## ALLERGY OR DEFICIENCY?

Infantile eczema may be due to allergy. But it may also be due to deficiency of an essential unsaturated fatty acid.

The infant on a cow's milk formula gets only one-fifth as much n-linoleic acid as the breast-fed infant. The blood of most eczematous infants is low in linoleic acid and most cases respond dramatically when the deficiency is relieved.

Soyola should be tried in such cases. It is a stable, palatable emulsion of soybean oil, a rich source of n-linoleic acid.
