

1985–86 Badger Women's Basketball Preview

Youth and inexperience would be considered a weakness by most people, but Coach Edwina Qualls looks at the 1985–86 Wisconsin women's basketball team as enthusiastic and possessing a winning attitude. With the loss of five starters to graduation, the 1985–86 Wisconsin women's basketball team will have to look for that enthusiasm and attitude from last seasons reserves.

During the 1985–86 season, the Badgers finished in a tie for seventh in the Big Ten with a 11–17 overall record and 6–12 conference record. The Badgers were led by seniors Chris Pruitt and Faith Johnson who finished their Wisconsin careers with an 11.9 points per game average and topped the 1,000 career point mark. Coach Edwina Qualls must also replace starting center Theresa Theder, power forward Andrea Adams and guard Carmella McMullen.

Leading Badgers this year will be seniors Sheila Driver and Cindy Slovak. Driver, a 5–8 guard from Racine, Wis., returns as a Badger leader from the shooting guard position. Though slowed by a knee injury, Driver averaged 6.9 points and 2.8 asssists per game last season. A starter in 14 games last season for the Badgers, she is eighth on the Wisconsin all-time list in assists and steals. The leading scorer and most experienced Wisconsin player returning, Driver will give the Badgers experience and leadership in the back court.

Slovak, a 5–11 forward from Chicago, was selected by her teammates to be a team tri-captain during the 1985–86 season. A hard worker who gives 100 percent at all times, Slovak will give the Badgers depth and experience at the small forward position. She is also a good outside shooter and rebounder.

Three other players will be competing for the starting job at the small forward position. Tri-captain Michelle Fischer, a 6–0 junior from Flint, Mich., played in 12 games at small forward as a sophomore and continued improvement in her ball handling skills and aggressiveness should put her in contention for a starting position.

Tri-captain Delinda Hastie, a 5–11 sophomore from Washington D.C., suffered a severe knee injury in the second week of practice last year and was forced to sit out the rest of the season. A good jumper and rebounder with the quickness of a guard, Hastie will be an asset to the Badgers if healthy.


Also challenging at the small forward position will be Maike Grossman, a 6–0 sophomore from Hamburg, West Germany. Grossman, a member of the West German national team since December 1984, has also competed in the club system in Germany.



The Badgers look strong at the power forward position with the return of Lisa Bonnell, a 5–11 sophomore from Merrill, Wis. Bonnell was sixth in scoring last season with 179 points and led the team in blocked shots with 29. She also finished second in rebounds with 146 boards. Bonnell, who played in 27 games as a freshman and started in seven, returns as one of the Badgers more experienced players.

Adding depth to the power forward position will be sophomore Kelly Leinfelder, a 6–0 transfer from Montana State University with immediate eligibility. Already experienced on the collegiate level, Leinfelder has the ability to shoot with either hand under the basket and has a good shot from up to fifteen feet. A good post player, she will give the Badgers help in scoring and rebounding.

The center post position will be one of the Badgers strongest with three returning letterwinners. Leading the returnees is Marsha Millhouse, 6–3 a sophomore from Washington D.C. Millhouse finished seventh in Badger scoring last season with 125 points for a 5.0 average. She also averaged 3.4 rebounds in 25 games, including 10 starts. A strong offensive player with a good shooting touch, Millhouse should be the strongest Badger at the post position.





Also competing for the starting post position will be Camilla Hudson and Inga Young. Hudson, a junior from Aurora, Ill., sat out most of the 1984–85 season with a knee injury. The 6–4 center has the size to neutralize taller opposing centers and should give the Badgers aid in rebounding. Young, a junior from Alexandria, Va., played in 18 games last season at the back up post position. Stronger than last year, Young has also improved her offensive skills and will be a contender for the starting post position.

A trio of newcomers and two veterans will be working towards the starting guard positions. In addition to Driver, Vicki Prince returns as an experienced letterwinner for the Badgers at guard. Prince, a 5–7 sophomore from Flint, Mich., saw action in 20 games as a freshman and averaged 1.9 points per game. Prince came on at the end of the season and began to perform the way she is capable. With excellent speed and quickness for a large guard, she can outperform many smaller guards.

Leading the way among the newcomers is Karen O'Malley, a 5–7 guard from Madison, Wis. O'Malley, an Associated Press all-state selection, averaged 25.0 points per game her senior year. The holder of the Madison prep school scoring record with 1,526 points, O'Malley was also selected to all-city, all-conference and all-area teams. An aggressive player who will fit in well with the Badgers fast break style of play, she will play either point or off guard for the Badgers.

Another top recruit for the Badgers is Verdell Hale, the New York City Player of the Year. The 5–5 guard averaged 18.0 points and 7.1 assists per game in leading her team to their second consecutive state title. Hale, an excellent ball handler, has the ability to penetrate the zone or hit the open person. A solid defensive player, she will challenge for a starting position at the point guard position.

Closing out the guard ranks is Tracy Faulkner, a junior transfer from Lincoln College. Experienced on the collegiate level, Faulkner led her team to its first ever appearance in the National Junior College Athletic Association Tournament. She averaged 17.3 points and 5 rebounds per game on her way to becoming the Lincoln College all-time leading scorer with 1,124 points. A NJCAA All-American first team selection, Faulkner possesses a good outside shot that will help the Badgers in backcourt shooting from the point or off guard positions.

The 1985–86 Wisconsin season opens on November 24 when the Badgers host Western Illinois. On November 29 and 30, Wisconsin hosts the Badger Invitational, competing against Eastern Illinois, Miami of Ohio and powerful St. John's. Tough non-conference competition comes on December 6 and 7 when the Badgers travel to Charlottesville, Va., to compete in the Virginia Invitational. Host Virginia should give the Badgers a challenging

game as well as invited teams Northeastern and Pittsburgh.

In Big Ten play, the Badgers hope to move back up into the upper division of the conference after finishing in a tie for seventh last season, and placing second in 1984 conference play. Perennial powerhouses Ohio State and Iowa are again favored in the conference.



Administration

Dr. Kit Saunders, the former Director of UW Women's Athletics for nine years, assumed a new role in the Wisconsin Athletic Administration in 1983. As the Associate Director of Varsity Sports, Kit oversees the policies and direction of the 22 men's and women's non-revenue sports.

Kit's long association with Wisconsin includes serving as the women's club sports coordinator, lecturer in physical education and women's tennis coach prior to her appointment as Director of Women's Athletics in 1974.

She has held positions of athletic leadership at the state, regional and national level. As one of the founders of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Conference, Kit served in numerous state offices including that of president. She was formerly a commissioner for the six-state Midwest Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (MAIAW), and was elected vice-president for Division I schools of the former Association of Intercollegiate Athletics for Women (AIAW).

In 1984, Kit was honored as the first member of the Wisconsin Women's Athletics Hall of Fame in recognition of her contributions to intercollegiate athletics for women on the UW campus. Paula Bonner became the Assistant Athletic Director in charge of the Wisconsin Women's Intercollegiate Athletics Program in 1983. Now in her eighth year of administrative association with the UW program, Paula oversees the complete operation of the 11-sport Badger women's program including budget preparation and expenditures, financial aid, special events arrangements, and recruiting.

She has served as the chairperson of the State and Midwest Regional AIAW ethics and eligibility committees, and heads the UW Athletic Board Women's Sports Committee. She is also a charter member of the Wisconsin Task Force on Women's Sports which is affiliated with the Wisconsin Women's Network, and serves on the steering committee for the Association of University Community Women.

Sports Information

The responsibility for disseminating all information and publicity materials for the 11-sport women's athletic program lies with Tamara J. Flarup, Director of Women's Sports Information.

Now in her ninth year, Tam has been able to observe Wisconsin women's sports gain stature and recognition both statewide and nationally. Under Tam's direction, the sports news staff coordinates sports results, plans brochures and other publicity materials, and writes weekly sports releases and additional features on the women athletes. Tam also assists the Women's Intercollegiate Sports Booster Club (W.I.S. Club) in its promotions and publications.

Active in concerns of women's sports publicists nationally, Tam organized and chaired the College Sports Information Directors (CoSIDA) "Publicists for Women's Sports Committee" two years, served as a coordinator for the CoSIDA Publications Contest Committee, and was a member of the AIAW Publicity Committee. She has been a contributing writer on women's sports in the NCAA Public Relations Manual the past two editions.

In 1983, Tam was selected as one of 34 sports information directors to serve as a media liaison director for the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs.

Academic Counseling

Academic excellence is emphasized at Wisconsin. Much of the credit for the impressive academic record behind many Badger athletes is the counseling system available to the men and women student athletes.

Assistant Athletic Director Dr. Diane Johnson and Counselors Alan Zussman and Mary Weaver are responsible for the Wisconsin Athletics counseling program which is offered to the nearly 900 Badger athletes. As former members of the academic dean's office, Diane and Alan have a comprehensive understanding of academics at Wisconsin, and a permanent line of communication with all university departments.

For those athletes that do request assistance, Diane, Alan, and Mary offer counseling sessions on a one-to-one basis at a time appropriate for the athlete. Wisconsin athletes are encouraged to be degree-oriented while allowing for the flexibility to explore different areas. The counseling staff takes a personal approach to each athlete in determining his or her individual needs, whether the needs be personal or academic in nature.

Sports Medicine

The care, prevention and treatment of injuries to all Wisconsin athletes is supervised by a six-person staff of N.A.T.A. certified athletic trainers. Gordon Stoddard, Jan Tappon, Joe Baer, Dennis Helwig, Sherri Springer, and Jim Bossany are supported by a staff of 25 student trainers and two certified graduate assistant as they care for the nearly 900 men and women athletes at Wisconsin.

The staff utilizes training rooms in the Stadium, Armory, Coliseum, Natatorium, and UW Fieldhouse. All training areas are equipped with the finest therapeutic modalities and rehabilitative apparatus. Other medical specialists assigned to intercollegiate athletics also assist in the diagnosis and treatment of the athletes.

Program Assistants

Program Assistants Roxann Zimmerman, Marilyn Sheldon, and Jackie Larson assist the Women's Intercollegiate Athletic Program in operating at peak efficiency. Roxann and Marilyn work closely with the athletic directors and coaches, as well as with the W.I.S Club booster organization. Jackie assists the coaches in expense reports. All are an integral part of office efficiency and public relations.

Coaching





Head Coach Edwina Qualls

Head basketball coach **Edwina Qualls** begins her 10th year of coaching women's basketball at Wisconsin. A native of Connecticut, Edwina coached basketball and taught physical education at R.C. Lee High School in New Haven, where she compiled an 82–15 high school coaching record over a seven-year period. Her teams consistently appeared in the Connecticut State basketball tournament claiming the Class L state title in 1975 and runners-up titles two other years.

Edwina's university coaching experience began at Southern Connecticut State College, where she received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees in physical education. She later teamed with basketball great Louise O'Neal, serving as her assistant basketball coach at Yale University prior to coming to Wisconsin.

Coach Qualls was honored by being named "Coach of the Year" in 1975 by the Connecticut High School Coaches Association. She served as the Midwest basketball coach at the National Sports Festival in Colorado Springs in 1979, and was a member of the AIAW Division I Basketball Committee 1979–80.

While at Wisconsin, Edwina's teams have an overall record of 127 wins, 117 losses and five winning seasons including a second place Big Ten Conference finish in 1983–84. She guided the 1981–82 squad to a quarter-final finish in the AIAW National Basketball Championship.




Trish Roberts, a 1976 Olympic Silver Medalist and former standout at the University of Tennessee, enters her first year as assistant basketball coach at the University of Wisconsin. The former Illinois assistant coach also coached at Central Michigan for two years. She will be responsible for recruiting, scouting and on-court teaching.

The 6-1 center was a teammate of 1984 Olympic Coach Pat Head Summitt on the silver medal winning 1976 Olympic team. Following a transfer from Kansas Emporia State College, Roberts joined the Tennessee team under Summitt to complete her final year of collegiate eligibility.

Playing just one year for the Volunteers, she accumulated 987 points and 467 rebounds while leading Tennessee to its first national championship appearance and third place AIAW finish. Her 29.9 points and 14 rebounds per game earned her Kodak All-American honors. In her first appearance at Tennessee's Stokely Athletic Center, the talented senior scored 51 points to break the Field House record of 50 set by Pete Maravich, a record that still stands.

Prior to her graduation in physical education from Tennessee in 1979, the Monroe, Georgia, native played with the World University Team in 1977, and captained the U.S. National team in 1978. From 1978–81, Roberts played professional basketball in the now defunct Women's Basketball League as a player/assistant coach with the Minnesota Fillies two years, and with the St. Louis Streaks one year. She has served as a summer camp clinician at Tennessee, Kansas, Georgia, and Kansas State since 1978.



Linda Gough, a former Wisconsin standout player, begins her fifth year assisting with the Wisconsin women's basketball program. The first 1000 point scorer for the Badgers, Linda played the forward spot for Wisconsin four years, graduating from the squad in 1981. She was a member of the Midwest Team attending the National Sports Festival in 1978.

Among her many career records is the enviable statistic of having played 103 consecutive games for Wisconsin in a 105 career tota1. Although she saw many of her records broken by scoring and rebounding aces Terri and Janet Huff, Linda still ranks fifth in scoring and fourth in rebounding and fifth in blocked shots. She also ranked among the top 10 in 11 other career categories.

Linda will assist in scouting and recruiting again this year in addition to her practice coaching duties. She received a B.S. in recreation and resource management in 1982.

Wisconsin Sports Facilities

Athletes at the University of Wisconsin benefit from some of the finest sports facilities found anywhere in the country. From practice and competitive areas to athletic and weight training, Wisconsin offers modern and well equipped facilities for its women athletes.

The basketball and volleyball teams practice and compete in the Wisconsin Fieldhouse (seating capacity 12,204). The facility contains four remodeled locker rooms and a modern and convenient athletic training area.

Our tennis players have a marked advantage in their ability to play tennis year-round at Nielsen Tennis Stadium. The two-million dollar facility seats 1500 spectators, and features 18 tennis courts (12 indoor and six outdoor), five squash courts, and one squash doubles court. The Stadium is named for Arthur C. Nielsen, founder of the Nielsen television rating system, who captained the Wisconsin men's tennis team from 1916–1918 while a student in electrical engineering.

Wisconsin's track program is enhanced by practicing and competing during the indoor season in the Camp Randall Memorial Sports Center. Located next to the Stadium, the "Shell" contains a 220-yard Mondo Rubber track, throwing and jumping areas in the infield, and a seating capacity of 2500. The athletes and staff also look forward to utilizing the newly renovated 400 meter Mondo Rubber outdoor track in the 1985–86 season.

Our teams also have access to Unit II and the Natatorium, the center of activity for the Department of Physical Education and Dance. This complex includes seven gyms which are utilized by the volleyball and fencing teams. The fencing team also practices in the Henry Mall Gymnasium located on central campus.

The swimming and diving team has the luxury of having two pools in which to practice and compete—the Natatorium adjacent to Unit II, and the new Unit III facility or SERF. The "Nat" contains an eight-lane, 25-yard racing pool equipped with a fully automatic Colorado Timing System and digital readout score board. The 50' × 40' separate diving well is fitted with three one-meter and two three-meter Dura (Maxi) Flex boards. The recently completed Unit III facility features an indoor long course pool with movable bulkheads that more than double the program's training space.

The latest addition to the list of fine facilities at UW–Madison is the renovated





Armory where the gymnastics team practices and competes. Better known on campus as the Red Gym, the facility provides increased training areas and spectator seating of 1000.


Outdoor facilities at Wisconsin include soccer fields adjacent to Camp Randall Stadium, and the outdoor track near Unit II on the West side of campus. The crew boat house, situated on Lake Mendota, provides the Badger crews with a modern facility including an indoor rowing tank for year-round practice.

Other facilities which are an integral part

The large medical facility offers a well equipped preventive medicine and rehabilitative area for all Wisconsin athletes. A certified staff of athletic trainers provides for the care and prevention of injuries for both the men and women athletes.

The modern weight training area features Nautilus equipment, free weights, and stereo music in a spacious, fully carpeted room in Camp Randall. A full-time weight training instructor monitors and advises all Wisconsin student-athletes.









Nestled among a chain of four sparkling lakes, the dominant feature on the Madison skyline is the majestic capitol building, whose 200-foot illuminated white dome is visible for miles both day and night.




UW-Madison has ranked among the top ten universities in the United States in every scholarly reputational study since 1910.




The Wisconsin campus is located just one mile from the state capitol on a series of hills overlooking scenic Lake Mendota, the largest of the chain of lakes.

The campus covers over 900 acres—most within two blocks of Lake Mendota. Many of the residence halls have the lake in their backyard, and there are numerous bathing beaches along the Mendota shoreline. In addition, the UW Arboretum, a nature study and hiking area, offers another 1,224 acres to the campus community. Also located near the campus is Picnic Point, a 129-acre park-like peninsula which extends into Lake Mendota and is used for nature study and recreation. Jogging paths and bike trails extend along the entire campus shoreline of Lake Mendota.






