My former student and good friend, Andrew Singer, has given the real estate program here at Wisconsin a special \$1000 scholarship in memory of the late Mrs. Ness Gaines.

As in the past, Andy has asked us to apply his scholarship assistance to students with some disability. For the spring semester we intend to support a graduate student by the name of Jon Vet. Jon is a Dutch student whose graduate work has been delayed and undercut by a blood disease which is cureable but prolonged. Frequent hospitalizations during the summer and fall semesters have lead to the necessity of his working at a reduced credit load and extending his semester attendance beyond his funding. He is an excellent student who has managed to carry forward despite considerable pain in his joints and a tendancy towards fainting spells. We are pleased to be able to provide Jon some assistance at this point and will use the scholarship as leverage to obtain additional student loans and partial waiver of out of state tuition.

I am sure you will be hearing directly from Jon when we tell him of the financial package we have been able to put together for him in response to this generous and thoughtful memorium for Mrs. Gaines.
