The Versatile Real Estate Agent Disappears in New York.

HIS WIFE ARRIVES ONLY TO FIND HE IS GONE.

He Arrives in New York and Leaving the Fifth Avenue Hotel the Next Day Is Never Seen Again—A Two Days' Search by the Police and His Wife Fails to Discover Any Trace of Him, and Mrs. De Leur Starts for Home.

New York, Dec. 11.—Albert De Leur of Milwaukee arrived in this city from Chicago on Thursday, Dec. 1. He went to the Fifth Avenue hotel, where he had stayed during previous trips, and before going to his room sent a dispatch to his wife in Milwaukee, saying that he was all right and would be home on the following Monday, Dec. 5. The morning of Sunday, Dec. 4, Mr. De Leur walked out of the Fifth Avenue hotel, leaving in his room a small handbag, his only article of baggage, and saying nothing to anybody. He had neither been seen nor heard from since by the hotel people, and that he did not go home was indicated, first, by the receipt for the key to the hotel, which was being inquired as to his whereabouts, and then by her presence there due to her anxiety about him. She arrived last Tuesday night, but was unable to get any trace of her husband, and yesterday at noon she went to police headquarters. Sgt. Frank Robb, who was in charge of the bureau of information there, searched, but found nothing about her husband. Then, at her request, a general alarm was sent out over the police wires to all the stations, giving a description of Mr. De Leur.

Mrs. De Leur, on returning to the Fifth Avenue hotel, had lunch, and at 1:30 drove to the Desbrosses street ferry in time to catch the 2 o'clock ferryboat for the West. She said she was going back to Milwaukee. Her departure was evidently the result of a sudden decision, and she was not known to have left. She left on Friday and Saturday with William Conaghan, the Fifth Avenue hotel detective, in visiting the hospitals of the city and the morgues, but he found nothing. She went to Blackwell's island to-morrow. The detective took her to police headquarters on Saturday, and then she said she did not want an alarm sent out, but she had changed her mind regarding this to-day and it is supposed that she could do, and so started for home. She took her husband and his wife, and she told the detective that she had several attacks of nervous prostration and had gone away mysteriously once before. That was about seven years ago, when she was without telling anybody that he was going, left home and nothing was heard from him for two weeks. When he returned his only explanation was that he had been away on business. She also said that he had spent a little time in a asylum and her theory for his present disappearance was that his mind again became affected and that he would never return. 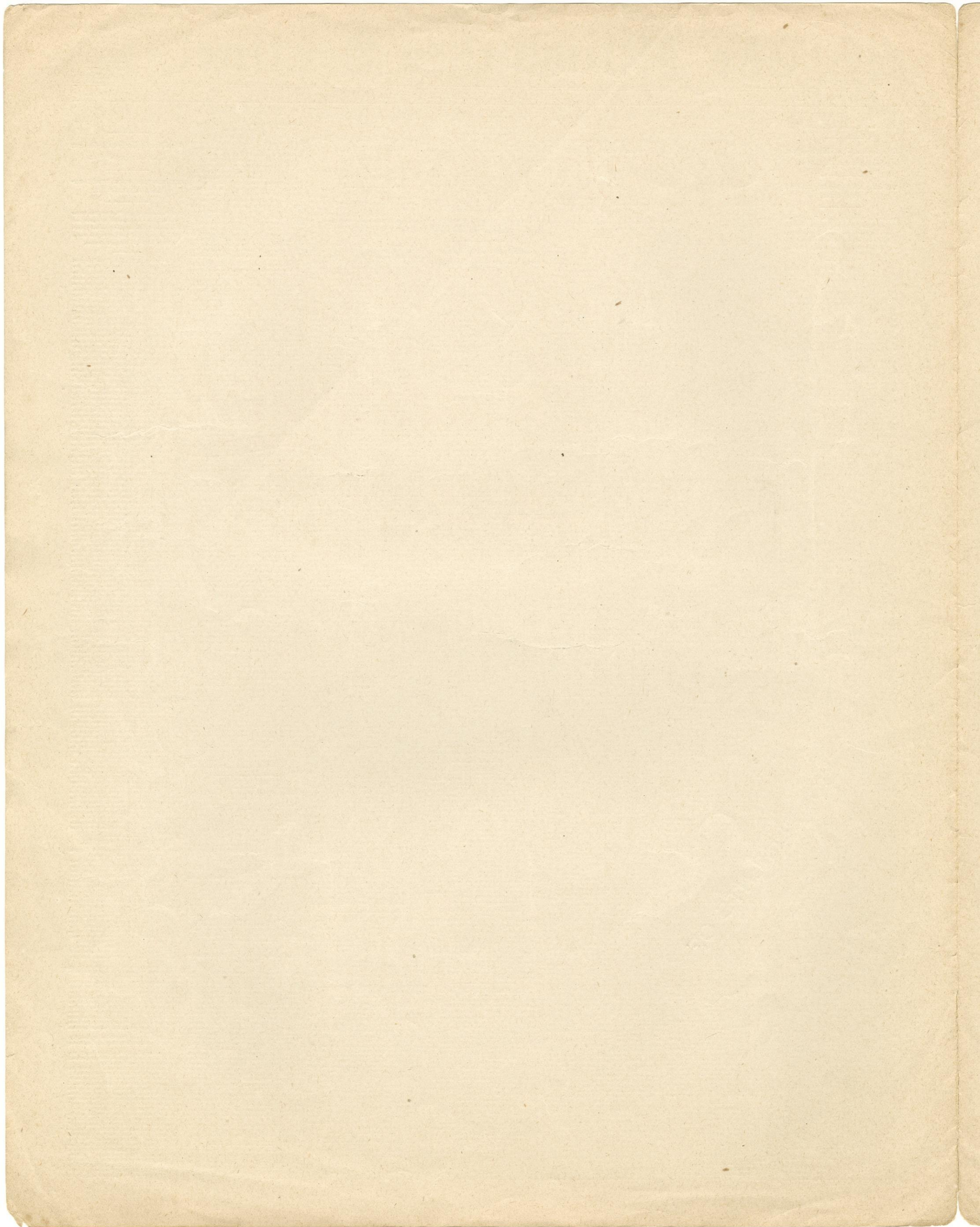

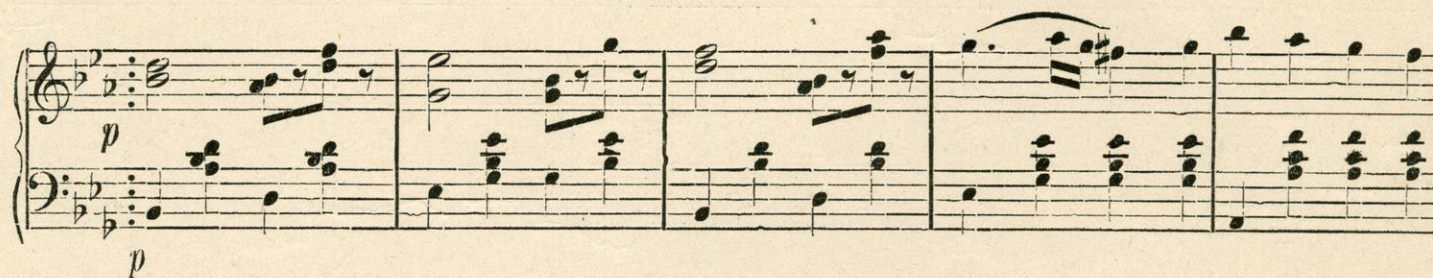

Fourth system of piano accompaniment. Treble and bass staves. Dynamics: *ff* (last measure).



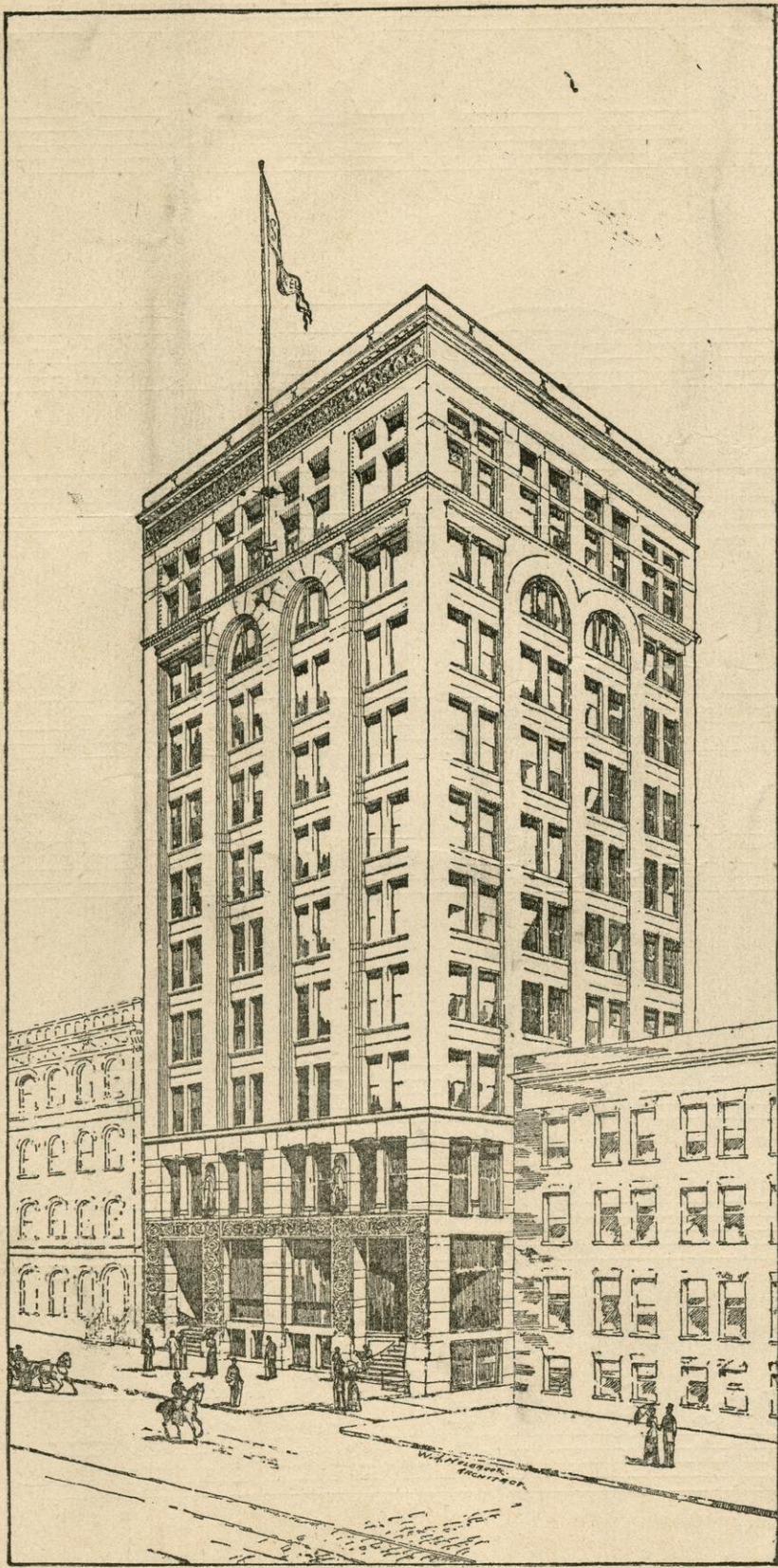
