Regent Hassett, reported that the main issue at the July VTAE Board meeting was the upcoming biennial budget, the effort being to bring the VTAE request up to the level of the K-12 system, which would require an increase of nearly 60 percent in state aids for the VTAE System. The budget was to be discussed at the September meeting. The suggestion had been made that the 1.5 mill levy limit be lifted in order to give local districts more freedom to tax for programs they wanted, but there was considerable opposition to eliminating that limit. At the same time, there was a request to allow district VTAE boards to be elected, rather than appointed.

## Report on Recent Activities

Noting that the last month had been an especially busy one. Regent Weinstein reported that he and President Shaw had spent a great deal of time looking at some of the opportunities and challenges facing the UW System. President Weinstein also had sent individual letters to all legislators offering to meet with them at any time. In addition, he had sent 130 letters of appreciation to faculty and staff who were granted emeritus status this year. These people had devoted a composite total of 3,605 years of service to the UW System, averaging about 27.7 years each.

The following statement was made by Regent President Weinstein: "Since our last meeting, there have been two organized public campaigns which, in part, have targeted the UW System in their assault on what the sponsors term is excessive state spending. One has come from a group which calls itself "The Council of Small Business Executives." It has produced a video tape called "Choices" which many of you viewed, and I thought it was important that we make that available to you. The other originated from the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce Association, first through its newsletter in July and subsequently in a series of pamphlets.

"As a member of the Wisconsin business community since 1949 and as a native of this state, I want to now publicly disassociate myself from both groups on this issue. It is my opinion that we would be misled if we interpreted or accepted their conclusions as representing all, or even the vast majority, of Wisconsin's business leaders. Their views also run contrary to the long established state and national tradition of providing quality public higher education to all those who can benefit from it, no matter whether they be rich or poor, men or women, the children of immigrants like myself, minorities or disadvantaged citizens.

"Quality public education is our noble way of sharing the opportunities of our democracy with all Americans. It is our principal response to the ugliness of ignorance, discrimination and elitism, no matter the form.

Importantly, quality education will, without question, assist Wisconsin business and industry in achieving meaningful economic growth and stability.

"President Shaw has publicly commented on the 'Choices' video tape, and I am pleased that he has done so. Copies of his public response have been sent to Regents and are available to others upon request. We cannot and should not tacitly accept broad and undocumented assertions which distort the true picture of public higher education in this state. We must appropriately respond and rebut such undeserved allegations, no matter how dramatically they may be posed or what medium they employ.

"Both groups have taken, in my opinion, an extremely short-sighted view of our state and of the aspirations of our citizens. They would measure the quality of our society by how little we spend, rather than by what we value.

"Yesterday, I sent a letter to the president of Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce communicating my views on their campaign which is now statewide. I would like to share that letter with you now."

Amendment to Chapter V, Section 1, of the Bylaws of the Board of Regents Relating to Placing Items on the Board's Agenda, R3619, pp 3-5 4 EX. B

Introducing Resolution 3619, President Weinstein noted that, as required by the bylaws, the proposed amendment was set forth in the notice of the meeting and that the bylaws also provided that amendments must be approved by an affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the board. He thanked Regent Vice President Schilling for his constructive input in V helping to bring this matter forward.

Regent Schenian moved and Regent Finlayson seconded the following resolution:

Resolution 3619: That the attached amendment to Chapter 5, Section 1, of the bylaws of the Board of Regents be adopted.

(The amendment is attached as EXHIBIT B.)

Regent Flores referred to the sentence which read as follows: appeals of matters which have been through the institution governance process, the President shall verify that all institution procedures have been exhausted and will then determine whether, in the President's judgment, the Board of Regents should consider the matter." If the same matter arose at several institutions, he asked whether institutional procedures on all the involved campuses had to be exhausted before the matter could be brought forward.

In that case, President Shaw replied, he could decide to bring the matter to the board as a policy issue, rather than an appeal, without waiting an unduly long time for all procedures on each campus to be completed.

Regent Clusen referred to the sentence which read as follows: "If the President of the Board determines that the matter should not be considered by the Board, any member of the Board may request that the matter be considered by the Board." She asked if the members of the board would be apprised of the decision to deny an appeal and if it was necessary to include words to that effect in the bylaws.

President Weinstein agreed that the board should be notified if an appeal had been denied.

Regent Schilling cautioned against including language in the bylaws which might set a rigid requirement for the president to report to the board on large volumes of correspondence.

Regent Clusen said she would be satisfied with verbal assurance that the board would be advised of cases which were significant or raised fundamental questions.

In response to a question by Regent Hanson, President Shaw said the number of complaints had been relatively small, perhaps in part because the procedure was not clearly laid out. He suggested that copies of letters of denial be sent to all regents, any of whom could then request further information if they wished.

Regent Fish inquired about the chancellors' views of the proposed amendment.

Chancellor Shain replied that the amendment would codify current practice, and Chancellor Penson recommended that it be approved with no changes. No chancellor expressed opposition to the amendment.

It was moved by Regent Schenian and seconded by Regent Grover that the words "positive or negative" be inserted after the words "President of the University of Wisconsin System and carry his or her recommendation." Regent Schenian explained that the purpose of his amendment was to make clear that, although the president might make a negative recommendation on the substance of an issue, he still might consider it an important enough policy matter for the board to decide.

It was noted by Regent Schilling that a recommendation might be neither positive nor negative.

On a voice vote, the amendment failed.

Regent Schenian then suggested addition of language at the end of the proposed language to state: "allowing for immediate appeal to the next level of authority."

Regent Flores felt the additional wording was not necessary, since the language as written included provision that the appeal was deemed denied if no action were taken within 60 days. The law presumed that the matter was concluded at that point, allowing an appeal to proceed.

Suggesting that "60 days" be changed to "30 days," Regent Schenian expressed the view that 30 days should be enough time to make a decision about whether to bring a matter before the board. He noted the bylaws did not require that action by the board be taken in a given time frame, only that a decision be made about placing an item on the agenda.

It was pointed out by Regent Schilling that either of the presidents might want to discuss a matter with the board before making a decision.

Regent Weinstein observed that if the president happened to be out of town when an appeal was made, denial for failure to act might occur because there was inadequate time to consider the matter.

While 30 working days should be sufficient in most circumstances, President Shaw added, the problem was with the exceptional cases in which an appeal could be denied simply by passage of the time limit, whereas the president might have decided to bring the matter to the board if there had been adequate time for consideration.

Put to the vote, Resolution 3619 was unanimously adopted.

The September 4 meeting of the Council of Trustees was chaired by Regent Finlayson, in the absence of the chairman and vice chairman of the council.

Reporting that the hospital continued to experience significant increase in patient activity over the summer, Regent Finlayson said admissions were up four percent and patient days up eight percent over the same period last year. These positive trends came at a time when many hospitals were experiencing significant declines in admission and patient days. The increase in patient volume was attributed largely to recruitment of outstanding new faculty and strengthened programs, particularly in cardiology and trauma care.

The council was apprised of the results of an independent financial audit for 1985-86, which found the hospital's financial position and accounting systems to be sound.

It was reported that nurse recruitment efforts continued to be successful, with 15 nurses having been hired to support the substantial increase in clinical activity at the hospital. Recruitment of nurses was expected to become more difficult, due to the shortage of students in nursing programs and competition from other hospitals. As a result of these trends, the UW Hospital and Clinics planned to strengthen nurse recruitment efforts on both a regional and national level.

Acting Vice Chancellor Jay Noren reported that plans and budget reports for construction of two new modules for radiology and surgical sciences were being completed and would be presented to the council in the near future.

Assistant Superintendent Lester Brower reviewed the dramatic rise in clinical activity in a number of major areas, including surgical cases, intensive care unit days, helicopter service, transplants, and emergency care. The Surgical Department chairman, Dr. Folkert Belzer, stated that additional space would be required to sustain growth in these areas, and planning to provide the necessary space was being undertaken.

In response to a question by Regent Hanson, Regent Finlayson said the newly hired nurses were employed in the area of outpatient services, as well as intensive care and surgical units.

Presentation on the Wisconsin Dairy Task Force 1995

Introducing the presentation, President Shaw noted that the task force was established a year ago by the UW System and the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, the idea for a study having come from UW-Extension's Dairy Marketing and Policy Program Committee. The task force was now proceeding into the second phase of its projected two-year study.

He then introduced Professor Donald Peterson, a UW-Madison faculty member for 32 years. Dr. Peterson introduced Mr. Donald Soberg, administrator of the Trade and Consumer Protection Division of the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, who was representing Howard Richards, secretary of the department; Professor Robert Cropp of the UW-Platteville College of Agriculture, who was serving as executive director of the task force; Professor Richard Vilstrup of the UW-Madison College of Agricultural and Life Sciences, who co-chaired the committee which determined the feasibility and guidelines for the task force endeavor; Professor Neil Jorgensen, associate dean and director of the UW-Madison College of Agricultural and Life Sciences, who was a member of the technical steering committee which supported the task force efforts; and System Assistant Vice President Albert Beaver, whose help and advice had been instrumental to the task force's work.

Recognizing Regent Lyon, who had initially served as vice-chair of the task force as a representative of the diverse off-farm segment of Wisconsin's dairy industry, Dr. Peterson noted that he had resigned from the task force upon his appointment to the Board of Regents. Finally, he recognized Executive Vice President Lyall, who represented the UW System as acting president at the time the task force was established.

Introducing Philip Peterson, chair of the task force, he noted that Mr. Peterson was a dairy farmer who enjoyed credibility and respect throughout the Wisconsin dairy industry. The owner of a 550-acre dairy farm near Oregon, Wisconsin, he also served as town chairman, president of the local school board, president of his church council, and president of the board of directors of the Middleton Insurance Company. At the regional and national levels, he was midwest regional director for American Milk Producers Incorporated, the largest dairy marketing cooperative in the United States. He also served as national secretary of the Agricultural Council in America, which was formed to build bridges between producers and consumers of agricultural products.

In reviewing the reason for formation of the task force, Mr. Peterson emphasized Wisconsin's economic dependence on its dairy industry, with over 41,000 Wisconsin farms annually producing 25 billion pounds of milk (over 17 percent of the nation's supply), having an economic value in excess of \$3 billion (57 percent of the state's cash farm income). When considering purchases by farmers, processors and marketers of milk and dairy products, and the service industry, the multiplier effect of this economic value produced a \$10 billion per year Wisconsin dairy industry.

Included in the state's dairy industry, Mr. Peterson continued, were some 325 cheese plants, 36 butter plants, 40 ice cream manufacturers and 13 powdered milk plants. The cheese plants alone employed in excess of 10,000 people who produced 36 percent of the nation's cheese. Wisconsin's 340 meat processing plants slaughtered over 520,000 cull cows, 450,000 dairy steers and 300,000 calves, supplying 10 percent of the nation's hamburger for retail, recreation and fast food consumers.

Other agri-business employers included 1,300 feed mills, 85 feed manufacturers, 4,700 commercial trucking firms, 6,000 meat retailers, 1,150 dealers and brokers, 800 veterinarians, 1,650 farm supply firms, 450 farm financial service firms and banks, 600 equipment dealers and 250 farm builders. Also included were services for dairy farmers such as insurance, power, fuel, machinery, trucks, vehicles, hardware, semen, chemicals, seed and fertilizers. This list illustrated the economic interdependence of Wisconsin's agri-businesses and rural and urban communities with the dairy industry. The dairy industry was, however, approaching a crossroads. Well-managed competition from California, New York, Arizona and Texas was increasing rapidly, and imitation products as well as imports posed a growing threat. Mounting dairy surpluses prompted lower farm milk prices and uncertainty in dairy legislation, while production costs continued to rise. Observing that the industry also faced uncertainty regarding the impact of new technology, Mr. Peterson referred to predictions that major structural shifts would occur in the dairy industry over the next decade and that dairying in the upper Midwest, particularly Wisconsin and Minnesota, would not be able to compete economically with the larger 1000 to 2000 cow dairies of the South, Southeast and West. It was asserted by some that Wisconsin farms were too small, had relatively high capital investments per cow, were slower to adopt new technology, and could not utilize economically much of the bio-technology and computer technology that had been developed.

Pointing out that many in Wisconsin did not agree with those predictions, Mr. Peterson said it was nonetheless recognized that the challenge of change must be met by the Wisconsin dairy industry. The task force was an industry-wide effort to maintain and enhance the competitive position of dairying in Wisconsin.

Specific objectives were: (1) to encourage research, education and legislative programs aimed at more profitable and efficient milk and meat production, better farm business management and finance, and better farm tax and economic policies; (2) to improve dairy processors' profitability and efficiency; and (3) to increase marketing effectiveness.

The task force was comprised of 33 members, 17 of whom were dairy farmers, 8 milk processors and marketers, and 8 from allied organizations. Serving as ex-officio members were Robert Bartlett of the Governor's office, Senator James Harsdorf, Senator Rodney Moen, Representative Larry Swoboda, and Representative Joseph Tregoning. Working with the task force was a 22-member technical steering committee drawn from the university, the Department of Agriculture Trade and Consumer Protection, and the Vocational, Technical and Adult Education System.

The task force identified over 30 key issues to be addressed, ranging from milk quality to farm financing, new product development, property taxes, advertising and promotion, dairy research, extension, and education. In December 1985, nine public hearings were held around the state for additional input to the task force. Subcommittees had been formed to study the various issues and to develop recommendations for consideration by the task force as a whole.

The final report of the task force, due June 1987, was to include recommendations in the following areas: (1) needed changes in state laws and regulations; (2) needed dairy research, extension and education programs; (3) more efficient industry practices for milk procurement, marketing, pricing and transportation; (4) improved milk production practices for enhancing profitability on the farm; (5) improved economic viability of dairy plants; and (6) federal legislation including policy and federal milk marketing orders.

Stating that this report would provide a blueprint for action into the next decade and beyond, Mr. Peterson emphasized that a strong, competitive dairy industry was a cornerstone of the state's economy, with many communities, businesses, and jobs directly dependent upon the well-being of the dairy industry in Wisconsin.

Regent Hanson asked if projections had been made on the number of Wisconsin dairy farms that would be lost in the next decade.

Replying in the negative, Mr. Peterson said that, while economic conditions might cause the number of farms to decline, he felt the number of farm families would remain fairly stable. Where dairy operations were consolidated, former farm owners might continue working on other dairy farms. In addition, it was hoped by the task force that profitability could be increased through more efficient production of milk, which also would mean lower prices for the consumer.

Regent Clusen observed that effectiveness in promoting needed legislation would be crucial to the future of the dairy industry.

Expressing agreement, Mr. Peterson added that the task force study should produce information which would facilitate reaching consensus on the necessary legislative changes.

In response to a question by Regent Knowles, Dr. Cropp said about 1,300 out of the 42,000 Wisconsin dairy farmers participated in the federal farm buy-out program. This amounted to about 3.2 percent of milk production compared to a national figure of 8.7 percent. He considered those figures as indicators that Wisconsin would remain a dairy state.

Regent Lyon remarked that a major concern was adaptability of technology that could be utilized in the upper Midwest to maintain the dairy industry in a competitive position with other parts of the country, particularly since this area did not have all the alternatives in agriculture available in such places as California, Texas and the Northwest states. He expressed the hope that the task force's work would provide more direction for the Wisconsin dairy industry in technological areas and asked what initiatives the task force could be expected to recommend to improve profitability.

Mr. Peterson replied that the intention was to formulate guidelines farmers could use to evaluate their own dairy operations, including use of computers and other tools for analyzing production. While some farmers had taken advantage of technological innovations, the majority still were not utilizing them.

Reporting on the first meeting of the task force, President Shaw noted that the chair was former Marshfield Mayor Marilyn Hardacre, and that the members included Senator Walter John Chilsen; Joint Finance Committee Co-Chairman Marlin Schneider; two major business executives, Leon Weinberger of Wausau Insurance and Roger Fitzsimonds of First Wisconsin National Bank in Milwaukee; DOA Secretary Doris Hanson; and himself. His presentation at the first meeting was based on a paper which detailed his concern about statutes and regulations that impaired effective management.

After giving an overview of how the UW System related to state government and the magnitude of the university operation, he explained how funds were expended and reminded the committee that about 62 percent of the UW System's budget came from non-state sources. Following was a report by Secretary Hanson, who pointed out some of the ways in which the university was currently treated differently from state agencies, and a report on how Wisconsin compared to other states with regard to the management flexibility issue.

Describing the discussion as constructive, Dr. Shaw said Representative Schneider commented on his concerns about some university actions in the past and his doubts about the legislative feasibility of granting additional flexibility. Senator Chilsen, on the other hand, had taken a different view. There was considerable discussion about the relationship between having responsibility for actions and the necessary authority to carry them

On the issue of position control, it was pointed out that the UW System had 9,200 positions not funded by GPR, which created about 19,000 jobs, using a conservative multiplier. To the extent, therefore, that the UW System was controlled in that area, the state's ability to grow also was controlled. Staff of the Department of Administration commented, however, on the political reality that the number of positions was an often-used barometer of the growth of state spending. To deal with that reality, President Shaw observed, it would be necessary to educate the populous about the fact that much university spending came from outside sources which boosted the economy without expending state tax monies.

At its October meeting, the task force planned to discuss solutions which would improve management ability without reducing proper public

UW System Resources for Wisconsin Business and Industry, Pp 11-13

President Shaw described several examples of the UW System's continuing efforts to strengthen and enhance Wisconsin's economic development.

Noting first that UW-Oshkosh was to offer its MBA program on the UW-Green Bay campus beginning this month, President Shaw commended the cooperative effort by these two institutions in serving their region through shared resources and avoiding unnecessary duplication.

Second, the President announced that he soon would begin a series of thirteen statewide roundtable meetings with area business and industry executives in nine Wisconsin communities. These informal meetings would start with a brief overview of university resources available to business and industry, after which there would be the opportunity for business and industry representatives to discuss with him their views on how current programs and services might be improved and what more could be done to enhance economic development.

Third, in response to a state agency inquiry about expenditures of the units listed in the *Directory of University Resources for Business and Industry*, data had been collected on units which were likely to have the most sustained contact with business and industry. It was found that expenditures of these units (about a third of the listings) on economic development activity totaled \$55 million last year—over 75 percent of which was from non-state revenue sources.

Fourth, an agreement was reached which would enable UW-Stout to share its industrial management expertise with the Case IH Company in Wausau on a three-year manufacturing engineering project. Case IH was consolidating in Wausau heavy equipment manufacturing currently done at several other plants in Iowa and Indiana. The university's assignments were to include improvement of material handling and inventory procedures, evaluation of advanced technology opportunities, consolidation of numerical control programs and automation of quality sensitive operations. UW-Stout would devote the time of about 20 faculty, eight graduate students and 40 undergraduate students to this effort. In addition, the project would make use of university facilities, computer equipment and computer software.

The impact of this single example of the UW System's positive response to the needs of Wisconsin business and industry, President Shaw continued, was summarized in a letter which Governor Earl sent on August 20 to the co-chairs of the Joint Committee on Finance:

"Active involvement through UW-Stout in the Case IH consolidation will provide substantial benefits. Case IH is a major employer in Wisconsin and the company is facing strong foreign competition and a difficult future. Case IH is making a large financial investment to upgrade operations in Wisconsin as part of their strategy to return to profitability. Our assistance can help them remain a part of the state economy.

"The involvement of the University of Wisconsin highlights one of the state's economic strengths. The university has a wealth of expertise which can be used to help industries be productive and profitable. The Case IH project will help advertise this expertise."

In conclusion, President Shaw expressed pride in the UW System's services to business and industry, as well as firm resolve to sustain and enhance that partnership in the future.

Bryce Tolefree, President of United Council, announced receipt of a grant for a project called STAAR (Students Taking Action Against Rape), the first program of its type in the nation.

Reporting that United Council had requested the Governor to declare September 22-26 Wisconsin Higher Education Awareness Week, Mr. Tolefree commented that it was a perception among students that the regents and the system officials were promoting tuition increases. Stating that United Council wished to cooperate in countering misconceptions, he urged participation in activities of Higher Education Awareness Week to make students and parents aware of the problems which existed and to let the citizens know that the UW System stood for quality and was an asset to the state. United Council planned to promote activities at all universities, including petitions and letters to legislators conveying their position that increasing funds to the UW System would only benefit the state. Referring to comments made in the video tape "Choices," Mr. Tolefree stated: "I don't believe the students in this state are bargain-hunting students. I believe the students just want what everybody else wants in this state: to have a quality education and to continue the Wisconsin Idea in promoting high quality education at a low cost for those students who are the most needy."

Regent Flores asked that United Council provide the regents with a schedule of activities in connection with Higher Education Awareness Week.

President's Comments on Funding Problems and Solutions, Pp 13-14

Referring to President Shaw's participation in a recent radio call-in program, Regent Schilling observed that the President had done an excellent job in tying together the levels and problems of underfunding with the kinds of options available to provide solutions. He asked Dr. Shaw to replicate those comments at this meeting.

President Shaw said he had tried to put in a larger perspective questions having to do with filled class sections and other problems of underfunding by suggesting to callers a number of initiatives that the Regent Study Group on the Future of the UW System was considering, such as enrollment limitations and higher admission standards. He pointed out to them, however, that there still remained a deficit in funding of about \$88 million per year based on the national average cost per student, and that there were in reality three ways to deal with that problem.

The first was to request \$88 million in GPR funds, over and above the cost to continue. If that were done on a two-year basis, it would require more than 40 percent of all the state's new money. The second was tuition increases, which would amount to \$640 per student to erase the deficit, not including the cost to continue. The third was to make up the deficit through enrollment reductions, which would necessitate a decrease of 22,000 FTE students.

Pointing out, however, that the entire amount did not have to come from one area, he suggested to callers that there were a number of options. If the current tuition approach were maintained, the gap could be filled by asking for \$44 million in GPR and reducing FTE enrollment by 11,000. Another option would be not to reduce enrollments, but to generate \$13 million by moving tuition to the peer group mid-point and requesting \$75 million in GPR. A third option would be to move tuition to the peer group mid-point to generate \$13 million, request \$50 million from GPR, and produce \$25 million from enrollment reductions of about 6,000 FTE. His purpose in setting forth these options was to make it understood that there were three measures by which to generate resources to deal with the deficit problem and that the solution could be found in some combination of those measures.

The purpose of this lease request is to renew the Middleton Satellite Clinic lease for 2,222 sq. ft. which expires on September 30, 1986 and to consolidate that lease with the existing Women's Health Center lease for 1,694 sq. ft. of clinic space located in the same facility through a lease amendment. The lease amendment covers a period beginning October 1, 1986 through January 31, 1989 to coincide with the expiration date of the Women's Health Center lease.

Except for the provision of a two-year renewal option with an annual increase of 2% if exercised, the same terms, conditions, and rental rate per sq. ft. as the lease for the Women's Health Center will apply. The cost of this lease amendment is \$2,581.22 per month (\$13.94/sq. ft.) for the period from October 1, 1986 through January 31, 1987; \$31,544.13 (\$14.22/sq. ft.) the second year; and, \$32,226.01 (\$14.50/sq. ft.) the third year. Rental payments will be provided from UWHC's operating funds.

Regent Nikolay stated that he voted against the resolution in committee because he was opposed to automatic acceleration of lease rates. Vice President Brown had contacted the Bureau of State Facilities Management for explanation of the reason for these yearly increases, but he had received a response which Regent Nikolay considered unsatisfactory.

In reply to a question by Regent Grover, Regent Nikolay said the alternative was to negotiate a lease on an annual basis, instead of simply assuming that inflation was going to continue and increasing the rates accordingly.

Replying to an inquiry by Regent Weinstein, Regent Clusen said the annual rate of increase was two percent.

Put to the vote, <u>Resolution 3631 was adopted</u>, with Regent Nikolay voting "No."

Regent Fish commented that relocation costs for property within a campus boundary might well be higher than for outside property.

Vice President Brown did not feel relocation costs would be affected by the campus boundary since the statutory entitlement would be the same regardless of location. In commercial areas, however, relocation costs would be higher than in other areas.

In response to a question by Regent Flores, Regent Fish explained that the university was the only probable buyer for property within a campus boundary. Because the opportunity for sale therefore was restricted, owners might make the claim that they were entitled to more money for relocation to another area. If this were the case, he felt there should be more deliberation in changing campus boundaries, especially since there was no reason why the university could not own property outside the designated campus boundaries.

Regent Weinstein requested a review of past experience to see if the effect of campus boundary status on relocation costs could be determined.

Expressing the view that statutory relocation allowances were exorbitant for this type of property purchase, Regent Nikolay commented that the issue should be addressed by the Legislature.

Regent Fish recalled that, when he served on the Building Commission, he had prepared a report which concluded that relocation costs were far out of line. Although corrective legislation was proposed, it had never been adopted. While he was not opposed to legitimate relocation costs, he noted that there had been cases when transients were compensated much more than they had paid in total rent.

It was suggested by Regent Weinstein that the Physical Planning and Development Committee might wish to look into the issue and possibly bring to the board a recommendation to forward to the Legislature.

## Approval of Minor Projects

The committee unanimously approved six minor projects, at UW-Eau Claire, UW-Madison, UW-Milwaukee and UW-Whitewater. Three were maintenance projects, one involved handicapped access, one concerned code compliance and one was related to a grant which the board accepted in April.

Reports were presented to the committee on bid openings. State Building Commission actions and results of 1985-86 energy management activities in the UW System. Pointing out that the energy management report was a good example of successful university efforts to save taxpayer dollars, Regent Nikolay said the reports showed that expenditures for heat and electricity during 1985-86 totaled \$37 million--\$5.1 million less than was budgeted. While some savings were attributable to lower prices for gas and oil, they also resulted from ongoing efforts by administrators, faculty, staff and students to reduce energy consumption. The system was able to use \$2.2 million of these savings as an offset against its required \$34 million budget reduction, with the remaining portion reverting to the state's general fund. Regent Nikolay commended all who had made these achievements possible.

At 11:10 a.m., the following resolution, moved by Regent Schenian, and seconded by Regent Nikolay, was unanimously adopted on a roll call vote, with Regents Clusen, Finlayson, Fish, Flores, Grover, Hanson, Hassett, Knowles, Lyon, Nikolay, Schenian, Vattendahl and Weinstein voting "Aye" (13), and no regents voting "No."

Dear Jim:

As President of the University of Wisconsin System Board of Regents and as the chief executive officer of a company which has been a long time member of your organization, I am deeply concerned about the tone and conclusions which WMC has drawn from data regarding public higher education, and the UW System in particular, as presented in your July 18 newsletter and in associated pamphlets developed by WMC for purchase and distribution by its members.

While I always welcome reasoned and robust debate on major policy issues of such importance as state spending, I believe it is particularly incumbent upon organizations such as WMC to address this topic in a fair and accurate manner. I am dismayed that your campaign fails to meet this basic standard. The premise of your argument is that State spending is too high because the State is attempting to do too much. With respect to the University of Wisconsin System, your assertions mix "apples and oranges," contain inaccuracies and are flawed by omissions.

Let me offer an example -- you state that Wisconsin citizens spend more for public higher education than the national average. Yet...

- o You fail to state the basic reason -- Wisconsin has far more high school graduates as a percent of its population than the national average and more of our citizens attend public higher education institutions than the national average.
- o You fail to state that, on an annual basis, the instructional budget of the University of Wisconsin System is \$600 less per full time equivalent student than the national average.
- You fail to state that Wisconsin's tax support of the UW System amounts to only 38.5% of the total UW System budget; or that 9,400 of the UW System's 26,200 employees are not funded by State tax dollars; or that every State tax dollar is leveraged over 2.5 times by the UW System through grants, fees and auxiliary earnings.

- o You fail to state that, when conservative economic multiplier effects of respending these dollars are considered, every state tax dollar in the University's budget generates an additional six dollars in state and local incomes and a minimum of 18,750 additional jobs for Wisconsin's business economy.
- o You fail to state the positive economic impact of the UW System's employees who pay on average \$2,106 in State taxes and \$1,628 in local property taxes annually.

As an organization committed to the welfare of Wisconsin manufacturing and commerce, it is regrettable that WMC apparently chose to exclude mention of these facts and the inescapable conclusion that the non-State tax impact of the UW System, if considered within the context of the private sector, would clearly qualify the University as one of the principal leaders in Wisconsin's business economy, spending nearly \$900 million each year from sources other than State tax revenues. Along with many other business persons, I view Wisconsin's educated and skilled human resources and public higher education's positive impact as among our State's major economic, social and intellectual assets, not as liabilities.

Another example -- your print materials state that the number of institutions in our system is: "more than double the number for similar sized states." This is both misleading and inaccurate since similar sized states also have significant junior or community college systems which you include in the UW System data but do not include in comparative figures for other states. A comparison with the neighboring and similar sized state of Minnesota indicates that it has exactly the same number of comparable institutions as ours but with <a href="three">three</a> systems of higher education, not just one merged system as we have here in Wisconsin.

Yet a third example -- you compare tuition at a public institution like UW-Madison, where undergraduate tuition and fees are \$1,571 per year, with private institutions like Harvard and Yale, where tuition and fees exceed \$10,000 per year. This "apples and oranges" comparison generates a perception that the UW System spends \$10,000 per year per student; as you should know, this is clearly not the case, since our total undergraduate instructional costs are less than half that amount, about \$4,100 per student. If you had fairly compared tuition/fees at UW-Madison with its counterpart Big Ten public institutions, you would have discovered that UW-Madison's tuition is within \$200 of that charged at three of the other eight public institutions. Clearly, private institutions naturally rely heavily on tuition and fees for funding, whereas public institutions, as the name implies, receive public support to assure that higher education is available to individuals of all social, economic and ethnic groups, not just reserved for the affluent. The philosophy of publicly supported higher education undergirds the progressive history of this State and redounds to the benefit of our economy, your members and all Wisconsin citizens.

A final example -- you state that: "In Wisconsin, students generally pay only 30% of the costs of their instruction..." That is inaccurate. The actual average cost is now 34% and it will increase to 35% in 1987. Non-resident undergraduates now pay 105% of instructional costs. The Board of Regents Study Group on the Future of the University of Wisconsin System is currently considering increased tuition as one of its many policy items. As my Board colleagues and I deliberate this issue among others, I can assure you that we will do so with full appreciation of the profound public policy implications involved. We know that quality, funding and enrollment levels are inextricably intertwined and that, first and foremost, we cannot and must not sacrifice educational quality.

At the same time, we must be realistic about funding levels and the impact of significantly increased tuition or significantly decreased enrollment. If, for example, we reduced enrollment so that existing funding per student equaled the national average, we would be forced to cut 20,000 students from the UW System. I trust that WMC would agree that such draconian action would be an inappropriate solution to its perceived state spending problem and equally inappropriate public policy.

Faced with such issues, the Board of Regents, comprised of dedicated citizens from almost every walk of life, is developing a strategic planning document as a blueprint for the future. Public hearings on our preliminary recommendations will be held in November. I would urge WMC to become more responsibly engaged in these important public policy choices. I invite WMC's staff and members to study the Regents' plan and become active and constructive participants in the public hearing process. We welcome your involvement in such forums where the full range of ideas, problems, proposed solutions and their consequences can be properly "sifted and winnowed" in the tradition of Wisconsin and its university system.

In my 36 years as a business person, I have learned the fundamental lesson that "it isn't just what we spend but what we buy" that counts. I encourage you to apply the same cost/benefit standard to public higher education in Wisconsin and to avoid letting reason succumb to rhetoric. Our citizens and your members deserve no less than full consideration of such essential and complex public policy issues.

# STATEMENT FOR THE SEPTEMBER 1986 UW SYSTEM BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING BY LAURENCE A. WEINSTEIN

Since our last meeting, there have been two organized public campaigns which, in part, have targeted the UW System in their assault on what the sponsors term is excessive state spending. One has come from a group which calls itself "The Council of Small Business Executives." It has produced a video tape called "Choices" which many of you have viewed. The other originated from the Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce Association, first through its newsletter and subsequently in a series of pamphlets.

As a member of the Wisconsin business community since 1949 and as a native of this state, I want to publicly disassociate myself from both groups on this issue. It is my opinion that we would be misled if we interpreted or accepted their conclusions as representing all, or even the vast majority, of Wisconsin's business leaders. Their views also run contrary to the long established state and national tradition of providing quality public higher education to all those who can benefit from it, no matter whether they be rich or poor, men or women, the children of immigrants like myself, minorities or disadvantaged citizens.

Quality public education is our noble way of sharing the opportunities of our democracy with all Americans. It is our principal response to the ugliness of ignorance, discrimination and elitism, no matter the form.

Importantly, quality education will, without question, assist Wisconsin business and industry in achieving meaningful economic growth and stability.

President Shaw has publicly commented on the "Choices" video tape, and I am pleased that he has done so. Copies of his public response have been sent to Regents and are available to others upon request. We cannot and should not tacitly accept broad and undocumented assertions which distort the true picture of public higher education. We must appropriately respond and rebut such undeserved allegations, no matter how dramatically they may be posed or what medium they employ.

Both groups have taken an extremely short-sighted view of our state and of the aspirations of our citizens. They would measure the quality of our society by how little we spend, rather than by what we value.

Yesterday, I sent a letter to the president of Wisconsin Manufacturers and Commerce communicating my views on WMC's statewide campaign. I would like to share that letter with you now.

#### CHAPTER V

#### SYSTEM ADMINISTRATION

President of the University of Wisconsin System Section 1. The President of the University of Wisconsin System has full executive responsibility for the operation and management of the System. He or she shall carry out the duties prescribed in Wisconsin Statutes for this office, and such other duties as may be assigned by the Board or be implicit in policy actions of the Board. The President of the System shall see to the appropriate staffing of System administrative offices, and direct and coordinate the activities of these offices as needed to fulfill his or her responsibilities. All items to be brought before the Board of Regents for action, except matters which come to the Board pursuant to its administrative rules or existing policies and those initiating in the Board itself, should reach the Board through the President of the University of Wisconsin System and carry his or her recommendation; and-when-involving-policy-actions,-indicating establishment-of-a-new-policy--reaffirmation-of-an-existing-policy--revision of-an-existing-policy,-or-rescission-of-an-existing-policy- If an item arises at or is related to an institution, the President shall ensure that it has first been through the established institution governance process and carries the Chancellor's recommendation; if it has not been through the institution governance process, the President shall request that it be so considered by the institution. On appeals of matters which have been through the institution governance process, the President shall verify that all institution procedures have been exhausted and will then determine whether, in the President's judgment, the Board of Regents should

be considered by the Board can be appealed directly to the President of the Board. If the President of the Board determines that the matter should not be considered by the Board, any member of the Board may request that the matter be considered by the Board. A request that an item be considered by the Board which comes from other than the President or any member of the Board must be in writing. Persons making such requests shall be advised in writing of determinations by the President of the System and President of the Board regarding their requests. Failure by the President of the System or the President of the Board to act on a written request that an item be considered by the Board within sixty days of its receipt shall be deemed a denial of the request.

Administrative Rules

As you know, on July 9, 1986, the Senate Committee on Education and Government Operations held a public hearing to consider the university's proposed administrative rules on use or possession of alcoholic beverages on university premises, political campaigning in state-owned residence halls, and use of university facilities. Subsequently, acting in executive session, the Committee recommended that the university make certain modifications in the proposed rules. These suggestions are generally consistent with the substance and intent of the proposed rules, and can therefore be accommodated without significant problems.

The following are the Committee's specific recommendations, together with responses and amendments to the rule language which would accomplish the suggested changes.

1. Require that the board of Regents review and approve the campus policies on the use of alcoholic beverages.

Ordinarily, by operation of s. UWS 18.09, Wisconsin Administrative Code, campus policies of this type would become effective upon filing with the Regent Secretary. The Committee's suggestion would require specific Board action before campus alcohol beverage policies could take effect. To ensure a rapid implementation process while satisfying the expressed legislative concern that there be an approval mechanism beyond the institutional level, proposed s. UWS 18.06(13) could be amended by adding the following paragraph:

- (d) Notwithstanding s. UWS 18.09, institutional regulations developed pursuant to this subsection shall be reported to the president of the system for review and approval.
- 2. Provide for consultation with students in the setting and implementing of alcoholic beverage policies and access to university facilities policies on each campus.

Proposed s. UWS 21.06 currently contains a provision for consultation with students as to institutional policies on the use of university facilities. The following amendment to proposed s. UWS 18.06(13)(a) would also include students in the consultative process for campus alcohol beverage policies:

EXHIBIT C

UWS 18.06(13) ALCOHOL BEVERAGES. (a) The use or possession of alcohol beverages is prohibited on all university premises, except in faculty and staff housing and as permitted by the chief administrative officer, subject to statutory age restrictions. The chief administrative officer may generally permit the use or possession of alcohol beverages by promulgating institutional regulations in consultation with appropriate staff and students, or in specific instances by written permission.

3. Require that copies of each campus' campaign policy be available at each residence hall, office of chief administrative officer and the offices of the Board of Regents and central administration.

Addition of the following language to proposed s. UWS 18.06(16m) would make explicit the intent to make copies of these policies readily available to interested persons:

- (d) Institutional policies and procedures developed pursuant to this subsection shall be available at each residence hall, at the office of each chief administrative officer of an institution, and at the office of the secretary to the board of regents.
- 4. Require that, to the greatest extent possible, each campus' campaign policies be uniform and permit the greatest possible access to students living in state-owned residence halls.

Section 36.11(1)(cm), Wisconsin Statutes, establishes the principle that political literature may be distributed and political campaigning may be conducted in state-owned residence halls. The proposed rules were intended to assure that there would be the required access to dormitories for these purposes and to encourage intra-institutional consistency of regulation, where possible. The following amendments to proposed s. UWS 18.06(16m) could be made to clarify and emphasize these points, while recognizing the privacy rights of students (added material underscored, deleted material struck over):

(16m) CAMPAIGNING IN STATE-OWNED RESIDENCE HALLS. (a) The residence halls students of each institution, subject to the approval of the chief administrative officer, shall establish policies and procedures assuring that political literature may be distributed and political campaigning may be conducted in state-owned residence halls consistent with the rights of residence halls students, and prescribing the time, place and manner in which these activities may be conducted. political-literature-may-be-distributed-and-political campaigning-may-be-conducted-in-state-owned-residence-halls; (b) Where appropriate and consistent with the rights of residence halls students, the policies and procedures developed under this subsection shall apply to all residence halls at an institution. Matters to be addressed in institutional policies and procedures shall include at least the following:

EXHIBIT C--P. 2 1. The hours of the day and the time of year, if any, to which particular activities shall be limited.

- 2. The locations in residence halls, if any, to which particular activities shall be limited.
- 3. Any requirement for registering or obtaining permission to enter a residence hall before engaging in a particular activity.
- 5. Review the use of the term "if any" in proposed UWS 18.06(16m)b.1. and 2. to assure that the campuses are not encouraged to limit access to students.

The insertion of the phrase "if any" in the rule was intended by the drafters to suggest that—if desired by the residence halls students—there could be situations where no access limitations would be imposed. Thus, the phrase was intended to expand rather than restrict access and would be so interpreted in the event of any question being raised as to its meaning.
