HISTORY:

Built as the SIDNEY, her home port was Wheeling, West Virginia. She was later in the Diamond Jo Line of St. Louis and the Streckfus Steamboat Line of Dubuque. She also ran in freight and passenger trade on the Upper Mississippi from St. Louis to St. Paul. She was renamed WASHINGTON in 1920-21. Reported abandoned in 1945 edition of the Merchant Vessels of United States.
