Dear Professor Hickey,

My long delay in replying to your very good letter of last October has not been due to neglect. At the time it came I was making a slow recovery from an operation, and then in January came the terrible shock of our eldest son, Ward, Fr's death - sudden and wholly unexpected - from a coronary occlusion.

Only recently have I regained the energy to start the formidable job of resorting books, papers, etc. that had to be stored while we were getting resettled in a small house. and most fortunately I recently located Aldo's file of the Pine Cone and - mirabile dictu, my own. I am mailing Aldo's set by insured parcel post to you, as I am not sure of Stella Leopold's present address, and I hope you will be kind enough to see that it gets safely into her hands.

I made an effort a couple of years ago to sift Aldo's articles from my own; but the time lapse is too great to permit doing so except in a relatively few cases. Those were exuberant days, as you so well put it; and the Pine Cone revivifies many happy experiences when Aldo and I were scaling the heights together.

After many formidable interruptions I have been able at last to get down to the systematic writing of my book on evolution from the ecological standpoint. The scientific logic of the orthodox evolutionists has long been overdue for a drastic overhauling, and that is what I am boldly - and I think successfully - doing. It is a prodigious and fascinating task, which is going to keep me fully occupied for another year at least.

I was delighted to hear of the honors paid to Stella Leopold by the Natural Resources Association of Wisconsin. Please give her my affectionate greetings. And I send to you and your colleagues in the Department my best wishes.

Dear Aldo:-

Received the copy of your letter to Sherman.
Expect him here tomorrow and will give him your file then if
he wants it.

I enclose the penciled list of the Cones I made
when I first received them. I intended to write you at that
time, thanking you and calling your attention to the apparent
missing numbers. I arranged them in order as soon as I opened
the package and made this list at that time. You may know about
these missing numbers, or they may not have been issued at all.
I am very sorry I did not keep a file of them myself. Yours are
probably the only ones now in existence and certainly should be
cherished.

I note your list of the original group and think that
you have included a number of names who did not come in until a
later date. I am positive that Pettit, Sisk and Baldrige were
not with us when Hornaday was here. I don't think Jamie was and
think you have forgotten Don Rankin. My brother and I took poor
Jamie on the first hunt he ever had. He wanted to see what this
sport was that would make us stop playing tennis when the dove
season opened.

Sure wish you were here now and for the next year as
I am very strongly of the opinion that we are facing a BAD
political crisis and are in grave danger of losing nearly all the
ground gained in the last ten years. It sure don't look good and
we have been sailing along so smoothly that it is mighty hard
to make the sportsmen realize the present danger. Neblit has
taken the attitude of tearing the whole thing down unless he can
control it himself.

a quarterly newspaper being the official bulletin of the Albuquerque Game Protective Association. AL ^{founder} editor - ^{S.P. Wright} Ward Shepard also editor. Named New Mexico S.P.A. subsequently. The paper's aim was to promote the protection & enjoyment of wild things, efficient wardens, refuges, NM politics, wildlife conservation. articles unsigned - presumably AL wrote most of them. circulation 5,000. (?) AL's name not on ^{but Shepard Wright} masthead various issues. listed as editor 1/1917 ^{Wright} too. →
