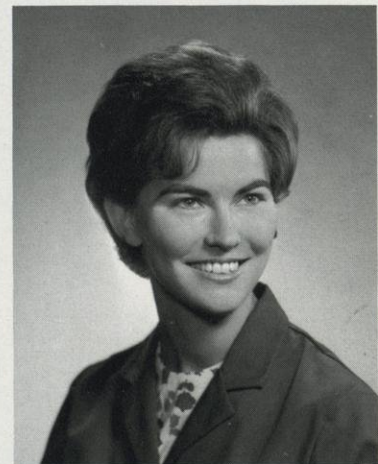

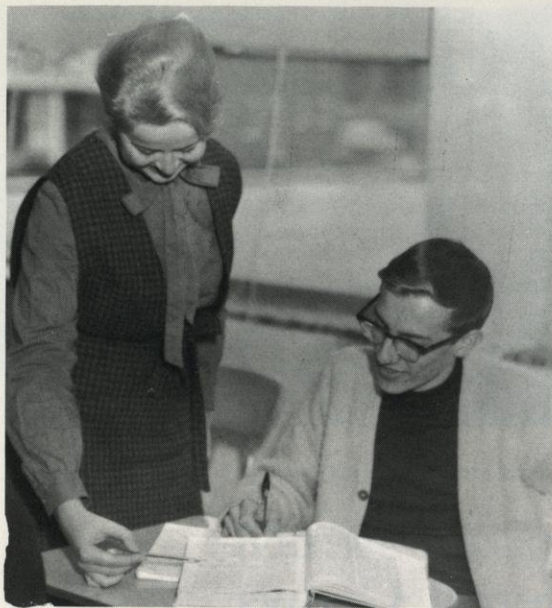
teaching of English at Waterford. A monthly newspaper was printed by the English staff to keep the parents informed of the activities and current news in the English department.



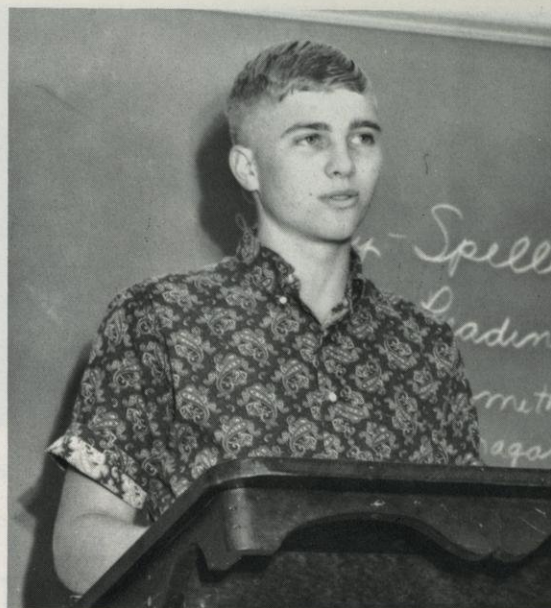

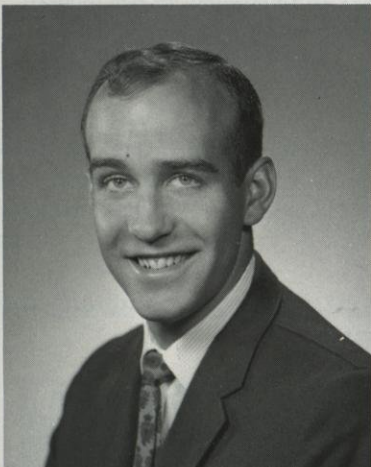

Language Interest Grows

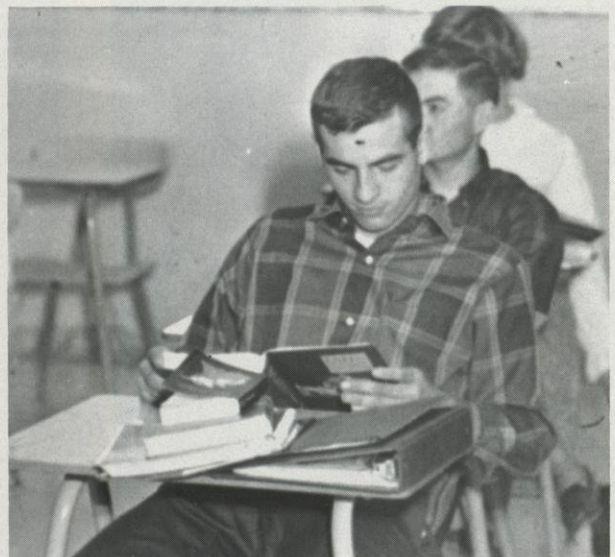

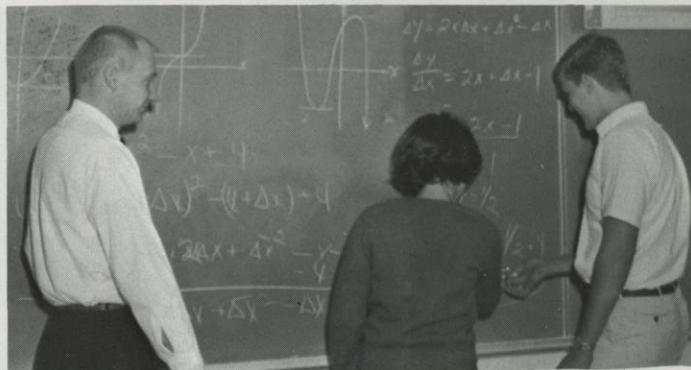

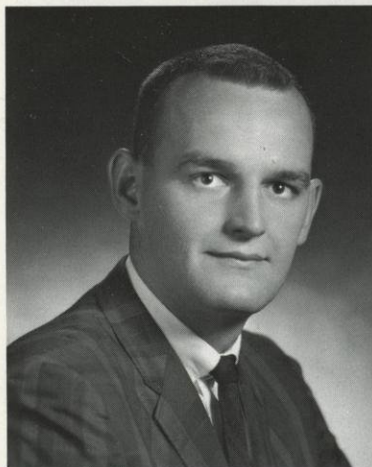

Mathematics Teaches Logic

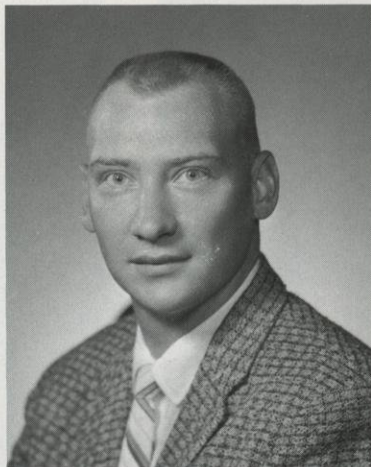


These are conscientious geometry students?

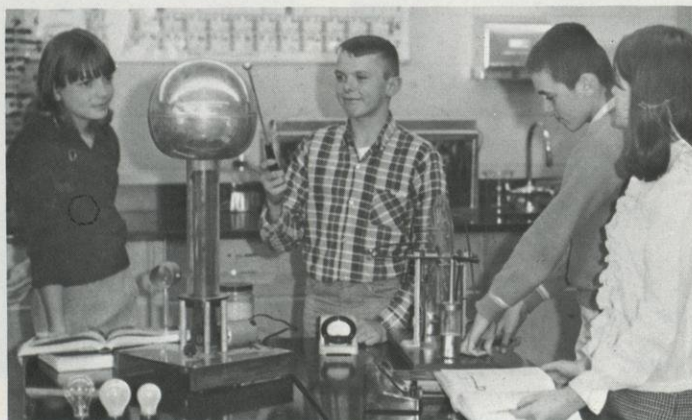
Our Modern Science

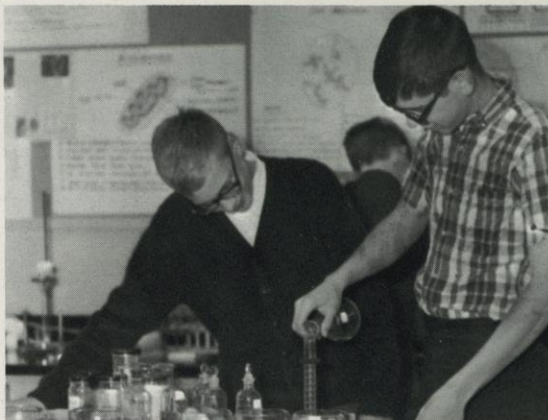

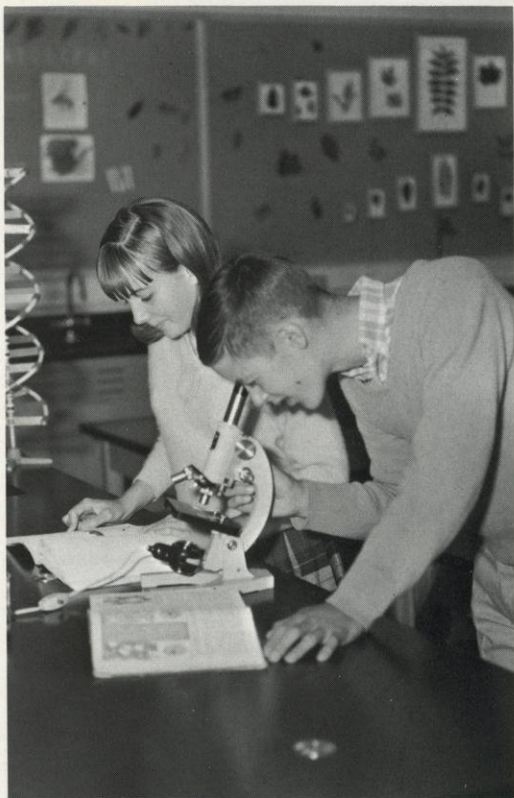

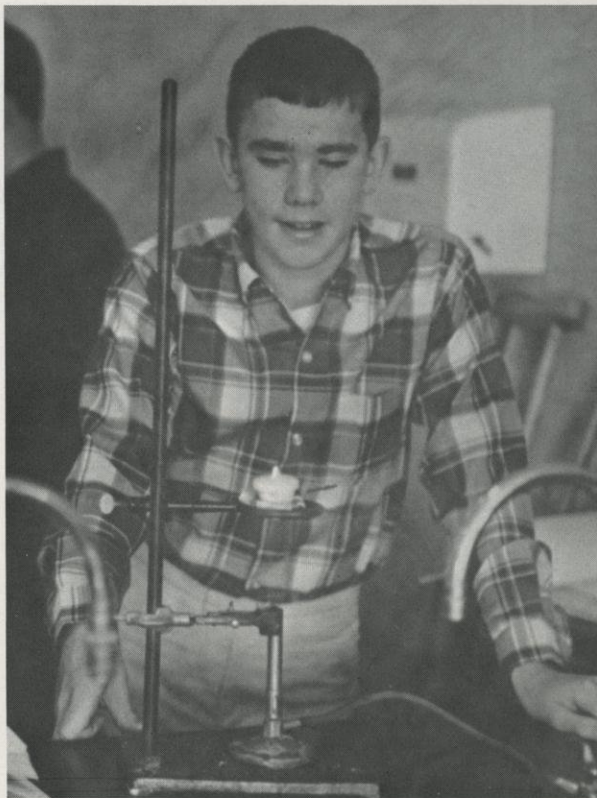

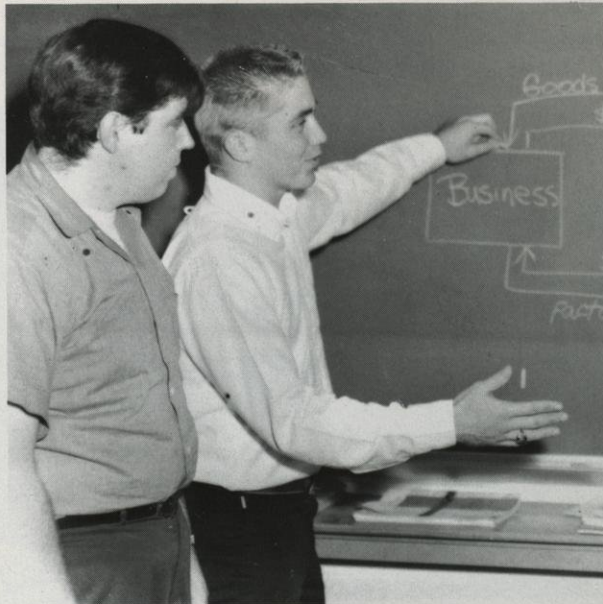

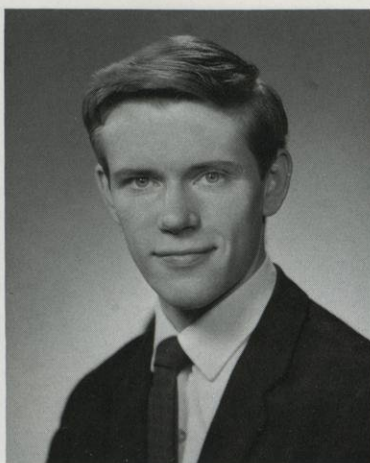

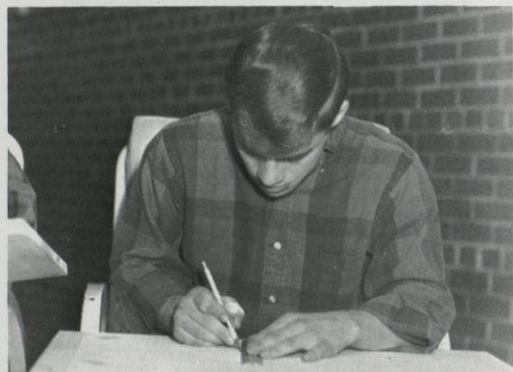

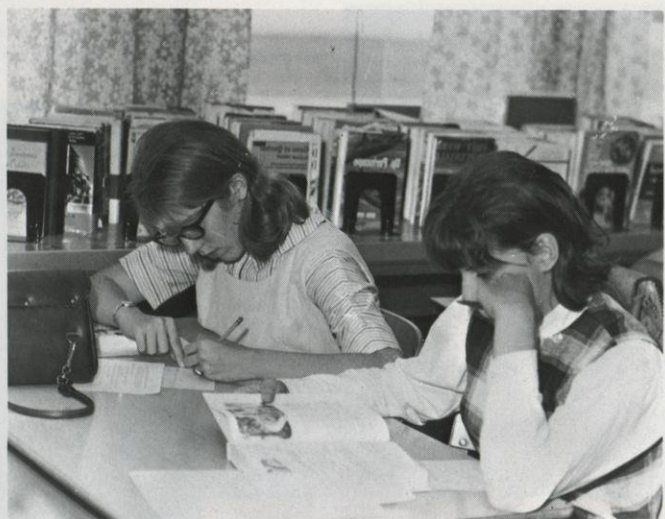

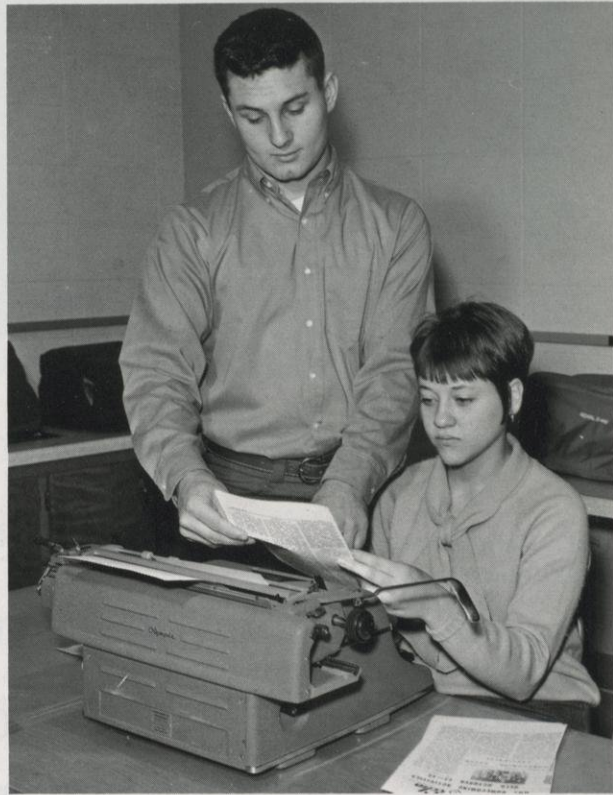

Echo: Read It First Here!

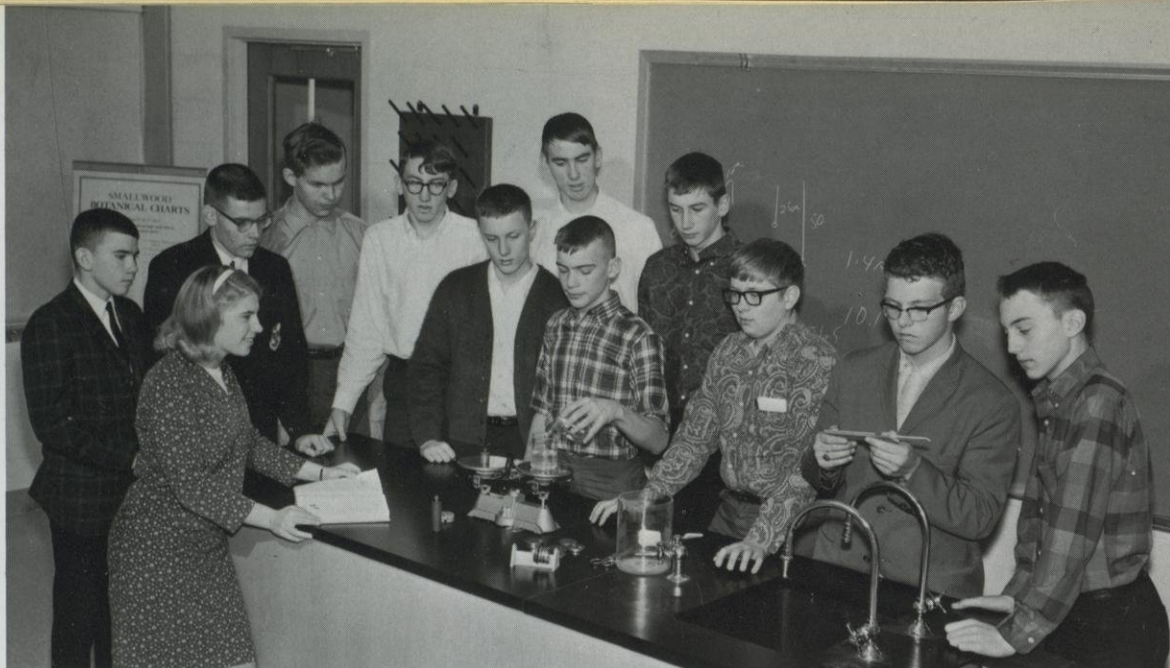

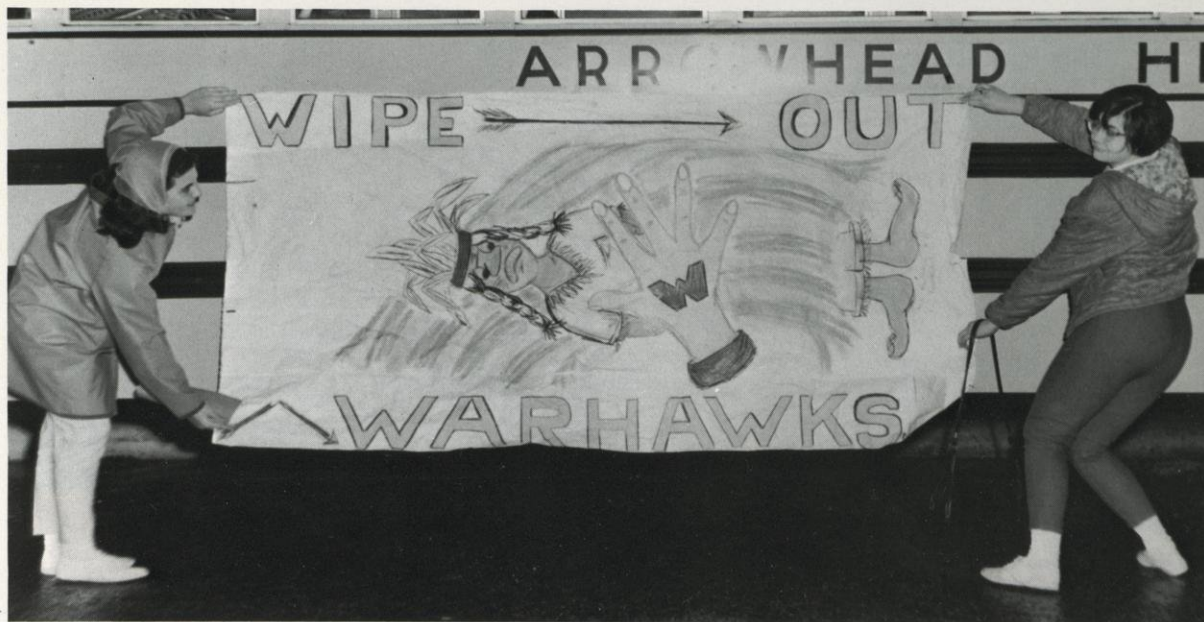

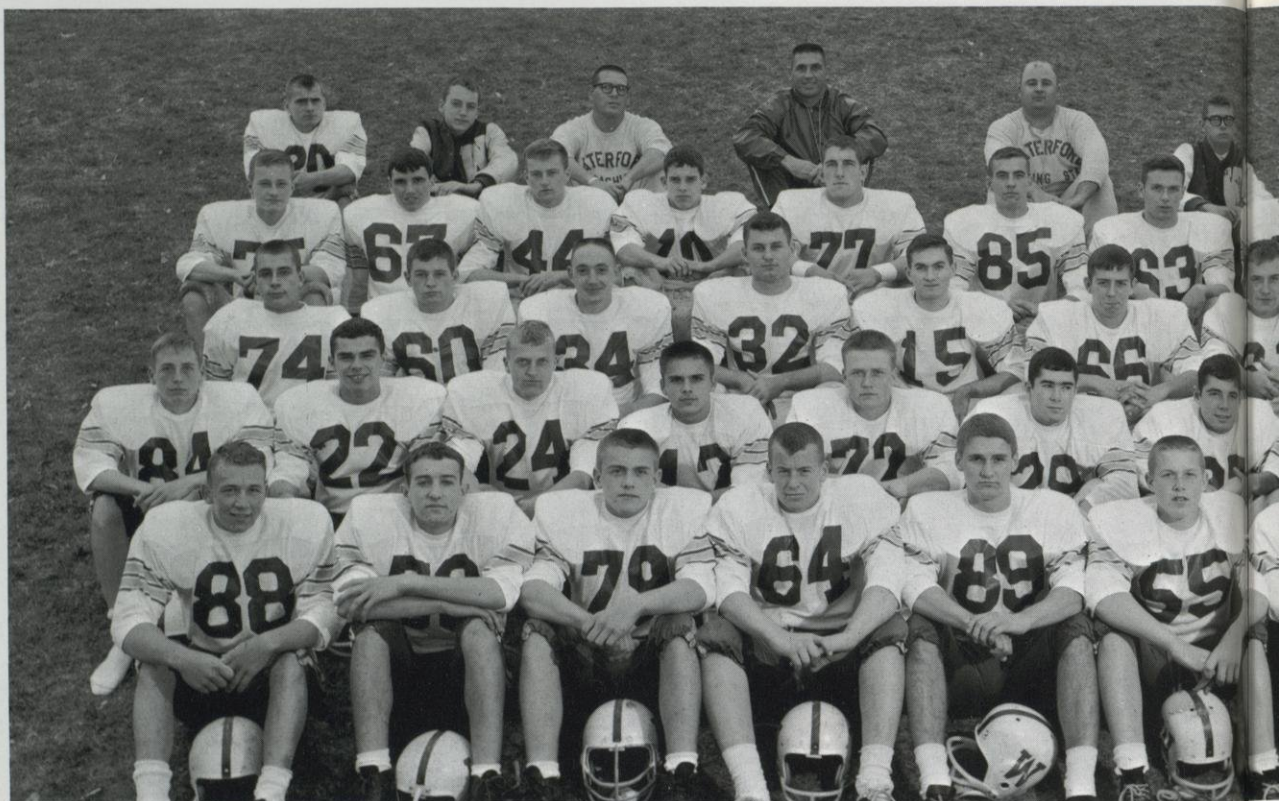

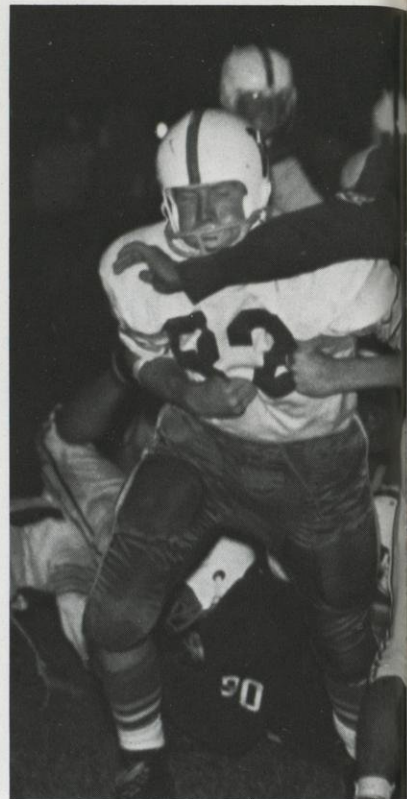

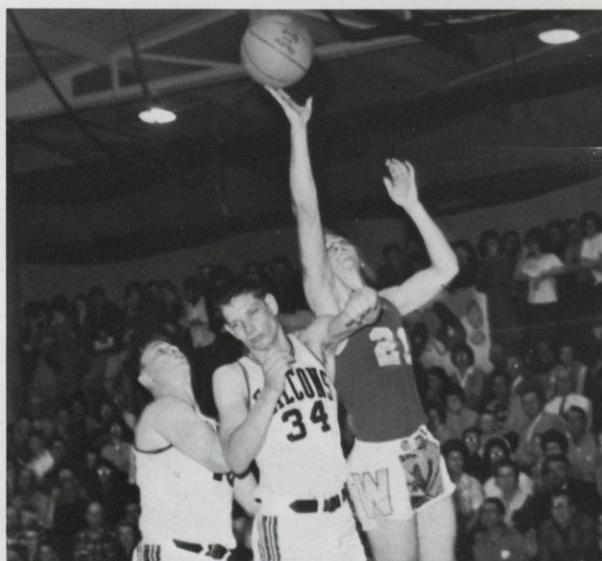

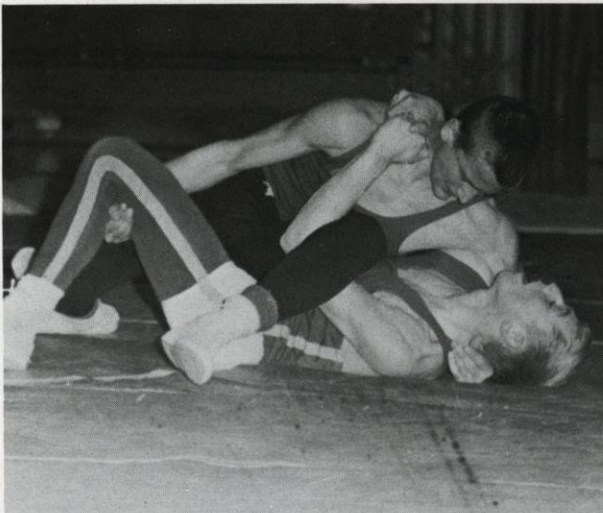

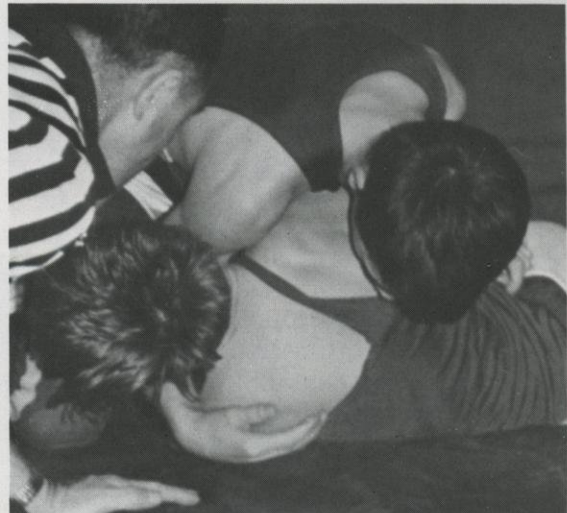
