

HISTORICAL SKETCH

OF THE

CITY OF JANESVILLE,

WISCONSIN.

Resources, Commercial and Manufacturing Facilities.

EDITORIAL REVIEW.

JANESVILLE, the county seat of Rock county, is located on parts of the townships of Harmony, Rock, Janesville and La Prairie, in the center of the county, and beautifully laid out on the east and west banks of Rock river. It is twelve miles north of the Illinois State line, ninety-one miles from Chicago, seventy-one miles from Milwaukee, sixty-five miles west of Racine, and forty miles southeast of Madison, the capital of the State. Her railroad communications, if not all that could be desired, are of an excellent character, both to the east and the northwest, as the city is located on the crossing of the Wisconsin Division of the extensive Chicago and Northwestern Railway and on the Monroe Branch of the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railway, thus giving her great facilities for her general trade and an outlet for her manufactories. The ground upon which the city is built is finely diversified, affording in its undulations of surface and in the rounded bluffs, which skirt the river, innumerable business sites of great beauty, and securing that great desideratum in municipal economy, perfect drainage of every portion of the city. The limpid waters of Rock river flow through the city with rapid current, until coming to the two dams located here, whence it is diverted from its course to turn the wheels of the various manufacturing establishments, to which, together with the fertility of the surrounding country, in a large measure, the prosperity of Janesville is due. The early settlers of the city, while preparing the foundations for the future Janesville, with a thoughtfulness which we of the present day cannot too highly commend, spared many of the beautiful groves which crowned the swells of the prairie and clothed the river banks, and these have been cared for and added to until the sobriquet of "Bower City" has, by general consent, been conferred upon it, as truthfully describing its aspect during the season of foliage.

Situated in the midst of an agricultural district unsurpassed in loveliness, in the fertility of its soil and the intelligence of its inhabitants, possessed of the finest water-powers, and blessed with religious and educational advantages beyond those of many western cities, it is not to be wondered at that on the prairie, which thirty-seven years ago was gemmed with flowers and checkered with beautiful groves, through which flashed the "clear waters" on their way to the mighty Mississippi, lay before the fascinated gaze of the hardy pioneers who had come to spy out the land, and which years afterward was purchased of the government for a dollar and a quarter as acre,—there has grown up a community numbering over ten thousand souls, rich in all the elements of material and intellectual prosperity, and standing in the front rank of the inland cities of the great State of Wisconsin.

The first settlers of Janesville, of which we have knowledge, were John Inman, George Follmer, Joshua Holmes, William Holmes, Jr., and Miles Jones, who came here in October, 1835, while Samuel St. John was the first settler who moved here with his family, which was in November, 1835. The five first named gentlemen, immediately upon their arrival, commenced to erect a cabin, which was located opposite the "Big Rock," an old landmark of the Indians, and which may still be seen opposite the north end of Monterey bridge: In January, 1836, Dr. James Heath and wife joined this little band of bold pioneers, and the small cabin, which had been roughly put together the previous fall, gave shelter to eleven persons in all, with two married couples in the number. It was here, shortly after New Year's, that the first white child was born, if not in the upper valley of the Rock, certainly in the county of Rock, and he was named Seth B. St. John.

On the 9th of March, 1836, Judge William Holmes removed to this place from Michigan City, bringing with him all his family except those of his sons who had gone before him to spy out the land. His family consisted of five sons and two daughters, one of whom, Catharine, wife of Volney Atwood, is residing here at the present writing, and is the oldest settler in

Rock county, and one of the most kindly and estimable ladies in Janesville. Her husband, along with W. A. Lawrence, are the oldest hardware merchants in the city, having been established, in one location, 7 South Main street, since 1847.

Henry F. Janes, in honor of whom the city was named, came in 1836 with his family, brother Edward, and several others, who, with the numerous Holmes family, and others, made quite a pleasant society. Rock county was organized and the county seat established at Janesville, under a territorial law passed February 13, 1839, in which year Judge Irving held the first session of the Rock County District Court. In the early part of 1841, the erection of a court house was commenced, and in December following it was completed and ready for use. This served its purpose until 1859, when it was consumed by fire, and gave place to the present one, which was not completed, however, until 1870, but which is said to be the finest in the State. It is three stories high, with Mansard roof, and cost over \$100,000. The first story is entirely of beautiful cut stone, while the other stories are of the best Milwaukee pressed brick, elaborately trimmed with stone, the whole edifice being fire-proof throughout.

In 1837 the first post office was established, and in 1842 the first bridge was built across the river at a cost of \$2,000, which for those days was considered a huge enterprise. In 1844-5 the first dam was erected, and in 1848-9 the second, in the southern part of the city. The water power here obtainable is capable of turning many times the number of wheels now propelled, notwithstanding the fact that quite a number of flouring mills and other manufacturing establishments are located here. The first flour mill erected in this place was built in 1845, and was known as the "Big mill," and was, until destroyed by fire a short time ago, in the occupation of Mr. Hiram Jackman, now an extensive commission merchant of Chicago. Mr J. B. Doe, the efficient cashier of the First National Bank, and several other gentlemen erected it, and it was considered for those days an enterprise of great magnitude.

In 1844 the first substantial brick block was erected, and July 3d of the same year a steamer from St. Louis arrived at the "port" of Janesville, which event was properly commemorated on the glorious Fourth. In 1845 D. F. or "Frank" Kimball erected a brick store on West Milwaukee street, in which was sold the first goods on the west side of the river.

In 1853 the city was incorporated, and elected for its first Mayor A. Hyatt Smith, and has for its present Mayor J. W. St. John, one of our oldest residents and most esteemed citizens.

The streets of the city are well laid out, principally at right angles, are well provided with sidewalks and afford many prominent drives and promenades, which are eagerly taken advantage of by residents and visitors. Main and East and West Milwaukee streets are her principal business thoroughfares, on either side of which, magnificient and substantial blocks and buildings are erected, which not only do credit to Janesville, but which would do credit to a city of much larger size. These streets are usually busy from morn till night, while teams not only transacting the ordinary business of the city, but many bringing in their country produce, which meets with ready sale here, Janesville being one of the leading wheat and produce markets of the west.

The principal place of amusement is the Opera House, while there are several other halls and buildings of creditable character. The city is lighted with gas of good quality, being manufactured by the Janesville Gas Light and Coke Co., with Hiram Merrill as superintendent. The educational facilities are of a high order and are increased by the practical education secured at the Janesville Business College of King & Silsbee, which teaches penmanship, bookkeeping and banking for a nominal amount. The High School building is one of the finest and largest brick structures of any city of the size of this, while each of the ward schools are elegant structures and reflect credit on the intelligence of their projectors and the citizens generally. In this connection it is appropriate to say that Janesville is also well furnished with churches, some twelve or fourteen elegant structures adorn the city and are capable of accomodating a vast congregation. This feature of the character of a city speaks volumes in itself, especially when we say that two of the churches, the Baptist and Congregational, cost between forty and fifty thousand dollars each and are mostly, if not altogether paid for.

In closing our remarks in this department of our Directory, we would say that few cities present better facilities for manufacturing purposes than does Janesville, with ample water power and good railroad communications, many establishments might be erected here with profit to their founders.

In this department we ought to mention the various enterprising manufacturing establishments which do so much towards keeping the city in a prosperous condition, as well as those business men who are ever ready and willing to assist any enterprise set on foot for the city's interest. As these names would occupy too much of our space, however, in this part of our work we will defer them until we reach our editorial department.

The population of the city in 1855 was ascertained by the census taken

under State authority, to be over seven thousand, an increase of more than two thousand, since the early part of the year 1853.

In 1856, among the public improvements specially to be noted, was the construction of the bridge between Court and Pleasant Streets, under the superintendence of Wm. Macloon.

From the foot of Centre Avenue to Miltimore's quarries, another most substantial and durable bridge, with cut stone piers, and strong, wooden superstructure, was erected in the same year, and is now known as the "Monterey Bridge."

The Chicago, St. Paul and Fond du Lac Railroad was completed to Janesville, in November, 1856. This was formerly known as the Rock River Valley Union Railroad, and now is styled the Chicago and Northwestern Railway. About the first of October, 1859, its track was laid to Oshkosh, and the whole line from Chicago to that place, put in successful operation, and in November, 1862, the line was extended to Green Bay.

Having thus briefly sketched the leading events in the history of our town, and the progress of improvement from the early days to the present time, it is appropriate to add some remarks relating to its present condition, its various advantages, and its probable future.

The facilities for manufacturing by water power, the improvement of which has been noted in some detail, are coming every year more into use, and from this time onward, it may be safely predicted, they will attract the attention of men of capital, and induce the investment of means in manufacturing establishments, until the full capacity of the power shall be exhausted in the propulsion of machinery. The situation of Janesville, also, peculiarly fits it to become a great manufacturing town. The county of Rock is one of the best agricultural districts in the West. Its soil is equal in fertility to that of the best lands in any of the Western States, and there is scarcely an acre within its limits, which cannot be profitably used for farming purposes. In addition to Rock, there are considerable portions of the adjoining counties, for which Janesville is a market. At the present time this is, it is believed, as a wheat and general produce market, next to Milwaukee, the most important in the State. The early establishment of flouring mills here is one of the causes which have brought this about.

Another principal cause is in the fact that the town stands at the intersection of the railways, leading to Chicago, and to Milwaukee, and here the produce dealers of these cities compete for the trade of a large and rich surrounding territory. Our own produce dealers have, also, done their part, by a liberal course of business, to promote the interests of the city

From an early day, down to the present time, a very large trade has been done here in general merchandise. Our merchants have kept up with the needs and demands of a widely extended circle of customers, and have enjoyed a reputation for liberal dealing. Dry goods, hardware, groceries, and other descriptions of goods have been sold at prices uniformly moderate, when compared with the trade of other inland towns, and this fact has always had an influence in the highest degree favorable to the interest of the place. Our mercantile establishments are upon a scale as to extent, amount of stock, quality of goods, and the style in which they are fitted and furnished, that would be creditable to older and much larger towns.

As yet nothing has been said of the merits of the site upon which our fair young city is built. On this object, every citizen of Janesville, is apt at times, to speak in such enthusiastic terms, that those who listen to the description of what they have not yet seen, are likely to take it with many grains of allowance. But all strangers who visit the place, and pass through its different wards, and wide extent of streets, are charmed with the beauty of the landscape, and its admirable adaptation to the purpose for which it was chosen and has been improved. There is here a pleasing variety of surface, all in harmony, in no part of it abrupt or rough; affording the choicest sites for residences, in profusion, and at the same time convenient and handsome streets for the uses of business. On the east side the ground rises rather rapidly, from the second street running parallel with the river, to the fine plateau of prairie which stretches away for miles beyond, and on the brow of this rise, which is diversified with grassy knolls, and here and there with beautiful groves, for a distance of two miles or more, are sites for villas and cottages, many of which are occupied, not to be surpassed in any town in the Union. The same may be said of the high land which rises from the river, on the south side of its westerly reach, on both sides of the State Asylum for the Blind. On the west side the ground rises from the river, with an easy grade towards the west and northwest, and just beyond the limits of the town, in the direction last named, commences the high rolling land forming a part of the famous Rock Prairie.

The year 1875, now just closing, is remarkable for the growth and extension of the town and the revival here of business of all descriptions, the spirit of enterprise on all hands exhibited, and the cheerful countenances of our prominent business men, are tokens of a general prosperity, based upon strong toundations, and destined to grow, year by year, with a rapidity

greatly augmented over that of any previous period in the history of Janesville. The few local causes that disturbed the harmony of our citizens have disappeared, and all are laboring with the energy and intelligence for which they are distinguished, to maintain her rank in business importance among the cities of Wisconsin.

BLIND INSTITUTE.

The Wisconsin Institution for the Education of the Blind is located here, under the management of the following Board: A. A. Jackson, President; Dr. J. B. Whiting, Secretary; J. B. Doe, Treasurer; Members: Anson Rogers, W. H. Tripp; Superintendent. Mrs. Sarah F. C. Little, M. A.; Matron, Mrs. M. H. Whiting; Teachers in Literary Department, Miss S. A. Watson, Miss A. J. Hobart, A. B., Miss Eva M. Putney, A. B.; Music Teachers, John S. VanClure, Miss Lizzie Blinn; Foreman of Mechanical Department, Ambrose M. Shotwell. The object of the institution is to furnish to the blind children of the State a good education, specially adapted to their condition, thereby fitting them to take an intelligent and useful part in the affairs of life. Instruction is given in those subjects usually taught in our public schools, also in vocal and instrumental music and various kinds of work. The Institution is supported by the State and no charge is made for either board or tuition.

THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

The present system of graded schools was organized in October, 1856 from several district schools, which had partially coalesced the previous year. The work of adapting the materials to the object in view, was entrusted to a Board of Education, and Mr. Levi Cass, as Principal of the High School, faithfully executed the plan. For five years Mr. Cass devoted himself with increasing energy and never varying persistence, for the unification of the schools, and the interest then aroused among the people was carried up to such a plane, that during this half decade the present High School building, Second Ward and Fourth Ward buildings were erected, occupied, and paid for in part. The seating accommodations were thus increased from five hundred sittings to eleven hundred, and the present system was so much of a success as to elicit the commendation of a great majority of citizens. In 1869 the First Ward building was erected, and it was occupied in February, 1870. During the past three years all the build. ings have been thoroughly repaired, and have been supplied with ample heating and ventilating facilities. At the recent school census taken by

Mr. Wilson, the total number was found to be 3,511; males, 1,729, females 1,842. Since their original organization, the schools have steadily progressed in efficiency. The annual city tax, levied for the support of the schools, has increased, until the Board of Education is enabled to secure and retain the services of competent teachers, so the citizen is conscious of living within reach of superior public school facilities.



FIRE DEPARTMENT.



The safety and protection of our homes and other property from fire, is one of the first considerations of importance in the selection of a residence or business location. So far as the city of Janesville goes in this direction, she need not fear much from the fire fiend, as most of her business houses are solid brick structures, and many of them fire proof. But notwithstanding this fact, she, with her usual caution, has secured a very creditable Fire Department, to combat any emergency that may arise. At the present writing the organization is superior in muscle, discipline, engines and their various appliances, to many other western cities, and will bear favorable comparison with that of any other in the West. The present Chief Engineer is J. F. Wilcox, who is an old experienced fireman, both here and in the East, and to whom great praise is due for the present high state of efficiency of the department. In March 1872, the department was first organized, and since then each of the steamer companies consist of twelve members, and Hook and Ladder, fifteen. New hose has been purchased, competent engineers employed, who have charge of the steamers, platforms

have been constructed at various and convenient places along the river from which to obtain water, and never was the fire department in a more flourishing and good working condition. Below we give the names of engines, locations and chief officers:

CEMETERIES.

Among other things, Janesville has not been slow or behind other large cities in providing a well selected and appropriate place for her departed. Hence, an organization known as the "Oak Hill Cemetery Association" was organized in 1851, for the purpose of selecting a site. The site chosen by the organization is a beautiful one, and contains some thirty-six acres of rolling ground, interspersed with a natural growth of trees and shrubs, making its landscape beauty unsurpassed for the purpose designed. It is located at the north end of the Madison road, and the Catholic Cemetery adjoins it, its entrance being north end of Oak Hill avenue.

CHURCHES.

Cities are often judged by the educational and religious advantages offered to those seeking locations, as well as visitors, and in this respect Janesville stands out pre-eminent. With schools unsurpassed in any city of a similar size, and a dozen church edifices, mostly of a massive and substantial character, goes far as a recommendation for the city and its inhabitants. Two

of these churches (the Baptist and Congregational), cost between \$40,000 and \$50,000, and several of the others large sums, and still the indebtedness of this property is but trifling, which does credit to the zeal of the members and all those who take an active interest in the cause of religion and education.

ROCK COUNTY.

Settlement, Organization, Climate, Bounds, Productions, Principal Prairies, Names of Towns, Streams, Principal Cities and Villages, County Officers, Supervisors,

Township Clerks, Postmasters,
etc., etc., etc.

Rock county was first settled about the year 1835, and was laid off from Milwaukee county in 1836, organized fully February, 1839. It is one of the richest and most productive counties in the State, and is composed of high rolling prairie land interspersed here and there with belts of fine timber. The land is a rich black loam well adapted for almost any kind of grain. The climate is delightful, it being neither very hot nor cold, and is altogether highly conducive to health. The county lies in latitude 40° 40' North, in longitude 12° west, and is bounded as follows: On the North by Jefferson and Dane counties, East by Walworth, West by Green, and on the South by the State of Illinois. It contains twenty Congressional districts, and has an average of 460,800 acres, is twenty-four miles north to south by thirty miles East to West. Corn, oats, wheat and barley are the principal productions, as well as tobacco, which is extensively grown, especially in Fulton township and adjacent sections. The first breaking of the soil was done by Joseph Inman in the Spring of 1836. The first house was erected on the east side of the river by Ira Washburn in 1838. river runs through near the middle of the county from north to south.

The principal prairies are Rock, Jefferson, Du Lac, Ramsey's, Catfish, Morse's and Turtle; Rock prairie extends almost through the county from east to west, and varies in width from six to eighteen miles.

NAMES OF TOWNS:

Lima, Milton, Fulton, Porter, Union, Magnolia, Center. Janesville, Harmony, Johnstown, Bradford, La Prairie, Rock, Plymouth, Spring Valley, Avon, Newark, Beloit, Turtle and Clinton, and the city of Janesville, organized from portions of Janesville, Rock, La Prairie and Harmony.

STREAMS

Rock river rises in Fond du Lac county, and runs south, through Dodge, Jefferson—the towns of Milton, Fulton, Janesville, Rock and Beloit, in Rock county, into Illinois, thence into the Mississippi at Rock Island.

The Catfish is the outlet of four lakes, and empties into Rock river in the town of Fulton.

Badfish rises in Rutland, Dane county, passes through Union, Cookville, and the town of Porter, emptying into the Catfish in the town of Fulton,

Allen's Creek, a branch of Sugar river, rises in Union. runs south-west-and empties into Sugar river.

Afton or Bass creek, rises in Magnolia, and runs south-east through Magnolia Center and Rock, and empties into Rock river near the village of Afton.

Valley Creek rises in Magnolia, runs through Spring Valley and Avon, emptying into Sugar river at Avon.

Sugar River, which rises in the western central part of Dane county, passes through the whole length of Green county from north to south, thence bearing easterly, passes through the town of Avon, in Rock county, and empties into the Peckatonica, in Illinois.

Coon Creek rises in Plymouth, and runs south through Newark into Sugar river.

Turtle Creek rises in Turtle lake, near the north-east corper of Richmond, Walworth county, runs south-west, enters Rock county, passing through the towns of Bradford, LaPrairie, Turtle, and Beloit, into Rock river, almost exactly on the State line at Beloit.

Pratt's Creek rises in Lima, and runs east, into Walworth county, emptying into Whitewater.

Otter Creek rises in Lima, runs north-west into lake Koshkonong.

LAKES.

Lake Koshkonong in Milton, is eight miles long and nearly three miles wide. Rock river runs through this lake. A part of the lake lies in Rock county, a small portion in Dane, but mostly in Jefferson county. Also several other smaller sheets of water, Clear Lake, Grass Lake, Duck Lake, Mud Lake, Starr's Lake, Big Spring Lake, and Little Spring Lake.

It was completed some five years ago, at a cost of \$120-000, and goes far toward proving the current belief, viz: that of the liberality and wealth of the county. It is erected in the center of the city park, and commands a beautiful view of the surrounding country. It is three stories high, with a Mansard roof, and finished throughout in an elaborate style. The first story is built entirely of cut stone, the upper stories being of the best Milwaukee pressed brick, elaborately trimmed and faced with stone. The court room, as well as the various offices, are well fitted up with everything necessary and convenient, the whole building being heated by steam. 



HISTORICAL SKETCH OF EVANSVILLE.

Evansville is situated on the Madison Division of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway, 18 miles from Janesville, the county seat, 115 miles from Chicago, and 23 miles from Madison.

The merchants of this town control the trade of a large section of country anterior to them, and we were much surprised on visiting it to see those unmistakable signs of financial prosperity, the crowded stores and streets. Evansville was so-called in honor of Dr. J. M. Evans, the first physician who settled in the village. Dr. Evans is still an influential and enterprising citizen of the place, being engaged in the drug business, as a member of the firm of D. C. Griswold & Co.

The location of Evansville is one of the finest in the county, being on the border of a small prairie, and in one of the finest groves in this section of country. Allen's creek passes through the eastern portion of the town.

The mail was carried from Union for two years by Jacob West, on horse-back. At present the village contains a population of about one thousand. The inhabitants of the town are principally Americans.

It was burnt down about three years ago and was re-built by Mr. Eldredge.

HANOVER.

Is a thriving little place, eight miles east of Janesville, has a good hotel, kept by Mr. Schenck. A harness shop owned by Andrew Bradt. A general store kept by Squire & Munger; two blacksmith shops, a shoemaker shop &c. This grove is one of the most beautiful in the western country.

JOHNSTOWN CENTER.

Was laid out by Noah Newhall in 1840, first church built in 1855. It was surveyed by John Davis and Jno. Fletcher, and they being all Johns they called it Johnstown. A very fine hotel was built in 1852, by Mr. H. B. Johnson who still carries it on. Mr. Warner, one of the old settlers of Janesville township and who kept for many years the old Half Way House between Janesville and Edgerton, now carries on a general store here in which is kept a very nice assortment of goods of all kinds.

LIMA CENTER

Was first settled in or about the year 1856 by Mr. M. A. Childs, who kept the first store, and who is now station agent for the C. M. & St. P. Ry. There are two churches—Methodist and United Brethren. School house first erected in 1866. This is quite a grain and lumber shipping point; is fifteen miles from Janesville and six from Whitewater.

SHOPIERE.

Situated in the town of Turtle, eleven miles from Janesville, was first settled in 1835, and was called Waterloo. In 1849 a stone flour mill was erected by Harvey, Randall & Dockstader. Mr. Harvey was afterwards Governor of the State.

There are two stores, a cheese factory and two blacksmith and wagon shops.

The remaining villages and post offices are Fulton and Fulton Center, in Fulton township.
