HISTORY OF RACINE.

On the west shore of Lake Michigan, twenty-three miles south of Milwaukee, and sixty two miles north of Chicago, lies the city of Racine. As it justly deserves, it has been christened, and is universally known as the "BELL CITY OF THE LAKES," not on account, as many may suppose, of the fair maidens residing there, (and they are numerous), but from the fact that it is, without exception, the most beautiful city in the northwest. The grounds upon which the city is built are of undulating surface, with ravins and groves of natural growth. It is situated at the mouth of Root river, the improvement of which has given to the city one of the best harbors on the Lake Michigan

Capt. GILBERT KNAPP was the first white settler who put in an appearance at this point, coming from Chicago on horse-back in November, 1834. He was accompanied by two men in his employ, one of whom was Wm. Luse. From Skunk Grove, where at the time was located a traveling post with a French trader by the name of Jambeau at the head, he was piloted by an Indian to the mouth of the river. Soon after his arrival, with the assistance of his men, he erected a log cabin near where the Miner & Company sash, door and blind factory now stands. He made a claim to all the lands comprised in the original plat of Racine, containing about 140 acres. During the following winter Capt. Knapp left, returning again in April, 1835.

Upon his return he immediately commenced to interest other parties in his claim, and sought co-operation in founding and building up a settlement. Messrs Gurdon S. Hubbard, of Chicago, and Jacob A. Barker, of Buffalo, were the ones whom he interested and who were connected with him in the enterprise. A short time prior to the return of Capt. Knapp, Messrs S. Campbell, Wm. Lee, Paul Kingston and E. Weed, came to Racine. The former built a shanty upon what afterwards proved to be a portion of Capt. K.'s claim. He then removed farther west and erected a log house upon what is now known as the harbor addition to the city. Wm. Lee located at the Rapids, and E. Weed made claim to the land whereon Hon. N. D. Fratt now resides, while Paul Kingston built a cabin on the south limits of Capt. Knapp's claim. He had, however, to yield up his claim in a short time, and the premises became the homestead of Capt. Knapp. In May 1835, Mr. Joel Sage put in an appearance, purchased the claim of a hoosier, whose name is unknown, and located on the west side of Root river, on what is known as Sage Town. He occupied a log house on the bluff situated in the center of what is now State street. Shortly after Mr. Sage's arrival, and during the same year, several other men of prominence took up their abode at Racine. The following year (1836) the place was plated and began to assume village proportions. From that time to the present, the city of Racine has rapidly and healthily increased until it has reached a population of about fifteen thousand, and contains several fine business blocks and magnificent residences as can be found in places much larger and of greater age.

THE MANUFACTORIES

of Racine are extensive and various, and widely known at home and abroad. The threshing machine works of J. I. CASE & Co., covering at least twenty acres of ground and employing about five hundred hands,

There are four *Foundries and Machine Shops*; viz., J. I. CASE & Co.; A. P. DICKEY; S. FREEMAN, and the HARDWARE MANUFACTURING Co. The first named firm, make as has already been stated, threshing machines, portable engines, horse powers, &c. Mr. A. P. Dickey, manufactures fanning mills, steam engines, farm implements, &c. S. Freeman, boilers and florist's goods, and the Hardware Manufacturing Co., make a specialty of florists' goods, house trimmings and hardware in general. Employment is given by these firms to hundreds of persons, and thousands of dollars are paid out by them every Saturday, which finds its way into the money tills of the merchants and tradesmen.

In the manufacture of *Sash, Doors and Blinds*, as well as all kinds of building material, H. W. WRIGHT and THOS. DRIVER & SON, are the leading firms. They do an extensive business in their line, employing large numbers of men and boys, and thus help to increase the manufacturing interests of the city.

The WINSHIP BROTHERS' *Pumps, Wind Mills, Washing Machines*, &c., are known throughout the land and give universal satisfaction wherever they have been introduced. The Racine Pump is very celebrated, and for miles around one or more of these may be found on every farm. The Cooper elastic rubber bucket pumps manufactured by J. M. JONES, are fast growing in popularity, and their general use is early anticipated.

The RACINE BASKET MANUFACTURING COMPANY, has become a fixed fact, employing from twenty to thirty hands, and turning out baskets of every style and size. The baskets made at this factory are sold through the northwest and give general satisfaction.

Among the more recent manufactories established in Racine is the RACINE SILVER PLATE WORKS. At these works is manufactured every imaginable article for table use or ornament usually made of silver. Not only do they make new goods, but they do an extensive business in the way of re-plating.

In the manufacturing of *Boots and Shoes*, Racine has already

gained an enviable reputation. The manufactories of JOHN BECK, J. MILLER & Co., and A. G. PEIL, are doing a large and prosperous business, whilst several others are competing for the trade and in time will rank among the large factories of the city.

Two large *Trunk Manufactorys* are in operation, giving employment to scores of men and boys, and turning out trunks of every description, from the profanely unmanagable "Saratoga" to the smallest valise. M. M. SECOR & Co. and I. BURESH & Co., are the firms thus engaged.

Of *Tanneries* there are ten, all doing a good business and giving work to numbers of men.

Racine can also boast of several *Mitten Factories*, which give constant employment to hundreds of girls and who are daily manufacturing thousands of pairs of mittens and gloves.

The *Boot and Shoe Pac* factory of PHILBROOK & Co., are heavily engaged in the manufacturing of those articles and employ about a dozen men.

The *Linseed Oil Works* of EMERSON & Co., also employ about fifteen men, and is one of the best and most profitable factories in the city.

BLAKE & COMPANY, are engaged in manufacturing shawls, blankets, yarns, cloths, suitings, &c.; their goods finding their way to the stores and shops throughout the country and give satisfaction in every particular. To say that the goods are from the Racine Woolen Mills, is sufficient to insure a sale.

There are in the city three Flouring Mills, making superior brands and finding a ready market in this and eastern states.

Besides the above enumerated Manufactories, there is one for the manufacture of Patent Wagon Lock Brakes, a Wagon Hardware factory, Tobacco Factory, several cigar manufactories, Wire factory, Tow Manufactory, Edge Tool works, Glue works, the Marble works of

HUGGINS & WASHBURN, two Soap and Candle factories, Vinegar works, &c.

In the way of livery stables the city has its full supply, and nowhere can a better or more fashionable "turn out" be found. Those engaged in this business are M. THROUP, (who is also proprietor of the Omnibus Line) PASSENGER BROS., BLACK BROS., and WM. SUMNER.

Having made mention of the manufactories of the city we will now take up the educational interests, Church advantages, Hotels, Newspapers, &c.

The first School House was built in the year 1836, and was located where the McClurg block now stands. In January, 1838, the Racine Seminary was incorporated, and shortly after it was organized and put in "running order." Now the city has seven public school buildings, practical and stately edifices, complete in all departments, and which would be an ornament to any city. The schools are in the highest grade, ranking the first in the state.

Besides the public schools Racine has its College. It is pleasantly situated on the lake shore, near the southern city limits. The grounds comprising about ninety acres, are beautifully laid out with walks and drives, are excellently shaded with a natural growth of trees, and from the extensive view of the lake, are the most pleasant and charming the country affords. The buildings are all that could be desired, ample and sufficient, and present an appearance of comfort and neatness, equaled by few institutions of the kind and excelled by none. The institution is under the control of the Episcopalians.

The Sisters of Saint Dominick are in charge of St. Catherine's Academy, an institution liberally supported by the Catholics of the northwest and receiving the patronage and confidence of our own citizens. Several of the churches maintain parish schools, in which denominational religious instruction is made a part of the daily course.

The advent of the centenial year was marked by the opening of

RACINE ACADEMY, a private institution organized by Col. JOHN C. McMENN, long recognized as one of the leading educators of the west. The Academy building is located on the corner of College Avenue and Tenth street, facing West Park, and every desk was engaged before the building was completed.

There are twenty-four Churches in the city, of various denominations, and of different nationalities. Nearly all have large and convenient church edifices, are well furnished and well attended. The several Pastors are educated, able orators, moral, upright and conscientious, and command the respects of their congregations. Any one having a choice of denomination cannot help but find the church of his choice in Racine, advantages which are generally sought after by people when making selection of a home.

The Hotels, nine in number, are sufficient for the accomodation of all who may favor the city with their presence. *Congress Hall*, SENECA RAYMOND, prop. ; *Huggins House*, C. H. JEWELL, prop. ; the *Bouton House*, A. LEWIS, prop. ; and the *City Hotel*, EVAN JONES, prop., are well kept Hotels. The proprietors are pleasing, affable, and accomodating, and use their utmost endeavors to make their guests feel "at home."

There are published in the city no less than seven news papers and periodicals, political, religeous and literary. They are as follows : the *Advocate*, published by A. C. SANDFORD, Republican in politics and issued every Saturday ; the *Journal* published by F. W. STARBUCK, also Republican in politics and issued weekly ; the *Argus* a Democratic weekly, published by Z. C. WENTWORTH & SON ; the *Slavie*, a Bohemian independent weekly ; the *Missionæren*, a Scandinavian religeous monthly ; the *College Mercury*, a literary, semi-monthly published by the students of Racine College ; and the *Hyrde Stemmen*, a Scandinavian Sunday School Semi-monthly.

Taking into consideration its excellent location, its ample harbor, its manufacturing facilities, superior schools and numerous churches of all denominations, Racine stands at the head of all western cities. No where can be found combined so many excellent advantages, necessary to the building up of a large city. It offers superior inducements to those in search of a business location, and to those desirous of a permanent home it is undoubtedly far superior to many much larger places. It is deservedly named, and will always be hailed as the Belle City of the Lakes.





Requirements for Admission.

Candidates for the Freshman Class are examined in the following books and studies :

Greek—Hadley's Greek Grammar, or its equivalent. Xen. Anab, three books. Hom. Il., three books. Arnold's Greek Prose Composition, twenty exercises, or its equivalent.

Mathematics—Davies' University Arithmetic. Davies' University Algebra, to equations of the second degree. Davies' Legendre, books I-IV.

English—Fowler's English Grammar, with Analysis of English sentences.

History—The history of Greece, Rome, and the United States, with a general knowledge of Geography.

SCHOOL OF SCIENCE.

REV. CHARLES N. SPALDING, A. M. *Dean.*

This School is intended to provide a thorough course of study in the Natural Sciences—a more extended course in Mathematics—the English branches, and Modern Languages. The study of Ancient Languages is not pursued. The course is four years. Its instruction and government are regulated by a Dean and Faculty of its own. Upon graduating, the degree of Bachelor of Science is conferred.

GRAMMAR SCHOOL.

REV. FLAVEL S. LUTHER, A. M., *Rector.*

The Grammar School is intended for Students, preparatory to entering business, or to fit them for entering either of the Schools of the College. It has its Rector and Body of Masters, for government and instruction, and purposes to be most thorough and exact in its drill and management. Its course is six years, and it receives lads of ten years old and upwards. Especial care is given to the health, manners, and training of the younger lads.







Village of Burlington.

The village of Burlington, containing about two thousand inhabitants, is situated on the Fox River about twenty-five miles west of the city of Racine, and thirty miles from Milwaukee; its inhabitants mostly German. An industrious and honest and general thrift pervades the entire village. It was first settled in December 1835, by Messrs. Moses Smith and Wm. Whiting, the later making a "jack-knife" claim to the lands whereon the Perkins Mill now stands. In 1836, D. B. Rork made a claim to the fraction of land upon which the greater part of the village is not built. Mr. Lewis Royce settled in the place in 1837, building a residence west of where the R. R. Depot is now located. The first store was opened in 1839, by Pliny M. Perkins in a log house built by Moses Smith. The first mill was built by Messrs. S. C. Vaughan and Moses Smith, and was known as the "up and down" saw mill. Subsequently Mr. Perkins purchased the mill property and erected a grist mill in which was ground the first flour shipped from Wisconsin to New York. The first physician was Dr. Edward G. Dyer, who came in 1839. In 1840 the first hotel was opened for the accomodation of the traveling public, it being signalized by a grand New Year's Ball. It stood near where the present Jones House is now located. Messrs. Francis and Joseph Wackerman were the first German inhabitants of the place, coming from New York. The first school was taught by Sarah Bacon in the summer of 1838, and 1839 the first school house was erected. The first election was held in the fall of 1836 at which Capt. Gibert Knapp was elected for member of the territorial legislature. The first town meeting was held in the spring of 1838. Henry Edmunds settled in the place in 1838 and was the first blacksmith in the village. In 1837, with Moses Smith as Post Master, the Foxville Post Office was established. The first birth was a son of George Newman, in May or June 1837, and the first death, Miss Hayes, occurred in July 1836. The first Woolen Mills established in the County, if not in the State, was built in Burlington by E. & P. M. Perkins in 1843.

Burlington is well and favorably known throughout the entire northwest on account of its excellent water privileges and manufacturing interests and its easy accessibility to all points of the country. All branches of mercantile and manufacturing business is carried on in the village, which is usually pursued in places much larger, and all engaged

therein are doing a remunerative and healthy business. To those in search of a place of business, either mercantile or manufacturing, no better facilities can be found, nor a more generous intellectual or refined people than in the village of Burlington.





The grounds upon which the depot is built were purchased from Mr. H. Johnson, who, settled in the country when it was comparatively new, coming from Schuyler, Herkimer Co., N. Y. in 1844. Shortly after the depot and other Railroad buildings were erected, Mr. Johnson commenced the building of the "Johnson House," a neat, substantial and commodius Hotel, in close proximity to the two railways, completing the same in 1873. Mr. H. M. Fitzgerald, an accommodating and courteous landlord, is the present proprietor of the Hotel, having leased it for a term of years. In 1874, Mr. S. Parker, platted twenty-five acres of his lands laying adjacent to the junction, naming the plat "Parkersville," and putting them into the market, readily disposed of several lots, upon which are now erected tasty and comfortable cottages and several business buildings. In

the fall of 1874, Mr. S. A. Sage, in partnership with Wm. I. Carpenter, built a large and well constructed building and engaged in the business of pressing hay. Subsequently, Mr. Sage purchased the interest of Mr. Carpenter, and alone continues the business. Twelve hundred tons of hay was put up at this press the first season, and nearly three times that amount the season following. The Post office is named Johnson, though a change of name to Western Union Junction is early expected, a petition having been forwarded to Washington for that purpose. The Depot is under the immediate charge of Mr. Phillip R. Frey, an old and experienced railroad man, than whom a more honest, capable and accommodating railroad official cannot be found. The present population of the village is upwards of one hundred, the majority of whom are railroad employees. To those seeking a place of business, or a quiet home, no better opportunities are afforded than at Western Union Junction.



VILLAGE OF ROCHESTER.

The village of Rochester, containing a population of about five hundred inhabitants, is pleasantly situated on the Fox river, twenty-three miles west of Racine, twenty-eight miles by the road from Milwaukee, and five miles north of Burlington. The first plat of the village was made in October 1839, and embraced all the village property on the west side of Fox river and that portion east of the river, and south of Main street. The second plat was made in May 1840, and embraced all that portion of the village tract east of the river and north of Main street. The first name given to the village was "Upper Forks." It was first settled by Mr. Levi Godfrey, who came into the country in the fall of 1835, accompanied by John B. Wade. His shanty, sixteen feet square, was the first structure erected for human habitation in the town. In 1836, Mr. Godfrey brought out his family, and in 1837, James H. Gibson, Alonzo Snow, and several others located in the town. Mr. Godfrey kept the first hotel in the town, opening it in 1837. It was a log building and known as the "Old Ark." Alonzo Snow was the first merchant in the place and occupied a building on the corner of Main and Front streets. In 1837, M. C. Whit-

man erected a saw mill, which was burned in 1839, it being the first mill built in Rochester. In 1844, the first flouring mill was put up by Philo Belden, who, in connection with M. S. Green and J. Ford, located the present Rochester water power. The first bridge over Fox river at Rochester, was built in 1836 by Ira A Rice and J. S. Palmer. The first fanning mill establishment in the county was established in Rochester in 1839, by Mr. Richard E. Ela. His first mills were built in the cellar under his house. The first church building erected in the town was built in 1844 by the Congregational Society. Rev. C. C. Cadwell was the first resident minister in Rochester, settling there in 1839. The first physician was Dr. Solomon Blood. The first chairs and bedsteads manufactured at any place within a distance of sixty miles west, were made by Oren Wright, who settled in Rochester in 1840 and established a turning lathe, &c. The Baptists were the first religious society in the place, having been organized in 1837.

The village of Rochester contains at the present time, some half dozen stores, a full supply of shops of every description, the necessary professions, artists &c. It has also a first-class Hotel, the "Union House," kept by Capt. J. H. Gipson, an old settler, and who is every way qualified to discharge the duties as "landlord." He is assisted in his management by his son, Mr. A. H. Gipson. There are also two churches, a lodge of Odd Fellows, (one of the oldest in the state), a Division of the Sons of Temperance, and a large, well attended institution of learning, known as the Rochester Seminary.

The streets of Rochester are wide and clean and nowhere can be found a better shaded, or a more pleasant and beautiful village. The buildings, although some are old, are substantially built and present an appearance of neatness and comfort seldom seen in small villages. The water power of Rochester is excellent and abundant, and will at some future day, not far distant, be extensively used for manufacturing purposes. Then will Rochester be alive with business; its population increase by the hundreds, and it will become, as it justly deserves to, one of the best manufacturing places in the state, if not in the northwest. No better opportunities are afforded to "grow up" with a town, no better chances for wealth making, and the securing of a pleasant home in the midst of a moral and enterprising community, with excellent educational opportunities, church advantages, &c., than are offered in Rochester. To those who are desirous of settling in such a place, it offers great inducements.

VILLAGE OF WATERFORD.

The village of Waterford is situated on Fox river, about twenty three miles west of Racine and seven miles north of Burlington. The first claims to the land whereon the village is built were made by Messrs O. W. Barnes and —— Beebe, who subsequently sold their interest therein to Levi Barnes and Samuel E. Chapman. The latter named gentlemen built the first log house in the village in 1836, which was known as "head quarters." The river offering unusual facilities for the establishment of a water power, it was determined to found a village, which determination was soon put into effect, and a village built, taking its name from Waterford in the state of New York. In 1844, Waterford contained one hundred and fifty inhabitants, two saw mills, two grocery stores, one public house, etc. At present it contains upwards of six hundred inhabitants, several good stores, flouring mill, (one of

the best in the state) several churches, excellent schools, hotels, numerous shops of every kind, several manufacturing establishments, and professional men in abundance. Like the other villages in Racine County, it lacks rail road facilities, which is the only "draw back" to the making of a large town. This difficulty, it is hoped, will soon be obviated. Some years since the Fox River Valley Railroad Co., surveyed a line through the village from Milwaukee to the south, purchased the right of way, and graded the road bed ready to receive the ties and iron. Work was then suspended and the road remains unfinished. It is expected however, that in a year or two, work will be resumed and the road completed. Waterford will then renew its wonted life, and *business* will again be the order of the day. No better water power can be found in the state, no better facilities for manufacturing, no better opening for the merchant or professional man, and no better place to reside in the west than at Waterford. Its citizens are refined and well educated, moral, upright and honest. In the location and appearance, the excellent privileges of church and school, and the bright prospects it has of becoming a populous and thriving city, it has no rival. It is destined to become one of the great manufacturing places of Wisconsin.

UNION GROVE VILLAGE.

The building of railroads throughout the West, has been the cause of hundreds of new towns springing into existence, very many of which have become manufacturing and business villages and cities, far excelling in size and activity the older ones of the East. Among the villages which date their beginning from such circumstances, is Union Grove, a thriving place of upwards of five hundred inhabitants, situated on the line of the Western Union Railroad, fifteen miles west of the city of Racine. In August, 1856, the first train of cars made its appearance at the Grove, and soon after, Mr. P. P. Taber, erected a building on the corner of Market street, opposite the depot, and commenced business as a merchant. James Russell followed him in a short time with a lumber yard, and E. D. Cadwell, with a blacksmith shop. The town plat was made in 1856, by a company, of which Dr. A. P. Adams, was President and S. H. Skewes, general manager. The plat comprised all the land in the village west of Market street and south of the Rail Road, and that portion north of the Railroad west of State street. Several additions have since been made, and the village plat more than doubled. In 1857 the Moe Brothers commenced business as carpenters and builders, and were also engaged in the lumber trade.

For a time Union Grove was at a stand still, and few thought it would ever be more than an ordinary *four corners*. In 1869 it received a fresh start, and from that time has steadily and rapidly increased, until from a store or two a shop and lumber yard, it has several stores, shops manufactoryes, &c. The business buildings of the village are mostly well built and spacious, and the residences are handsome and comfortable. The streets are wide and well shaded, with good walks on either side. As a manufacturing town it is destined to become of considerable importance, having the facilities necessary for nearly every kind of manufacturing business. As a place of residence, with its excellent schools and churches, and its moral, liberal and intellectual inhabitants, it will bear a comparison with any in the State.






