ROBERT N. (BOB) JOHNSON

WISCONSIN HOCKEY COACH

ALTHOUGH HE IS JUST BEGINNING HIS THIRD YEAR AS HEAD COACH AT THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN, BOB JOHNSON HAS CREATED A HOCKEY RENAISSANCE IN THE UNIVERSITY'S HOCKEY PROGRAM AND THROUGH HIS HARD WORK AND ENTHUSIASM HE HAS SPARKED THE GROWTH OF HOCKEY AT ALL LEVELS OF COMPETITION IN THE STATE OF WISCONSIN.

BESIDES HIS OBVIOUS DUTIES WITH THE BADGERS, JOHNSON KEEPS BUSY TRAVELING THROUGHOUT WISCONSIN PROMOTING HOCKEY. HE HOPES TO SOMED DAY TO PUT WISCONSIN ON A LEVEL WITH MINNESOTA IN JUNIOR HOCKEY.

IN THE TWO YEARS UNDER JOHNSON, THE BADGERS HAVE COMPILED 16-10 (1966-67) AND 21-10 (1967-68) RECORDS FOR A COMBINED RECORD OF 37-20. LAST SEASON'S VICTORIES INCLUDED WINS OVER WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MICHIGAN TECH (4-3), MICHIGAN STATE (5-3), AND COLURADO COLLEGE (4-3,6-2).

BOB IS A 37-YEAR-OLD MINNESOTA NATIVE WHO HAS A SUCCESSFUL ATHLETIC BACKGROUND -- BOTH AS A COMPETITOR AND AS A COACH.

HE WAS AN ALL-STAR HOCKEY PLAYER AT MINNEAPOLIS CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL AND CAPTAIN HIS SENIOR YEAR IN THE LATE '40'S. HE ALSO EXCELLED IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL.

HIS COLLEGIATE HOCKEY WAS PLAYED AT NORTH DAKOTA UNIVERSITY WHERE HE WAS THE LEADING SCORER IN 1950-51, AND AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA IN 1952-53 AND 1953-54 WITH THE GOPHERS WINNING THE WESTERN COLLEGIATE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION TITLE BOTH YEARS. HE ALSO WON LETTERS IN FOOTBALL AND BASEBALL AT MINNESOTA.

BOB BEGAN HIS COACHING CAREER AT WARROAD, MINNESOTA HIGH SCHOOL FOLLOWING ARMY DUTY IN KOREA IN THE MID-1950'S, AND AFTER ONE YEAR, BECAME HEAD COACH AT MINNEAPOLIS ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL WHERE HIS TEAMS WON 51 OF 60 CONFERENCE GAMES IN SIX SEASONS THROUGH 1962-63.

PRIOR TO COMING TO WISCONSIN, BOB SERVED COLORADO COLLEGE AS BOTH HOCKEY AND BASEBALL COACH FOR THREE SEASONS. HIS HOCKEY TEAMS POSTED À 12-14-1 RECORD IN 1963-64; 7-19 IN 1964-65; AND 10-18-2 IN 1965-66.

BOB RECEIVED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1954 WITH A DOUBLE MAJOR IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION AND SOCIAL STUDIES. HE GAINED HIS MASTER'S DEGREE FROM MINNESOTA IN 1961 IN PHYSICAL EDUCATION, AND IS CURRENTLY WORKING ON A DOCTOR'S DEGREE IN THE SAME FIELD.

HE IS THE AUTHOR OF A BOOK ENTITLED <u>COACHING HOCKEY</u> AND HAS A SECOND BOOK DUE FOR PUBLICATION SOON. BOB HAS ALSO PLAYED A GUIDING HAND IN THE ORGANIZATION OF ONE OF THE FINEST HOCKEY SCHOOLS IN THE NATION, HELD EACH SUMMER IN ASPEN, COLORADO.

BOB AND HIS WIFE MARTHA ARE THE PARENTS OF FIVE CHILDREN.
