Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the minutes of the regular meeting of the Board held on October 6, 1956, be approved as sent out to the Regents.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Steiger, recommendation No. 1 listed under Degrees was adopted.

Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That the gifts and grants listed in EXHIBIT A, attached, be accepted; and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign the agreements.

Upon motion of Regent Werner, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED, That the Actions by the President, since the October 6, 1956, meeting of the Board of Regents, covering resignations and terminations, appointments, leaves of absence, changes in status or salary of personnel, and resignations to accept other U.W. appointments (EXHIBIT B attached) be approved, ratified and confirmed.

President Fred made the following statement to the Regents:

"I have received a request from Professor Harry Steenbock that his retirement be made effective November 15th.

"Dr. Steenbock is now seventy years old. Under our rules he will reach retirement age at the end of this school year. To grant his wish and to vote him emeritus status would be the least we could do in thanks for all he has done for this University and for mankind throughout the world.

"But I ask this Board to delay such action. We should try to prevail upon this great teacher and scientist to stay with us -- not only until the usual retirement age -- but beyond that, on special contract, so long as he desires to continue his work at this institution.

"We shall be eternally grateful to Professor Steenbock for what he has meant to this institution, and the part he has played in curing one of the most disabling ills of children.

"Harry Steenbock 'trapped the sun' by discovering and substantiating an inexpensive method for the artificial irradiation of foodstuffs to create Vitamin D — the 'sunshine' vitamin. With this discovery he enabled mankind to end the great scourge of rickets and make the arms and legs of children throughout the world straight and strong, keep their backs erect, and their bones and teeth healthy and normal.

"But that was not all. He helped create the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation which made the fruits of his research, and the discoveries of others, produce seeds and grow into further studies and developments benefiting mankind.

"But let us not allow these great contributions to overshadow Harry Steenbock the scholar and professor who, through brilliant teaching, introduced young men and women to the wonderful world of science and sharpened their intellects and curiosity in preparation for scientific careers.

"Back in 1950 a poll was taken in our state to give the people an opportunity to name the ten greatest living Wisconsin residents. Harry Steenbock was named by the people to that honored list — the only University of Wisconsin staff member so chosen.

"For Dr. Steenbock is a symbol of this University, the embodiment of this institution's dedication to productive scholarship, great teaching, and helpful public service.

"For these reasons and for many more, the University takes great pride in its long association with Harry Steenbock and should, I believe, seek to lengthen that association. Therefore, I ask Board approval of a resolution expressing our heartfelt thanks for Professor Steenbock's devoted service, and our deep desire that he withdraw his request for retirement."

Regent Werner made the following statement and motion:

"I am sure that at the appropriate time some portion of the high honor that is due Harry Steenbock, for the contributions he has made, will be paid to him. For the present time, I move that the action recommended by the President be taken and an attempt be made to persuade Harry Steenbock to continue as an active member of our institution."

In seconding Regent Werner's motion, Regent Jones made the following statement:

"It is my privilege to second that motion, and may I add that, in my opinion, this is one of the most significant items that has appeared on the Regents' agenda for many a day. I do not know Harry Steenbock personally, as some of you do. I have had only one personal conference with him since I have been on this Board, and I found it very satisfactory, fruitful, and helpful, and therefore the few words that I express here can be

based only on the facts that are in the record concerning the life of this distinguished scholar.

"He is a native of Wisconsin, born in this State, was a student at the University, obtained his graduate degree, his master's degree, and doctor's degree here. He studied elsewhere and abroad. He has served as an assistant professor, associate professor, full-time professor and chairman of his department. He has made great contributions to human health and welfare; and in that field alone, as a scientist, if we were to put up a blackboard in this room this morning and ask someone to write the names of the scientists who have served with great promise, we would put up naturally the names of Babcock, E. B. Hart and Harry Steenbock; and his name is not in third place, except as it is put there chronologically. Three great, outstanding scientists — world-wide in reputation.

"I will not go into the significance of that marvelous discovery that Dr. Fred has mentioned. I wish to go to fact number two, that sets this man apart as a human being, an educator, a scientist. He made this great discovery, the irradiation of foods, with the addition of Vitamin D, the sunshine vitamin. He knew that he had something unusual. Now, many a man would have taken cognizance of the fact that he had something that could be commercialized, and that, if it could be developed, it would make him independently wealthy. The record shows that he gave no such thought to that procedure. He patented this process at his own expense and on his own initiative. The Record shows further that he brought this great discovery to the then Board of Regents of the University of Wisconsin, hoping that they might take steps so that it might be commercialized and controlled, because the very nature of the process is such that it should be controlled. The Board of Regents at that time had some very distinguished members, the late Governor Walter J. Kohler, who rendered distinguished service on the Board and rendered great service later as the Governor of this State -- a great man. There was Harry Butler, one of the outstanding members of the bar in the entire state. There were others. There were fine men and women on that Board of Regents. The Board decided that, due to the legal inhibitions that surround board activities and responsibility, the Board, as such, could not do anything to develop Dr. Steenbock's discovery.

"He then went to that great benefactor of the University, George Haight; and Mr. Haight called in some of his fellow alumni, of whom there are a large number fortunately, and they set up this special corporation, incorporated under the laws of Wisconsin, as a non-profit organization to develop this and other discoveries, with the avowed and express purpose that the profits, if any, should be made available for research in the natural sciences at this University and for no other purpose. That was back in the '20's, something over thirty years ago; and this dream of Harry Steenbock's, with the spark as he supplied it, that came as a result of his understanding and determination, has developed into one of the finest organizations for the support of education in the entire field of education in America. I do not need to recite here the contributions that that organization has made to this University, of which there is an example here this morning -- an addition to their previous grants totalling \$800,000 for the construction of an addition to Sterling Hall, which sum was not sufficient, so they contributed \$400,000 more this morning.

"The significant thing about Harry Steenbock is that he submerged self gain. He put it aside and kept in the background. Not once did he suggest that he wanted to participate in the profits of the Wisconsin Alumni Research Foundation. He insisted that the rewards should be used for the advance of pursuits of benefit to the University of Wisconsin. It is an example of devotion, high ideals, of selflessness and of effectiveness, if I may use that term, that is so rare in the field of education that I doubt if it can be duplicated in any other University, either publicly supported or privately endowed. These are two facts about this man, either one of which set him apart as an outstanding man, who has made manifold contributions to human welfare and to this institution.

"There is just one other fact, and that is that Harry Steenbock has demonstrated, as I get it from the record of his attitude, of his statements, that he is a great American. He has a passionate belief in America, in American institutions, American freedoms. I am sure that developed when, as a scientist, he found himself free to explore in his search for new life and new facts. I am sure that Harry Steenbock is devoted to the Declaration of Independence and the Bill of Rights, and has them set up in his thinking along with the Decalogue and the Sermon on the Mount. We cannot honor this great man — we can only recite the facts. He is a truly great man; and we should be proud that he is a product of this great University and of this State."

President Gelatt then stated, "I am sure that we all join with Mr. Jones in his thoughts as he has expressed them so admirably."

The question was put on the motion, and it was voted unanimously.

Vice President Peterson presented the report of the Vice President of Business and Finance.

Upon motion of Regent Watson, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That recommendation No. 1 listed under the Report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (I. Construction Contract Awards (Over \$2500)) (EXHIBIT C attached) be adopted.

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Laird, it was VOTED, That recommendation No. 2 listed under the Report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (I. Construction Contract Awards (Over \$2500)) (EXHIBIT C attached) be adopted.

Upon motion of Regent Renk, seconded by Regent Werner, it was VOTED, That the Reports of Actions Taken numbered II., IV. and V., and Memorandum Agreement numbered III., listed under the Report of the Vice President of Business and Finance (EXHIBIT C attached) be approved, ratified and confirmed.

The Vice President of Business and Finance presented the report of budget transfers for October, 1956, for the information of the Regents. (See Exhibit D appended to EXHIBIT C attached)

Vice President Peterson reported that the Housing and Home Finance Agency had approved the applications of the Wisconsin University Building Corporation for a loan of \$892,000 for the Married Student Apartments project, to be located on the Pharmaceutical Gardens site, and of \$2,415,000 for the new Chadbourne Hall project.

Regent Laird presented the report of the Educational Committee.

Regent Laird moved the adoption of the following recommendation of the Educational Committee, and the motion was seconded by Regent Jensen:

That the Coordinating Committee for Higher Education be advised that the Regents of the University of Wisconsin recommend that the cost of rehabilitation scholarships, similar to those authorized in the State Colleges under Section 37.11(14) of the Statutes, belongs in the budget of the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education rather than in the budget of the University.

Regent Watson questioned whether the cost of these rehabilitation scholarships was a rehabilitation cost or a cost of education. President Gelatt reported that the University administration believed that the cost is one of rehabilitation. Regent Rennebohm suggested that the Regents did not have the right to tell the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education that these scholarships should be included in their budget. It was pointed out that this recommendation was proposed for the purpose of advising the Coordinating Committee for Higher Education in connection with the request which the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education had made to the Coordinating Committee, and which the Coordinating Committee at its meeting on October 6, 1956, had referred to the University Regents. President Gelatt read the letter addressed to the Coordinating Committee under date of October 3, 1956, by Mr. C. L. Greiber, State Director of Vocational and Adult Education (EXHIBIT E attached). The Regents were informed that the University at one time had granted scholarships to students recommended by the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education, but had discontinued the scholarships because the statutes did not authorize

the Regents to grant such scholarships. Regent Rennebohm suggested amending the motion to delete the statement that the cost of the rehabilitation scholarships belongs in the budget of the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education, and to include reference to the fact that, under the statutes, the University is not permitted to grant such scholarships. The Regents were also informed that the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education is presently paying fees to the University for the students which would be eligible for such scholarships.

Regent Jensen noted that the State of Wisconsin has made very generous provisions, compared to other states, for its unfortunates; and that there is no justification for the assumption by the University of some of the financial load of other state departments. It was suggested that, if funds were expended by the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education for these scholarships, the result would be additional federal aid to the Board of Vocational and Adult Education. Regent Rennebohm withdrew his suggested amendment and moved that the recommendation be amended to read as follows:

That the Coordinating Committee for Higher Education be advised that the Regents of the University of Wisconsin recommend that the cost of rehabilitation scholarships, similar to those authorized in the State Colleges under Section 37.11(14) of the Statutes, does not belong in the budget of the University.

Regent Renk seconded the motion to amend the recommendation, and it was voted, with Regent Watson voting "No". The question was put on the motion, as amended, and it was voted, with Regent Watson voting "No".

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the Department of Neuropsychiatry of the Medical School be divided to form two new departments, designated as the Department of Neurology and the Department of Psychiatry.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Jensen, it was VOTED, That the bequest by the late M. Lydia Wakeman, Madison, Wisconsin, for the establishment of the Nellie Wakeman Scholarship Fund, the income of which is to be used for scholarships in the School of Pharmacy, be accepted by The Regents of The University of Wisconsin in accordance with the Last Will and Testament of M. Lydia Wakeman, Deceased; and that the Secretary be authorized, on behalf of The Regents of The University of Wisconsin, to sign receipts and to do all things necessary to effect the transfer of this bequest to the University of Wisconsin.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Jensen, it was VOTED, That the following University Faculty action be approved:

Since the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee faculty at a meeting held October 4, 1956, voted that the 1957 summer session be primarily a six-week session, be it resolved that the course offerings be essentially comparable, by Departments, Divisions, Schools and College, to those offered in the 1956 summer sessions, adjusted to a six-week basis.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Watson, it was VOTED, That the resignation of Gordon Haferbecker, Professor of Economics, The University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee, be accepted; to take effect October 1, 1956.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That Lloyd L. Hughes be appointed Superintendent of University Hospitals, beginning January 1, 1957; salary at the rate of \$12,500, annual basis; charge to balance on salary of Harold M. Coon, resigned.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the leave of absence granted Linnea C. Dennett, Associate Professor of Home Economics (Foods), for the first semester of 1956-57 be changed from leave of absence with pay, chargeable \$2,885 to the College of Agriculture budget, to leave of absence with pay on summer session basis, chargeable \$1,985 to the Agriculture budget and \$900 to Summer Session Trust Fund.

Regent Laird moved the adoption of the following recommendation of the Educational Committee, and the motion was seconded by Regent Watson:

That Otto R. Zeasman, Emeritus Professor of Soils and Agricultural Engineering, be employed on a special service contract on a part-time basis from November 1, 1956 to June 30, 1957, to (1) act as consultant to the Agricultural Administration in the planning of the reconstruction of the University of Wisconsin marsh drainage system, and (2) assist in making complete plans, including pumping

plant and design of tile layout; at a salary of \$50.00 per month; charge to extra labor, Administration, 1-A.

Regents Renk and Rennebohm questioned the expenditure of funds for fixing the drainage system in the University Bay marsh, and noted that the Regents had previously rejected a request for approximately \$25,000 for this purpose. Regent Wanvig pointed out that this recommendation merely involved the expenditure of \$50.00 per month to make a study of work that needed to be done, and that the matter of doing the work could be considered by the Regents after the study is completed. The Regents questioned whether this recommendation contemplated replacing the present drainage system, or merely making minor repairs to it. It was suggested that this recommendation be deferred for a month pending receipt of additional information. Regent Laird withdrew her motion and moved that consideration of this recommendation be deferred to the next Regent meeting. Regent Watson, as the second, concurred in the withdrawal of the original motion. Regent Werner seconded the motion to defer consideration, and it was voted.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the appointment of Maxwell M. Freeman, Professor of English, The University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee, be changed, effective October 9, 1956, to Professor of English and Acting Associate Dean of Letters and Science, The University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee; and that he devote half-time to the Department of English and half-time to Administration, Letters and Science; with no change in salary for the remainder of the year.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Watson, it was VOTED, That the title of Paul L. Trump be changed from Director of Admissions to Registrar (Professor of Education), to take effect November 10, 1956; with no change in salary for the balance of the fiscal year 1956-57.

Upon motion of Regent Laird, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That the following recommendations of the Educational Committee be adopted:

1. That Kenneth B. Raper, Professor of Bacteriology and Botany, be relieved of assigned departmental duties and appointed a George I. Haight Traveling Fellow for the period mid April 1957 to mid November 1957; stipend for the remainder of the 1956-57 year to be at the rate of his present University salary with the stipend for the remainder of the period of the fellowship to be determined in the 1957-58 budget.

2. That Eugene E. Van Tamelen, Associate Professor of Chemistry, be relieved of assigned departmental duties and appointed a George I. Haight Traveling Fellow for the period mid June 1957 to mid November 1957; stipend for the remainder of the 1956-57 year to be at the rate of his present University salary with the stipend for the remainder of the period of the fellowship to be determined in the 1957-58 budget.

Regent Jones presented the report of the Business and Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Rennebohm, it was VOTED, That Wisconsin University Building Corporation be authorized to rent Lots 8 and 9, Block 1, Central Homes Addition, City of Madison, to the State Crime Laboratory; and that authority be granted to transfer University Temporary Building, T-4, to the State Crime Laboratory for location on said lots.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That, upon recommendation of the State Director of Purchases, the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign an agreement, effective April 17, 1957, for a period of one year and thereafter until terminated by either party upon not less than twelve months' prior written notice to the other party, with Linde Air Products Company, Chicago, Illinois, for the furnishing of exygen to the University Hospitals, as proposed by Linde Air Products Company on October 22, 1956. This agreement supersedes the agreement entered into by the parties as of January 12, 1954, and provides a new schedule of prices.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Werner, it was VOTED, That \$5,860 be allotted, from the appropriation of \$100,000 made by the State Building Commission on October 19, 1955, for miscellaneous remodelling, to the College of Agriculture for the purpose of repairing and rehabilitating dwelling Number 288 at the Spooner Branch Experiment Station; and that the Vice President of Business and Finance be authorized to sign a contract with Gilbert Durand, Spooner, Wisconsin, for the repairing and rehabilitating work on the basis of his proposal of September 20, 1956, in the sum of \$5,860.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Renk, it was VOTED (a) That the State Building Commission be requested to transfer \$45,000 from savings in the appropriation for the Commerce Unit of the Social

Studies Building to the allotment of State funds for the Poultry and Genetics Research Laboratories and for the Spray Drier.

(b) That the following schedule of costs for the Poultry and Genetics Research Laboratories be approved:

⁽d) That when the proposed Animal Science Building is constructed to house the Poultry Husbandry staff and students, one of the wings or halls be designated the Halpin Hall, in honor of Emeritus Professor James G. Halpin.

Regent Jones moved the adoption of the following recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee, and the motion was seconded by Regent Steiger:

b. That the Executive Committee be authorized to act for the Board in the award of contracts for the Milk Drying Tower Addition to Babcock Hall.

The question was raised as to what would be done if the bids for this work were in excess of the funds provided in the schedule of costs. The Regents were informed that, if the additional funds requested were authorized by the State Building Commission, it was proposed that contracts be negotiated for this work, and that it was anticipated that the funds provided in the schedule of costs would be adequate.

The question was put on the motion and it was voted.

Upon motion of Regent Jones, seconded by Regent Wanvig, it was VOTED, That the appropriate officials of the Wisconsin University Building Corporation be authorized to sign an agreement with the Village of Sherewood Hills covering utility facilities, fire protection service, etc., necessary for the construction and operation of the Married Student Housing to be developed in the Pharmaceutical Gardens area.

Regent Jones moved the adoption of the following recommendation of the Business and Finance Committee, and the motion was seconded by Regent Laird:

That, upon the recommendation of the President of the University, the biennial budget estimates for the University of Wisconsin for the period July 1, 1957 to June 30, 1959, as revised from \$46,056,633 to \$45,887,009 from State tax funds be approved for presentation to the Coordinating Committee for Higher Education.

Regent Jones stated that this recommendation, that the biennial budget estimates, as previously approved and submitted to the Coordinating Committee, be reduced, is due primarily to the fact that the enrollment at the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee is lower than was estimated; and as a result a lesser amount of supporting funds are necessary for that institution. He stated that this recommendation was submitted in fairness to the Coordinating Committee and in order that the record of the Regents in submitting budget estimates might be beyond reproach.

A called vote was taken on the above motion with all Regents present and with all voting "Aye". The motion was declared carried.

At the request of Regent Rennebohm, the report of the Special Regent Committee on Agricultural Lands was presented by Vice President Peterson.

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Watson, it was VOTED, That the President and the Secretary of the Board be authorized to sign a quit claim deed conveying to the City of Madison the land on the East Hill Farm which constitutes the right-of-way dedicated for highway purposes by the Regents on February 7, 1946, said deed to contain the same conditions as those specified in the resolution dedicating the property for highway purposes.

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Jones, it was VOTED, That, subject to the approval of the State Building Commission, the following described property on the East Hill Farms be conveyed to the City of Madison for possession by September 6, 1957, for a consideration of \$7,500.00, to provide

a site for a city fire station, and that the President and Secretary be authorized to sign the deed:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the North line of Regent Street and the West Line of Meadow Lane; thence North 194 feet along the West line of Meadow Lane; thence West 220 feet, on a line parallel and 194 feet North of measured at right angles to the North line of Regent Street, to the East line of Midvale Boulevard; thence South 150 feet along the East line of Midvale Boulevard; thence Southeasterly on a straight line to point of beginning.

On behalf of the Special Regent Committee on Acquisition of Land in Mil-waukee, Regent Wanvig reported that he had not had an opportunity to have a meeting of this committee; that apparently there was a feeling on the part of some people in Milwaukee and elsewhere that the decision of the Regents to designate the site of the former Wisconsin State College in Milwaukee as the area for the development of the campus of the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee was an unwise decision. He noted that suggestions had been made to consider a larger site in the Glendale area. He also reported that Milwaukee Downer apparently was disposed to convey part of their land for the campus of the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee. Regent Rennebohm stated that he wanted to go on record as definitely being opposed to any large expenditure for expansion in Milwaukee. He stated that, if offers are made to dedicate land for this purpose, such offers should be explored.

President Gelatt recalled that the Regents had been informed that it would probably cost less to acquire up to ninety acres in the area of the former state college in Milwaukee than to locate the Milwaukee institution elsewhere. Regent Rennebohm suggested that a report be made on what land might be acquired, and at what cost. Regent Wanvig noted that such a report had previously been made; and he suggested that a recommendation might be obtained from the Coordinating Committee. President Gelatt pointed out that the matter of the site for the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee was not a function of the Coordinating Committee. Regent Wanvig noted that the request by the Regents for funds for that purpose would have to be approved by the Coordinating Committee. It was suggested that the Special Regent Committee on Acquisition of Land in Milwaukee file a report on this matter at the next meeting of the Board.

Upon motion of Regent Rennebohm, seconded by Regent Steiger, it was VOTED, That the meeting adjourn.

The meeting adjourned at 9:50 A.M.

Dear Mr. Gelatt:

Some years ago the Legislature enacted Section 37.11(14) of the Statutes, which reads as follows:

"The board of regents of state colleges shall have authority to grant scholarships equivalent in value to the payment of incidental fees to disabled bonafide residents of the state who are recommended and supervised by the rehabilitation division of the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education."

Under the provisions of this section of the statutes, scholar-ships have been granted by state colleges through the remission of incidental fees to rehabilitation clients of the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education in a number which approximates the sum of approximately \$10,000 annually in incidental fees.

The Board of State College Regents has suggested that, unless legislation is passed by the legislature to apply to the granting of such scholarships by the University of Wisconsin, the practice of granting scholarships to rehabilitation clients under the provisions of Section 37.11 (14) may be discontinued by that board.

The action of the State Board of College Regents was discussed by the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education at the last regular meeting, and I was requested to bring the problem to the attention of the Coordinating Committee on Higher Education. The State Board of Vocational and Adult Education hopes that legislation may be sponsored which would authorize the University of Wisconsin Board of Regents to grant scholarships equivalent in value to the payment of incidental fees to disabled bonafide residents of the state who are recommended and supervised by the Rehabilitation Division of this department. If this is not done and the Board of

State College Regents discontinues its present practice of granting such scholarships, additional funds must be made available by the state legislature, otherwise educational services to handicapped persons in this state must be reduced.
