This is a book for any nurse trying to meet the challenges of diverse clinical situations. It is just as important in schools of nursing—for faculty and students. The author develops a framework for thinking and acting that makes it easier to apply the principles of nurse-patient relationships to any specific nursing situation. The book lets you recognize the major recurrent variables inherent 1) in the nurse, 2) in the patient, and 3) in external conditions. These variables then become the determinants in a particular nurse-patient relationship. Many examples are given to show the use and usefulness of the determinants in clinical nursing.

In her integration of theoretical and practical aspects of nursing, Miss Ujhely also contributes to education—she shows how interpersonal aspects (and perhaps all aspects) of a nursing curriculum may be organized.
