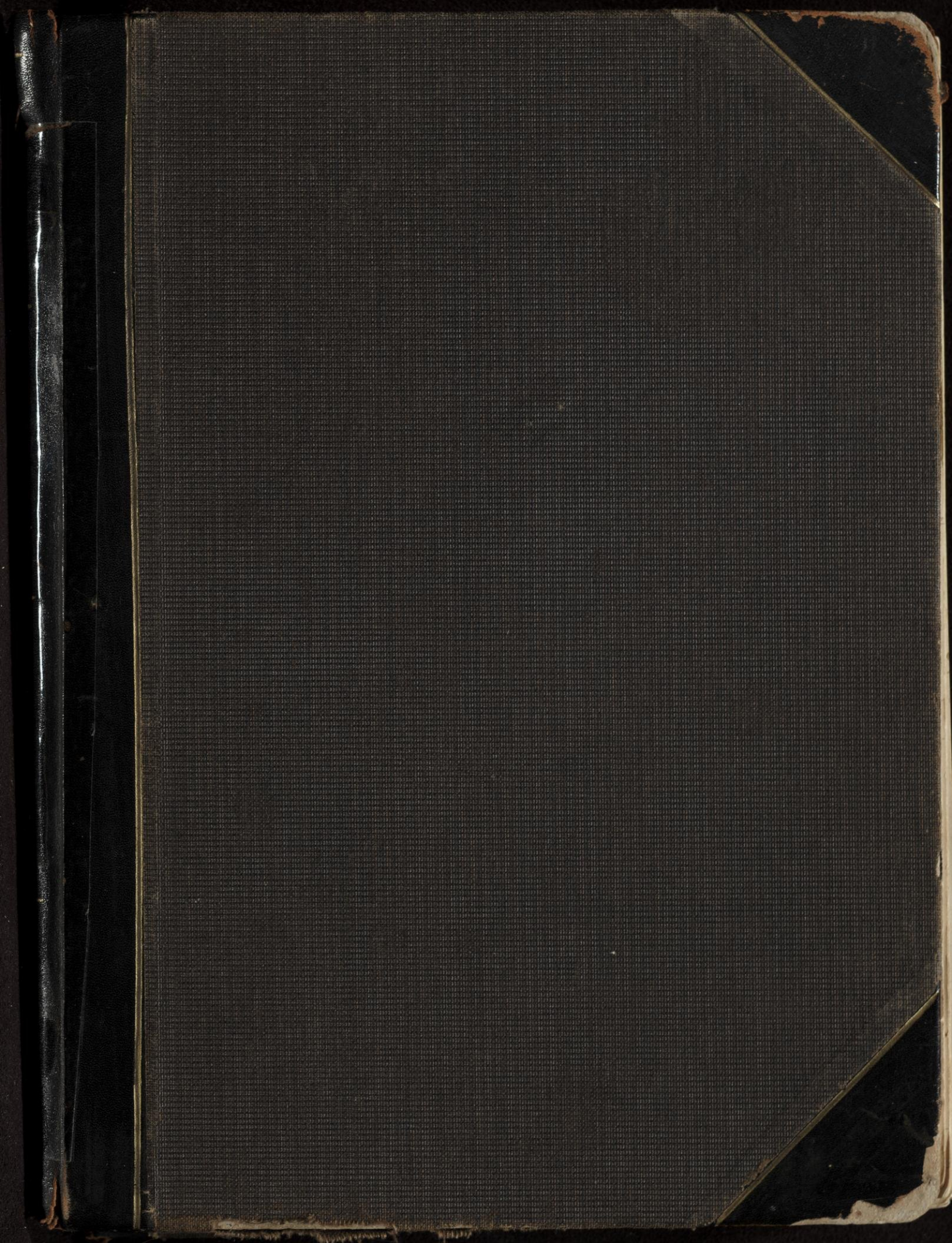

By-laws.

Article I

Name and Location.

Section I The name of this corporation shall be the Kiel Public Library.

Section II Its principal office shall be located at Kiel, Wisconsin.

Section III Other offices for the transaction of business shall be located at such places as the board of directors may from time to time determine.

Article II

Members Meeting.

Section I An annual meeting of the members shall be held on the second Wednesday of September in each year at 8. P. M. At such meetings, the members shall elect directors to serve until their successors shall be elected and qualified.

Section II Special meetings of the members, to be held at the same place as the annual meeting, if convenient, and may be called at any time by the president; and in his absence by the Vice-President; or by the

directors. It shall be the duty of the president and Vice-President to call such a meeting whenever requested by ten or more members of the corporation.

Sect. III Notice of the time and place of all annual and special meetings shall be mailed by the Secretary to each member ten days before the date thereof.

Sect. IV The President, or, in his absence, the Vice-President, shall preside at such meetings.

Sect. V At every such meeting, each member shall be entitled to cast one vote.

Sect. VI A quorum for the transaction of business at any such meeting shall consist of ten members; but the members present at any meeting, though less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting to a future time.

Sect. VII The members shall have power, by a majority vote at such meetings, to remove any director or officer from office.

Article III

Directors.

Sect. I The business and property of the

corporation shall be managed by a board of five directors, who shall be elected by the members. Each director shall be a member and shall receive no compensation for his services as a director.

Sect. II

The directors shall be classified with respect to the time for which they shall severally hold office by dividing them into three classes, two consisting of two members and one of one member. The directors of the first class shall be elected for a term of one year; the directors of the second class for a term of two years; and the directors of the third class for a term of ~~three~~ three years; and at each succeeding annual election the successors to the class of directors whose term of office shall expire that year, shall be elected to hold office for the term of three years so that the term of office for one class of directors shall expire each year.

Sect. III

The regular meeting of the directors shall be held in the principal office of the corporation

immediately after the adjournment of the annual meeting of the members and also on the 2nd ~~Wednesday~~ day of each month at the hour of 8 o'clock P. M.

Sec. IV Special meetings of the board of directors, to be held in the principal office of the corporation may be called by the President, and in his absence by the Vice-President or by any three members of the board. By unanimous consent of the directors, special meetings of the board may be held without notice, at any time or place.

Sec. V A quorum for the transaction of business at any regular or special meeting of the directors shall consist of three members of the board; but a majority of those present at any regular or special meeting shall have the power to adjourn the meeting at any time.

Sec. VI The directors shall elect the officers of the corporation; such election to be held at the meeting immediately following the annual meeting of the members of the Corporation.

An officer may be removed at any time by a two-thirds vote of the full board of directors.

Sect. III

Vacancies in the board of directors may be filled by the remaining directors at any regular or special directors meeting.

Sect. III

The Directors may, by resolution, appoint a librarian to manage the library.

Sect. IV

at each annual meeting of the members, the directors shall submit a statement of the business done the preceding year, together with a report of the general financial conditions of the corporation, and of the condition of the tangible property.



Article IV

Officers

Sect. I

The officers of this corporation shall be a President, a Secretary and a Treasurer, who shall be elected for a term of one year, and shall hold office until their successors are duly elected and qualified. No one shall be eligible to the office

of President and Vice President who is not a director of the corporation; and any such officer who ceases to be a director shall cease to hold office as President or Vice President as soon as his successor is elected and qualified. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held by one person.

Article V

Committees.

Section I at the annual meeting of the President shall appoint standing committees as follows: a book committee to share with the librarian, the responsibility of selecting books and to recommend their purchase to the board; a finance committee which shall supervise all library finances, examine and report upon all bills against the board and working in cooperation with the librarian, prepare an annual budget of expenditures; a building committee; and a committee on such administrative questions as may fall under the jurisdiction of the

librarian or of other committees.

Article VI

Order of Business.

sect. I

Minutes of the First Meeting.

Nine ladies who were present at a meeting at the home of Mrs. D. F. Naeth, on Friday, Oct. 31, 1924, voted in favor of having a Public Library Association formed in Kiel, with the purpose of sponsoring and working for a Public Library. The nine ladies formed a committee to work out an underlined principle to usher this movement into existence and to use their influence in interesting the various organizations and the public at large.

It was agreed to hold a public meeting some time in the near future, when the public would be asked to pass their opinions and form the organization.

The members present were: —

Miss Lindeman acted as temporary chairman and Mrs. Wallman as

temporary secretary.

In order to spread this movement, Mrs. Naeth was asked to represent the Committee at the Study Club, Mrs. J. B. Lauen at the Kiel Frauenverein, Mrs. Bohr at Release Lodge, Eleanor Quecker at the Bridge Club, Mrs. Wallman at the Lady Foresters Mrs. Kaemmerer at Reformed Church Verein, Mrs. Meyer at Christian Endeavor, Miss Lindeman at Rockville and Schuesing Aid Society and Mrs. Quecker at the Dorcas Society. The meeting adjourned to meet with Mrs. Kaemmerer on Friday, Nov. 7, 1924 at 2:30 P. M.

Minutes of the Meeting Nov. 7, 1924.

Several ladies interested in promoting a library for the city of Kiel, had their second meeting at the home of Mrs. A. L. Koemmel on Friday, Nov. 7, 1924.

The meeting was called to order by chairman, Miss Lindeman.

Most of the afternoon was spent in discussing plans, as how best to get the community interested in regard to organizing a Library Association.

Motion was made, seconded and carried to invite some of the ladies of the community to attend a meeting at the City Hall on Friday, Nov. 14, at 8 o'clock. On this evening, the organization of this association shall be considered.

The secretary was asked to have this invitation announced thru the "Record," on Wednesday. It was also decided to make a house to house canvass and talk to women personally. The chairman planned the following schedule: -

Minutes of the Meeting Nov. 10.

The committee interested in promoting a library for Kiel, met with Mrs. Ed. Bluecker on Monday evening Nov. 10th

The Chairman - Miss Lindeman called the meeting to order at ten minutes of eight.

Mrs. Bluecker was appointed temporary secretary.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read & approved.

Some of the members of the committee expressed their opinion in regard to obtaining a library for the city of Kiel.

One suggestion was, that if in some way, the Chamber of Commerce would be induced to build a Community Hall, the city council most likely would have their meetings at the new hall, and the building that ^{is} now used as the city hall, could be remodeled for a library. The hall is centrally located and the remodeling probably would not cost a great deal.

Another suggestion was to rent the first floor of the Arnold building invest in the necessary fixtures and furnishings to make the interior chamber, cheerful & cozy, and use it as a library until the association is certain of running on a paying basis. The up keep of a library under these conditions would probably be less than under ordinary conditions.

Another suggestion was to erect a new building to be used for a library only, - not in connection with any Hall.

after these suggestions had been made, the meeting adjourned until Friday evening.

The secretary was asked to ask Mrs. Goeres, Mrs. Misch and Mrs. Greve to speak at the meeting on Friday eve. Miss Lindeman was asked to ask the teachers.

Minutes of the Meeting Nov. 17, 1924

A group of ladies interested in a library for Kiel, met at the city hall on Friday evening Nov. 17.

Miss Lindeman called the meeting to order at 8:20 and then very briefly explained to those present how the movement for a library originated.

After this Mrs. Paul Wagner, librarian at Plymouth library, addressed the ladies. Mrs. Wagner's talk proved very interesting and encouraging, she being able to give absolute facts regarding to books and finances.

The secretary, Mrs. Duerker read the minutes of the previous meeting.

A vote was taken whether or not to organize a library association. The voting resulted in 39 votes being cast. 37 in affirmative and two in the negative.

It was moved & seconded & carried to ask each person at this meeting to sign a paper pledging themselves to support the library association. Res. were set at one

dollar per year. The result of this motion was that every one of those present signed the pledge.

It was moved, seconded and carried that each one having signed the pledge get as many more for membership as possible and then at some future date call a meeting to complete plans for the organizing of the association also for election of officers.

The date for this meeting was set for Monday evening Nov. 24, 1924.

Mrs. Prof. was appointed to ask the School Board for the use of the High School Assembly Room.

Meeting adjourned at 10 o'clock.

It was also moved, seconded and carried to call this association, The Kiel Public Library Association.

The rules read as follows.

- I Adults residing within the counties of Manitowac, Calumet and Sheboygan are entitled to draw books by filling out application blanks. Children under the age of 14 must obtain the signature of parent or guardian.
- II One book of fiction and two of non-fiction may be drawn at a time.
- III Books may be kept 2 weeks and renewed once for the same time. Books marked "Seven Day Book", may be kept for that time only and

cannot be renewed or transferred.

IV A fee of two cents a day will be imposed for books kept over time.

V Any book other than a seven day book, may be reserved upon the payment of one cent for cost of notice, which will be sent as soon as the book is returned to the library. A book will not be held longer than two library opening days, after which it will again be put into circulation.

VI A temporary resident may obtain a book by making a temporary deposit equal to the value of the book.

Mrs. Keller was appointed to have rules printed for insertion into library books.

The book committee recommended the construction of a disinfectant box for the disinfecting of books. Hugo Neumann & Wm. Keller were appointed to construct such box.

A bill of \$8 was presented to Treasurer for printing.

Motion made & seconded to allow bill.
Carried.

Moved & seconded to adjourn. Carried.

fiction, 145 young people, 36

library. The total number of books
now owned by the library is 1175.

The city has provided
for a large library room in the new
city hall. Our library will be
allowed to use these new quarters,
but we are to pay for the cost of
heating and care-taking. This
room has well served our library,

will be more comfortable in winter
and have many other advantages.
We hope that before very long,
perhaps in a year or two, the city
