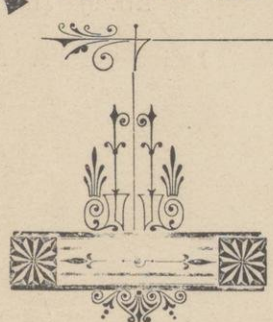

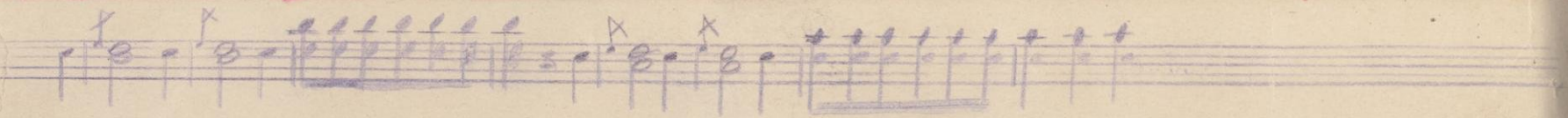

MME. FRANCESCA JANAUSCHEI NOTED ACTRESS, WHO
IS CRITICALLY ILL AT SARATOGA.



NEW YORK, Aug. 16.—Mme. Francesca Janauschek, who is critically ill at a hotel in Saratoga, where she has been living since her stroke of paralysis three years ago, is now closing the seventy-third year of her life and the thirty-sixth of her career on the American tragic stage. The once great actress was born in Prague and had already achieved great success in Bohemia and Germany when at the age of 37 she came to her adopted country and began the study of English. Her triumphs in English have been notably in Deborah, Bianca, Mary Stuart, Queen Elizabeth, Lady Macbeth and Meg Merrilies. In 1899 Mme. Janauschek made a tour of the principal American cities.
