War of 1812

During the War of 1812 my late grandfather George Doxtator was in it. And his wife, named Mary, by herself drove the animals as they hauled supplies. He was a soldier by himself for two year while they were fighting here and there while he was in it. And another Oneida used to belong by the name of Elijah Powless. I knew him really well. His Oneida name was Lanakléhkwe. And another I used to know who belonged had the name of Joe Thomas. They used to call him Shó·sle in Oneida. And still another who belonged was named George Hill. I don't remember if he had an Oneida name. This George Hill's wife and my grandmother got a pension when they arrived here. It was just three months and twenty four dollars they would get. But not right away did they get this pension money. It was two years after the Civil War that I became well off.
