Death took double toll at the Frank Hegeman home, this village, on Monday, February 23, claiming both Mr. and Mrs. Hegeman, aged 69 and 60, respectively.

Mr. Hegeman's death occurred at eight o'clock that morning. His health had been poor for the last 12 years, the result of being overcome by coal gas.

Mrs. Hegeman, however, had been ill only two weeks and suffered a stroke early Monday morning which resulted in her death shortly after noon that day.

Frank Hegeman was the son of Mr. and Mrs. Theodore Hegeman and was born Oct. 25, 1861 in the Township of Rochester. He was educated at St. Mary's school, Burlington. He was married on February 11, 1890, to Miss Katherine DeGrave at St. Thomas church, Waterford. They lived on a farm at the English Settlement up to seven years ago, when they moved to Waterford which has since been their home.

Mrs. Hegeman was the daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. James DeGraves and was born in the Town of Rochester, January 8, 1870. She received her early education at St. Thomas School, Waterford.
