November 14, they were really upperclassmen. Their class rings arrived and they were the envy of everyone. On February 1, the Junior Class Play, "Return To Bedlam", was presented. Another student, Carole Boe, joined the class in March to make a total of seventeen members.



On February 6, the Barneveld High School Gymnasium was crowded with spectators who witnessed victory of our "A" and "B" teams over Hollandale.




Barneveld Union Free High School's second annual school fair was held on Friday September 26, 1952. The weather was ideal and a large crowd attended.

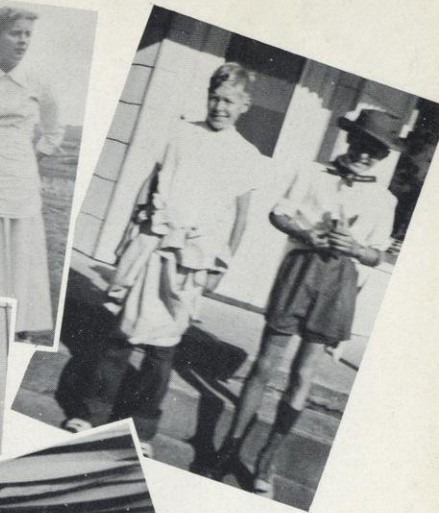
The first event of the day was judging the exhibits. This event took most of the morning because of the numerous entries.
