THE REASON

When the Government asked us to save paper in every possible way, **The Log** naturally had a searching of heart to determine whether its existence was necessary or not. The rather pointed suggestion of Uncle Sam, that, if we did not solemnly pledge ourselves to save paper as a war measure, the wholesale houses would get orders to give us no paper for any use whatsoever, was decisive. We signed the pledge, and **The Log** stopped. The present number includes the four missing issues of 1918 and completes the quarters July-Sept., and Oct.-Dec.

COUNTY LIBRARIES

Beginning with this new year, an effort will be made to extend the service of the city library to every home in Milwaukee County. No one doubts or questions the desire of the people of the county to use the library. The problem is in these busy days how to get the books out to the people who wish to use them.

The county branches, twenty-two in number, have done good work. But from the way they are at present constituted, and owing to the different conditions of life in town and country, perfect service could

not be expected. The teachers of the county, who have administered these branch libraries without pay, have done a noble work. All honor to them for giving this library extension so good a start. There are limits to which one dare not drive willing workers. We shall have a different plan to propose shortly and we hope it will meet with approval in every quarter. School branches are the right sort in the country, and we ask the continued co-operation of the teachers. See the next number of **The Log**.

THE HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATE

At the close of the present school semester, that is, about February 15th, the next training class for the Public Library Service will begin. These classes are offered by the library board to all high school graduates whose personality fits them for library work. There is no charge for either tuition or material. Everything is free. By the new ruling of the library board the pay of beginners in the library service has been increased, and, during the course, the students of the training class are permitted by the civil service board to do apprentice work in the library for which they are paid 20 cents per hour. The class is held in the morning only, five days per week, and the work of the course will be finished and the class ready for the civil service examination by June 1st. After the examination, those who pass are quickly absorbed into the library staff. Those who are accepted for the training class are practically assured of a position in a very short time. The pay of beginners in library work is not quite as much as the pay of a teacher in her first year of teaching. But the library has some advantages. In the library, high school graduates can begin work almost immediately after graduation, without years of further costly preparation. By the time the high school graduate is ready for teaching, the young woman who entered library work is established in her place and is earning a better salary than the new teacher receives. But money is not everything. Think of this. Compared to the school the public library is the Fountain of Perpetual Youth. (Vide Ponce de Leon in the old school history.) In the library no one gets tired or cross. Everybody sings and is happy. Old age is deferred. Compare this happy life with teaching, where "old wrinkles" come with the cares and anxieties of making endless reports, and winding and unwinding red tape world without end! No wonder teachers want more pay, they ought to have it when one realizes what they suffer. Investigate the training class at the Public Library. You'll like it!
