THE UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN SYSTEM

The University of Wisconsin System marked its nineteenth anniversary in the fall of 1990. The UW System was created in October 1971 by a law placing all of the state's public university campuses under a single Board of Regents. The UW System is composed of 13 universities and 13 two-year UW Centers, and UW-Extension which provides outreach services from offices in every county. Although only 19 years old, the UW System was one of the first statewide higher educational systems in the nation and has pioneered in developing coordinated and high quality programs and services on a statewide basis. System administrative offices are in Madison.

Universities are at Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Madison, Milwaukee, Oshkosh, Kenosha-Racine (Parkside), Platteville, River Falls, Stevens Point, Menomonie (Stout), Superior and Whitewater. Centers are at Baraboo, Fond du Lac, Janesville, Manitowoc, Marinette, Marshfield, Menasha, Rice Lake, Richland Center, Sheboygan, Waukesha, Wausau, and West Bend.

MAX R. SPARGER, COMMISSIONER OF ATHLETICS

Max R. Sparger was named athletic commissioner of the Wisconsin State University Conference in July of 1971, succeeding Fred Jacoby.

Sparger has experienced a varied and successful career in athletics as a participant, coach, administrator and official.

A native of Wichita Falls, Texas, Sparger was a member of the UW-Stout athletic staff from 1959 to 1971, and athletic director his last two years there.

The Commissioner grew up in St. Paul Park, Minnesota, graduating from high school there in 1952. He earned his bachelor's degree in 1956 from Dubuque (Iowa) University, where he played football and wrestled during his college career.

Following graduation from college, Sparger coached high school and junior college sports in Ford Dodge, Iowa, leaving to join the Stout staff as assistant football and basketball coach in 1959. He received his master's degree in education from Macalester College, St. Paul, Minnesota, in 1961, and since then has done advanced work at the University of Minnesota.

He became head football coach in 1963, and was selected to receive an award for "Outstanding Teaching" during that year. He guided Stout to a Conference championship in 1965, after which he was named "Coach of the Year" in N.A.I.A. District 14. He gave up his football coaching duties after becoming athletic director in 1969.

Sparger was inducted into the UW-Stout "Hall of Fame" in 1980, and into the NAIA District 14 "Hall of Fame" in 1985.

TOM BUTLER, SPORTS INFORMATION DIRECTOR

Tom Butler joined the WSUC staff part-time May 1, 1967, to assist the Commissioner with the dissemination of sports information. The Madison native graduated from East High School in 1942.

Following three years in the Navy during World War II, he received a B.A. degree in journalism from the UW-Madison in January of 1950. After working as sports editor of the Stevens Point Daily Journal and the Daily Jefferson County Union (Fort Atkinson), Butler joined the Wisconsin State Journal as a sports writer February 1, 1953. He retired from the State Journal in 1987.

GENE CALHOUN, SUPERVISOR OF FOOTBALL OFFICIALS

Gene Calhoun, a veteran Wisconsin athletic official, became supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference officials in 1966. He has more than 30 years experience in officiating.

Calhoun graduated from Madison East High School in 1941, served in the Army Air Corps during World War II and is a retired lieutenant colonel in the Air Force Reserves. He earned his bachelor's degree from the UW-Madison in 1947, and his law degree in 1950. He is a practicing attorney in Madison.

An official since 1947, he worked in the Big 10 for 20 years, and was referee in the 1968 and 1976 Rose Bowl games, the 1971 Cotton Bowl game, the 1974 Sugar Bowl and the 1981 Orange Bowl game.

He retired from active officiating after the Orange Bowl and assumed the duties of Supervisor of Football Officials for the Big 10 in 1982, retiring from that post in 1990.

OTTO PULS, SUPERVISOR OF BASKETBALL OFFICIALS

Otto R. Puls is supervisor of Wisconsin State University Conference basketball officials.

Puls, a veteran high school and college official, graduated from Madison East High School and the University of Wisconsin, where he earned a B.S. degree in Pharmacy. He currently is chief pharmacist at the Central Wisconsin Center for Developmentally Disabled in Madison.

Otto played baseball at East and at UW-Madison. Following college he played professional baseball in the Baltimore Orioles farm system.

He started officiating in 1955 and has worked Big Ten football for the past 13 years. During that span he officiated six Michigan-Ohio State football games, the 1978 Tangerine Bowl, 1981 Orange Bowl and Rose Bowl games in 1977 and '82.

PREVIEW OF 1990 WSUC FOOTBALL SEASON

The Wisconsin State University Conference prides itself on balance, especially in the annual run for the football championship. Six of the nine teams in the conference figured in at least one championship during the 1980s. Only Oshkosh, Stout and Superior were shut out. Three times during that 10-year span two or more teams tied for the title. Four teams shared the crown in 1980 and three grabbed a piece of the 1986 championship.

Mike Farley's River Falls clubs came closest to being the dominant team of the '80s. The Falcons figured in five championships, sharing four titles and winning one outright. La Crosse and Whitewater figured in four each, the Eagles winning two undisputed championships and the Warhawks one. Eau Claire finished alone on top twice, while Platteville and Stevens Point each shared a title.

How about 1990, the first season of the new decade? (Although there's always an argument about whether the decade starts at zero or one, we'll go with '90 as the kickoff.)

Most coaches in the conference see defending champion La Crosse campaigning as one of the strongest two or three teams in the conference, if not the biggest challenge down the line. The Eagles lost to Westminster (PA) in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics Division II finals the past two years and won the national championship in 1985.

Whitewater, which won the WSUC championship in 1988 and lost in the National Collegiate Athletic Association Division III West Regional finals that year, will try to rejuvenate its program after slumping to sixth place with a 2-5-1 record last fall. Bob Berezowitz's Warhawks struggled with an uncertain quarterback situation last season but they could receive a much needed lift at that position from Dennis Bogacz, a talented signal-caller at Oshkosh the past two years who transferred to Whitewater and is eligible for the 1990 season.

WSUC coaches were casting wary eyes toward Eau Claire as preseason practice got under way. Coach Jim Lind's Blugolds surprised everyone a year ago with a 5-3 finish in the conference (7-3 overall) when nobody gave them a second thought at the outset of '89. Eau Claire returns the nucleus of Lind's explosive offense, headed by quarterback John Clark, the highest rated player in the conference returning at his position.

Platteville beat champion La Crosse and tied second-place Stevens Point last season but stumbled against Eau Claire and River Falls. Coach George Chryst hopes to convince his Pioneers that relaxing against any opponent in the WSUC can mean disaster. Running backs Dave Shumway and Devin Cobb and some newcomers on defense carry a big load for the Pioneers this fall.

Coach John O'Grady starts his second season at River Falls without "wishbone" triggerman Jeff Saueressig but with Mike Farley as his chief assistant. Farley came out of retirement to help his former pupil after long-time aide Ted Thompson decided to take the head job at Superior. Some wonder if it might be detrimental having the legendary coach so close to the scene, but those who know Farley well insist those fears are unfounded.

Stevens Point might be hard-pressed to repeat its second-place finish without quarterback Kirk Baumgartner, who rewrote the record book for passing efficiency. After four years starring for the Pointers Baumgartner this fall is trying to make the Green Bay Packers' squad.

Stout also has some big shoes to fill with the departure of quarterback Tim Peterson and wide receiver Scott Fredrickson, both of whom also are hoping to extend their football careers in the professional ranks. Even more critical for coach Rich Lawrence could be the task of shoring up a defensive unit that yielded more than 30 points a game last season.

Thompson is taking a new approach at Superior, seeking to corral the best athletes available from the surrounding area of the big lake and then molding them into a cohesive unit, featuring the "wishbone" offense and a smash-mouth defense.

Coach Ron Cardo still is looking for the right combination at Oshkosh. The defection of Bogacz didn't help, but it's also apparent that the Titans finished eighth in the conference (1-6-1) with him last fall, so maybe it's just a case of getting everyone settled down and operating on the same page in 1990.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

Most WSUC observers labeled Eau Claire the surprise team of 1989. One publication picked the Blugolds to finish next-to-last in the conference but coach Jim Lind's first recruiting class matured a year early, jumping out to a 7-1 start before finishing with tough losses to champion La Crosse and runnerup Stevens Point.

Lind's formula for success included blending youth with experience to mold a contender that challenged right up to the final weeks of the season. The starting lineup for last year's finale at Stevens Point included nine juniors and five sophomores. They form the nucleus of a unit Lind hopes will challenge for the conference championship this season.

Lind said the foundation is in place for continued success but emphasized the importance of a solid recruiting effort this year. "This is the year the Blugolds need to have a good recruiting class because of the number of seniors we'll have (this fall)," he said. "We have to recruit some guys we think can come in and play right away at key positions."

Last season the Blugolds produced impressive numbers while leading the WSUC in total offense, averaging 458 yards a game, 304 passing and 154 rushing. Keys in this explosive attack were quarterback John Clark, running backs Cary Osborn and Chris Herzog, wide receiver Pete Balistrieri and tackle Rob Buck. They head a group of seniors who must provide leadership during the 1990 campaign.

Clark ranked second only to heralded Stevens Point quarterback Kirk Baumgartner in passing last season, connecting for an average of 295 yards a game and 19 touchdowns on the season. Among his targets was Balistrieri, who caught 29 passes for 658 yards and nine touchdowns in eight conference games and 35 for 884 yards on the season, including a 99-yard scoring strike from Clark in a 16-10 defeat of UM-Duluth.

Herzog led the Blugolds in receptions swinging out of the backfield, which is a staple in Lind's wide open offensive attack. He caught 57 passes in 10 games, Osborn 38 and wide receiver Bill Johnston 21.

Defensively the Blugolds face a tough task replacing all-conference nose guard and team most valuable player Tim Golden. They also must replace Mike Lukas and Chad Christianson in the defensive line as well as linebacker Corey Willert, who led the team in tackles last year. The secondary appears strong, though, headed by sophomore Dana Strain and junior Jeff Hebert.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

The Eagles should make a strong defense of their 1989 championship because of their many and talented returnees. Coach Roger Harring did lose some key offensive linemen but a strong contingent of defensive regulars returns. Most coaches put their emphasis on defense and Harring is no exception. That side of the football can keep a team competitive while the offense jells.

Heading that defensive unit are three all-conference performers--tackle Jon Wiltzius along with Fritz Leinfelder and Casey Campbell in the secondary. Also back are linebacker Jon Lauscher and end Andy Pretasky, both of whom could make a strong bid for all-conference honors in 1990. Among the 1989 defensive standouts missing are tackle Shawn Starks and backs Clint Beyer and Preston Pointer. But, capable reserves are ready to move up.

Harring frets because his offensive line was "decimated" by graduation. The loss of tight end Troy Bellrichard, tackle Terry Strouf and guard Gary Larson is particularly damaging. Also gone is all-purpose back Harold Owens, whose breakaway speed made him a threat every time he touched the ball.

The plus side of the offensive ledger includes quarterback Dennis Goettl, who came into his own as a sophomore last season and guided the Eagles to the WSUC championship and the NAIA Division II finals, where they lost the championship to Westminster (Pa.) for the second year in a row. Goettl completed 56 percent of his passes in 1989, connecting for 1,886 yards and 13 touchdowns in eight conference games. Experience in 14 games a year ago should make him even better as a junior.

Also back are tackle Greg Daniels and fullback Kyle Reddy, both of whom made the second all-conference team last season. Reddy rushed for 75 yards a game and 5.4 yards a carry as the mainstay of La Crosse's ground attack. Another major plus is punter Eric Jahn, who averaged 38 yards on 27 punts in 1989.

Harring, the dean of WSUC football mentors and coach of the year again in 1989, is starting his 22nd year at the helm of the Eagles. Since 1969 his teams have won or shared nine conference championships. Last season his Eagles led the league in defense and ranked seventh offensively. That should provide some indication as to the importance of defense in WSUC football. La Crosse's strength heading into this season remains on the defensive side and this does not bode well for the opposition. This is one reason WSUC coach still fear the Eagles, who are looking for another national championship.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

Oshkosh was hit hard with graduation last season and returns only 24 lettermen. Also, quarterback Dennis Bogacz, who shattered most Titan passing and total offense records the past two seasons, transferred to Whitewater last semester and will be doing his throwing for the Warhawks this fall. Ten of the 24 lettermen are seniors, though, and seventh-year coach Ron Cardo hopes that they will provide the needed leadership for this year's squad.

Last year the Titans ranked among the national leaders in total offense by averaging 406.1 yards per game, including 325.3 through the air. Despite all the passing, the Titans have shown the ability to run the football as well. And they probably will do more on the ground this fall with Bogacz gone. But, Cardo must find a new quarterback and he will be inexperienced. That's a major problem at the outset.

A new quarterback will have the luxury of throwing to Rob Neta, one of the WSUC's top receivers last season when he caught 33 passes for 776 yards and six touchdowns. He also averaged 23.5 yards per catch, ranking among the conference leaders. Ron McDonald and Scott Kaufman lead candidates for the other wide receiver positions.

Mark Matzke, Oshkosh's third all-time leader rusher with 2,403 yards, graduated but the Titans return their second and third leading rushers Chris Kujawa and Alan Christian. Kujawa led the Titans in scoring last season with 56 points, while Christian also caught 24 passes for 347 yards, returned 20 kickoffs 379 yards and returned 14 punts for 86 yards.

Oshkosh's strength on offense could be the line were 1989 starters John Dobyms (center), Bill Rotta (left tackle) and Brian Vander Velde (left guard) return. The defensive line is anchored by tackle Jeff Row, who recorded 71 tackles last season, including 10 quarterback sacks. All-conference linebacker John Moe is gone, so Dan Beimborn, Chris Campshure, Torris Epps, Pat McCarty and Mike Pfeiffer will be battling for starting assignments.

Joe Wagner and Todd Meyer return to lead the secondary. Wagner was the second-leading tackler on the team last season with 94 stops. The kicking game will feature new ingredients as both placekicker John Stack and all-conference punter Brian Rill graduated. "The kicking game is a big concern for us," Cardo said. "Almost one out of every four plays in a game is a kick so we need to find capable replacements.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

The Pioneers hope to improve on their fourth-place finish in the WSUC last season. Included in their 5-2-1 conference record and 6-2-1 overall mark was a 34-28 victory over champion La Crosse. Platteville also battled to a 28-28 tie with conference runnerup Stevens Point. But, the Pioneers stumbled against Eau Claire and River Falls, which spoiled an otherwise successful season.

Coach George Chryst's offense rang up some impressive numbers while finishing fourth in total offense in the conference. The Pioneers were second only to River Falls in rushing, and running backs Dave Shumway and Devin Cobb return to provide explosiveness in that phase of the attack.

Shumway made the first all-conference team and Cobb, who averaged 6.8 yards a carry, earned a spot on the second unit. Each scored 11 touchdowns in the conference last season. Shumway needs only one more touchdown to set the school career record with 32.

Missing from a productive offense is quarterback Brad Taylor and that causes considerable concern among the coaching staff. Taylor was the catalyst of last fall's resurgence. He provided the Pioneers with 183 yards a game in total offense. Included in his passing statistics were 10 touchdown throws and only six interceptions. Finding a replacement for Taylor presents a problem. Sophomore Joe Oberneder and junior Eric Wixom are the only returnees at that position.

All-conference center Tim Murphy and Chad Hempel, a starting tackle last season, anchor the offensive line. Replacements must be found for guard Mike Pascavis, a second team all-conference guard, and tight end Mike Wild.

The defense is hurt by the loss of two-time all-WSUC linebacker Dave Runde and three-fourths of the backfield (Dave Lombardo, Nick Feira and Matt Sevenz), but the return of linebacker Rick Verhaalen and free safety Barry Baganz softens the blow. Several backup players with experience are ready to step in and make their mark.

The Pioneers play three road games before returning Sept. 29 for their first home appearance against Whitewater. Also, only four of their 10 games will be played in the friendly confines of Pioneer Stadium and three outings are scheduled at night, the most ever for the Pioneers in one season. All these factors could have a bearing on what happens in 1990.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

Coach John O'Grady starts his second season at the helm of the Falcons searching for a starting quarterback and three defensive backs to plug holes in the secondary. O'Grady did an exceptional job in his debut after replacing highly successful Mike Farley as the Falcons compiled a 7-3 record and finished third in the WSUC at 6-2.

This is a new season, though, which always brings with it gaps on both sides of the football. College coaches must live with this and O'Grady is looking for a quarterback to trigger his "wishbone" offense. Talented Jeff Saueressig, who averaged 104 yards a game rushing last season, second best in the conference, is gone. His spot, of course, is the sensitive position in the wishbone. Sophomore Chad Johnson is the lone returning letterman at quarterback.

Also missing is halfback Joel Marvin, center Jeff Batta, tackle Randy Vinter and placekicker Andy Feil. On the plus side, fullback Chris Krueger, and all-conference running back who was third in WSUC rushing with 101 yards a game, returns to bolster the attack along with guard Jim Schulenburg.

Defensively, O'Grady must find replacements for all-conference linebacker Joe Moore as well as Dave Hopkins, Pete Adler and Roy Gruel in the secondary. The latter also made first team all-conference. Anchoring this year's defensive line will be all-conference end Arlin Frank, a 6-5, 258-pound senior from New Richmond. There is no dearth of defensive backs returning, but O'Grady must find the right combination for the Falcons to hold their own in the pass-conscious WSUC.

Another void O'Grady finds this preseason is in the coaching staff where he will be without veteran Ted Thompson, the venerable assistant who contributed so much to River Falls football during the past nine years. Thompson has taken over head coaching duties at UW-Superior, where he plans to introduce his wishbone philosophy. The Falcons compiled a 74-25-2 record and captured five WSUC championships with Thompson on the staff.

Equally important to practically all phases of football in the eyes of O'Grady is the kicking game and he will be looking intensely for a long snapper and a replacement for Feil. This also was a high priority item in Farley's scheme and O'Grady played college football under the former coach.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

No team in the WSUC will miss one player to the extent Stevens Point figures to suffer initially with the departure of quarterback Kirk Baumgartner. Coach John Miech's offense revolved around the passing wizardry of the young man from Colby, who led the conference in passing and total offense three straight years.

Baumgartner left Stevens Point with a book full of WSUC career records, including most yards passing (10,072) and touchdown passes (85). He climaxed his illustrious college career with a sterling performance in the prestigious Senior Bowl, where he threw for a pair of touchdowns and more than held his own against an impressive collection of NCAA Division I athletes.

Miech now can only reminisce about those impressive statistics Baumgartner rang up the past three years. His immediate concern is finding a replacement at a position where the cupboard is bare. There is no returning letterman at quarterback. A newcomer must emerge quickly if the Pointers, who finished second to La Crosse last fall, are to challenge again in 1990. Tradition is on Stevens Point's side, however, because its quarterbacks have led conference passers in 14 of the last 18 seasons.

Also missing from the offense is center Rick Diny and all-conference tight end Don Moehling. Despite the losses, though, the offense still features such stalwarts as running backs Donn Lowney, Jim Mares, Barry Rose and Jason Sicchio. Rose, second in conference receiving with 54 catches, was voted all-purpose back on the all-conference team. The line is bolstered by the return of all-conference tackle Pete Lucas, a 6-5, 310-pound junior.

Linebackers, headed by all-conference Craig Verhagen; Bob Bostad, second team all-league, and Brian Filtz, are the strength of the defense. Other key defenders are end Kurt Krueger, tackle John Gajewski and backs Jerry Olszewski, Eugene Wojciechowski and Kevin Schedlbauer.

Miech is confident his strong linebacking crew, the anchor of the defensive unit, and Stevens Point's tradition of wide open offense that can score from anywhere on the field, bode well for the Pointers heading into an uncertain season.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

The Blue Devils averaged 26 points a game last season and that suggests their record would be considerably better than the 3-7 with which they finished. However, they also yielded more than 32 points a game, including 40.4 in their final five conference outings. Defense, then, becomes a high priority item as coach Rich Lawrence heads into his fifth season as head coach.

Lawrence will start with two key defenders, end Brian Adler and cornerback Mike Lawrence. Both were honorable mention all-conference in 1989. Adler is a 6-foot, 228-pound senior from Cumberland and Lawrence, the coach's son, a 5-10, 165-pound senior. The most difficult to replace on the defensive unit will be tackle Steve Stolarczyk, linebacker Dave Bartels and back Mike Enz.

The biggest voids on the team, though, are on offense, where Lawrence must find replacements for quarterback Tim Peterson and wide receiver Scott Fredrickson. Peterson passed for 2,358 yards and ran for 353 more last season, finishing second in WSUC total offense to Stevens Point's Kirk Baumgartner. Peterson also threw for 15 touchdowns and averaged 295 yards a game passing in the conference.

Peterson's favorite target and a key reason for his success was Fredrickson, the conference's leading receiver with 63 catches. The latter caught six touchdown passes and averaged 13.9 yards a reception. Veterans Larry Baltutis, Joe Pleshek and Kevin Schillinger are wide receivers who must take up the slack.

Quarterback, of course, is the one position which will dominate the attention of offensive coaches from the outset. Senior Paul Lehmann is the only veteran back from 1989, although Bob Lindburg is returning after a three-year layoff. He started for the Blue Devils in Lawrence's first year at the helm and could be a key factor as the season progresses. Transfer Joe Hofman also could enter the picture.

A corps of potentially strong running backs could alleviate the loss of Stout's aerial offense but they still must prove themselves. Lawrence also has 15 players who started two or more games last season among the 22 seniors and 27 juniors returning. That could help the transition from Peterson and Fredrickson.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

Ted Thompson is the latest coach entrusted with "resurrecting" Superior's dormant football fortunes. The highly-regarded River Falls assistant coach earlier this year replaced Bill Connor, whose two-season stint at the helm produced a disastrous 1-19 record, including 0-16 in the conference.

Connor had replaced veteran Gil Krueger, the successor to venerable Mertz Mortorelli, who gave up coaching the Yellowjackets in 1984. Krueger's four-year effort produced a 7-34-1 record. Victories have never come easy at Superior, which hasn't enjoyed a winning football season since 1971, when the Yellowjackets went 6-4, including 6-2 for third place in the WSUC under colorful Monte Charles, now an assistant at Stevens Point.

During nine years at River Falls under Mike Farley and John O'Grady Thompson did an outstanding job as the Falcons compiled a 74-25-2 record and captured five WSUC titles. Superior athletic director Steve Becker noted that Farley said Thompson was like a second head coach. "The guy knows football. He knows how to build programs. And he knows how to win," Becker said.

Thompson spent 14 years as a high school coach at Ashland, Chilton, Omro, Port Washington and Wisconsin Rapids, compiling a 91-32-2 record and earning "coach of the year" honors from the Wisconsin High School Football Coaches Association while at Ashland in 1975.

Thompson plans to use his ties and those of his defensive coordinator, Larry Hoff, a former coach at Superior High School, to narrow the school's recruiting focus to northern Wisconsin, the Upper Peninsula of Michigan and Minnesota's Iron Range. Recent coaches have gone far and wide in search of talent with little success.

The new coach also plans to install the "wishbone" offense, which became an institution under Farley and O'Grady at River Falls. "I started running the wishbone in 1970 and I've been connected with it ever since," Thompson explained.

Hardly a neophyte in the WSUC, Thompson knows the problems and pitfalls facing him at Superior but he's still looking for challenges. "It's probably my last hurrah," the veteran coach admitted. "I'm 56 years old and I've got a three-year contract. If I can get it going in three years, I'll stay on. If we can't get it going, I'll be gone and retired."

PROSPECTS FOR 1990

The Warhawks are in a rebuilding mode after slumping to sixth place in the conference last fall on the heels of two straight championship seasons. The defense faltered, yielding 45 points to Stevens Point and 42 to River Falls, while posing a 0-3-1 record in the final four games of 1989. Coach Bob Berezowitz must find a cohesive lineup that can wipe out the stigma of last year's 4-5-1 record, including 2-5-1 in the conference.

Berezowitz will miss all-conference defensive tackle Jim Sherman and second team all-league cornerback Dennis Herbst. Defensive leadership must come from linebackers Dave Jahnke, Kyle Dempsey and Doug Blank; free safety Bryan Tarrolly; nose guard Pat Crowley, and cornerbacks Ron Donart and Shawn Eichorst. Potentially the defense is strong but must remain healthy and stay on the field together long enough to jell. Jahnke, an all-conference performer a year ago, was the team's defensive point leader in 1989.

Missing from the offense are wide receiver John Sterner, tackle Mike Wozny and running back Tim LeMonds. The leading offensive returnee is running back Travis Talton, the WSUC's No. 1 rusher the last two seasons. He slipped to 864 yards in eight games last year compared with 1,255 in 1988, but injuries slowed his start. Berezowitz needs him healthy all season for the offense to click.

The Warhawks will be bolstered by the presence of several in-coming freshmen and transfer students, the most interesting being quarterback Dennis Bogacz from Oshkosh. Bogacz, who will be a junior, set numerous passing and total offense records as an Oshkosh freshman two years ago. Last season he averaged 306 yards a game passing in the conference, second only to Stevens Point's Kirk Baumgartner, and finished third in total offense.

Bogacz will compete with lettermen Dan Berezowitz, Joe Parish and Jeff Rondorf for the starting quarterback assignment. Warhawk coaches are looking for a leader at that position who can lift the entire offense. Bogacz could be that spark, especially if he and Talton complement each other as expected.

Oshkosh won its second straight NCAA Division III cross country championship with 55 points at Rock Island, Ill., in November. It marked only the fourth time in the meet's 17-year history that a team repeated. WSUC rival La Crosse finished fifth with 195 points.

Titan Runners Win WSUC Crown

Oshkosh ran to its first WSUC cross country championship in 22 years in 1989, scoring 22 points during the 29th annual meet at the Stevens Point Country Club. Titans Scott Steuernagel and Ron Welhoefer finished 1-2 but were both clocked in 25:14 over the 8,000-meter course. Oshkosh's John Zupanc was voted coach of the year in the conference.

PREVIEW OF THE 1990-91 BASKETBALL SEASONWISCONSIN STATE UNIVERSITY CONFERENCE

Eau Claire's National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics runnerup team looks like a tough act to follow, but the returning Blugolds and their ever faithful partisans don't look at the situation that way. A strong nucleus from coach Ken Anderson's national power returns, headed by 6-7 Duane Bushman and 6-7 Mike Johnson, a potent tandem that makes the Blugolds doubly tough around the basket.

Despite Eau Claire's glittering tournament drive last March, the Blugolds were not champions of the WSUC. That honor was won by Platteville, whom the Blugolds nipped, 64-61, for the right to continue play at Kansas City. The Pioneers will defend their 1989-90 title with most of the last season's cast intact, including all-conference standouts Shawn Frison and Robby Jeter.

While Eau Claire and Platteville figure to battle in the thick of the race again this season, Stevens Point could challenge these two even more energetically than the Pointers did a year ago when they finished third, five games off the pace. Coach Bob Parker loses one starter, Scott Anderson, but returns a strong contingent of lettermen headed by Jon Julius, Andy Boario and Chas Pronschinske.

Among the three teams who tied for fourth place last season--Oshkosh, River Falls and Whitewater--the Falcons seem in the best position to make a move up because of the presence of Dean Cook and Rick Montreal. A year of maturity on these two should provide coach Rick Bowen with the kind of stability necessary to survive the rigors of the 16-game WSUC season.

Oshkosh under new coach Ted Van Dellen starts with some huge question marks because of playing without Ric Kunnert and Mark Ziebell for the first time in three years. Coach Dave Vander Meulen of Whitewater will be hard-pressed to replace all-conference point guard Ricky Spicer, the league's most valuable player and leading scorer last season.

The bottom three in the 1989-90 standings--Stout, La Crosse and Superior--need instant help from newcomers in order to crack the first division. Second-year coach John Muraski at Stout is optimistic about his rebuilding progress. Muraski appears to have pulled off a major coup in landing Randolph scoring sensation Kevin Flegner during the recruiting season.

You can count on one hand the freshmen who made an impact on WSUC basketball over the years but Flegner just might be one of those rare exceptions. The 6-1 guard averaged 39.6 points a game as a high school senior and several times reached the magic 50-point mark. Muraski is looking for Flegner to make his presence felt after the first of the year.

Coach Randy Handel is starting almost from scratch at La Crosse without last season's senior standouts Jim Rosemeyer and John Fullerton. Handel is hoping for help from newcomers but it's too early to evaluate his 1990 recruiting class.

The cliché about having "nowhere to go but up" is certainly apropos of Superior's situation. The Yellowjackets lost all 16 conference games last season and won only four of 26 starts overall. Coach Glenn Carlson faces another monumental task with the league's top contenders seeming to grow stronger each year. He has an outstanding guard in Will Starks but needs help around the basket against those big tough WSUC front lines.

Only four of the conference's top 10 scorers are returning, headed by River Falls' Cook, who finished third with a 20.7 average. The others are Stout's Willie Tucker fourth (19.3), Montreal of the Falcons sixth (18.7) and Superior's Starks 10th (16.6).

So, there's room at the top for many new faces during the coming season. Still, those individual statistics aren't indicative of who's leading the league come March. Neither Platteville nor Eau Claire had a player among the top 10 in scoring. They depended on balance and defense, which generally is the key to the first division in the WSUC.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Veteran coach Ken Anderson starts this season with four of the five starters and three of the top four reserves who played a major role in the Blugolds' 30-4 finish in 1989-90. Eau Claire finished second to Platteville in the WSUC but then swept through the tournaments until being knocked off in the NAIA championship game at Kansas City by Birmingham Southern, 88-80.

Among the returning players are 6-7 Duane Bushman, a member of the NAIA all-tournament team who scored 30 points in the title game, and 6-7 Mike Johnson, NAIA all-American honorable mention and the District 14 rebound leader. Also back is Mike Prasher, a 6-4 guard-forward who was the team's leading scorer and already ranks No. 10 on the school's all-time scoring list.

Spearheading the defense, which ranked third in the final NAIA statistics with a 59.85 average, is 6-6 Todd Oehrlein. Aiding the offense will be the team's top three-point shooter last season, Matt Benedict, who averaged nearly three made per game.

Eau Claire's major loss, of course, was the graduation of point guard Tim Blair, a third-team all-American last season and the guy who make the Blugolds click. Two red-shirt transfers, Andy Doolen from Ellsworth Community College and Dave Mlachnik from Rice, will vie for Blair's vacant position.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Coach Randy Handel has some huge gaps to fill at the start of his second season at the helm of the Eagles. Missing are all-conference forward Jim Rosemeyer, who averaged 18.7 points a game and 7.1 rebounds last season, and starting center John Fullerton, who contributed 15.7 points and 6.8 caroms to the Eagles' cause.

Still, those impressive figures did not prevent La Crosse from slipping to eighth place (4-12) in the conference and finishing 10-16 overall during the 1989-90 campaign. Handel has his work cut out in the tough WSUC. On the credit side, though, the energetic young mentor hardly had a chance to get his feet on the ground after assuming head coaching duties a year ago. Now he's a year older and much wiser in the ways of guiding a WSUC team as head man.

Mitch Hauser, one of only three Eagles to play in all 16 conference games last season, figures to start in the backcourt. He averaged only 6.6 points a game last season but that was good enough for third best on the team, an indication of how heavily the Eagles depended on Rosemeyer and Fullerton. Hauser made 31 of his 78 three-point attempts, but he will have to jack up his point production considerably.

La Crosse faces a massive rebuilding project to become competitive in the high-powered world of WSUC basketball. The defense performed respectfully enough last season, yielding 65.8 points a game, second best in the conference. But, offensively they scored only 65.4 points, second lowest output in the WSUC, and averaged only 26.7 rebounds a game, which ranked last in that category.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Ted Vandellen, the chief assistant coach of the Titan since 1984, takes over head duties, succeeding Jim McGrath, who resigned in March to become a middle school principal in Viroqua. Van Dellen, a three-year Titan letterman in the 1970s, brings a solid background and exceptional enthusiasm into the task of rejuvenating basketball at his alma mater.

It won't be easy, however. Ric Kunnert and Mark Ziebell, a solid one-two punch for three straight years, completed their eligibility and that means Van Dellen must fill the void left by these two, who could be counted on for 35 to 40 points between them each game. People like 6-4 Roy Burt and 6-3 Rick Bunge must step into the breach. Van Dellen is hoping for help from transter Paul Roberts (UW-Parkside) and freshmen Charles Cunningham (Racine (Case), Mickey Steger (Appleton East), Todd Hencsik (Wisconsin Luthern) and Troy Gill (Milwaukee Marshall).

The backcourt is fairly solid with veterans Kurt Woelffer and Steve Derouin returning. Derouin averaged 9.8 points in the conference last season and is expected to assert himself more with Kunnert and Ziebell out of the picture. Woelffer averaged 7.8 points a game and made 18 of his 37 shots from three-point range.

The Titans shared fourth place (8-8) last season and compiled a 15-12 overall record, good enough to qualify for the NAIA District 14 playoffs, where they lost to Viterbo, 61-47, in the opening round. It was a disappointing setback for the Titans, who blew hot and cold all season. Van Dellen hopes to develop consistency during the coming campaign. Newcomers who might help in this quest are 6-3 Cunningham, 6-2 Gill and 6-5 Hencsik.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

The Pioneers are in a good position to repeat as WSUC champion and win their third conference championship in four years. Coach Bo Ryan has seven of his top players back from last season's title team, including all-league performers Shawn Frison and Robby Jeter. Frison averaged 16.4 points a game in 1989-90 and Jeter 11.5.

Don't look for either of them among the conference scoring leaders, though, because Ryan emphasizes the team aspect of the game and depends on a platoon system, running eight or nine players in and out of the game to ensure fresh troops at all times. The pressure defense employed by the Pioneers puts a premium on conditioning and stamina. Ryan does not look for one or two players to carry the load.

This is not to say the Pioneers won't miss the floor leadership of departed Andy Banasik and Bill Freidig, who made major contributions to last season's championship with their play in the backcourt. Banasik in particular made better than 50 percent of his field goal attempts and shot at an .831 clip from the free throw line.

Heading the list of returnees are forward Delano Brazil, who averaged 9.7 points a game, center Brian Gilmore and guard Carlton Jeter. They, too, were instrumental in Platteville compiling a 26-3 overall record. The 26 victories are the most in history for the Pioneers and the three defeats were the fewest since a 21-3 mark in 1957-58.

Rebounding again will be a problem for the Pioneers but Ryan hopes for help from 6-11 Mark McCumber, a transfer from Western Illinois.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Coach Rick Bowen sees improvement in his Falcons this season but is realistic enough to know that defending champion Platteville and NAIA runnerup Eau Claire will be difficult to dislodge from a top the WSUC standings. The Falcons shared fourth place last season with an 8-8 record and were 15-13 overall, losing to Eau Claire in the District 14 playoffs.

Heading Bowen's list of returnees are Dean Cook, an all-conference forward, and guard Rick Montreal, honorable mention in the balloting last season. Cook averaged 20.7 points a game, third best in the conference, while Montreal chipped in with 18.6, ranking sixth in the league. This pair represents a good starting point in Bowen's quest to restore River Falls to a position of eminence in the WSUC.

Missing is 6-7 John Kinney, whose 7.2 rebounds a game will be tough to replace unless some leaping newcomers are found. Also gone are Eric Miller, Andy Reise, Paul Peters and Mike Hall. Miller was third best in conference assists last season, dishing off 4.6 a game, which was of particular help to Cook.

Bowen is banking on some new faces to bolster his team this season, including redshirts John Quinn (6-7) of Ellsworth, Rod Polk (6-4) of Montello and Craig Mell (6-7) of Rush City, MN. The coach figures a lack of strong inside play to be a major problem and the addition of the three redshirts could go a long way in alleviating this deficiency in his program.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

The Pointers made giant strides last season under coach Bob Parker, whose youthful charges began to demonstrate maturity and poise. Following a sixth-place finish in the WSUC (6-10) the year before, the Pointers improved their record to 10-6, good for third place last season. They also advanced to the NAIA District 14 playoffs, losing in the semifinals to Eau Claire, the eventual national runnerup.

Only Scott Anderson is gone from that unit. Still, he leaves an enormous void in Point's scheme. A first-team all-conference choice, he averaged 17.8 points a game and was the WSUC's leading free throw shooter, sinking 56 of 62 foul shots for .903 marksmanship.

A stable of talented returnees includes 6-5 forward Jon Julius and 6-0 guard Andy Boario. Parker hopes Julius remains healthy all season after missing seven conference games as a sophomore. Boario averaged 12.5 points a game as a freshman, hitting 34 of 90 shots from three-point territory. Also back is 6-2 guard Chas Pronschinske, a dependable backcourt player who averaged 9.6 points, 4.1 rebounds and 4.3 assists a game last season.

Parker understands the challenge of moving up against Platteville and Eau Claire but he figures his club's experience and intelligence should help in that quest. Also, 6-11 Jack Lothian should start to assert himself in his sophomore year and additional help is expected from transfers Dale Wiebke from Winona State and Scott Frye from Denver University as well as redshirt freshman R.A. Caves.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Last season was a learning period for first-year coach John Muraski and his mostly inexperienced basketball team. The Blue Devils finished seventh in the conference (5-11) and were 11-15 overall. Now that he's traveled the circuit once he came away with a better understanding of what to expect. His challenge this year is for the Blue Devils to show improvement.

"My administration has helped out greatly and put Stout hopefully in the right direction," Muraski said, while assessing the coming season. "We need to have back-to-back good recruiting years to be able to compete with the heavyweights. Last year we survived as best we could. This year we rebuild Stout basketball."

Boyd Wiff is the only letterman who will not be back this season unless unforeseen circumstances wipe out someone else. Among returnees are guards Willie Tucker, the fourth leading scorer in the conference last season with a 19.3 average, and Troy Hamilton, who contributed 13.7 points a game. Also back is 6-4 Chris Korba, who averaged almost 10 points a game as a freshman.

The backcourt is strong with Tucker and Hamilton but the Blue Devils need competent inside people. "We need help in every position," Muraski emphasized. "We will play a lot more people to allow us to keep pressing and fastbreaking."

Depth will be a problem and the second-year coach has concentrated on recruiting. Whether or not the depth improves depends on his success.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Coach Glenn Carlson faces another difficult task of preparing his Yellowjackets for a typical campaign in the WSUC, where again so many teams are returning seasoned performers, particularly in the upper division of the conference. His club dropped into the cellar last season, losing 16 straight games and finishing 4-22 overall.

Keith Yadon, who averaged 9.2 points a game, is the only letterman lost from the 1989-90 squad. Nine lettermen return, including 6-2 guard Will Starks, who finished 10th in conference scoring last season with a 16.6 average. Also back are 6-0 swingman Bronson McNeal, who averaged 12.9 points, 6-7 center Kurt Christiansen, who contributed 9.4, and 6-0 guard Clarence Williams with a 7.9 average.

While assessing his club, Carlson conceded Superior must improve scoring, rebounding and defense if the Yellowjackets hope to escape the cellar. The quickness is there but they must find ways to get the basketball and generate some offense. Last season the Yellowjackets averaged only 65.4 points a game, while yielding an average of 83.9. By contrast, Platteville scored an average of 83.6 points and defensive leader Eau Claire gave up only 62.2 in 16 conference games.

The gap between the haves and havenots widened in the conference last year and coaches fret that discrepancy might become even greater during the coming season. Carlson noted the balance among the top four squads and reasoned, "Considering all the squads were young, mostly with juniors and sophomores (last season), this will be a very tough year."

Every coach worries about recruiting in a non-scholarship conference and Carlson is no exception. He needs an influx of new blood to change Superior's losing image and hopes newcomers Bob Bissell, Pat Hoskins, Brian Hedrick and Tracy Cobb will help.

PROSPECTS FOR 1990-91

Except for the exploits of senior point guard Ricky Spicer, Whitewater's 1989-90 basketball season was a disappointment. The Warhawks slumped to a fourth-place tie (8-8) after sharing the WSUC title and winning the NCAA Division III championship the year before.

Spicer led the WSUC in scoring with a 24.3 average, earned the conference's most valuable player award and became the only basketball player in Whitewater history to earn first team all-American honors on every NCAA Division III team selected. But, Elbert Gordon, who won the conference MVP award in 1989, played only eight games because of disciplinary reasons and the Warhawks never seemed to get untracked.

Top priority this year is replacing Spicer. Dodd Davey is the only veteran guard returning. He averaged 8.3 points, 3.8 rebounds and 3.4 assists a game last season. Curt Pryce, Steve Fisher and Rionocco Phillips will be competing for a spot in the backcourt along with Tyrone Lewis, a transfer from Iowa Western Community College.

Vying for starting assignments in the front line are 6-4 Craig Coulthart, 6-7 James Hodges, 6-5 Scott Houtakker, 6-11 Jeff Jones, 6-8 Rick Jones and 6-5 Paul Kneubuehl. Hodges was the most productive of that group last season, averaging 10.9 points and 4.8 rebounds a game in the conference. Rick Jones averaged 6.6 points and 4.1 rebounds. Two or more from this group must come to the fore quickly for the Warhawks to regain consistency comparable to their 1988-89 level.

Eau Claire All-Sports Champion

Eau Claire won its first WSUC all-sports championship since 1982 by compiling 61 points during the 1989-90 school year compared with 58 for runnerup Whitewater, the defending champion. Eau Claire clinched the title with a swimming championship, a share of the tennis title, seconds in cross country and basketball, a third in track, fourth in golf, fifth in football and wrestling and a share of fifth in baseball.

Point Skaters Make History

Stevens Point became the first NCAA Division III hockey team to win two national championships March 24 when the WSUC winners defeated Plattsburgh State (N.Y.), 1-0, in a 15-minute mini-game for their second straight title. Jeff Marshall scored with 1 minute, 35 seconds remaining in the mini-game to give the Pointers the victory. Plattsburgh State had won the regulation game, 6-3, earlier to tie the series after Stevens Point's resounding 10-1 triumph the night before.

Anderson Paces Pointers

Scott Anderson averaged 23 points in two games while sparking Stevens Point to victories over Abilene Christian, 92-83, and Fort Hays State, 78-67, and the Kearney (Neb.) State Invitational basketball tournament championship. He scored 25 points and dished off four assists in the championship game and was named the tournament's most valuable player.
