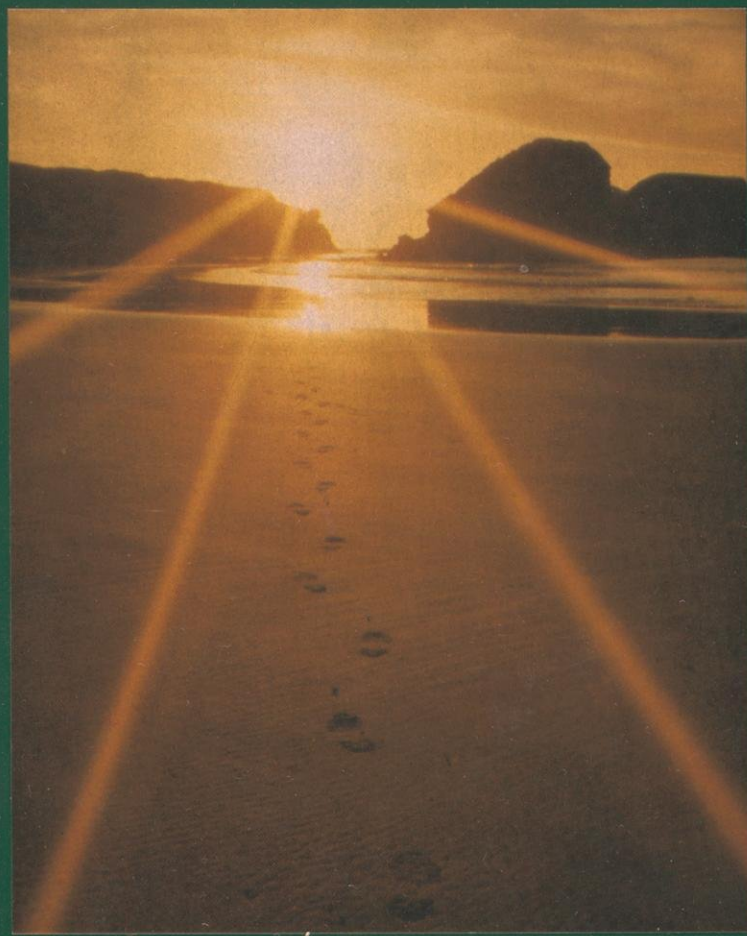



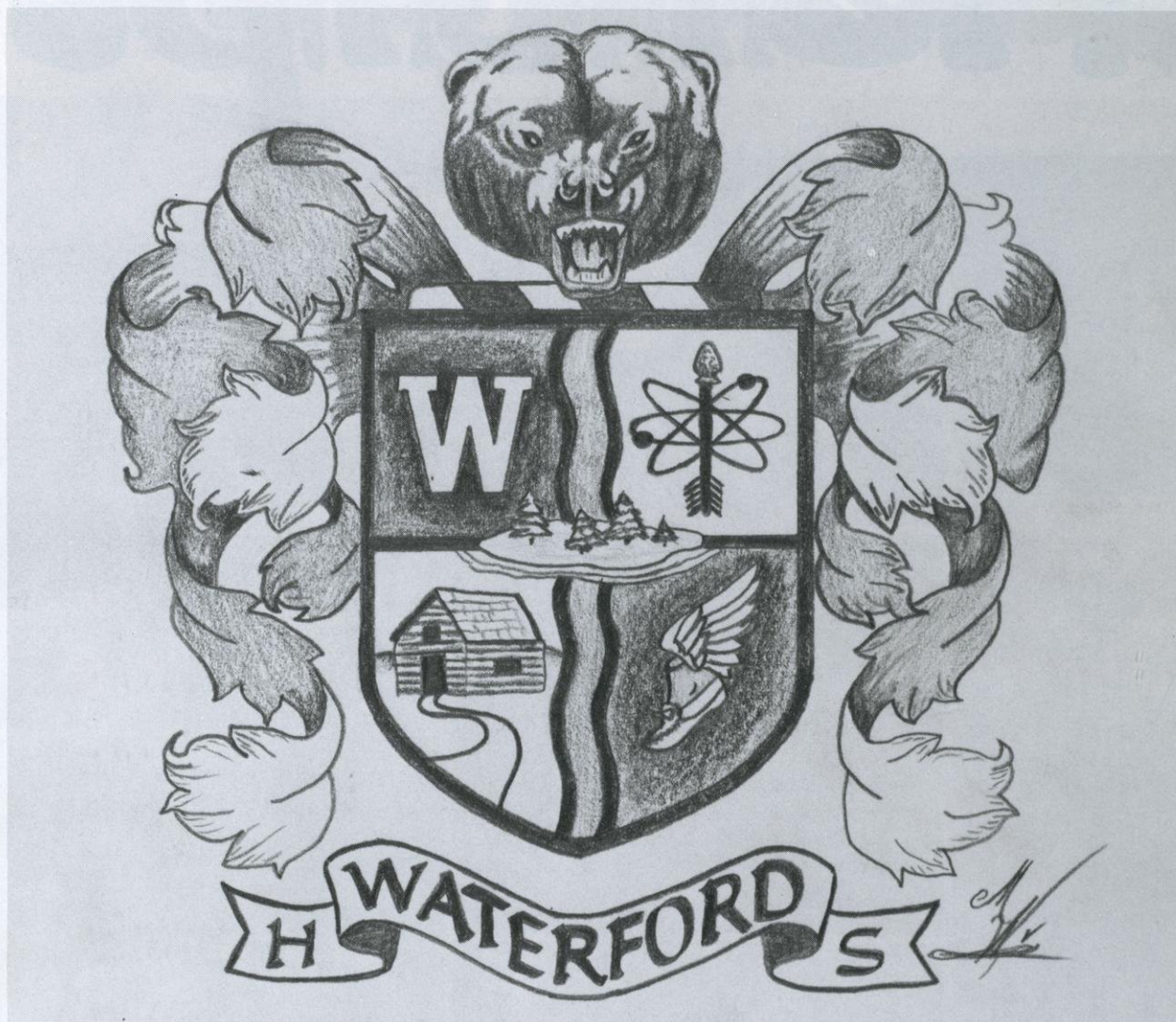

UPPER LEFT QUADRANT Waterford's letter "W"

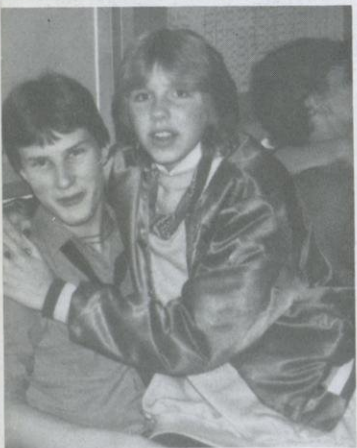
UPPER RIGHT QUADRANT Symbolizes progress of education from arrows to atoms.

LOWER RIGHT QUADRANT Winged moccasin symbolizes the athletic prowess from the day of the Pottawattomie Indian to the present day athlete.

The quadrants are linked by the Fox River and the Fox Isle, the hub of traders and a combination of business and recreational activity. The coat of arms is capped by the WOLVERINE, mascot of the Waterford High School. The school colors are kelly green, white, and gold.

Secretaries Cooks

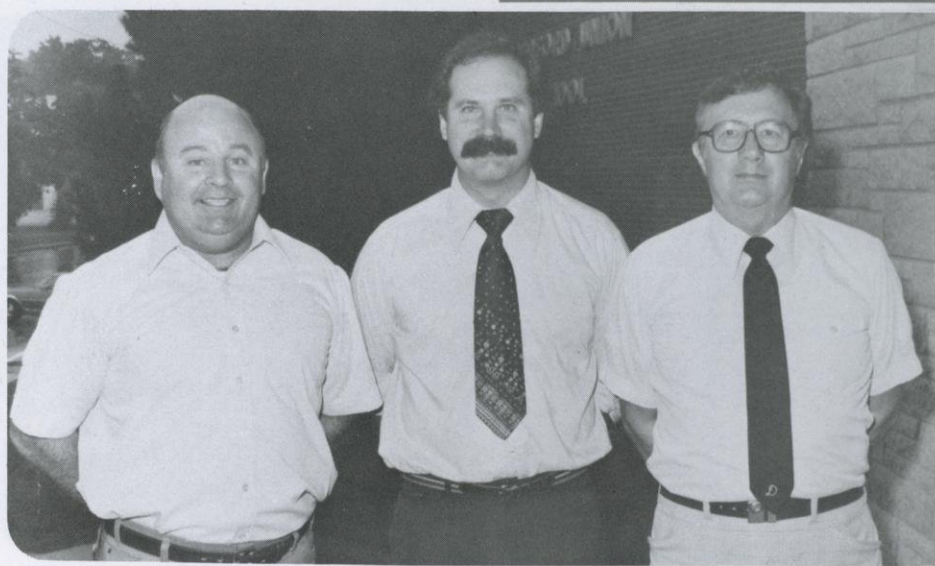


The secretaries and cooks are very important to Waterford High School. They handle many things, but each has her own responsibilities.

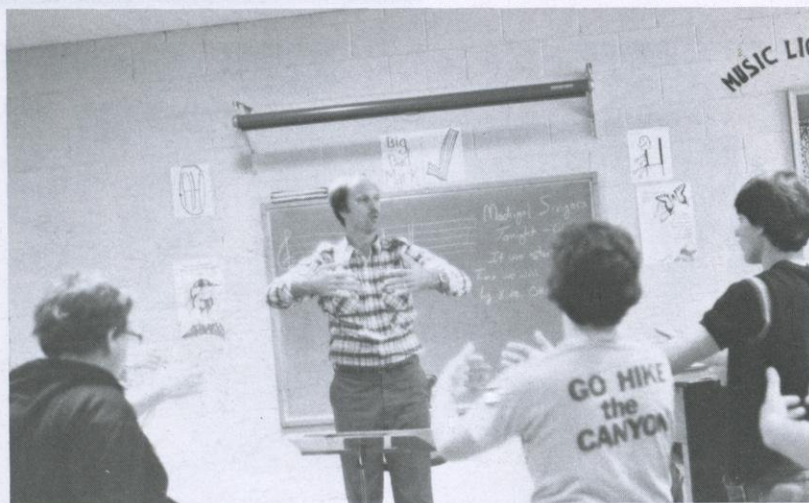
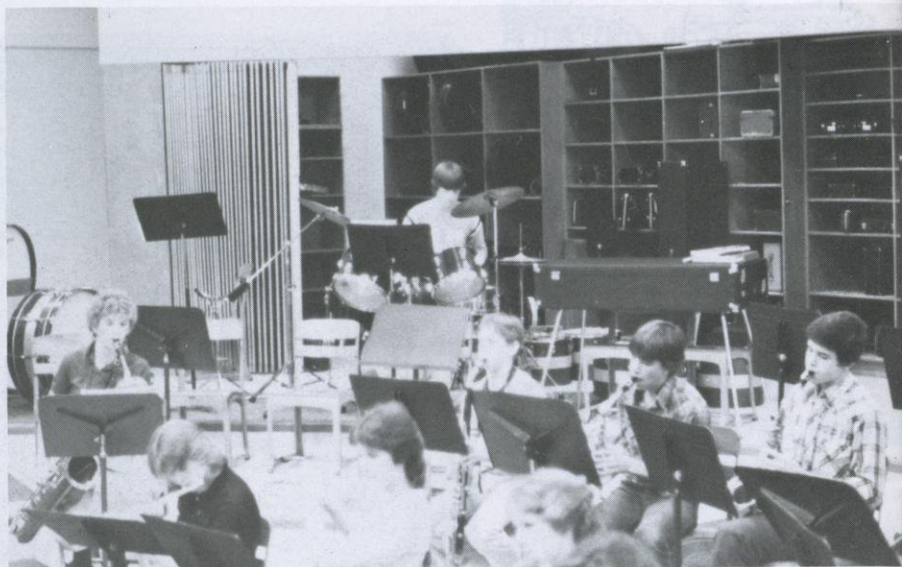
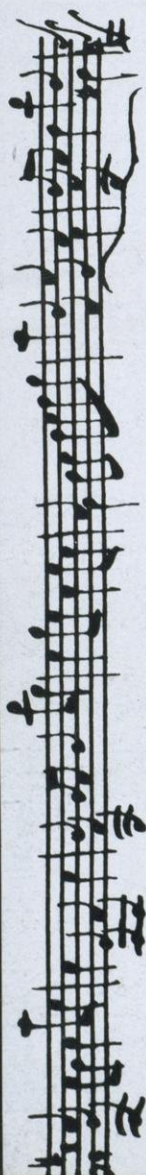


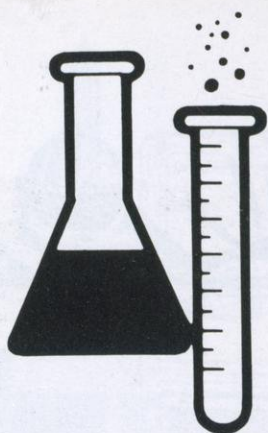
Music Department



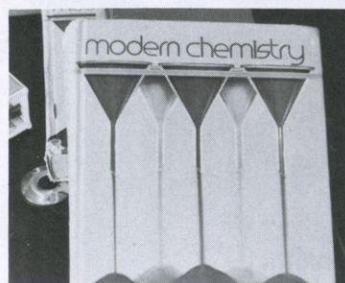
Mr. Westergaard and Mr. Krzyzaniak

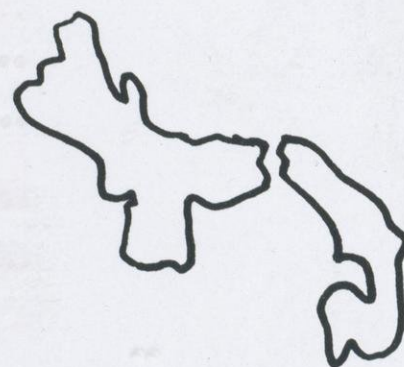
Well, my time to go back to Panama is here! I think these nine months I spent here past so fast! I would like to be here for a long time, but I have to go back.
