
Dear Mr. Gaines:

My former student and good friend, Andrew Singer, has given the real estate program here at Wisconsin a special \$1000 scholarship in memory of the late Mrs. Ness Gaines.

As in the past, Andy has asked us to apply his scholarship assistance to students with some disability. For the spring semester we intend to support a graduate student by the name of Jon Vet. Jon is a Dutch student whose graduate work has been delayed and undercut by a blood disease which is cureable but prolonged. Frequent hospitalizations during the summer and fall semesters have lead to the necessity of his working at a reduced credit load and extending his semester attendance beyond his funding. He is an excellent student who has managed to carry forward despite considerable pain in his joints and a tendency towards fainting spells. We are pleased to be able to provide Jon some assistance at this point and will use the scholarship as leverage to obtain additional student loans and partial waiver of out of state tuition.

I am sure you will be hearing directly from Jon when we tell him of the financial package we have been able to put together for him in response to this generous and thoughtful memorium for Mrs. Gaines.

1. The Shidler Essay Competition for Graduate Real Estate Students once again recognized the talent pool at the UW Real Estate Program. Mark Eppli, first year Ph.D. student, won Second Prize, \$5000 cash. Ralph Cram, graduating MS student, won Third Prize for \$1000. ^{Mark Eppli} Ralph is slipping - last year he won Second Prize. The essay contest had ~~eighty-four~~ ^{ninety-two} submissions from all the well known real estate programs in the country, as well as a few unknowns. Mark Eppli wrote on "Corporation's Hidden Leasehold Assets."

2. ^{Harvesting a} The Urban Land Institute has established the Henry S. Miller Land Use and Development Fellowship for \$5000, funded by the Good Gulfstream Foundation of Tampa Florida. This year Dan Knox~~X~~, second year Ph.D. student, was one of twenty fellowship winners. Incidentally, Dan Knox continues to receive the highest student evaluation scores of any T.A., ^{including} including Bob Gibson, his outstanding predecessor.

3. Funding for Ph.D. students is very significant because currently we have four Ph.D. candidates in residence who receive financing support as teaching assistants and project assistants. These include Dan Knox, Evan Harrison, Elaine Worzala, and Mark Eppli. In addition we have four outstanding Ph.D. prospects who have been admitted on the condition that they realize we have no funding for them at this time. Our Ph.D. cadre has never been stronger.

4. Corporate fundraising is moving slowly. Prudential has provided a second draw of \$25,000 and Robert Polachek has ~~pledged~~ ^{pledged} \$5000.
