RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE PRESIDENT

- Physical Education - Women -

l. That Jane Goss be appointed musician assistant in physical education, women, from March 7, 1938, to the close of the second semester of 1937-38; to be paid at the rate of \$.60 an hour, total not to exceed \$18 for the semester; charge to item for musician assistants, p. 32, fund 1A; and that the appointment of Mrs. Florence Burns, musician assistant, be reduced accordingly from \$300 to \$282 for the academic year 1937-38. (The appointment of Jane Goss does not carry with it exemption from non-resident tuition.)

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE BUSINESS MANAGER

That authority be granted to purchase a seven-room house, including lean-to and basement salvage from Hilmer Farms, Inc., Coddington, Wisconsin, and to move the same to the Coddington branch of the Agricultural Experiment Station for use as a house for the farm foreman, \$500 of the purchase price of \$700 to be charged to 3-D and \$200 (Confirming oral approval) to 3-K.

That upon the recommendation of Dean Goodnight, Professor Gaines Post of the History Department be permitted to withdraw cash in the amount of \$427.50 from the Summer Session Trust Funds in lieu of leave of absence credit for teaching in the 1936 Summer Session. Adopted.

Charles A. Halbert, State Engineer, and Wm. F. Stevens of the State Bureau of Engineering were present and outlined the progress made on the plans and specifications for the new men's dormitories.

The Committee approved of the Secretary arranging for the acquirement of the Burr W. Jones tract of 20.6 acres for a consideration of \$3500 through the Wisconsin University Building Corporation, to be planted and developed in connection with the development of adjoining land known as the Garttner tract; the Committee also approved of the Building Corporation borrowing the amount from the Vilas Estate or the State Annuity Board for a term of five years at not to exceed 5% interest, the interest to be paid by the University as or in lieu of rent.
