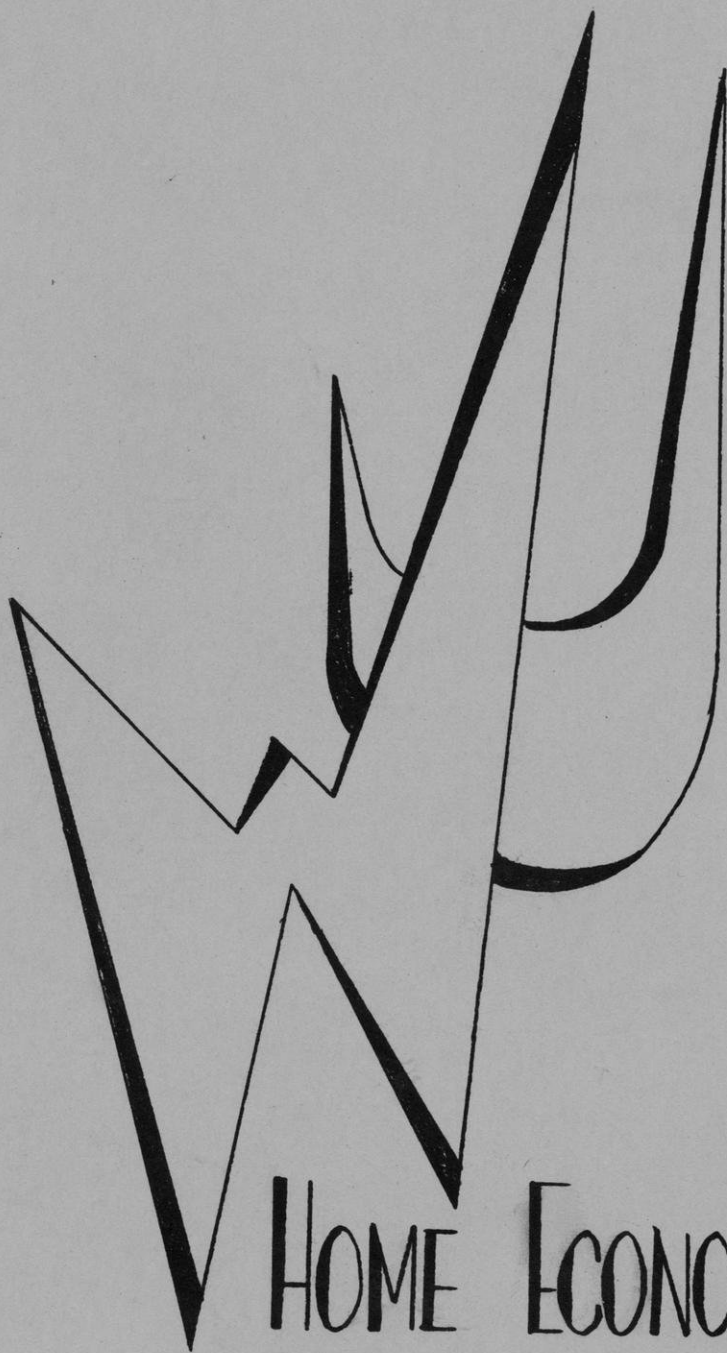

Department of Home Management & Family Living

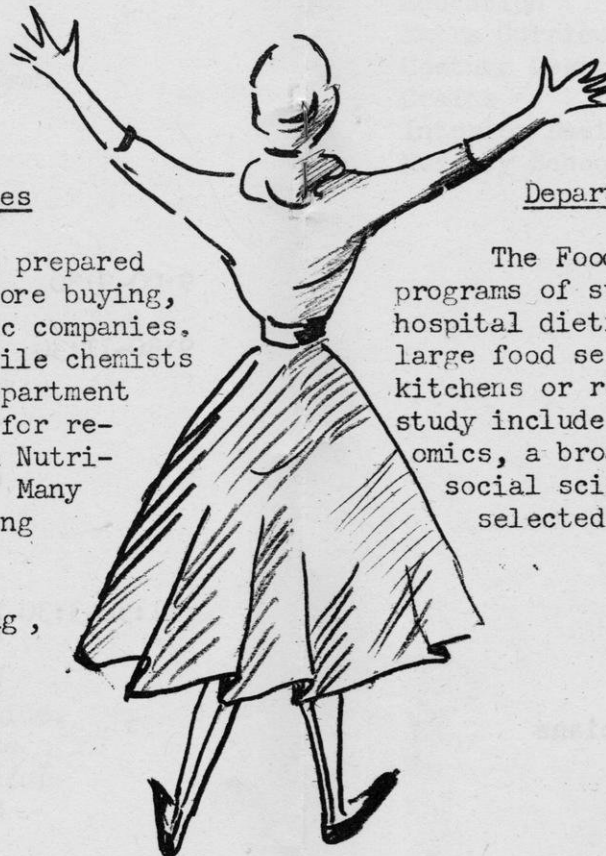

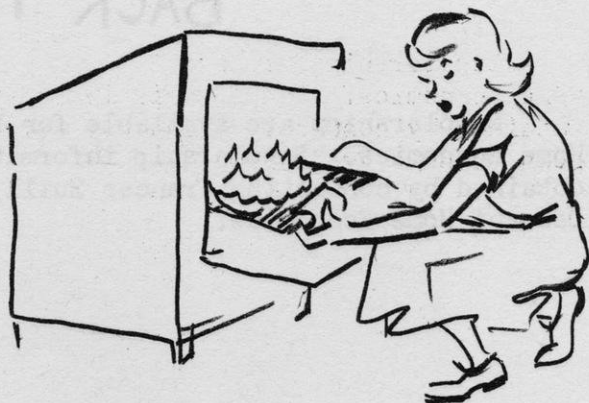




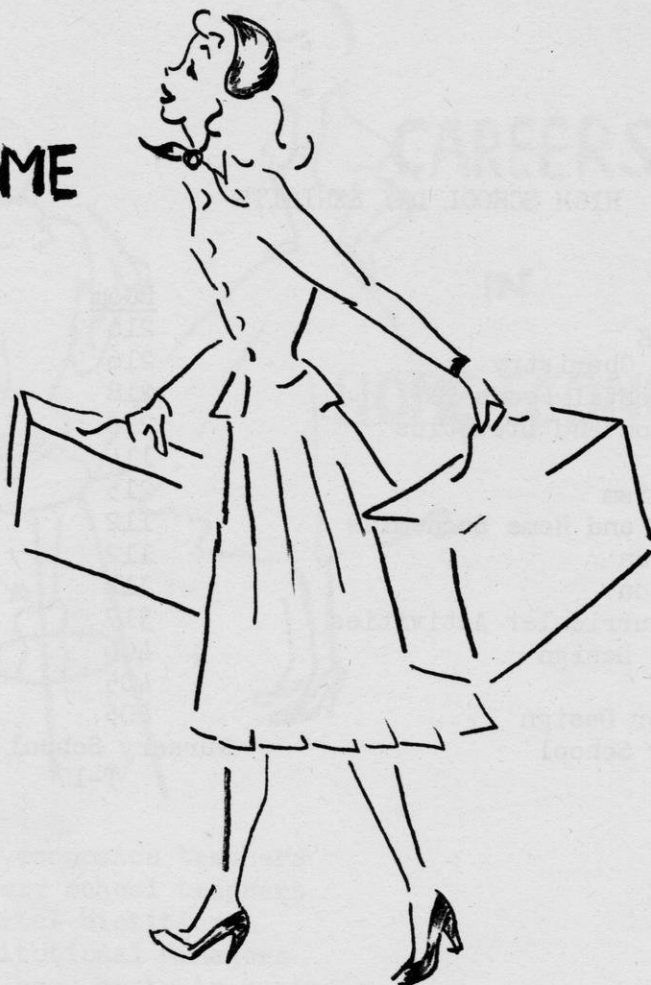
