



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

### A FEW WORDS ABOUT THE MICHIGAN TRANSIT CO.

The Michigan Transit Co. serves practically all Northern Michigan ports from Ludington to Mackinac

Island, inclusive, and Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., with an unusually efficient and popular service.

During the season of 1921 the company will operate the modern palatial steel steamships "Manitou," "Puritan," and "Missouri." The "Manitou" will perform the express service between Chicago and Charlevoix, Petoskey, Harbor Springs and Mackinac Island as usual; the "Puritan" will make the run between Chicago, Frankfort and Traverse Bay, touching at principal intermediate ports and the "Missouri" will run through to Sault Ste. Marie, Mich., touching in both directions at Charlevoix, Petoskey, Harbor Springs and Mackinac Island. The 6-day trip of the "Missouri" offers a delightful, healthful and economical cruise of Lake Michigan, St. Mary's River, portion of Georgian Bay and Grand Traverse Bay. This is the most enjoyable cruise on the Great Lakes. Ample time is allowed at all ports of call for sightseeing.

### THE MUNICIPAL PIER, OUR CHICAGO TERMINAL

The steamships of the MICHIGAN TRANSIT CO. dock at the Municipal Pier, at the foot of Grand Avenue, just north of the Chicago River. Nowhere else are there such excellent steamship facilities or such attractive provision for the comfort and convenience of the traveler by water. Open-air promenades, large, airy waiting and rest rooms, a restaurant, observation towers from which one may look far out over the broad expanse of Lake Michigan or over Chicago's wonderful, serrated sky-line—all combine to make the Municipal Pier an object of interest and enjoyment in itself, as well as a point of happy leave-taking and joyful home-coming.


