paid \$100 in lieu of expenses in connection with a conference of graduate students in geology during the month of April, 1932; charge to L. & S. travel, p. 38. Adopted.

2. That Nathan L. Silverstein, assistant in economics, be paid an additional sum of \$300 for research work for four months (total for the semester \$550), beginning March 1, 1932; charge to assistants in economics, p. 44, fund 1A. Adopted.

3. That Merrill Murray, assistant in economics, be paid an additional sum of \$50 for research work (total for the semester \$425) for two months, beginning March 1, 1932; charge to assistants in economics, p. 44, fund 1A. Adopted.

4. That R. J. Havighurst, assistant professor of physics, be granted leave of absence from March 14 to May 14, 1932, without pay; and that his salary be accordingly reduced \$666.66. Adopted.

5. That Freeman Butts be appointed assistant in the Experimental College from March 14 to April 5, 1932; salary \$75 for the period; charge to balance on salary of R. J. Havighurst, on leave of absence. Adopted. 6. That Hoyt Trowbridge be appointed assistant in the Experimental College from March 14 to April 5, 1932; salary 975 for the period; charge to balance on salary of R. J. Havighurst, on leave of absence.

7. That the salary of Wayne T. Sproull, assistant in physics, be increased by \$87.50 per month for two months, beginning March 15, 1932, on account of additional teaching; increase, \$175, to be charged to balance on salary of R. J. Havighurst, on leave of absence.

8. V That \$25 be transferred from the balance on salary of R. J. Havighurst, on leave of absence, to extra clerical help, physics. Adopted.

9. That C, N, Wise be appointed assistant in speech for the second semester of 1931-32; salary \$125 for the semester; charge to Regents' Unassigned. Adopted.

10. That an appropriation of \$125 be made from Regents Unassigned for the Department of Speech (Forensics) to cover traveling expenses for the balance of the year, Adopted.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

1. That upon the recommendation of President Frank, \$150.00 be transferred from Regents' Unassigned 1A to the Committee on Loans and Undergraduate Scholarships for clerical help. (Confirming verbal approval of March 11, 1932.) Adopted.

2. That the President and the Business Manager be authorized to set up the details of the radio broadcasting budget for the balance of this fiscal year within the total amount available from the grant by the Emergency Board and the contributions by other State Departments, with the understanding that operating costs not exceeding, \$600 for the month of March, 1932, may be charged to Regents' Unassigned 1-A, in accordance with the action of the Regents dated March 9, 1932. 4. V That the dividend stock of Chapter House Association of Kappa Kappa Gamma coming to the University from the estate of Mary Hill, par value \$2800, be offered to the Association at 50% of par value, or \$1400 cash. Adopted.

✓ President Frank presented a communication from Professor Bennett, dated March 25, 1932, with a suggested plan for the acquiring of radio station WISJ, involving an appropriation of \$3500 from the Emergency Board. Professor Bennett was present and discussed the situation. The following recommendation was presented by the President:

V That the President and Business Manager be directed to confer with the Governor regarding the purpose of the State respecting the support of the operation of WHA after June 30, 1932, and, contingent upon State support outside existing university funds, of the operating budget of WHA, to negotiate for the purchase of the WISJ towers and building.

Regent Richardson, who was unable to attend the meeting, was reached on the telephone and this recommendation was approved by Regents Callahan and Richardson. Regent Wilkie was excused from voting.
