

Dear General Bryan:

Apropos of our conversation in Omaha relative to separating the Jap officers and non-working Jap non-coms, we have submitted a #105 through channels requesting approval of constructing the approximate area enclosed in red on the accompanying plan. The post engineer believes it to be more practical to use CCC type of buildings than to use hutments. And CCC type buildings may be available near Camp McCoy for this area.

News reports indicate that additional Jap POWs have been captured. If the existing facilities of old Camp McCoy may be used we can expand to care for about 6,000 Jap POWs. This will of course require buildings to house them and fencing generally as indicated on the plat by green. Mess halls, latrines, administrative buildings and other needed facilities are all available. This construction can be done piece meal as the need is indicated.

When this form reaches the office please give it careful consideration and bring it to my attention. If the form is not received within a reasonable time, we should start a check from this end.

Dear General:

Advice has just been received from Chicago that a 105 requesting money to convert the 7200 Block of the Old Camp McCoy to Prisoner of War use has been forwarded on to Washington. This covers mostly materials that have been used and materials to be used in completing the project.

We have completed only one mess hall (Building 7225) and one latrine (Building 7226). At the moment only seventy-eight (78) non-working Japanese Prisoner of War non-commissioned officers are quartered in this area. On completion of another mess hall (Building 7224) and addition of latrines in the remaining buildings, we can move our working Japanese Prisoner of War into this area and can build it up to a total of about nine hundred (900) men which is the capacity without over-crowding.

This completed area will permit us to return the non-working non-coms to the main stockade. The officers now confined in a barracaded ward of the Post Hospital can be returned to the buildings which were converted for them. We will also be able to form a battle casualty non-working company to be held here. This main area may not be filled to capacity of seven hundred fifty men (750) and one hundred (100) officers by the time the working area is filled but it gives us a working installation and an increased capacity.

As the main camp may go on a stand-by status by the 1st of October, we urgently need to get the officers back into the main stockade.

An approval of this 105 is urgently needed and anything you can do to help us will be appreciated.

1. Submitted herewith is request for funds in the amount of \$33,321.00 to complete an enclosure for housing 6,300 Enlisted Japanese Prisoners of War as directed by the Commanding General, Sixth Service Command. Post request No. 47-018-480, OCE Form 105 is attached, as is also Plan No. 47-018-480.

2. Conversion of existing housing will be as follows:

a. Standard 74 Man barracks will be used for housing based on the allowance of 40 sq. ft. per man.

b. Laundry will be handled at Post Laundry.

c. Existing RB-4 recreation buildings in each compound are considered sufficient for Army Exchange and indoor recreation space.

d. A standard I-2 Infirmary is available in the immediate vicinity.

e. Hospital facilities are available at the Station Hospital.

f. Housing of the guard complement will be in existing building.

g. Outdoor recreation area is provided for.

3. Security measures are as follows:

a. The inclosed area is more than 500 ft. from any boundary or public road.

g. Lighting of towers with exception of the two towers at recreation area is as per standard detail. No lighting is proposed for the two towers at the west side of the recreation area.

4. Building #2734 was damaged by fire on 23 July 1944 and, since it has never been restored to its former condition, the cost of such restoration is included in this request for funds.
