Just as another American Citizen I am writing to you, in order to know, if my wife and myself, should consider to be interned for the duration of the war.

We have been arrested on December 8th, 1941, by the F.B.I. of Honolulu, T.H.

On the 18th of December, a warrant was read to me and on December 23rd, 1941, my wife and myself had a hearing at the Immigration Station in Honolulu.

During this hearing witnesses expressed under oath that Mr. and Mrs. Smith were loyal, true, and faithful, and sincere citizens.

It had been testified, that I am the owner of the Hawaiian Roofing and Paint Company, that I have been in Honolulu, since October 31, 1934, naturalized on May 25th, 1940 in Honolulu, changed name by order of Court from SCHMIDT TO SMITH, wife naturalized on the same date, that we have home on 2825 Park Street, Nuuanu, valued at \$20,000 with balance of \$2000.00 then, that I have \$12,000 in Cash Notes, and \$2,000 Cash on Hand. My income according to my statement about \$1,000 each month, but \$700 to \$1,000 according to the Tax Acct, Mr. Cameron all Taxes are paid. We have traveled around the world, from Honolulu, we also visited the mainland several times, incl. Mexico City and Havana, Cuba (1941)

I have no police record whatsoever.

On December 28th, 1941 I was ordered detained to Sand Island, on January 17th, 1942 my wife arrived from the Immigration

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Station in Honolulu, also detained.

We both have been told by authorities, that if we were innocent, we should know what to expect.

On January 20th, 1942, I was requested by F.B.I. Agent to state my life history. On February 17th, I was ordered to the Immigration Station in Honolulu, now requested to sign my name to a paper as an Alien Enemy. I protested, but had been told that I must sign, so I did:

On February 20th, I had been sent to San Francisco, Angels Island, where other papers did call for, Prisoner of War. On March 6th, together with 12 other U.S. Citizens, we were taken to Oakland, California depot and sent to the above address. Since March 9th I have been here and wondering, if my so long expected release is coming from Washington.

At the present time I do not know the whereabouts of my wife. Last address know, Sand Island, Detention Camp.

My citizen papers No. 4721409, Petition No. 3723 is in my possession. I am still asking why my wife, who had a hearing of five minutes, and why I am interned as an American citizen. Please help me. Thank you. Aloha.

My income according to my statement about \$1,000 each month, but \$700 to \$1,000 according to the Tax Acct. Mrs. Cameron all taxes are paid. We have traveled around the world, from Honolulu, we also visited Hawaii several times, incl. Mexico City and Havana, Cuba (1941)

I have no police record whatsoever.

Dear Sir:

I have to write to you for your help and assistance and hope to know, that you will give to my family and myself your cooperation. At the same time I am sorry to bother you with my own affairs, knowing that you must be very occupied at a time like ours now. But who could I see for help? My wife was born on the Island of Kauai, T.H. she spent all her life on the Islands but two (1927-1928). In these two years she visited the United States and Europe. Since 1928 she never left the Islands again which are always everything to her. When she married me she lost her citizenship, but regained it again after a short period. My oldest girl (step-daughter) was born on Oahu. She attended Punahou and Roosevelt High. At the age of 15 we decided to give her a trip around the world, to get her away from the company she was getting into and the attitude of which was not to Mrs. Berg's and my liking. She was caught up with her which she happened to be in Germany, but managed to come back to her native land in August, 1941. My other two little girls were born in Oahu. Now since the 8th of December my wife and my oldest daughter are interned on Sand Island. You can imagine how a mother will feel to be separated from her children, in her own country which she loves, for no reason whatsoever.

She had her own business which, she had built up through hard work during the last six, seven years. This business (Rest home for old people) which gave her an income of 500-800 dollars monthly has been wrecked. Due to her arrest. I'm a loyal American citizen never having been away from Oahu since 1928. I worked for American firms only and at the time of my arrest I was employed by Sears, as Shop-Superintendent. During the last seven years Mrs. Berg and myself saved all the money we were able to and invested same in real-estate. At the time of our arrest we were the owners of nine houses. How long we do not know. The houses are mortgaged, and our source of income has been destroyed. Why all this?

When somebody made a mistake why let it out on loyal citizens, women, and children. They called us enemy aliens and forced us to sign papers to that fact against our protest. There are 40,000 aliens in the islands, why pick on us citizens. Are there really people in this country, so feeble-minded to think, that we would help any foreign nation to blow up or destroy our lovely islands, in which we invested the earning of our life. Here in this camp we are 13 citizens all from Hawaii and we have been told again and again to be patient, everything is in such a terrible state of confusion and matters would be straightened out very speedily. Where ever we came on our trip to this camp, people were

You as our Delegate to Congress from our lovely Hawaii ought to be able to help me in the following matter.

I am an American citizen since June 28, 1930, (No. 3187685) and have lived in Hawaii since 1924.

Here I am interned with a bunch of aliens, Gestapo agents, 5th column and Nazi agents who are making fun about our American citizenship.

I have been interned as a Prisoner of War 5000 miles from my wife, Mrs. Frances Beyer (formerly Miss Frances Brickwood Fraado, who is part Hawaiian) and deprived of all rights and privileges so stated in the Constitution as well as the rights of other citizens.

On December 8th I have been taken from my wife and home for a hearing, and detained at the Immigration Station in Honolulu. On December 18th a warrant has been read to a group of us and charged as an enemy alien.

I am retired of my business (Potato chips and catering) sold in 1940, since then I bought the apartment building at 811 Lunaliilo Street. In 1932 I served the jury in the Maassie case, and ever since I have had very few dealings with the Navy Yard in business. That were a great point for giving the business up.

I would like to know if I am interned for good, or what else I have to expect. Besides me, 12 other American citizens are interned here from Honolulu. Thanking you, Aloha

Dear Mr. Secretary:

I am one of 13 U. S. citizens of German extraction who are interned here at Camp McCoy. Although our personal history is somewhat alike, I prefer to give you mine individually, so as not to cause any confusion. We are all from Honolulu.

Born in Germany, arrived in the U. S. in 1929, in Honolulu in 1932, resided there ever since. Naturalized in 1935. My wife, born in Germany, arrived in the U. S. in 1928, naturalized also in 1935. Married since Jan. 1936. At present (?) employed as the Accountant of the Ready-Mix-Concrete Company, Ltd. in Honolulu, a defense industry firm. We own our own house.

Both my wife and myself have always conducted ourselves not only like any good American-born, but by reason of our European experience have deeply appreciated our new Country, and have taken our Oath of Allegiance very serious.

We were arrested in Honolulu on December 8th and charged with "under suspicion of being an Enemy-Alien," a charge easily disproved by our bona-fide citizenship papers.

Our Board hearing (or should I say my board hearing, since I have not spoken to my wife since 1/8/41) in my opinion proved my loyalty, supplemented by 100% vouching of my 3 witnesses. From then on I have waited for my release daily, fully understanding that due to the unexpected happenings of Dec. 7th, it may take a certain time.

On February 20th, we (the 13 citizens plus 175 aliens) were taken to San Francisco and then to this Internment Camp, Camp McCoy.

I do not know where my wife is. She was interned at Sand Island as of 2/17. My wife doesn't know where I am. I have never been charged with anything beyond the aforementioned, and this has been disproved. I have never been informed why I am interned, and what to expect.

Now, here at McCoy, new complications arise. We 13 are the only citizens here, all others are aliens, and from what I have heard, mostly pro-Nazi. Among them is the Bund-Leader from Los Angeles and his Group. We still consider our Oath of Allegiance to the American Flag as binding, but at present are very confused. Living together with Nazis, we want to discuss our Country's Fate, but how can we when we see their eyes gleam when the Radio

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reports German and Japanese successes, and hear their joy.

We have asked these people to please consider our status as U. S. citizens, but we are being laughed at: You can take your Citizen papers and - - - -. I am afraid that serious fractions, even assaults will arise shortly, unless, of course, we are ready to agree with Nazi opinions.

This letter is therefore directed to the Secretary of War to kindly speed up our cases. We have for over 3 months patiently waited to be released, because we are Americans, and want to do our share - OUTSIDE.

We believe in our adopted Country and its future, and we do not, we cannot listed to daily glorifications of the Axis. Are we orphans now, because we happen to have been born in Germany?

I have written in general, for everybody of us 13, but as far as I myself am concerned, I know that I have never had a clearer conscience.

Dear Sir:

The Provost Marshal General has directed me to answer your letter of June 13, 1942, regarding the release of you and Mrs. Walther.

Considerations of national security, dependent upon the military factors involved, governed the decision of the Commanding General, Hawaiian Department, who interned you and your wife upon the findings and recommendations of a board of civilians before whom your hearings were held. The hearing thus afforded you was not held as a matter of right, but was allowed in order to avoid injustice.

Since the release of you and Mrs. Walther is of primary interest to the Commanding General, Hawaiian Department, Fort Shafter, T. H., your letter has been forwarded to him for his consideration. In order to secure your releases, however, it will be necessary for you to prove to the satisfaction of the Hawaiian Department, that such releases would in no way endanger the public safety of the United States or be detrimental to the war effort.

I am begging you for some assistance. I live in Honolulu since 1932 became a citizen of U.S.A., in U.S. District Court in Honolulu in 1935, and also a registered voter in Honolulu. I was arrested at my place of occupation, the Waialeale Training School where I hold a position as Steward since May, 1940. I was also employed four years as Executive Chef at the Young Hotel, and had the honor to cook for Our President at Schofield during his visit in Honolulu in 1934. My fate since December 8, 1941 is the same as the other 12 U.S. Citizens of Hawaii.

I sincerely believed and whatever may happen always keep my oath of allegiance. Three well-known Honolulu citizens have testified as to my loyalty. Mr. King we are at war, a war for justice and freedom and I am sure favors can not be granted, only justice. Three months of undeserved imprisonment is a long time. As a loyal citizen of the United States and a registered voter of Honolulu I hope you will check on my case.

Dear Sir:

At the suggestion of Colonel Weber of the Provost Marshal's Office in Chicago, we are writing you to see whether or not you will grant the writer an interview with Alfred B. M. Smith, one of your internees. We would like to have this interview on some day next week, preferably after March 30th, either on Tuesday, March 31, Wednesday, April 1 or Friday, April 3. If it cannot be arranged that soon, of course we shall arrange our time accordingly. A choice of dates would be preferable. If it must be on a week-end we shall so arrange our affairs.

For your information, the request for this interview comes as a result of a letter written by Mr. Smith to the late Senator Charles S. Deneen, who until his death in 1940 was a senior member of this firm. It seems that Senator Deneen has assisted Mr. Smith back in 1930 on a question of proper entry into the United States. Mr. Smith asked Senator Deneen to look into his matter and if there was merit in it to see if he could represent him. As former partners of Senator Deneen we have continued the business of the firm and of the Senator's, and consequently we have made a preliminary investigation of the matter with the proper army officers in Chicago and, through our associate, with the War Department in Washington. We can find no record of the reason for Mr. Smith being taken into custody by the Army Intelligence.

Frankly, what we want to do is to find out whether this is a case of where this man is an actual enemy of the country (even though a naturalized citizen) and, if so, we do not want to have anything to do with his matter, or if he is a person who, in the natural excitement following the bombing of Pearl Harbor, was taken into custody and is innocent. If the latter we feel that he is entitled to representation. We make this explanation because we want you to know that we approach this with the attitude of cooperation. Since at the present time there are apparently no records as to the reason Mr. Smith was taken into custody, we thought that by a conference with him we might be able to learn with what charges

Dear Mr. King:

I presume that you have heard already from Francis Evans and my wife, how I as a loyal U.S. Citizen have been turned into an enemy alien overnight, the day after the Japs turned our 'Paradise of the Pacific', into the 'Hell of the Pacific', and since then have been interned as an enemy alien.

At my hearing I had five prominent Honolulu citizens, Frank Thompson, Senator Farrington, Alvah Scott, Nolle Smith, and John R. Fleming stake their reputations against mine and vouched for me 100% that I am a loyal U.S. Citizen and a good American.

So far I haven't heard of any charges against me from the authorities who are responsible for my internment and I bet my right arm that they cant, no matter how much they try to pin something on me, find any charges against me, except that I happen to be born in Germany.

I shall not elaborate on the details under which I had to labor since December 8, 1941. I realize the confusion that exists as the result of the war and have been very patient. I took it on the chin like every good American would do under the circumstances, hoping that sooner or later it all will be straightened out. But when the Authorities in power throw me in a concentration camp with Bund Leaders, Gestapos and Nazi sympathizers, that's going a little too far. That is more than any good American can swallow and for this reason I call on you as our Delegate to Congress to look into my case in Washington and stop them from making such a mockery out of our citizens papers and our Constitutional rights. War or no War. Any good American wants to be an asset to his country and not a liability. And I for one, despite being very disappointed, humiliated and disgraced, and the embarrassment that my wife had to suffer, a third generation American born girl of British extraction. I am still a firm believer in our democracy and I want to do my share with Aliens who make fun of our Citizenship and Constitution.

Please let me hear from you soon and try to clarify my status.

My dear General Gullion:

I had rather suspected that you and I would be again doing business when another war came upon us — and I was not in error!

A situation has been called to our attention which, in our judgment, deserves your personal and prompt action. It appears that some thirteen naturalized American citizens were arrested in Hawaii by agents of the F.B.I. and turned over to the military authorities, evidently on suspicion of disloyalty. No specific charges were brought, however, other than a general statement in the warrant of arrest. No hearings were held, so far as we are advised. The men were deported from Honolulu to the mainland and are now in Camp McCoy, Wisconsin. We have the names of several of the men at Camp McCoy; apparently the spokesman of the group is G. Herbert Walther. No response has been made to their appeals except by Delegate Samuel W. King of Hawaii.

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Without having more than ex parte facts, it would seem clear that these men should be released at once. We have advised them that we would assist, if they so desire, in bringing a writ of habeas corpus. We trust that your action may make that unnecessary.

MEMORANDUM for the Files.

1. On Saturday, April 4, 1942, a telegram was received from Roger N. Baldwin, American Civil Liberties Union, as follows:

"May we kindly request reply to our letter of March 25 concerning citizens held at Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, without charges or hearings. Regret that if War Department does not accord them their obvious rights, we shall be obliged to take matter into civil courts this week."

I read the above telegram over the telephone to Mr. Edward Ennis of the Department of Justice, who stated that in accordance with the conversation between Mr. Gitlin of Mr. Ennis' office and me last night on the same subject, he was submitting a memorandum to Mr. Biddle with reference to the legal propriety of Mr. Baldwin's action in encouraging litigation by the offer of free legal assistance. I told him that a letter on that subject was going forward to him today inclosing a copy of a letter dated March 25, 1942, from Mr. Baldwin to Mr. Herbert Walther, an interne at Camp McCoy.

2. As we have already replied to Mr. Baldwin's letter of March 25, I propose to take no action with reference to his telegram quoted above. I read the telegram to Mr. Ennis. Mr. Ennis suggested that he would talk to Mr. Biddle about the advisability of asking Mr. Baldwin to withhold the initiation of any court action until the Department of Justice had had an opportunity to examine the details of the alleged internment of American citizens. He suggested that he would not dignify the matter by having Mr. Biddle call Mr. Baldwin in person but that he, Mr. Ennis, would do so. He asked me what I thought of the advisability of making a determination

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of the citizenship of the Germans to the end that if such citizenship was established, they might be released and I told him that we were considering the idea ourselves but that the War Department did not want to be put in the position of taking any other stand than that it was the custodian of persons duly committed to it; that if the Department of Justice should determine either through investigation or hearings that these Germans were in fact citizens, and should the Department of Justice recommend their release, I believe that the War Department might comply with that recommendation. We both agreed that in the case of the Japanese, an entirely different situation existed and that the release of the Germans would offer no precedent for the release of the Japanese. Furthermore, it was agreed that there would be no difficulty in keeping the Japanese out of Hawaii or away from the Pacific Coast if they were released. Mr. Ennis said that he would ask Mr. Biddle to confer with General Gullion regarding this matter and if they should agree to releasing the Germans, it might be a method by which court proceedings could be deferred.

3. I also spoke to Mr. Ennis regarding another matter. A letter had been received in this office from Mr. Craven, The United States Attorney at Reno, Nevada, addressed to The Attorney General. That letter had been transmitted to us by a memorandum from Mr. Ennis. Prior to my talk with Mr. Ennis, I had talked to Colonel Bendetson in San Francisco and had told him that Mr. Craven had complained that copies of General DeWitt's proclamations, of which I believe there are five, had not reached Mr. Craven and that in view of the duties which had been placed by law and by Executive Order on the United States Attorney, Mr. Craven felt that he was entitled to receive such material. Bendetson told me that there may have been some slip-ups in furnishing information to all concerned prior to the time that he took over but that since that time he had made up rather complete mailing lists and that Mr. Craven was now and had been for sometime on the mailing list. Bendetson said that he would give the matter special attention and write to Mr. Craven and send him everything that had been published to date. I so informed Mr. Ennis and told him that we would so state in our letter replying to his memorandum.

Dear Mr. McCloy:

We are appreciative of your telegram stating that "there are some Jap deportees from Hawaii still in this country but they are being moved from Camp McCoy."

We do not understand your reference to Jap deportees. We did not know of Japanese-Americans so held. Our communications have been with naturalized Americans of Italian and German extraction.

If there are American citizens from Hawaii of whatever ancestry held by the military authorities in this country, obviously they should be either released or returned to Hawaii. Will you be good enough to let us know whether the men to whom you refer are American citizens, and whether they are being returned to Hawaii or sent elsewhere in this country?

As you know, we are exceedingly reluctant to resort to the courts to correct any irregularity which we feel the War Department itself should handle without intervention by private citizens. But you will understand our obligations are such that we must act through the courts if any American citizens continue to be improperly held. We would appreciate your further information.

"Camp McCoy, a large military camp, is being constructed near Sparta, Wisconsin. On its grounds is located an enemy alien detention camp. A large number of German aliens are interned there."

"Recently one prominent German alien was permitted to have a woman friend from a distant city call on him. Other aliens visit the Camp Exchange to enjoy their drinks. Others are allowed to conduct the services in the Camp Chapel for the American soldiers. It is also reported that the Commanding Officer of Camp McCoy is of German nationality."

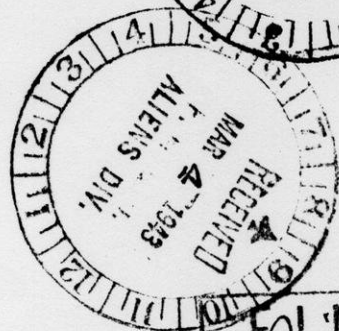
1. In compliance with paragraph 2, Section 4, Chapter XII, Tentative War Department Regulations Governing Civilian Enemy Aliens and Prisoners of War, Report of Punishment on internees at this station is submitted for February, 1943, as follows:

a. On February 8, 1943 Herman D. Wolkittel, ISN-48-G-124-CI, while on a coal hauling detail, refused to work, and used profane language in telling the truck driver in charge of the detail that he, Herman D. Wolkittel, would not work. The circumstances surrounding the event were personally investigated, and oral testimony given by individuals concerned was considered.

b. Forfeiture of one week's allowance (7 days) was imposed as a punishment.
