## HISTORY:

Built as the *SIDNEY*, her home port was *Wheeling, West Virginia*. She was later in the *Diamond Jo Line* of *St. Louis* and the *Streckfus Steamboat Line* of *Dubuque*. She also ran in freight and passenger trade on the *Upper Mississippi* from *St. Louis* to *St. Paul*. She was renamed *WASHINGTON* in 1920-21. Reported abandoned in 1945 edition of the *Merchant Vessels of United States*.
