



MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS



Max R. Sparger, 39, was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger, who has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official,

remarked at the time of his appointment:

"This is a very exciting thing for my family and me. It's a great opportunity and I am looking forward to the challenge."

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971 and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his

bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football four years and was named captain and most valuable player his senior year.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Fort Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961 and since then has done advance work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963 and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided the Blue Devils of Stout to a Conference Championship in 1965 after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming

athletic director in 1969.

Although football dominated his attention as a coach and player, Sparger's administrative duties keep him in close contact with all sports and he remains an

enthusiastic backer of the Conference's varied program.

He credits the success of the W.S.U.C. to the capable and dedicated personnel on the nine campuses, saying, "We have excellent leadership at our member schools. This is our greatest asset. The faculty representatives, athletic directors, and coaches are top flight people."

Max and his wife, Eloise, are the parents of five children -- Michael, Jane, Tracy, Susan, and David. The Sparger's live at 713 Thomas Drive in Sun Prairie.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR



Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native was born May 19, 1924, and graduated from East High School in 1942; and after a semester at the University of Wisconsin, entered the Navy on January 25, 1943, serving until February 18, 1946.

He re-enrolled at the University of Wisconsin and received a B.A. degree in journalism in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer on February 1, 1953. His duties there include covering University of Wisconsin football and basketball. Butler

Butler was named Sportswriter of the Year in Wisconsin in 1964 and 1965 and was nominated for the honor five straight years. GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF OFFICIALS



Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 20 years experience in officiating, including the last eight years in the Big Ten Conference, where he is now a football referee.

Calhoun, a Madison native born October 15, 1924, graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Corps during World War II and currently is a Major in the Air Force Reserve. He earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Wisconsin in 1947 and his law degree in 1950. He is a

practicing attorney in Madison.

Formerly freshman baseball coach at the University of Wisconsin, Calhoun also has represented many Badger athletes pursuing professional careers. He began officiating in 1947 and started in the Big Ten in 1963. He was the referee in the 1968 Rose Bowl game between Indiana and Southern California. Gene and his wife, Louise, live at 4014 Zeno Street in Madison with their two children -- Gary and Kim.

CONFERENCE SCHOLAR-ATHLETE AWARD

In 1967, the Conference established the Scholar-Athlete Award, the highest honor achieved by a Conference athlete, to be given each year to the most outstanding junior or senior scholar-athlete from each member institution. The award is made to the athlete exhibiting the greatest combination of performance and achievement in scholarship, athletics, and leadership.



PREVIEW 1973 FOOTBALL SEASON WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

The old sports adage about sticking with a champion until he's dethroned seems to prevail in the Wisconsin State University Conference football race.

Oshkosh stormed through its league schedule last fall and finished undefeated with a young team that's eager to repeat in 1973.

Coach Russ Young's "surprising" Titans get the nod from most opposing headmasters as the "team to beat", although Oshkosh won't be able to sneak up on anybody this year.

Titan opponents are wary. Still, Young has returning this fall the rugged running tandem of Tim Vander Velden and Dan Feldt, a competent quarterback in Pete Koupal, and talented linebacker Scott Kronenwetter to spearhead the title defense.

As usual, Whitewater and La Crosse rank as the principal challengers. Both retain a strong nucleus from 1972 and expect to be bolstered by promising newcomers.

Whitewater hopes to field a defensive unit comparable to the 1972 edition that led NAIA teams across the country in total defense.

The six other Conference teams figure to battle for first division berths and they could provide some fireworks before the race is decided.

Coach Monte Charles, who engineered Stevens Point's resurgence late last season, put it this way: "This season will see even more of a balanced Conference. Some of the so-called also-rans are starting to be heard from and there could be a lot of surprises in 1973."

With Koupal pulling the trigger on Young's Houston veer offense, and Vander Velden and Feldt around to do the heavy work, Oshkosh figures to field another strong offensive attack. Young is confident the Titans will have no trouble moving the football.

Oshkosh's chances of repeating hinge on the defensive alignment. The Titans have 37 lettermen returning, with nine offensive starters back. New faces will predominate on defense, where only five regulars are back.

Defense also is a major problem at La Crosse. The Indians, too, have nine offensive starters back and only five from the 1972 defensive unit.

Gone are 18 talented seniors, including star defensive back Byron Buelow. Coach Roger Harring faces a major rebuilding job in the defensive secondary after losing four seniors, three of whom started last fall.

Quarterback Joe Wagner will direct the attack again, but Harring figures underclassmen must mature fast, especially on defense, if the Indians are to experience a successful season.

Whitewater Coach Forrest Perkins, who develops perennial defensive powerhouses, expects another strong unit this season, but only four starters return. Of 26 returning lettermen, five were offensive regulars a year ago. Ed Nowell, Rich Murphy, or Steve Gerber must do the job at quarterback for the attack to be strong in 1973.

Eau Claire has 28 lettermen returning with the key man being quarterback Tom Bauer, who sat out last season with a knee injury. Although Bauer must return healthy, Blugold Coach Link Walker also has to rebuild the defensive secondary, find new offensive guards, and develop some young running backs.

River Falls Coach Mike Farley is looking for a top flight quarterback and more depth as he strives to improve on last fall's 4-4 record. He has 33 lettermen back, including 10 offensive starters from last fall and seven off the defensive unit.

Newcomers are the big hope at Platteville, which slumped to 4-4 last season after the Pioneers figured in the Conference title four straight years prior to 1972. Coach Gil Krueger faces a major task in rebuilding the offense to the stature enjoyed during those four championship seasons.

Coach Charles promises plenty of excitement at Stevens Point, where he took over at mid-season last fall and guided the Pointers to victories in their last two games. Charles considers passing as a major strength with quarterback Mark Olejniczak directing the attack.

Newcomers must carry most of the load at Stout, where Coach Sten Pierce must rev up the offense, an area that suffered because of inconsistency last fall. Finding an adequate quarterback remains a priority item.

Superior quarterback John Torzewski and two-time All-Conference wide receiver Jerry Uchytil give the Yellowjackets one of the leading aerial weapons in the Conference. Coach Ed Bender must complement this passing with some stronger running than was evident a year ago. He also is searching for defensive backs. Superior should be stronger, though, than last fall's 1-7 finish in the league.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

The Blugolds' success, or lack of it, this fall depends to a great extent on the availability of quarterback Tom Bauer, who sat out last season following a knee operation. An All-Conference performer in 1971, Bauer can provide Coach Link Walker with a balanced offense, if healthy.

Bauer (5-9, 190) combines strong running with adequate passing. He ranked second in Conference rushing with 504 yards in 1971 and shared the scoring lead with nine touchdowns. He figures to be throwing to a better than adequate receiving corps consisting of Steve Cooley, Steve Woletz, Reed Welsh, Marv Healless, and Rick Czechowicz. Cooley caught 25 passes in the Conference last fall, averaging 16.4 yards per reception.

Walker, beginning his sixth year as Blugold head coach, has 28 lettermen returning, including seven offensive starters and eight off the defensive unit. Rebuilding the defensive secondary ranks high on his priority list with Jim Sullivan, Dan Pedersen, and Tom Falk having graduated.

Replacements offensively must be found for All-Conference guard Fred Negus and full-back Ed Petkovsek, the leading Blugold rusher last fall. Eau Claire slumped to 2-6 in the Conference and 3-7 overall in 1972. The defense was adequate but offensively Walker must generate more steam if the Blugolds expect to make a strong bid for their first title since 1964.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

The Indians fell a game short of tying for their second straight WSUC football championship last fall and an inconsistent offense probably contributed as much as anything to the near miss. Coach Roger Harring faces a major rebuilding job this season, strengthening the attack and finding adequate replacements for some top notch defenders who have graduated.

Among the missing is defensive back Byron Buelow, an All-Conference performer who also earned honorable mention in the NAIA All-American listing. Also missing from the defense are end Bill Coleman and linebacker Dan Tork, both All-Conference along with end John Richmond and cornerback Roger Buswell.

Harring starts building his lines with a pair of veteran tackles, Larry Wisniewski 6-3, 230 on defense and Al Steffen 6-1, 210 on offense. Leading candidates for jobs in the secondary are Steve Kamla, Jim Shattuck, Bruce Barlow, Wayne Pollnow, Tom DuFault, and Don Hornbeck.

Senior Joe Wagner 6-1, 190 should get the first crack at quarterback. Although ranking only fourth among Conference passers in yards gained last fall, he threw 10 touchdown passes, more than anyone in the league. His principal target figures to be end Dave Saeger 6-2, 190. The running attack needs most work. Leading returnee is halfback Mike Hammes 5-8, 185, a workhorse who gained 453 yards rushing in 1972.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

The Titans sprang a surprise on the rest of the Conference last fall by plugging relentlessly through an eight-game league schedule and finishing unbeaten. Coach Russ Young's determined charges wrested the championship most "experts" had conceded to Whitewater before the season began. The title probably surprised everybody but Young.

The veteran coach said prior to the opener in 1972, "Sometimes a team with plenty of youth can turn out better than some veteran units and we hope this will be true in '72." The Titans more than justified Young's hopes for them and some key performers among that group return this season for an encore. Among them are running backs Tim Vander Velden and Dan Feldt, quarterback Pete Koupal, tackle Ron Leichtfuss, and tight end Jim Miazga.

Vander Velden (6-2, 210) is a hard-running workhorse who finished second in Conference rushing with 692 yards last fall. He combined with Feldt for the most destructive 1-2 running punch in the Conference. Feldt ranked third in rushing last season with 525 yards. Koupal, although not spectacular, combines some heady generalship with consistency. He threw for just 737 yards but was intercepted only seven times, lowest of all regular Conference passers.

The Titans ranked third in defense but gone from that group are All-Conference Jim Hoefler at middle guard and Charles Ebert at cornerback. However, Young has a good nucleus, including end Ken Nowoczynski and All-Conference linebacker Scott Kronenwetter.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

After figuring in four straight Conference championships, the Pioneers slumped to 4-4 and a share of fourth place with River Falls last season. Coach Gil Krueger faces a mammoth rebuilding chore which includes practically every position on the team, but particularly in the offense where the Pioneers ranked only seventh in the league last fall.

Halfback Bob Walgenbach, the team's leading rusher with 411 yards in Conference competition last season and All-Conference tackle Greg Weist are gone, from the offense, but quarterback Bud Nystrom and flanker Mike Perteete return. Perteete caught 14 passes for 272 yards and three touchdowns in 1972. He averaged 19.4 yards for every reception.

Krueger will miss the steady play of middle guard Tom O'Brien and linebacker Rick Waters on defense, but dependable end Jerry Ring and cornerback Guy Nelson return to bolster that unit, which ranked fourth in the Conference last fall.

Platteville dominated Conference football from 1968-71 with a stingy defense and an attack that combined strong and sometimes spectacular passing with effective running. Krueger will search for operatives possessing similar talents and try to mold them into a contender this year. Newcomers might be the key to '73 for the Pioneers.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

Instilling a winning attitude among Falcon football players has been a dominant part of Mike Farley's program since he became head coach three years ago. River Falls, one of the smallest schools in the Conference, has won only a single football championship in the last 25 years and that came in 1958.

The Falcons scored a near miss in 1966, finishing 6-1-1 and second behind White-water's 8-0. Since then their fortunes have plummetted. Farley's first team in 1970 failed to win a Conference game in eight starts. The Falcons were 2-6 in 1971 and last fall they wound up 4-4.

With 33 lettermen returning for 1973, Farley sees some light at the end of the tunnel. Ten of those returnees started on offense last fall, including Doug Vezina, a hard-running senior fullback. Vezina ranked fourth in Conference rushing a year ago, the 5-11 210-pounder ramming for 490 yards in 98 attempts for a five-yard average.

Among losses were All-Conference free safety Daryl Herrick along with honorable mentions middle linebacker Dale Stephenson and offensive tackle Chuck Hougard. Center Jim Bodner and guard Brian Ramberg anchor a promising offensive line. Farley's major project is developing a competent quarterback to direct his wishbone attack, and building more depth.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

Monte Charles, who specializes in the rejuvination of ailing football programs, was called to the bedside of the floundering Pointers after four games in 1972 and master-minded a complete turnaround. Previously Charles coached Platteville's first championship team in 11 years (1968), did a short stint in Canada, and then compiled a surprising 11-5 Conference mark in two years at Superior.

Advocating a wide open, pro-type offense that emphasizes passing, Charles' Pointers came within four points of upsetting eventual champion Oshkosh at mid-season and finished the campaign with two straight victories, including a 40-13 walloping of Eau Claire in the finale.

Under Monte's tutelage Mark Olejniczak, a quarterback who wasn't even sure of his job, became the leading passer in the Conference, throwing for 1,235 yards and nine touchdowns. Olejniczak returns, but gone are his principal receivers, flanker Joe LaFleur and All-Conference tight end Bill Hamilton, who led the league with 46 and 45 receptions, respectively, last fall.

Also gone is All-Conference linebacker Mike Blasczyk, but Charles remains confident he has enough returning talent to produce a winner and is banking on five transfer students who could help out, if they gain eligibility. Most importantly, Charles figures the losing complex that plagued the Pointers in recent years has been eliminated.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

No coach in the Conference faces a more massive rebuilding project than Stout's Sten Pierce, whose Blue Devils struggled through a 2-6 Conference season, tied for seventh with Stevens Point, and finished dead last in both total offense and defense. The Blue Devils averaged on 157 yards a game on the attack while yielding opponents 335 yards.

Pierce's club presented a respectable passing attack with quarterback Steve Fedie averaging 101 yards a game through the air, but the Blue Devils failed to mount a threatening ground game and this probably was the major reason they were shut out by four Conference opponents and one non-league foe. Fedie's aerials to Tom Glinski just about constituted the offense.

Glinski returns as a wide receiver, but Fedie is gone and Pierce's priority position at the outset will be quarterback. He also needs running backs and some blockers up front because the Blue Devils averaged only 62 yards a game rushing last fall. Surprisingly, though, Fedie and Glinski accounted for the longest passing play in the Conference last season, a 77-yard touchdown sortie against Stevens Point, and the premier punt return, Jack Voight's 85-yarder for a score against champion Oshkosh.

Gone are the defensive unit's most consistent performers, end Jim Hittman and line-backer Rick Henneberry, so it appears the opportunities for advancement are more advantageous at Stout than anywhere else in the Conference.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

Ed Bender begins his second year as Yellowjackets' head coach with 35 lettermen returning, including 10 defensive starters from last fall and nine off the first offensive unit. His first season at the helm produced only one victory in 10 games and the aim this year is to escape the cellar.

The Yellowjackets did put together a formidable passing attack in 1972 and that should be a major strength during the coming season. Quarterback John Torzewski returns to guide the offense. He compiled the Conference's second best passing statistics a year ago, throwing for 1,033 yards and eight touchdowns.

Also returning is junior wide receiver Jerry Uchytil, who led the Conference in receiving two years ago as a freshman and wound up fourth last fall with 39 catches for 543 yards. His six touchdown receptions ranked second in the league. The 5-10, 170 junior earned All-Conference recognition in 1972 for the second straight year.

Most difficult graduating seniors to replace will be defensive back Greg Amys, a fine kickoff and punt returner, along with end Joe Weiss and guard Bob Grant. Offensive guard Cliff Studebaker, All-Conference honorable mention, is back with some other line veterans who show promise. Bender's priority positions at the outset are in the backfield, both offensively and defensively. He remains confident, though, and sees some help coming from freshmen and transfers expected to report in the fall.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973

The Warhawks won the statistical battle but lost the war in WSUC action last fall. Coach Forrest Perkins' club led the Conference in both total offense and defense a year ago. In fact the Warhawks ranked as the NAIA's leader in overall defense. But, Whitewater still finished third in the league with a 6-2 record, losing to La Crosse, 9-3, and Oshkosh, 10-7.

Perkins faces a rebuilding project. Whitewater players occupied seven All-Conference positions last fall -- four on offense and three on defense -- but only two return, defensive tackle Jim Walters and running back Bill Roper. Missing are end Greg Badger and tackle Toby Ackerman on defense along with wide receiver Dick Bilda, guard Al Thies, and quarterback Mike Gorecki on offense.

Defenders allowed opponents only 57 yards a game rushing last fall and 77 yards passing. Returning from that starting unit are Walters (6-1, 250), with guard Bob Behnke, linebacker Rich Barnes, cornerback Dan Ditter, and free safety Mark Dennis. Offensively, the Warhawks averaged 336 yards a game. Perkins must replace the entire starting line except tight end Dan Brunner. Also returning are half-backs Jeff Hanaman and Roper and fullback Kerry Larsen.

Roper led the Conference in rushing with 813 yards and a 6.3 average per carry. He shared the scoring lead with nine touchdowns. Another important offensive cog back is kicking specialist Mike Capodarco, who booted 31 conversions and two field goals in Conference competition last fall. Finding a competent quarterback and some linemen will be the big job.

PREVIEW OF 1973-74 BASKETBALL SEASON WISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

For the first time in four years Eau Claire won't go into the basketball season as overwhelming favorite in the Wisconsin State University Conference.

The Blugolds probably fall into the darkhorse category with Whitewater vaulting into the favorite's role. Coach Eli Crogan's Warhawks present a formidable lineup with all five starters returning from the outfit that tied Eau Claire for the championship last season.

That year of experience together should make Crogan's first six of Hugh Gnatzig, Larry and Garry Grimes, Elmer Polk, Bob Stone, and Tom Van De Bogart better than ever. They led the Conference in offense and defense in 1972-73, so opponents are forewarned.

Scoring dropped in the Conference last season, principally because of the "common" foul rule, but also due to an increased emphasis on defense. "Play D" and "Come on, Bid D" were chants frequently heard around the league.

As a result both Whitewater and Eau Claire finished with 63.8 defensive averages, the Warhawks having yielded only 1,020 points in 16 games and the Blugolds 1,021.

Whitewater averaged 77.4 points a game offensively. Contrast that with Eau Claire's leading 92.5 mark of the previous season, when five teams averaged better than 77.7 points a game. The best defensive mark during the 1971-72 campaign was the Blugolds' 69.9.

This defensive emphasis on the part of the Warhawks, along with their rebounding ability and scoring balance are what project them into the limelight as pre-season favorite. Stone and Polk are All-Conference returnees and Crogan has six players capable of falling into that category.

But, don't count Eau Claire out. Coach Ken Anderson is gunning for an unprecedented fifth straight crown. The Blugolds captured three straight undisputed titles before the tie with Whitewater last season.

The Blugolds had a 49-game winning streak snapped last season, but they are ready to launch another. Although Anderson has lost some talented veterans, opponents remember his entire starting lineup from 1971-72 graduated and the Blugolds still got a piece of the crown last season.

Stout, which finished third last season, just one game off the pace, compiled the best shooting percentage in the league, but Coach Dwain Mintz must start almost from scratch to rebuild. Sophomores must come through to put the Blue Devils back in contention.

La Crosse hasn't won a basketball championship since 1965 and the Indians will be hard pressed to challenge this season unless Coach Burt McDonald comes up with one or two big, strong rebounders. However, he does have the Conference's defending scoring champion, Eric Haug, who averaged 22.6 points.

Oshkosh, too, looks for some newcomers to rev up the Titan basketball resurgence. Coach Bob White has a pretty good rebounder in Bob Steif, but needs help on the boards and a couple consistent scorers.

Coach Dick Wadewitz looks for some help to complement talented senior forward Steve Kundert at Platteville, where the Pioneers completed an 8-8 season and are one or two players away from being a contender.

River Falls suffered some serious graduation losses, but Coach Newman Benson is confident a couple outstanding transfer prospects and improved defense can turn the Falcons into winners.

This does not look like Stevens Point's year unless Coach Bob Krueger can come up with some freshmen or transfers that can boost the basketball program there. The Pointers are solid in the backcourt with Cal Kuphall, second-ranked Conference scorer, but Krueger needs some help up front to challenge.

Superior seeks a complete turnaround to escape the cellar following last season's 1-15 finish. Coach Wayne Peterson is looking for help in all areas.

Whitewater appears to be the team to beat, but Conference coaches have learned through recent experience to keep a wary eye on Eau Claire.

PROSPECTS FOR 1973-74

The Blugolds have won or shared four consecutive Conference championships and they must be regarded as prime contenders for an unprecendented fifth straight crown. They tied with Whitewater for the title last season and have seven lettermen returning from that squad.

Veteran Coach Ken Anderson starts his sixth year at the helm. His Blugolds boast a 72-8 record in the Conference since he became head coach and 61-3 over the past four seasons. They have won 29 consecutive Conference games on their home court.

Anderson enters this season with a pair of classy guards, Ray Adams and Rich Reitzner, leading the way. The Blugolds must pick up the slack created by the loss of the two leading rebounders in the Conference last season, Tom Peck and Jeff Ellenson. This could be difficult if 6-8 center Dave Hines continues to have trouble with an ailing knee.

Duke Nash, a strong defensive player, also is gone, but Anderson hopes for rapid development of some talented recruits, including $6\text{-}10\frac{1}{2}$ Dennis Blunk of Shawano, 6-5 Mark Brost of Green Bay (Southwest), along with 5-11 Ed Smith and 6-4 Gary Hubka off Beloit Memorial's state championship team. Anderson says the squad is more experienced than last season and rates the playmaking and outside shooting as excellent.

If McDonald can find a center who can score and the Indians match last season's defense, La Crosse could move among the contenders.
