REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD

Report of the Vice President of the State VIAE Board

Regent Barry, Vice resident of the State VTAE Board, called attention to the paper describing the Tech-Prep Program, which was appended to his written report to the Board of Regents.

Regent Flores, Chair of the Council, summarized major items of the November 7 meeting. Reporting on admissions and patient days for the fiscal year to date, Superintendent Gordon Derzon advised the Council that total net income for the four-month period is \$6.9 million, compared with the budgeted amount of \$4.9 million, the higher net figure resulting primarily from favorable expense variances. Projections for the remainder of the fiscal year were for gross patient revenues to be slightly above or equal to the budgeted amount, and for expenses to remain below budget.

Dr. Paul Carbone, Director of the UW Comprehensive Cancer Center, provided a brief review of the Center's history and current activities. The Center's plan is to direct more attention in the future to prevention, through research efforts that focus on identifying cancer risk factors and development of compounds for use in preventing cancer.

Presenting a status report on the proposal to restructure University Hospital, Dr. Jay Noren, Vice Chancellor for Health Sciences, reported that he had discussed issues and options for restructuring with approximately 60 groups of University Hospital workers and had scheduled another 60 meetings during the months of December and January. In addition, Dr. Noren made presentations to 20 faculty groups. The Council will consider the restructuring options and possibly endorse a recommendation at the February meeting. Council members asked that the February discussion include review of the advantages and disadvantages of the proposed options and a review of feedback received from employee and faculty groups.

Other reports received by the Council included a review of hospital financial trends and an update on the hospital's regional activities.

The Council approved the superintendent's proposal to appoint an administrative committee to review the hospital's quality assurance reports. The committee will include a representative of the Council of Trustees who will report to the Council on the committee's meetings. This arrangement is acceptable to the Joint Commission on Healthcare Accreditation in meeting its requirement for Council involvement in quality assurance measures at the hospital.

Report on Legislative Matters

A written report was provided by Acting Vice President Ward.

Governor's Commission on UW System Compensation — Fermaler

Referring to Governor Thompson's announcement earlier that week on the appointment of a top-level Commission to study issues concerning compensation of UW faculty and staff, President Lyon stated appreciation "for the Governor's recognition and understanding of the importance of competitive compensation to maintaining the high quality of the UW System and for his leadership in creating a blue-ribbon commission to address this high priority issue."

The Commission will be chaired by Milton Neshek, an attorney and former Regent. Regent Michael Grebe will serve as Vice Chair, and Regent Daniel Gelatt will also serve on the Commission. The 19-member body is composed of distinguished representatives from the private sector, the Legislature, state government, the Board of Regents, the faculty, and the academic staff. Fredi Bove, Executive Assistant to the Board, will serve as Executive Director of the Commission.

Expressing gratitude to the members of the Commission for their willingness to lend their substantial talents and expertise to this important issue, President Lyon noted that the recommendations which result from the study will carry a high level of credibility and influence in the 1993-95 biennial budget deliberations.

REPORT OF THE ACTING PRESIDENT

Approval of Nonpersonnel Actions

Resolution 5968 was unanimously adopted by the Board of Regents, upon motion by Regent Schilling, seconded by Regent Gelatt.

Compensation - System Residents comments on formation

Governor's Commission on UW System Compensation, p, 4

Acting President Lyall commented that, because a great university depends on the efforts of distinguished faculty and staff, the work of the Compensation Commission will determine the quality of the UW System far into the future. The 1990s will be a period of accelerated retirements of faculty hired during the 1960s, and the market for replacements will be exceptionally competitive.

System Commission Co

It had become clear, she noted, that present methods for determining formal competitive levels of compensation no longer are effective. The Compensation Commission will take a fresh look at how other states and universities approach this problem, how the private sector adjusts salaries in tight markets, and will assess alternatives for the UW System. She was pleased that the Governor's charge allows the Commission great latitude to think creatively and to examine broadly the problem of competitive compensation.

In her travels to UW institutions around the state, she found faculty and staff concerned about whether Wisconsin's traditional commitment to first-rate public higher education will be maintained in the future. A critical component is a rational means of establishing and distributing salary funds, a means which recognizes the higher education markets in which UW institutions must compete. "If the Commission is able to move us toward a stable, competitive salary process," she stated, "it will do much to improve faculty and staff morale and to advance our ability to manage the future of a quality university system."

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Streamlining Reporting

Referring to the large amounts of data and other information received by the Board of Regents, Acting President Lyall noted that some of these reports are requested directly by Regents, much is mandated by statutory requirements, and some is originated by System Administration. While good management requires sound management information, she commented that tight resources and budget reductions dictate consideration of ways to streamline data collection, analysis, and reporting procedures.

Cepulature - Action To Sheanlers reports to Regulature, R5969

An inventory done the previous year showed that there are 40 annual reports required by the Legislature and 58 recurring reports required by the Board of Regents. These numbers do not include at least an equal number of ad hoc reports requested every year in connection with special initiatives, the biennial budget process and follow-up inquiries from Regents and legislative committees. Each of these reporting requirements, she noted,

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entails personnel, computing, data collection and analysis costs that are rising along with all other costs of doing business.

In order to assure that scarce resources are focused on reports that help make significant improvements in performance and service to students, Acting President Lyall made the following recommendations:

First, that the Board of Regents adopt a resolution to sunset all required reports to the Board effective July 1, 1992. Before that date, each Board Committee should provide an opportunity for Regents and others to request restoration of reports that have been required. Such requests should be supported by demonstration of the benefits of the report to improving educational services.

Second, all reports to the Board between January and July 1992 should include a fiscal note containing the estimated costs incurred at the System and institutional levels of preparing the report.

With all institutions and System Administration in the process of downsizing and reallocating more than \$26 million for quality improvements identified in the 1991-93 budget, Acting President Lyall felt streamlining and reducing reporting requirements will send an important signal about the seriousness with which streamlining university operations is being taken by the Board and System Administration.

Regent President Lyon stated his strong endorsement of Acting President Lyall's proposals.

Regent Davis moved adoption of the resolution suggested by Dr. Lyall, adding his hope that institutional reports required by System Administration also will be streamlined. Acting President Lyall stated assurance that will be done. The motion was seconded by Regent Steil.

Resolution 5969: That all required reports to the Board be sunsetted effective July 1, 1992. Before that date, each Board Committee will provide opportunity to consider requests for restoration of reports that have been required. All reports to the Board between January and July 1992 will include a fiscal note containing the estimated costs incurred at the System and institutional levels of preparing the reports.

Regent Krutsch proposed that the Legislature be asked to review its mandated reports with the same criteria in mind. It was suggested by Acting President Lyall that, as Board committees review the reports they receive, they identify legislatively mandated reports for which the Board might wish to request legislative review.

Regent Grover cautioned that when reviewing required reports, the committees should bear in mind the critical importance of a well-informed Board. He stated the assumption that elimination of a substantial number of reporting requirements will be accompanied by a commensurate staff reduction, and Dr. Lyall noted that such a staff reduction was already in process as part of the reallocation requirements.

Stating his strong support for the move to streamline reporting to the Board and the Legislature, Regent Lubar suggested there also should be a review of materials furnished to the Regents to reduce the volume and improve the organization in a manner to facilitate Regent consideration and decisionmaking. The kind of organization he had in mind included executive summaries highlighting the issues, setting forth the pros and cons of each of the issues as seen by staff and administration, and when appropriate including a recommendation from the administration.

Put to the vote, Resolution 5969 was adopted unanimously.

REPORT OF THE EDUCATION COMMITTEE

Regent Davis, Vice Chair, presented the Committee's report.

Consent Agenda Items

Presenting Resolutions 5970 to 5976, which had been approved unanimously by the Education Committee, Regent Davis moved their adoption by the Board as consent agenda items. The motion was seconded by Regent Krutsch.

Regarding Resolution 5970, Regent Barry noted that some of the time lines for implementation were fairly lengthy and asked if progress in some areas could be made more rapidly.

Regent Davis replied that comments about time lines were made at the Education Committee meeting and were noted by the administration. In a number of instances, these matters will be considered at the first meetings of working groups in the various subject areas.

Put to the vote, the consent agenda resolutions were adopted unanimously.

Yateway Courses p, &

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An update on student access to gateway courses was presented at a joint meeting of the Education Committee and the Business and Finance Committee.

The report concluded that access to gateway courses is no longer the significant problem it was in past years. Among other strategies, institutions have set aside contingency funds for increased numbers of sections, enrollments have decreased as a result of enrollment management decisions, registration processes have been streamlined, and there has been increased management efficiency.

Regent Hirsch expressed concern about access to junior- and senior-level courses.

Regent Gelatt commented on the importance of not allowing more students into the first course of a major than the institution is prepared to provide space for throughout the major.

Some Regents noted the difficulty in interpreting reports not based on statistical data and asked whether institutions are putting in place systems at each campus to quantify how many students try to enroll in courses and how many are closed out. Associate Vice President Presley responded that some of the planned pilot projects will provide such information.

Chancellor Gaylon Greenhill, UW-Whitewater, Chancellor Gary Thibodeau, UW-River Falls, Chancellor Judith Kuipers, UW-La Crosse, Chancellor John Schroeder, UW-Milwaukee, and Chancellor Donna Shalala, UW-Madison, discussed the registration process at each of their institutions and specific measures taken to assure timely access for students to gateway courses.

The observation was made that the number of seats available in sections of a course often considerably exceeds the number of closeouts, but that those vacancies are usually in sections scheduled at times which are not popular with students.

Report of the Vice President

Vice President Portch reported to the Education Committee on the following items: (1) A team of students from UW-Platteville won the Collegiate Dairy Judging Contest; (2) The Multicultural Children's Literature Institute at UW-Madison received an award from the National University Continuing Education Association; and (3) UW-Green Bay received a grant to support an "Upward Bound Regional Center for Mathematics and Science."

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Dr. Cara Chell, Senior Academic Planner, was introduced to the Committee.

Summarizing Committee discussion, Regent Davis reported that an amendment was proposed to make the following changes in Resolution 5977: That in paragraph I.3., the phrase "and English language proficiency standards" be deleted; that the statement "English proficiency standards will be established at the System level" be added as paragraph I. 4; and that the word "should" be replaced by the word "shall" each time it appears in Sections II. and III.

Discussion centered on whether the proficiency standards should be established at the System or institutional level, and what instruments might be available to determine proficiency. Chancellor Schroeder advised that UW-Milwaukee already has established minimum institution proficiency standards.

After discussion, the Committee concluded that paragraph I.2. as written, with the deletion of the phrase in I.3., requires institutions to establish proficiency standards and, therefore, the addition of I.4. was not necessary. The amendment, deleting the phrase in paragraph I.3. and replacing the words "should" with "shall" passed unanimously. The resolution as revised was then approved by the Education Committee.

It was moved by Regent Davis and seconded by Regent Schilling that the following resolution be adopted by the Board of Regents:

Resolution 5977: That, upon recommendation of the Acting President of the University of Wisconsin System, the Board of Regents adopts the following Policy on Selection, Training and Evaluation of Teaching Assistants:

I. Selection of Teaching Assistants

- 1. Institutions employing teaching assistants must establish minimum standards and guidelines for selecting teaching assistants.
- 2. Non-native English speakers must be required to demonstrate proficiency in spoken English before they are assigned classroom duties as teaching assistants.
- Institutions may determine whether establishing appointment criteria are best carried out at the departmental, college or institutional level.

II. Training of Teaching Assistants

- Institutions must require appropriate training or previous relevant experience for new teaching assistants as a condition of employment.
- 2. Non-native teaching assistants shall receive training in educational and cultural expectations for students and teaching assistants at their institutions.

- 3. Teaching assistants shall receive training on curricular and educational expectations for students in their institutional units.
- 4. Training of teaching assistants may take place at the institutional, college or departmental level, or some combination of these, as appropriate.

III. Evaluation of Teaching Assistants

- 1. Institutions shall establish standards for the supervision and evaluation of teaching assistants.
- 2. New teaching assistants shall be evaluated by the appropriate unit for the purpose of teaching improvement as early in the first semester as possible.
- 3. All teaching assistants shall be evaluated by the appropriate unit each semester.
- 4. All units employing teaching assistants must establish a process for receiving and addressing student complaints and concerns about teaching assistants. This information should be made available in the course syllabi.
- 5. Evaluation and supervision of teaching assistants may be carried out at the college or departmental level, as appropriate.
- 6. Institutions must establish meaningful, appropriate accountability standards and procedures to ensure that all units employing teaching assistants are complying with UW System and institutional policies on teaching assistants.

Institutional policies and accountability standards must be submitted to the UW System for approval by June 1992. Full implementation is dependent on fiscal implications.

Regent Flores asked if the term "non-native teaching assistants" applies to any teaching assistant not born a U.S. citizen, and Vice President Portch replied in the affirmative.

Put to the vote, Resolution 5977 was adopted unanimously.

2992-93 Sabbatical Awards

The names and projects of 175 faculty members who have been selected for sabbatical awards for 1992-93 were reported to the Committee by Vice President Portch, who advised that Senate Bill 250--legislation to provide faculty with

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full retirement credit during the period they are on sabbatical leave--passed the Senate by a vote of 33-0 before conclusion of the fall session. It was referred to the Assembly for action in the spring of 1992.

Academic Staff Professional Development Awards

The Second group of 1991-92 Academic Staff Professional Development Awards was reported to the Committee.

Program Review and Program Planning

Vice President Portch presented the Annual Report on Program Review and Program Planning, which documented the results of all program reviews conducted within the UW System in 1990-91, including general education reviews, reviews of programs requiring special attention, institutional program reviews, accreditation reviews and five-year program reviews.

He stated that he has been impressed by the overall quality of the institutional reviews and called the Committee's attention to his decision not to initiate any additional topical strategic plans. The Committee agreed with that decision. Instead, overall institutional and System planning will be done.

Dr. Portch also observed that the traditional accreditation process is at a crossroads nationally, and developments need to be monitored. Following some discussion on the accreditation process, on accrediting agencies, and on the necessity of accreditation in some professional areas, Regent Krutsch stated that there is need for the public to be educated about accreditation issues and made aware that accreditation may not always be in the interest of quality programs.

Report on Extension Function

The Education Committee was presented with the annual progress report on Board of Regents Policies on the Extension Function in the UW System. The question was raised whether the Board should continue to ask for this annual report. Regent Schilling replied that he felt the report should continue, and Vice President Portch agreed that at least one more annual report should be made, since next year's report will for the first time include data on promotion and tenure.

REPORT OF THE BUSINESS AND FINANCE COMMITTEE

Regent Gelatt, Chair, presented the Committee's report.

Consent Agenda Items

Presenting Resolutions 5978 and 5979, which were approved unanimously by the Business and Finance Committee, Regent Gelatt moved their adoption by the Board of Regents as consent agenda items. The motion was seconded by Regent Flores and carried, with Regent Davis abstaining from the vote on Resolution 5978.

Approval of Gifts, Grants and Contracts

Resolution 5978:

That, upon recommendation of the Acting President of the University of Wisconsin System, the gifts, grants and contracts presented at this meeting (copy on file with the papers of this meeting) be accepted, approved, ratified and confirmed; and that, where signature authority has not been previously delegated,

Unclassified Staff Salary and Title Structure, R 5980, Pp/2-13

Associate Vice President Wright presented to the Committee proposed amendments to the Hayes/Hill title and salary grade structure, which were submitted for Board approval, after which they were to be submitted to the Secretary of the Department of Employment Relations for review and final approval. Circuit Court Judge Mark Frankel found that previous amendments to the Hayes/Hill title and salary structure were not accomplished according to statutory requirements because required Board of Regents approval had not been requested and granted. The District IV Court of Appeals affirmed his decision in part and remanded the matter for further determinations. The university will be required to pay an as-yet-undetermined sum in back pay prior to the end of June 1992 as part of the court decision.

newsature - (suna) Associate Vice President Wright advised the Committee that the amendments resulted primarily from the change in the senior title definition including the definition of a distinguished position prefix and the assignment of salary grade to the distinguished prefix.

Selanes - (same)

Douglas Lueck of the Wisconsin Education Association Council, expressed objection to use of the distinguished prefix and to language delegating the monitoring function. Gloria Toivola, of TAUWP, recommended a delay in adopting the resolution to allow more time to review the proposed changes. System staff indicated that such a delay could make it difficult for the institutions to meet the June deadline and that the amendments will not result in any negative salary changes.

The resolution was revised by the Business and Finance Committee to include an annual review by the Board of Regents and then was unanimously approved.

Upon motion by Regent Gelatt, seconded by Regent Lubar, the following resolution was adopted unanimously by the Board of Regents:

Resolution 5980:

That, upon recommendation of the Acting President of the University of Wisconsin System, the register of proposed amendments to the academic staff title and salary structure presented by Hayes/Hill, Inc., be approved and, as required by s. 36.09(1)(k)2.d., Wis. Stats., be accepted for transmittal to the Secretary, Department of Employment Relations for review and approval.

Following receipt of approval for the amendments from the Secretary, Department of Employment Relations, the Board affirms the delegated authority of the President of the System to monitor and maintain the unclassified title and salary structure as amended and affirms the responsibility of the President to take any and all necessary actions to ensure consistent use of the title and salary structure among the institutions, subject to an annual review by the Board of Regents. The President may extend delegated authority to the Chancellors.

REPORT OF THE PHYSICAL PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE

Regent Gundersen, Chair, presented the Committee's report.

Consent Agenda Items

Presenting Resolutions 5981-5988, which had been approved unanimously by the Physical Planning and Development Committee, Regent Gundersen moved their adoption by the Board of Regents as consent agenda items. The motion was seconded by Regent Dreyfus and carried unanimously.

UW-Green Bay Approval of 1991 Campus Development Plan R 5981, P.14

That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Superior Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, authority be granted to sell a 200.2 acre parcel of unimproved land located in Bayfield County received by UW-Superior as a gift from the Iowa State University Achievement Foundation on August 26, 1987. The offer-to-purchase is for \$52,500 which will be used for UW-Superior campus improvements.

Union Addition and Remodeling, R 5985, p. 14

Resolution 5985:

That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Green Bay Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, the Design Report be approved and authority granted to construct the 1991-93 Student Union Addition and Remodeling project, at a total estimated project cost of \$4,609,000, using \$3,609,000 Program Revenue Supported Borrowing and \$1,000,000 Program Revenue Cash.

Land Acquisition Policy, R 5989, PP 15-19

Summarizing Committee review of this item, Regent Gundersen noted that the present policy was reflected in Resolution 5500, adopted May 11, 1990, as part of the larger subject of funding university facilities capital costs. The proposed revision was brought forward because the Building Commission is no longer willing to consider System requests for land acquisition using GPR funds. Building Commission staff stated that land acquisition was given a low priority because of the significant backlog of maintenance needs. The Board had not wanted to address the subject on an ad hoc basis, nor had it wanted to make exceptions to its policy. It was the consensus that System staff attempt to secure a formal enunciation by the Building Commission of a policy on the funding of land acquisition for parking. Such an attempt was made in November, but the subject was not placed on the agenda of the Commission. Instead, Robert Brandherm, Secretary of the Building Commission, wrote a letter to Regent President Lyon stating that the Building Commission established its policy by virtue of its action on the 1991-93 capital budget, in which it did not make an allocation specifically for land acquisition. Policies - same

Budget, Capital - Freenday sources for capital costs, R 5989, Pp 15-19

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Finally, Mr. Brandherm's letter requested the Board to reconsider its policy on the funding of land acquisition to enable use of program revenue to acquire land for parking.

Resolution 5989 proposed a revision to Resolution 5500, which would both reaffirm the Board's position that GPR is the prescribed source of funds for lands to be used for parking, and also would identify program revenue as an allowed source. The proposed change in policy contains the additional qualification that, in the event a site acquired by program revenues is subsequently needed for a GPR purpose, the Board assumes the Building Commission will make GPR funds available to reimburse the entire acquisition cost plus depreciated value of any program-revenue-funded improvements. The proposed revision would resolve the current stalemate and enable each campus to decide whether to proceed with high priority acquisitions or wait to see if GPR funding becomes available at a later time.

At the request of Regent Hirsch, wording was added to the proposed policy revision to state specifically that segregated fees are not an allowable funding source for parking land acquisition.

After discussion, the Committee unanimously approved Resolution 5989.

Upon motion by Regent Gundersen, seconded by Regent Barry, the following resolution was adopted unanimously by the Board of Regents:

Resolution 5989:

That, upon the recommendation of the Chancellors and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, Resolution 5500, adopted May 11, 1990, be revised. Resolution 5500 reflects the consensus of the Board of Regents relating to appropriate funding of university facilities capital costs. The revision to this policy makes Program Revenues an allowable funding source for the acquisition of parcels needed for the subsequent development of parking facilities needed on UW System campuses. This revision is subject to the condition stated on page 3 of this resolution.

(1) The Board of Regents reaffirms its position that students should not be requested nor allowed to commit money via segregated fees for use in academic capital budget expenditures. This philosophy extends beyond strictly instructional space to include other capital expenditures that are necessary in support of the primary mission of the University System. It is expected that secondary, non-curricular student use of facilities will occur, in an effort to maximize the use of facilities and meet the needs of students.

- (2) Capital costs related to the various auxiliary enterprises and/or revenue-generating activities should generally be funded by user fees. It is likely that some projects will involve use of segregated fees, such as student unions, recreation facilities, etc., in addition to or instead of user fees.
- (3) Extramural funds such as gifts and grants can be used to replace or supplement any other source(s) of funds that would typically be prescribed for capital expenditures. The Board of Regents reaffirms its position related to the use of outside funds for capital projects:
 - a. Such projects should not be initiated without an opportunity being provided for the Regents to determine the appropriateness of the proposed funds and/or project(s) to System needs.
 - b. The need for a project that also requires a GPR contribution, or a project that would otherwise utilize GPR as a prescribed funding source, should be evidenced by its inclusion in long-range campus plans that reflect overall needs.
- (4) The funding of capital costs need not necessarily be the same as the funding of operating costs for the facility/program. Appropriate funding sources for facility/program operation are documented elsewhere.
- (5) The following list, based on the above funding source parameters, represents the criteria that will be used by the Board of Regents to evaluate the appropriateness of funding proposed for the capital costs of facilities within the University of Wisconsin System:

Upon motion by Regent Gundersen, seconded by Regent Barry, the following resolution was adopted unanimously by the Board of Regents.

Resolution 5990:

That, upon the recommendation of the UW-LaCrosse Chancellor and the President of the University of Wisconsin System, authority be granted to purchase a 0.31-acre improved parcel of land located at 620 North 16th Street, at an estimated cost of \$48,700 Program Revenue (Parking).

Report on Preventive Maintenance Initiatives for Chiller Systems

The Physical Planning and Development Committee discussed another in a series of special reports on subjects associated with the responsibilities assigned to the Committee. This report concerned a special preventive maintenance effort initiated by System Administration staff to assure that the chiller systems, used to meet the need for building air conditioning across the System, remain in good working order. Noting that this initiative is part of the System's overall management effort to develop a preventive maintenance program to address potential problems before they occur, Vice President Brown

commented that a proactive maintenance program requires periodic examination and testing of the various mechanical systems found in all buildings. The central campus chilling equipment and individual building chillers represent some of the most significant investments on the campuses. Failure in any of this equipment is costly to repair, and the lack of air conditioning is disruptive to programs. This maintenance initiative will increase the assurance of uninterrupted service from these critical components of the campus infrastructure.

The Committee members were very pleased to be made aware of this initiative and Commended staff who had worked to establish the maintenance program.

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Milwaukee Civic Center Project

Regent Gundersen reported that the Committee received a status report on the Civic Center project in Milwaukee. Chancellor Schroeder, Chancellor Boyle and Vice President Brown addressed the facility deficiencies and programmatic needs for UW-Extension's Continuing Education and Outreach programs. The UW System had hoped for a joint venture with the state and the city to replace the facilities, but those efforts have not been successful. System Administration had repeatedly expressed the desirability of maintaining a high profile presence in the downtown Milwaukee area and had been pursuing replacement of these facilities at the existing site. Recently, the manager of the Plankinton Building made an offer to provide space for the programs in the Grand Avenue Mall. The Committee heard a presentation by Mr. Carl Mueller, representing the management firm. After discussion, the Committee approved a resolution on this subject.

It was moved by Regent Gundersen and seconded by Regent Dreyfus that the following resolution be adopted by the Board of Regents.

That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Milwaukee and UW-Extension Chancellors and the President of the University of Wisconsin System:

- (1) the University of Wisconsin System Administration be authorized to negotiate a lease with an option to purchase up to 80,000 assignable square feet of space in the Plankinton Building in Milwaukee from the Grand Avenue Mall Corporation, at a cost not to exceed \$12 million;
- (2) that the negotiations include consideration of the value of the present Civic Center campus as partial payment of the lease or purchase; and further,
- (3) that the Governor be requested to include the purchase in the 1991-93 Authorized Building Program.

The intention is to purchase the space on a condominium arrangement to replace the facilities on the Milwaukee Civic Center Campus and to utilize the value of the Civic Center property to reduce the cost of the purchase.

The lease option is recommended to accommodate the possibility that the required statutory language may not be enacted in a timely fashion to effect the purchase. The purchase should be finalized at the earliest possible time.

The resolution provides for remodeling up to 80,000 assignable square feet which will enable the University System to consolidate the Extension, Continuing Education, Outreach and Cooperative programs and staff from seven different office locations and numerous classroom, hotel, motel, and business facilities. It is desirable that the facilities bring a focus to the programs and provide a highly visible identity for the University of Wisconsin System with the civic and business community.

Regent Gelatt asked if System Administration was prepared to recommend that this project be given higher priority than others without a comparative discussion of the various projects. Vice President Brown replied that this is considered a high priority project.

Noting the deteriorated condition of the existing facilities, Regent Dreyfus explained that the reason for considering this project outside of the normal process is the unique opportunity presented by the Plankinton Building offer. The programs involved, he noted, are currently attended by 85,000 students and are underutilized due to poor facilities. Advantages of the Grand Avenue Mall location include adequate parking at reasonable rates, sufficient restaurant facilities, and easy access by mass transportation and the freeway system.

The project has the support, he added, of key officials, including the Mayor of Milwaukee and the two chancellors, and had been discussed with Secretary Klauser. Quick action would allow a request for inclusion of the project in the annual budget review legislation and would avoid a major building request in the 1993-95 biennium. Current facilities could serve to provide a down payment on this project. He therefore urged the Board to move forward with approval to proceed.

Regent Schilling stated that, while he favored the project in concept, he was concerned about circumventing the carefully formulated capital budget process. He would support stating, as affirmatively as possible within the established process, that this project should be a high priority and should move forward quickly. However, he was concerned that the proposed resolution seemed to decide the case prematurely.

While he found the proposal attractive, Regent Nicholas agreed with the concern expressed about the process and the relative priority of this project in a time of scarce resources. He inquired as to whether the stated \$12 million cost had been analyzed thoroughly.

Vice President Brown explained that the \$12 million figure had been presented to indicate an outside limit. If authority were granted to proceed with negotiations, the owners could be asked for detailed estimates of construction and lease costs. Building Commission authority to proceed also would be required.

Regent Hirsch expressed concern about moving so rapidly that all costs might not be fully considered. While he supported the concept of the proposal, he was not prepared to make a decision without complete data.

Regent Flores stated agreement with Regent Hirsch.

Regent Krutsch suggested that the Board might feel more comfortable with a resolution which would move the proposal forward but would not give full endorsement at this time.

In response to a question by Regent Schilling, Vice President Brown explained that the timing issue involved enumeration in the annual budget review to be presented in late January. What was needed at this time was indication of whether the Board would endorse a downtown location and a lease/purchase option rather than construction of a facility at another site.

Regent Barry noted that the proposal could be expected to enhance generation of program revenues from continuing education courses. He did not view the resolution as a final action, but rather as a means of facilitating progress of the proposal and supporting the concept of a continuing education facility in the downtown area. The results of negotiations would be returned to the Board for approval.

Reporting that Regent Grebe had sent a letter with a strong expression of interest in pursuit of this project, Regent Gundersen stated his own support for requesting enumeration in the annual budget review, since delay would foreclose for at least two more years the opportunity to remedy a problem for which a solution had long been sought.

Regent Dreyfus agreed that the key issue at this time was to request enumeration in the budget review, particularly since delay increases the cost of facility projects. He felt the proposal would be attractive to state decision makers because it would eliminate the need to request construction of a new building.

Regent Flores felt information was needed on how the cost of this proposal would compare to the cost of constructing a new facility.

In response to a question by Regent Lubar, Vice President Brown indicated that cost would include remodeling, equipment, and purchase of two floors of the Plankinton Building, plus part of the ground floor and entry.

Regent Lubar commented that the building is in a unique downtown location with ample parking and good visibility. He supported authorizing negotiations and exploring enumeration at this time because he did not wish the project to be delayed, but he agreed that cost data and comparisons are needed before making a final commitment.

Regent Barry believed a strong expression of support for the project would be adequate at this time, as long as it included a positive statement requesting inclusion in the budget review bill.

Regent Nicholas commented that there is an abundance of office space available in downtown Milwaukee and the proposed location probably will remain available for some time. Based on that circumstance, he saw an advantage in moving forward for the purpose of negotiating favorable terms.

Regent Schilling presented the following resolution, which was accepted as a substitute for the resolution on the floor. The question was put on Resolution 5991, and it was adopted, with Regents Davis and Steil abstaining from the vote.

Resolution 5991: That, upon the recommendation of the UW-Milwaukee and UW-Extension Chancellors and the President of the University of Wisconsin System:

- (1) the University of Wisconsin System
 Administration be authorized to negotiate a
 lease with an option to purchase up to 80,000
 assignable square feet of space in the
 Plankinton Building in Milwaukee from the
 Grand Avenue Mall Corporation, at a cost not
 to exceed \$12 million;
- (2) that the negotiations include consideration of the value of the present Civic Center campus as partial payment of the lease or purchase; and further,
- (3) that the University of Wisconsin System
 Administration be authorized to advance the
 concept to the Building Commission and explore
 enumeration of it in the annual budget review.

A complete report with cost estimates will be presented for action to the Board of Regents at its February 1992 meeting.
