Explanations.
The township lines show how far the public surveys have progressed in the several land States & Territories.
Townships near the ends of the surveys marked with a - and all townships around which no exterior lines are drawn, whether marked with the cross or not, are not surveyed.
Townships not surveyed are designated by an S.
The dotted lines show proposed surveys.
This map being a study designed for the Government use in connection with the public surveys is for a scale of convenience and on account of its dimensions scale drawn upon a singular projection.
Although the Township lines of the government surveys are extended over nearly the whole of the States of Missouri, Arkansas, Louisiana, and Florida, large portions of those States are covered with irregular private claims. The same is also true in some sections of Indiana and some of the other States.
