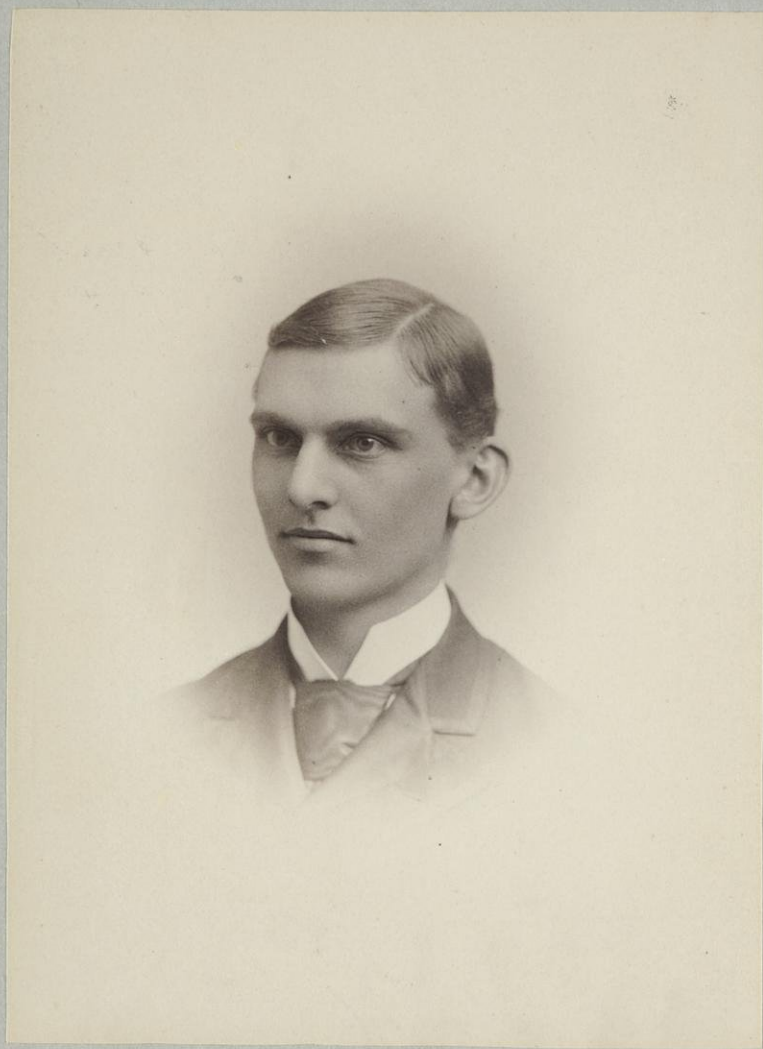
Walter F. Seymour

Politics, - Democrat.

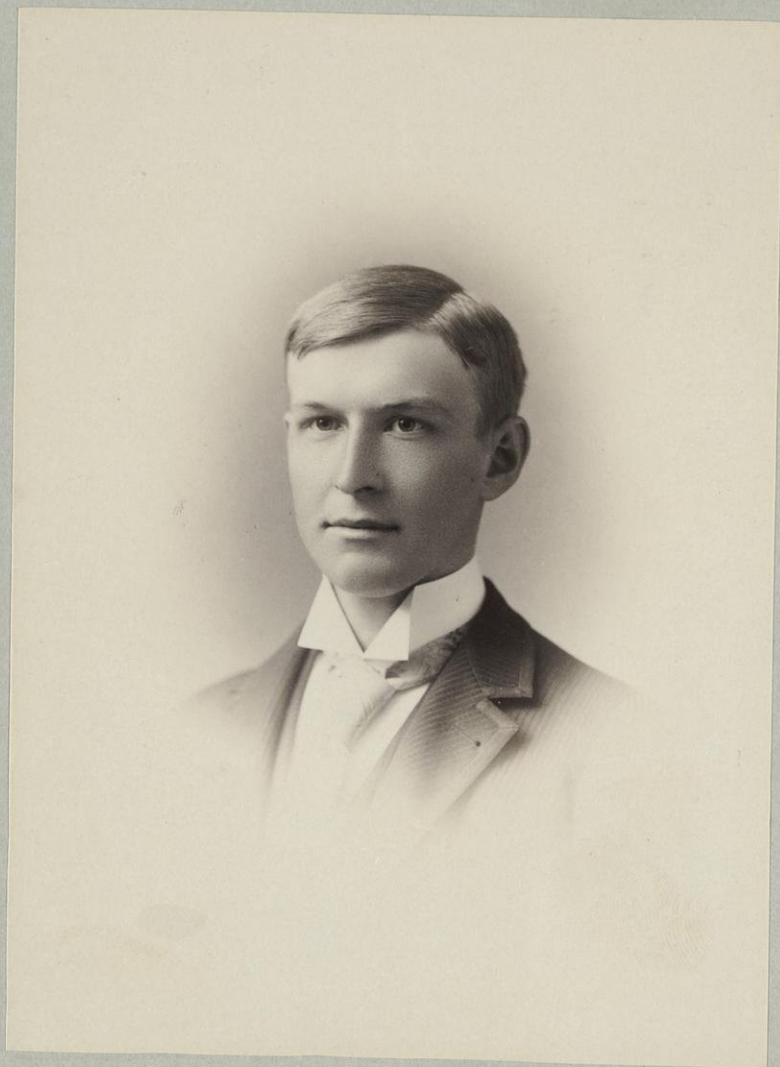


W. F. Robinson

in 1890.



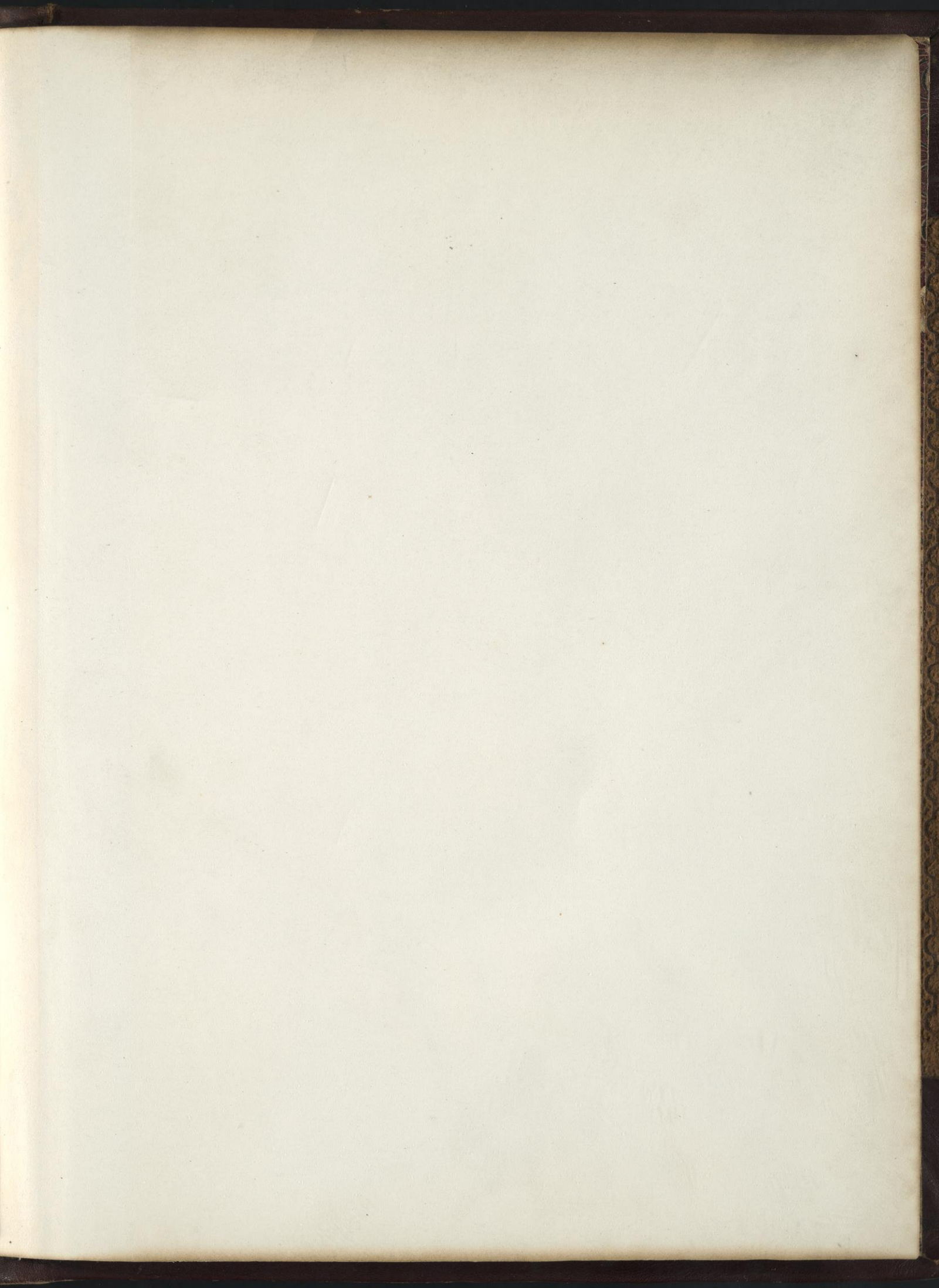

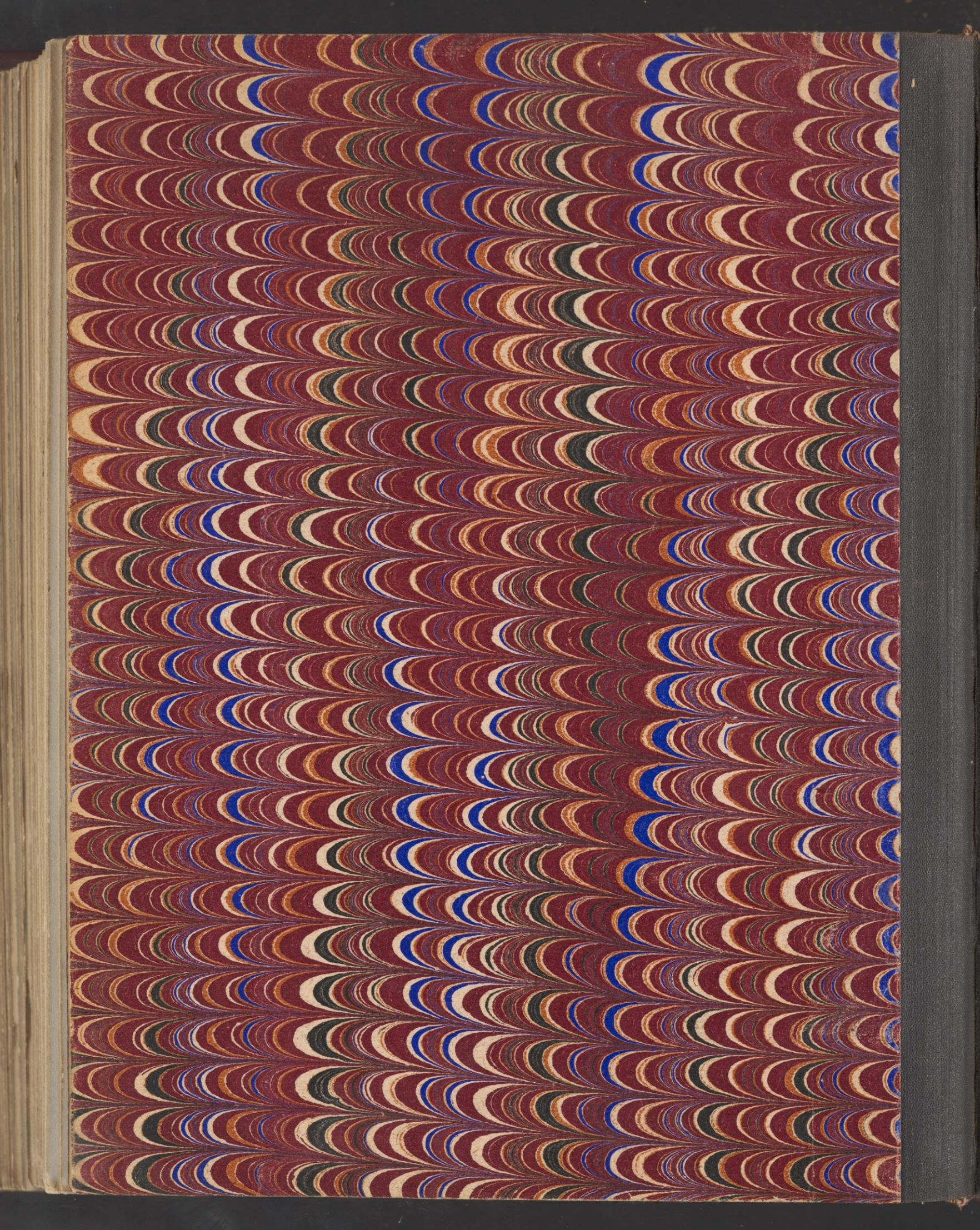

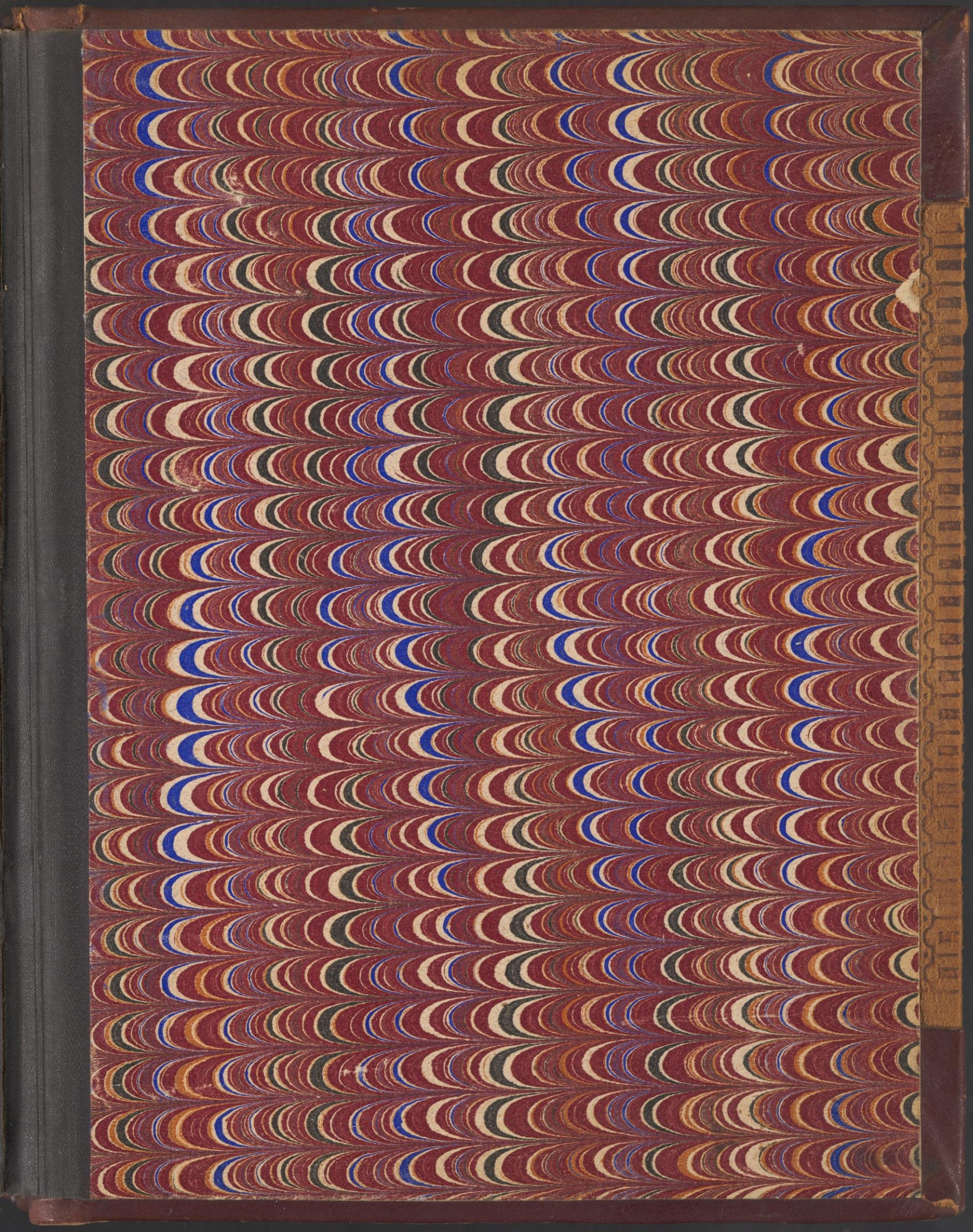
