

A Proclamation



Record production of milk and manufactured dairy products was again achieved in Wisconsin during the past year in answer to the call for more food to supply the United Nations and our fighting forces on the far flung battle fronts throughout the world.

Wisconsin farmers were able to meet this challenge of increased production in spite of the shortage of labor and machinery. They produced 14 1-3 billion pounds of milk the past year — a large amount of which was distributed in other forms to our soldiers, sailors, and marines and to our allies.



SECRETARY'S REPORT

JANUARY 1, 1943, TO JANUARY 1, 1944

The policy of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association to aid and assist in an educational way among dairy farmers of Wisconsin, and in Junior activities, has been continued during the past year as always before. The activities of the Association have been directed toward the interest of both better dairying to attain maximum production for the War Effort, and greater dairy income for the state of Wisconsin. The program of work was outlined with the thought of extending cooperation to other existing agencies, including the College of Agriculture, Department of Agriculture, Vocational Agricultural Departments, County Agricultural Agents, Breed Associations, and the Wisconsin State Fair. To promote and encourage Bull Associations, Production Record Keeping, Production Shows and Breeding Schools, and to work in every way possible with the Junior Dairymen. The Association has endeavored to cooperate fully with the above named groups. A brief summary of activities is included in this report.

1943 WINTER MEETING

The 71st Annual Meeting of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association was held at the Park Hotel, Madison, February 12, 1943. Because of the War and transportation problems, the meeting this year was streamlined into a one-day program with every emphasis possible being placed on greater production from Wisconsin dairy herds to meet the nation's war-time demands. Therefore, in outlining the program, special emphases were placed on Dairy Herd Improvement, Marketing Problems, and Production.

It was the close coordination of all groups participating that made the meeting possible; and to them, we wish to express our sincerest thanks and appreciation for the assistance and cooperation given.

GENERAL PROGRAM

At the General Assembly in the morning, the Association's Activities for 1942 were discussed by Mr. R. W. Stumbo, Secretary of the Association. "Our Job for 1943" was outlined by our President, Stanley Jamison, Appleton. In the absence of Mr. Herman Ihdes, who was seriously ill at the time, Mr. Russell Frost brought greetings from the State Department of Agriculture to all Wisconsin dairymen in attendance. Mr. Ralph Ammon of Prairie Farmer stressed the importance of Dairy Advertising and State Fairs in war time. Dr. Heizer, Wisconsin College of Agriculture, the last speaker on the morning program talked on the subject, "Future Demands on the Nation's Dairy Herd". In the afternoon Mr. Burt Oderkirk, Manager, Babson Farms, Inc., Dekalb, Ill., spoke on "Owner-Tenant Cooperative War Effort." The Business Meeting of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association followed. A joint informal dinner, with special entertainment and fun, was held in the evening.

NOON LUNCHEONS

The Wisconsin Jersey and Brown Swiss Associations held their Annual Meetings immediately following their individual noon luncheons.

The Wisconsin Holstein Breeders' Association canceled its Annual Meeting for the year, but had its Board of Directors meet with other state leaders for a noon luncheon and an enlarged Board meeting immediately following.

JUNIOR AWARDS

At the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association's Junior Luncheon, Mr. Milo Swanton of the Wisconsin Council of Agriculture was the principal speaker.

DAIRY QUEENS HONORED GUESTS

Mrs. Dorothy Cerny, Madison; Miss Helen McDonald, Fond du Lac; and Miss Joyce Radel, Spring Green, 1940, 1941, and 1942 Wisconsin State Dairy Queens respectively, were guests of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association at the Noon Luncheon and presented with enlarged, colored photographs of themselves as they appeared on the float in the Dairy Day Parade at the 1942 Wisconsin State Fair.

D. H. I. A. RECOGNITION

In accordance with a program launched three years ago, honors were paid dairymen who had tested their herds over a period of 25 years or longer. In checking with the Department of Dairy Husbandry, Wisconsin College of Agriculture, it was found that Mr. P. C.

Burchard, Fort Atkinson, and Lutheran Home Farm, Stoughton, were eligible for the recognition this year.

This program of recognizing consistent and long-time testing of dairy herds will be continued as an annual event by the Association.

EDUCATIONAL EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

In carrying out the Program of Work for the past year, cooperative Educational Extension Activities have been extended into the field in cooperation with representatives of the University of Wisconsin and the Vocational Agriculture Department of the State Board of Vocational and Adult Education. County and District meetings have been jointly held in connection with these representatives, and in connection with the various Breed Associations, in sponsoring and carrying on their Breed Association activities.

During the year, particular emphasis has been placed on dairy herd management, and most rural educational meetings have been organized around this central thought.

Cooperation between various state agencies has been sought in every possible means. Bull Associations have continued to be a major project of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association and much time was spent in organizing and supervising cooperative associations so that more good bulls would be alive when proven, and greater use would be made of the great sires when found.

County Better Sire Campaigns which were carried on for the past two years were continued in an organized way. While during the past two years it was the intention and purpose of these meetings to lead to building of organization and cooperation in the use of selected sires, and cooperative exchange of sires, this year's meetings were, more or less, directed toward good dairy herd management practices, and other discussions centering around herd management practices which had a direct or indirect influence on the building of better herds through good breeding and management.

STATE FAIR EXHIBIT

"Wisconsin Dairymen Gear for Victory Production" was the title of this year's Production Exhibit at the Wisconsin State Fair, provided for through the cooperation of the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association, Wisconsin State Fair, and the University of Wisconsin.

The exhibit consisted of two groups of cows—each group being composed of one representative of each of the five major dairy breeds. The first group of cows illustrated the value of good breeding and management practices in attaining greater production, while the second group of mediocre cows represented the average production of Wisconsin dairy cattle. An eight point program for increasing production was set forth at one end of the exhibit, while a chart showing how Wisconsin dairymen have met the challenge for greater production of dairy products caught the eye of each passerby at the opposite end.

The principal purpose in outlining and arranging the exhibit this year was to offer constructive and worthwhile recommendations to Wisconsin dairy farmers in their all-out attempt to produce a maximum of high quality dairy products for the War Effort.

DAIRY HONOR ROLL

Again this year, the Department of Dairy Husbandry and the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association will award certificates and seals to 243 Wisconsin D. H. I. A. members having made a herd average of 350 lbs. butterfat production or above for each of the past three or more consecutive years. However, the displaying of names and addresses of the Dairy Honor Roll members in connection with the Production Exhibit at the State Fair was discontinued.

COUNTY KEY-DAIRYMAN PROGRAM

A new program, sponsored by the Wisconsin Dairymen's association in cooperation with the Wisconsin Agriculturist and Farmer, College of Agriculture, and State Department of Agriculture was launched in the spring of 1943, known as the County Key-Dairyman Program.

The purpose of this program is to select annually for honorary recognition a leader from each Wisconsin county who has done a real job in the community in building dairy and agricultural interests. Nominations were made by ballot appearing in the Wisconsin Agriculturist and Farmer.

Nearly 300 nominations were received and County Key-Dairymen were selected for 46 counties. It is our hope that another year a Key-Dairyman may be selected from every county in Wisconsin.

Presentation of awards will be made at the 1944 annual Meeting to be held at the Park Hotel, Madison, Feb. 7, 1944 and at County Victory Institutes.

JUNIOR D. H. I. A. SUPPLIES

The Wisconsin Dairymen's Association has continued to cooperate and encourage Jr. D. H. I. A. activities in High School Vocational Agricultural Departments during the past year.

Herd book covers, cow record sheets, and monthly summaries which were furnished by the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association at approximate cost has been the principal way in which our cooperation supported this activity. The number of copies of this material furnished through this office, as stated in the Activity Report, indicates the importance of this phase of work in the Wisconsin Dairymen's Association program. 
