PRESENT: Regents Callahan, Gates, Wilkie; President Frank, Business Manager Phillips, Comptroller Peterson, Secretary McCaffrey.

✓ The Business Manager was authorized to request the Emergency Board for an appropriation for supplies of paints, etc., and to request the Government for funds for the employment of W.P.A. mechanics and laborers.

Works Progress Admin.

✓ Upon recommendation of the Business Manager, it was VOTED, That the appropriation for rent of the Historical Library Building be increased from \$5000 to \$6000 per annum, beginning with the 1937-38 budget, and subject to the approval of the legislative request.

✓ Applications of the following students for admission to the University on a resident basis were considered and approved:

Robert Plahn
Perry M. Nelson
Maudelle Bousfield.

✓ The application of Mrs. George Nelson was considered and it was held that she would be required to pay tuition if she entered the University during the current semester, but would be exempt beginning with the second semester of the current year.

✓ The application of Caroline Gonyo was considered and it was held that she would be required to pay tuition for the current semester, but not for the second semester of this year.
