

Sunday. Feb. 6, 1916.

Here I am again
sitting down to write in
my little diary after a
vacation I make a month
ah yes many at year. So
many things have happened
little diary since I commenced
last kept you up. Many
things, some bad, some so
lively. One of the saddest
the death of my dear mother
no one will really ever know
except you little diary how that
affected me or the sad news
I spend now at times in thinking
of her. I think I am just
commencing to realize how
much she would have meant
to me - but I have still a
dear and good brother
and father who I love
most dearly and I know

everything in the world to
be thankful for. From now
on I expect and am going
to try to keep you in a better
order and to tell you since I
my trials and tribulations.

One of happiest times of my
life are nearly over, that of my
High School career, in June
that comes to a close.

Today I have helped in
teaching my little Kindergartners
and then came home to a cruel
dinner dinner at which Mr.
Madison, an old war soldier
was with us. Mr Bill
and Ronald are here to see
Russell. Tonight at five o'
clock Lawrence is coming
down to spend the evening
"Good bye" for today

Monday eve, February.

Today little diary has run along in about the same course I habits as usual altho it has been an exceptionally cool morning day.

Went to school this morning but did not feel well so came home after the first period and went back again at noon and pursued my usual course of studies.

After school I practiced for the Cantata which we are to have soon and then walked home from school with my old school - mate Laurence.

O yes I must not forget to add that we had an awfully good soup for supper tonight but Papa had to go to Mass so could not enjoy that with us. Russell has now gone to the show trying the "Minstrels" A home talent given by W. G. C. Good hits.

Tuesday Eve. Feb.

Tonight I seem to be very tired altho I can really see no cause for my being so.

I went to school as usual, had all my lessons (ah me I only wish I had had).

It has been such a beautiful day, sunning so quietly and such great big sun-splashes too.

After school at the class meeting we decided to have a sleigh-ride party at Ruth Smuslind's Thursday night, Friday night Russell intends to take his S. School class here and Saturday night I am going out to Stella Adagies with the Standard Bearers, that is if the surveying continues.

Tomorrow (Wed.) I have got to play in Lyceum and after that practice for the Cantata. Yes I rather dread my ordeal in Lyceum altho I think I'll be brave and do my best.

Something has been worrying me today possibly I may tell you later.

Wednesday after - Feb.
It does seem a little unusual to sit down every evening and write in my diary but I'm going to try and keep it up just the same.

I played my duet in Lycurgus today, I was frightened I don't believe I could ever overcome that stage fear, don't believe I've made for that sort of thing at all. Guess I'm meant to be a plain every-day girl without any special accomplishments. O well I'll do my best and that's all anyone can do.

I learned today that Helen D. is going to be the clover flower in our Cantata. Wish that Lee fine, my cousin too. She's going to have a new "beau" tonight

too.

Got a nice long letter from Hattie today. I do think a lot of her she's certainly one lovely girl and you can't help but love her with that pretty auburn hair.

Bye-bye little diary for to-night.

Thursday eve.

Thursday was a beautiful day altho at noon it looked as tho it was going to get warm and melt all the snow so that we would not be able to have our sleigh - ride party but such was not the case.

We had the party, I went with Irene and Maine Spaulding stayed all night with me and we met with Ralph Hall. We had a splendid time. Sang songs and told stories going over played games when we got there and Ruth Townsend served some nice refreshments. Irene went to sleep early home and my foot was severely caught in under her so that I thought that it would surely come off but no fractures or anything past could induce her to leave. I shall never forget the night. We got home at one-thirty and I slept long after that.

Thus lots of things I could say regarding this party but I guess I may as well keep them to myself.

Friday eve. - Feb.

I drew me home dreadfully sleepy I did feel all day today, my eyes feel like lead strings too (?)

I turned home after school so that I might make some sandwiches for Russell's S. School Class but on opening the bread I had purchased downtown I found it to be so bad I could not use it and had to take it back and get some more. Everything went off fine, the little boys had so much fun and it surely repaid me for not being able to go to Basket-ball game and dance afterwards as most of the young people did.

Saturday But matin. Oliver Clunk and Ellis Van Dickle all went to a Chicken Pie Supper, that their class gave to the Phi Deltas. Of Mr. G. Clunk, it was the first Friday night that Louise and I have met together in a long time, it did seem strange, I tell of it. Bye bye.

Saturday Eve, Feb. —

Well little diary here I am again I havn't been writing in you for two or three nights and tonight I had to "make up" that isn't so much fun is it?

Today has been an exceptionally busy day for me, I got up quite late, because I was so tired and did my usual Saturday work then after dinner I made some clops sugar for Sunday, the first I have ever made and I also made a cake which turned out pretty good but I shun luck. I then went up and took a nice hot bath, that made me feel much better and got supper. Russel nearly ate one half of my cake can't say I enjoy cooking for this family.

This evening I went to write a few letters and retire early. George Hove called me up today seemed good, the first time in ages
Well bye-bye

Sunday eve. Feb.

Sunday proved to be a very cold day outside but inside Papa managed to keep it at about 80° all day long. Went to S. School and went in my own class for once in a long time, came home, made Smokey Salad for dinner and helped to get the rest of the dinner on.

After dinner I decided I would take a little nap as I didn't feel so very good. I had only just got to sleep when Peter D. and Margaret H. came over. They stayed until about 5:30 p.m. They were here while we had some apples. Florence called up while they were here, said he'd be down in the course of an hour. He came while they were here, so he took the bus up town and back and we all had some Salad and cake they had a long time and we went for thesmallest etter red. We never had a longer time. We then took the bus up to his house and he walked home with me. It was the coldest ride of the year but we didn't seem to mind it.

Monday Eve - February.

Smits I am quite tired again as we had quite a strenuous Sunday.

We had a practice after school twice for our Cantata until quite late, then I came home and read in my book which I am reading for E.g.

Helped to get supper and wash the dishes and now I am writing in my diary and will try to write a post letter.
Today is Valentine's day.

Tuesday Eve. - February.

Today was quite a usual day going to school all day long, at night after school walked home with Florence and a little Ford stopped and gave us a ride so I got home much sooner.

As we are papering we are in quite a "middle" but I worked thru and made a cake. it wasn't as good as I have made but will go in a hurry as everything does around this house.

Wrote two letters today one to Gertrude and Aunt Grace and want to write one as soon as possible to Grandmother Vailbu.

Read after supper until I became so sleepy I simply couldn't hold my eyes open any longer and then said "Good night" to all.

Wednesday eve - February.

I am quite sleepy tonite altho
not tired, I've had to wait until
quite late to write in my diary
tonight as Russell has been using
the desk to reply to an application
which he made to go north for
next summer at Petoskey to stay
all summer. I'm sure we shall
all miss him but we think he
will enjoy the change now.

We practiced for our Cantata
for awhile tonite after school and
then I went down to the Library
and read until about 5:30 and
came home in the most beautiful
weather and sunset that we have
had in many - day rounds
over quite strongly of a Spring
day and it makes that

"Hope Spring eternal in the Human
Breast."

Will say good bye for tonite.
Expect to go to Circuit tomorrow with

Thursday, February. -

Thursday was quite the same as usual, every thing moved along in the same old rut, went to school studied, wrote a letter to Stanley Voeckler.

Came home after school and made a cake, with orange frosting with nuts on it, it was pretty good, at least so Russell thought, he does like those kinds of frostings.

A little diary how I do hate the thots of him going up north this summer, such as if I can't stand it but its the best thing for him by all means and I hope he will find out how I feel.

Went to "American Girl's Concert" twice, it was fine, (with Yvonne of course) it was a beautiful, beautiful evening and oh but theres lots of things to say. Sometimes silence is bliss.

Friday February

Went to school as usual
after school Irmma O. and I
came home together she having
just cuts decided to get one dish
ice-cream with two spoons
I called up it when to my surprise
the boy brought us two dishes and
gave us both a treat. my but
we were surprised and glad
well I guess cause we were
hungry.

After supper Norval, Irmma
and myself went to the basket-
ball game at Arroyo between
Lyons and Onida. It was fine.
Onida beat in both the girls
and boys games. Helen (my little
cousin) starred nearly always
making a basket. Good job.

There was dance afterward
we didn't go. came home "sorter"
blue, thinking seriously of I wonder
what?

Saturday eve, February.

Today has been a bad day again little diary, making all morning then this afternoon I looked and sorted over some old letters and that and that. I really couldn't keep it, wish I could write as funny as I feel but what's the use, little incidents will bring up the memories.

After caring for those letters I layed down, had a good nap, took a nice warm bath and did various little things which I find no time for during the week. Got dressed had my supper and then turned in and I went down-town, stopped at Orpheum to see "Baby Mine" was pretty good, pictures were fine. Walked at Spring lots, went in to see Russell at Quality Store did some other Sat. night shopping and here I am.

"Bye bye" I'm sleepy.

Sunday eve February.

Today was one very busy day for me, it seemed to me as tho there was someth'g to do every minute.

Set up, went to S. School taught down-stairs, came home and had the best Sunday dinner that ever was, ham and eggs, and lots of goodies.

Well after dinner Morna W. and I took her little prins and went out to Marion Spaulding. Seemed as tho we would never get there and when we did get there we were nearly frozen, we stayed for quite awhile had a little lunch and started home but we were much warmer coming home and it was such a beautiful ride that we both enjoyed it immensely.

I had only been home a few minutes when Lourene came home to spend the evening. We had a real good time, read a story and talked -- -- 'Bye bye.

Monday eve. & Tuesday.
Today was a beautifull day
from the inside, but upon
getting out we found it to be
very cold, however I managed
to get to school without freezing
my(little) fingers off.

After school I waited for
Dorothy Winchell while she did
some Physics Problems and
then we went down to her house
to wait until it was time to
go to King der gator Teacher's
Pot Luck Supper J. M. E. Church.
We went had supper about eight
o'clock and had the bestest
things to eat but had to get right
up and run before they had
started their entertainment as we
wanted to go to "Japanese
Nite" at the Library sponsored
by "Story Tellis League." That
was fine and I completed a
happy day by staying with
my cousin Helen D.

A Happy day —

Tuesday AM - February.
Was so sleepy and tired today
guess everyone knew it too
because both Helen and myself
were late for school. Guess I'm
nearly as tired as I want to be
for a time.

Everything seemed to go a little
wrong today after it was
Washington's Birthday and that
O me! but I've got the blues, &
most horribly bad, can't hardly
see a bright gleam anywhere, this
world would be a mighty gloomy
place if anyone was truly or
descriptively I should give it time.

Nevertheless I'm going to "Junior
Nite" at the Mystic Theater tonite
perhaps if it isn't a real sad play
it will help some.

I was going to come Marine, L.
stay all night with her but
she's going with a "bump" sad I am
not good too, so she can't stay
here. Yours in tears of the soul.

Wednesday eve - February.
Smile I am one sleepy
girl we went to show last nite
and dare I write it, (skipped
up to Morse dance for a very
short time) but we both felt so
very guilty that we soon
skipped home again.

Wasn't in the least brilliant
in school today, we stayed for
Symphony and then went over
to Miss Hill's room to get
our places for the "National
Flower" as lantata to be given
by High School girls. It is
going to be doubly hard for me
as I am on the decorating
committee for the stage besides
being a journeyman. & I do
hope and pray it will be
a success after all the trouble
we have had with it.

Baked a chocolate cake trout
Since cake. "So long."

Thursday eve. - February

I was so tired to night, that I could not write in my diary so I am writing a few days late as I am often very likely to do.

I went to school quite the same as usual and intended to get home exceptionally early but such was not my luck as I had to go to the library and take a book back so Violet could take it out she hadn't read a book for a repeat and mine was short so I let her take mine when I did get home however I worked exceptionally hard dusting up the upstairs so I intended to do it Saturday Well I guess I was good today Wish I was ^a young kid again.

Tuesday evening. February.

I had the most fun tonight.
But I must go thru the
day as a whole.

Went to school, rushed home
and got ready to go out to Main's
S. did up my little parcel, freezing
as I did I was nearly late
to school. After school Dorothy
had asked Sarah, Knapp but
because she was sick she
asked Heta Marshall. And
she is the funniest girl why
really she is just comical. We
rode four in one buggy and
enough we had a circus.

After we had had supper
and put up some nice bengos
we went over to the School-
House for a Boy Social. I sure
I laughed at Heta until I had
to hold my sides. Dorothy and
Heta went to supper with Clarence
Kurtz, one of the luckiest boys in
Dixie, we got an older man. Had
an awfully good time. Good Heta

Saturday morning Feb.
We had to come down town
this morning so that we could
practice at the Amory at
10:15. We nearly froze riding
down way from Marion so
with 4 of a buggy. The amory
was cold but there we stood
it.

After practicing we came
down to my house for dinner
and after wiping dishes we
sat down to read a bit.
Towards evening we went down
town to get some things for
supper and came back got
supper and did up the dishes
however our company got
here before we were ready
but Marion went down. With
me our kids had quite a
good time, played cards and
talked. They went home quite
late and went to a dance after
leaving here. The naughty boys

Sunday morn. Feb.
This Sunday was one of the
most peculiar which I have
as yet experienced. Marion
was with me. We got up
quite late but went to S.
School because I had to take
a class, Marion went down and
helped me out wonderfully.

After Sunday school we came
home and helped get dinner.
After dinner we were waiting
to wipe dishes when who should
drive up in the Dodge but
Louise and Bert. I excused
myself and finished the dishes
altogether. Louise came out in the
kitchen. Then we went on a ride
cold. Oh no, it was almost
freezing when I got home. The
lump came in and stayed until
about 9 o'clock.

Roughly, Bill Fletcher and
Pif also came later as is usual to have

Monday Evening Feb.
Hattie & am tired. I so
tired, three nites are too
many for me. Add was it here
today she went to Savannah so
after fantale practice which lasted
until 5:30 I come home and
baked a cream cake - (some
cream stick here. Spaulding
gave us) and got supper, it
was hurry, hurry all the time
and after I had gone to lots of
fuss Papa didn't come home
I was so disgusted

I had two of its most
surprises today. Say Hattie
yes my own Hattie Hattie was
so tickled and who should walk
up to school but Arthur Rice.
Wish I might have had a little
meeting with both of them but
couldn't make them out that
way.
Well "good bye" little diary.

Tuesday evening Feb.

Came home from school
as quickly as possible and
did some dusting and
cleaning in general then I
washed out my two silk
waists and colored them
cleaned myself up.

After supper I had to hurry
to get ready for Cantata
Practice which we were to
have at 7:00 o'clock. We
practiced song and hand and
then a bunch of the girls chaperoned
by Margaret Steer went
up to a Leap Year dance
given by Ethlyn Selser and
some other girl. They wouldn't
let us stay because we
didn't have any man, so we came
home - time and went to show
it was good, scrubby time.

Wednesday evening. March 1.

We were compelled to stay after school for some time until being busy with our Cantata.

Got home just in time to stir up a cake before supper and get it on the man.

After supper I nearly read the paper and did a few other little things and turned to my little bed, tired, tired and oh so glad to think I really could lay myself down at a reasonable hour.

Nothing at all exciting.

"Bye-bye."

Thursday eve. March.
Today of all days was
a busy day. Went to school
quite the same as usual in
the morning but in the after-
noon they let four of us Senior
girls and four Senior boys off
to decorate Amory for Friday
nite.

Came back to Amory at noon
just loaded down with pillows
flowers, flags and a sweater
to wear. From then on we
were some busy folks until
5:30. Everything did look so
pretty we used red furniture
having brown curtains at the
back and light furniture.

Made Lawrence carry my
sweater home for me.

Was so tired & we had a few rehearsals

Fri. at. 6th, March.

It today was such an
awful day and evening
everything just jumped all day
and evening. Lawrence went to
Detroit soon after school let out.
I did late to see him go because
I just felt like doing something
funny and I guess I did.

We were all fixed up nice for
the concert. paint and everything
that goes with it, everyone did so
well and the stage looked so
pretty, Helen D. being our mimic
carried her part off most credit-
fully and I was so proud of
her. She giving a little dance.

But after the dance Marjorie S.

Drama O. Norma W. and myself
all started up to the nose. Drama we
had only nicely got started when Rock
J. Lawrence and along with Bill C. and
a Mr. Carpenter who is visiting him took

us up in the car. We
couldn't get the keys to stay
longer and so we had to go
up alone, we met Mr. Weigman
on the stairs and he asked
us if we were really going
to stay after reassuring him
that we were he decided to stay
also. There was a pretty
good crowd up there, we
had lots of fun. Had more
than one dance with Mr.
Weigman. I think he's nice.

Came home with the girls
in the new bus of the mor.
Being had an awfully good time.

Saturday - March.

Today was another strange day for me. Didn't get up until late and then had to go down to Amway to help clean up things. After that we went down to the Phoenix to get some ice cream. It was opening day and we each got a milk caramation. After that Norma, Dorothy and Marin S. stayed down to the Amway to skate while Armina and I went home.

After dinner I slept a long time and then soon after supper Norma called up and wanted me to go with a Mr. Carpenter who I had met the nite before. I was awfully tired but consented. He was just grand, had lots and lots of fun. Went for a long ride didn't get home until late again.

Sunday, March.

Today I'd really intended to stay quietly at home and have a good rest but such lively arts are not for me I guess.

Went to S. School and was in my own class for once in ages, it seemed quite good. After S. School Lawrence had the car down and as it wasn't so very cold and we felt just like it we took a nice little ride before going home. Enjoyed it immensely. Gene had an awfully good dinner, some afternoon Bert Martin and Lawrence came down in Bert's car, they wanted me to go up to Shadrack's so I went. We got Shadrack went for a long ride to Muir and Signs, it was terribly cold, we do such foolish things at times. Gene home early and went to bed.

Monday. Aug. March.

Today I was quite tired,
little book I recognize the
fact that I can't stand so
very much at at time.

When I came home from
School, I laid down and
slept until supper time as
I wanted to go to Elks
Dance in the Evening.

It proved to be a terrible
night, it was so slippery and
continued to rain in a distress-
ing fashion. but we had
lots of fun slipping along.

I wore a pink dress with
short sleeves and low neck.
Had the grandest time just
because I felt so much like
dancing I guess. feet awfully
Sore now because he had
a terrible headache. got home at
2 o'clock. Had such an awful tired.

Tuesday. March.
I think I have felt as bad today as I ever have in my life. I was so tired I thought I simply could not stay awake but I seemed to some way or other.

Came directly home from school and after washing dishes went to bed directly to bed I guess it must have been about 8 o'clock. I slept straight thru until morning too.

Last Sunday.

I forgot to speak about stopping to see Emma Johnson a girl who used to work for us while on her ride. It did seem so good to see her and I have wanted to for so long.

Wednesday March.

I feel just fine all day today. What wonders a little sleep does produce doesn't it?

Tonight I came right home from school, dusted up a little and made some sandwiches and got wood ready for evening.

In the evening my missionary people came after discussing various things and having refreshments they went home at an early hour. Then Papa and I washed dishes and we went to bed.

Happy day.

Got a nice letter from a Mr. Carpenter, he's coming to India again before long and wants me to go for another ride with him. This is a very nice boy I guess.

Thursday - March.
Today has been one of
the quietest days that
I have ever seen. Started to
school this morning, it was
cold but pleasant, didn't
wear any rubbers to school
at noon and it commenced
to snow by night it was
a regular blizzard. It was
terribly hard getting home
from school. Once Luther
was up to school this
afternoon, she's going to
visit her Aunt in Jacksonville
this next Tues. hate to see
her go because she's such
a fine girl.

Sums like everything went
wrong with me today. H.
Bunnell caught me off my
notes and read it dead like
"Blue day!"

Friday. March.
Went to school as usual, but because I forgot my report and the teacher sent me home after it. It was terrible walking regular miles to make three. I was some pretty mad girl when I got home but trotted slyly back with my report card in my hands.

After supper, Maine Saft, Gertrude M., Frances S., Anna W. and myself all went down to the movies. The show was pretty good altho Anna and I were pretty sleepy to be going to shows.

"It seemed good to see Bill Saft again, who is home from Ferris on an over Sunday visit.

"Good night!"

Saturday March.

Am so tired trite little book and this has been such a busy week, pretty near too much for me. (A little tiny matter has been worrying me too today but then life's too short for very much worry isn't it? I just haven't going to do it any more.

Worked hard all morning long then this afternoon I took a nice warm bath changed my clothes and went up to Astrid's awhile. We were all alone up there and had a good confidential talk, seemed good. Her Aunt is intending to move.

She came back with me as far as Dexter Street. We did some shopping and then I came home and got supper, washed dishes and am now thoroughly ready for bed.

Sunday March.

Today was spent in an entirely different way in which I usually spend my Sunday.

Went to church and S. School in the morning, helped them put in door in the Kindergarten Department then came home to my dinner.

After dinner I went up-stairs to lay down but could not sleep so I got up and started to read on my book about "Under Westing Eyes." Soon Bert, Utmost, Norma, and June Hackett drove up in Bert's car. They only stopped a very few minutes. Bert told me Lawrence was quite sick so I went right over and got him up. Came back, got something to eat, and then Wellie Pier came down and wanted us to help him find a muse for his wife after doing this we, Papa, Russell and myself went to church & saw Washington Gardner.

Monday night. - March.

Things have run along in
much the usual tract I
ments today. Went to school
as usual, came home very
early and feeling industrious
I swept and dusted our
sitting room and dining
room. After that I washed
out a waist and also an
underwaist and ironed them
also.

Went over to Fred's and found
Lorraine was but he wasn't
at home so I talked with
his mother. Glad to hear that
he was better.

Had the quiet dog come to
our house about supper time
but he ran away as soon
as we let him out of doors.

Bye - bye I do so
want either
a dog or cat.

Tuesday - March.

Was so happy today to think
that Laurence was back in school
again but possibly that no
more nor no different than I'd
feel for any friend, will wait
and see.

I only hope in reading you
in after years little book that
I may be able to read between
lines, as & so much of my
happiness & youth has been from
little things that have happened
that don't stand stately right in a
diary.

Came home from school tonight
and made a cake. Helped to
get supper and then washed my
hair, only hope that I won't take
cold because it seems awfully
cold and damp outside today.
There is a basket-ball game to-night
between Lowell and Fitch but I'm
going to bed.

Wednesday - March.
Today has seemed like
a long drag day. Nothing
especially exciting happened
perhaps that is the reason.

After school I came
directly home, had a
new white waist fitted, helped
to get supper and then
after supper I washed my
hair. It was a terribly cold
night and everyone thought I
would surely take cold but
I'll layer on the vest. Was
so tired after I got home with
this task that I went directly
to bed.

Suzanne was not at school
again today, probably sick
again. Poor kid.
"Bye bye."

Thursday. Dec March 16.

Today & me has run
along as much the usual
course, nothing seems to be
going on this week. We had
a class meeting tonight and
were assigned our parts in
Junior Play. I am to be a
Witch, surely some lousy role
for me. I will try my
best in whatever comes my
way.

Want to do show trout after
supper to see Blanch Sweet
play in the "Secret Orchard".
It was good.

My thots are busily occupied
just now on my theme to be
no next week on Comparison between
Gulliver's Travels and Modern
children's Stories.

Friday eve. March 17.

St. Patrick's Day and me
a German, such a funny
coincidence. O well I celebrated
just the same, we girls in
our band all wore our
hair down our backs and
green ties. Such fun. Was
glad tho because I may now
tell in years to come that
I wore my hair down my
back in my Senior year in
High School and nineteen
years old at that. It will
sound like a story won't it?

Really intended to go to a
Missionary meeting at Dorothy
Wendell's tonight but because
Eleanor always can't go I
can't as she is the only one
from down this way who goes.
"I am well" for Lassie.

Saturday March 18, 1914.

Today has been a most busy day. work, work for everyone, after doing my usual Saturday's work I looked up some things for my time.

After helping with the dinner work I went up stairs took a nice warm bath and was going to have a good nap when who should come to the door none other than Mr. Carpenter from Muskegon. 



Came home got supper, washed up the dishes and after reading paper and doing a few necessary things I went to bed cause I was so tired.

Sunday May - 1914
Went to S. School the
same as usual and after
having my dinner and helping
to wash dishes I went up to
Hertel's. It was a terribly
warm day.

I hadn't been up there long
before Violet and Belle came.
They were just getting home
from dancing where Violet had
been to an M. A. C. dance and
Belle had gone after her.

Tom drove up after
while and took us both down-
town with him. We met Bert
and Bert got in with him
while he took his car down to the
garage. We four went for a ride
in the Dodge. It rained, thundered
and lightning. Most exciting.

Monday - May - 1916.

Today was quite the same as usual. Went to school, came home late as usual.

I went to bed quite early because I was so tired.

It was quite an uneventful day, nothing exciting happening as I remember it now.

Tuesday - May - 1916.

There was nothing particularly different that happened today from any other day. I recollect I went to school, came home had supper, wiped the dishes and went to bed.

I remember Mr. Russell and I went to the Orpheum to see "Les Misérables". We had an awfully good time.

the we came home.

* Wednesday - May - 1914.

Today was a big day
for us at school. School let
out early so we might go
down to the Arroyo and
practice for our "May Festival".
We got out early enough but
as it was so extremely warm
and as Samson had his ear
at school, we filled it up with
S. P. mill. R. Ball. Samson, Ormon
and myself and went for a
ride. We got down to the Arroyo
the very last mes. Miss Martin
was so provoked at us.

Afterwards we layed down and I was
rather scared. We had to rub
our hair before we dared go
in as the wind had blown it so.

Thursday - May - 1916.

Went to school today quite
the same as usual.

I came from school early
so that I might have some
time to get ready in but
fate was against me. I
tried a little experiment, the
experiment of removing surplus
hair from the arm & pets and
it wasn't at all successful, it
just made a sticky mess
which I was forced to cut off.
It was terrible!

After eating a little wee bit
and jumping into my clothes
I started out and Lawrence
overtook me so I didn't have to
walk. The Festival was fairly
successful and we had a brandy
ride in ~~Bat's~~^{Lawrence's} car afterwards, but
it just thundered and lightened a little
which caused the folks all kinds of tremble.

Friday - May - 1916.

My today was a warm day, it was so hot and sultry. We got off for about half the morning to practice at the Amboy then I went home for dinner. After dinner I laid down to take a little nap but Lawrence came down and wanted me to go for a ride so up I jumped and away I went and what a good time I did have, just loads of fun, we went up the Sag Lake, had a boat ride and then came home just about sunset, it was so delightful and cool.

After supper of course we had to go down to the Amboy for my final exam. It was so warm and stuffy in there that I don't think I was so greatly enjoyed as it might have been. We took a short ride afterwards in But's car.

Saturday May - 1916.

Today was my busy day again and I really had to make things here. We cleaned the porch and put the porch furniture out but it is so dusty out there seeing they are just putting in the new pavement that I don't believe that we will take very much comfort out there for awhile.

Shortly after dinner I took a nice long nap and then came out to the porch and got cooled off and got supper, after I washed the dishes I went to bed, I was so tired I simply didn't stay awake any longer.

Sunday May - 1 916.

It was so warm today
and yet so beautiful.

As one of the B. School
teachers in the Kindergarten
Department were absent I
was forced to take a class
there where only 25 of the little
babies there did with the best
and wiggles I had all I
wanted to do.

Came home and had the best
dinner, strawberry short cake.
the bestest one.

After dinner Laurence came
down and we went up to Guties
for awhile and then we went for
a drive out South of the river
on some new roads. & they
were so beautiful. Some such
beautiful scenery. We came home
about dusk waited here for quite
awhile and then Bert and Gutie came
but didn't stay very long.

Monday - May - 1916.

Today was a usual day with me. It rained all day long and was pretty gloomy. Hug gave out some pretty long lessons for us to sit by with Decorative day.

As I look into the future it will be a very short time now before it'll be that I school will sun so queer and yet I suppose we all find something worth while to do after we are out but its so hard to begin.

Well I'm going to stop now because I must go up to Gettysburg and stay with her toute as she's all alone.

Tuesday - May 3rd - 1916.
Decorative Day.

Got about eight o'clock this morning, Bert and I had such a good time all by our selves since last nite. She popped some of the best corss and we had a general good time but we went to bed early for us.

Soon after breakfast I came home put out some flags and did some work, we then had dinner. After dinner Bertie came down and we sat out in the porch all afternoon. We had a good supper and after supper we went up to the Lake. We got stuck in the mud had a great time, didn't get home until late, home seemed to like it the least little bit.

Wednesday - June 1 - 1916.

Today was the day after
the mite before and I guess
it was in more ways than one
feet turnable all day today
was so sleepy and tired and
so discouraged with life in
general, everything looked gray to
me today. Everyone seemed un-
reasonable so fair but then
I suppose it's all right anyway.

Came home helped get supper
and went to bed good and early,
didn't have much of a desire to
stay up late.

My graduation dress is
started but I just hate to think
of graduation now that I know it
will be so soon.

Thursday - June 2. - 1916.

Today the world seemed a little better to me. I intended to wear some summer clothes today but it proved to be so cold that I decided I wouldn't.

School went along a little better today, we practiced some music after school and then came home. Erma and I stopped and got some candy on the way home.

Expert will have company toate for supper so must go in now and help.

Bye-bye little seary.

Friday - June 3 - 1916.

Today was a lovely day, the whole day long and then such a beautiful full moon at night.

School went along in much the usual course only Lawrence drove his car to school and so I didn't have to walk home.

After supper I went to meet Papa, to go to the Banquet given by Knight Templar's but he wasn't ready so I found Mrs. Smith in her auto in front of temple and I stayed with her. They sent all the women to the Shub for entertainment and then we went back to the Lodge & rooms for our banquet. Lawrence had come up after me to go to a dance and as Papa had to serve they let him eat with me. They had some of the worst, fist sandwiches. Good ^{the} West End Dance at 10:45. Good ^{the} year party.

Saturday - June 4 - 1916.

Today was a great day for Ionia, it being Field Day. Got up at seven this morning regardless I dance the night before. Worked hard all morning long and then this afternoon. —

Stopped for Emma on my way down to the track, as soon as we spied the girls we went with them. Ray Brown was our all around man and he did just fine. R. I. call broke a record, it was all very good. Towards the last we saw the boys and they wanted us to come and sit in the car which we were very glad to do. There were 4 of the girls and those 2 lousy boys. They took us for a bumpy ride & gave us some ice cream & pop - corn. Good time.

Sunday - June 1916

It was very warm today
wore my silk dress but it
was too warm for that.

Came home from S. School
nearly roasted, very soon after
dinner we went for a ride,
Lorraine, his father and mother
and myself. We went to
Portland had a fine time.
Wait up to his house for lunch
and I sat and But came up

High School life, do I realize just how much it means, I don't believe that I do, its all so mysterious can't understand it at all some way. Can't bear to think that today I must say "good bye" to all my school friends, that's what hurts the most.

I brought all my books home tonite, In three my new life must begin "Not finished just begun" Our class motto.

Thursday June 16.

This morning at 10 o'clock I took my tennis
box. Wasn't nearly as
scared as I might have
been. After the game I came
home and had my dinner
and after dinner I went
down-town to see Mary
Pickford in "Madame
Butterfly". It was fine.
We took Maxine and
Dorothy along they enjoyed
it too. They are two very

Friday June 17 -

We started from the High School at 2 o'clock, we took Mr. Dunlap, Wigness, Violet, Norma and of course Lawrence and myself with a lot of lunch thrown in.

We got there safely ^{long lake} & we were taken to Steers Cottage and then Lawrence and I walked around to the other side. Got a canoe and came back and the waves were so high that there were white caps on them, & such fun.

Had lunch and started home but we went over to Belding, went to the show there, got some sandwiches good good time. Started for home beautiful moon but very cold.

Tuesday June 1916.

We finally got started for the church but to my grief the organ would not work so we had to back by a piano. Everythig went fine however. Rode home with Lawrence, his Father, Mother & Grandfather.

Snugorie Pins.


Napkin Rings.

At night Emma and I went down-town to do some trading, we got separated and I found Mrs. Burleson down-town, they came a piece with me and then I came the rest of the way alone, and she came trailing after.

Sunday - 1916.

It has been just terribly warm all day today, we all stayed inside where it is breezy and cool.

After dinner Papa, Russell and myself all went down to Chatanqua, it was so warm in the tent but we were fortunate in getting a ride down there.

After the Chatanqua was over Burtie came over and asked me to stay down there for lunch with her Uncle's folks, so I parted from Papa and Russell.

Leslie came down early and we then started up town, met Bert on the road, asked us if we didn't want to take a ride said "breezy". Later Bert & I went to Chatanqua, took a ride ^{and} came

Monday - 1916.

Got word early this morning
of Grandpa's death which
occurred at 6:30 this morning.

Uncle George and Uncle Herman were at one house for dinner while Uncle Harry stayed at Aunt Carrie's. Soon after dinner we started. They stayed at the cemetery until the grave was covered up and as it was so extremely warm, we all felt very hot and tired when we got home. Uncle George was here for supper.

He wanted me to go home with him the next morning but I just didn't feel well.

Thursday - 1914.

Not warm day. just tired out and didn't do much the whole day long. Uncle George went at noon by auto to Grand Sedge, Uncle Henry and Papa and Russell also going stat far with him.

In the afternoon I read and read, seemed as if I was just simply all in. Went to shore with Russell to see "Papa & Papa".

Friday - 1914.

Worked hard all morning long, in the afternoon I took a nap and then read and amused myself as best I could until after supper time. Russell and I went down to see Marguerite Clark in "Papa & the Paper" with her

Saturday - 1916.

Worked hard again all morning long, in the afternoon trusted and then went up to see Tom Butler who is expecting to take a position in the Capitol in the new future. We had a good visit, then came home, got supper and did up the dishes.

Sunday - 1916.

Went to S. School but they didn't need me down-stairs so I came home, stopping a few minutes at Aunt Carrie's.

After dinner Robinson's folks and Papa and I took a lumpy ride to a farm near G. Jones. Spent time

Mr. Adgatis. stopped there to
tell her something & she said they
were going to drive down town so
I waited & she took me up
there. Frances S. was there
too & we all had a nice visit
& then I came home with Papa.
The folks didn't come for some
time afterwards.

Thursday - 1916.

Well little diary this is the last sheet in this edition & oh it has meant lots to me to put down these very best times of my life so far. I just know I shall always cherish this little book as it brings old true memories. So I say Good bye to you.

We had a six o'clock breakfast at Standard Beavers today we were in a grove near the river. We did have the "bestest" breakfast, one lady from the country made some home made ice cream. Afterwards they went to find a lake which was around there some place but we got tired of so we came back & as Maria had the car over there we went home. We drove around a bit & then we came home. It was much too warm for a picnic today.

Frances French came down & we talked village, I suppose that's the next big event in my life little diary.
