Repents Rennebohm and Steiger were absent due to absence from the state and Regent Watson was absent because of his appearance before the Joint Finance Committee of the Legislature.

President Werner announced that because there was not a quorum for this meeting, a meeting of the Executive Committee of the Regents would be held following the adjournment of this meeting and he appointed Regent Kleczka to serve as a member of the Executive Committee in place of Regent Rennebohm for that meeting.
