## REPORT OF LIBRARIAN

To the Board of Directors of the Madison Free Library:

The fifty-second annual report of the Madison Free Library shows a year very much like its predecessors of recent years. The library has started no new projects and accomplished no new feats. A circulation of over 360,000 books in a city, the size of Madison, shows a year of the steady, every day type of work.

The changes in circulation of books is rather interesting, as such changes are likely to occur often in the next few years. Any public library that is closely connected with the school library development is going to see some shifting in that part of its circulation, affected by conditions in the school libraries. To say the circulation went beyond the 360,000 mark, but made a gain of only 2154 does not give a correct impression of the circulation tables. The following table shows clearly the meaning of this statement.

The increases in both adult and children's book circulation, shown at the different distribution points were actual gains and, except partially at one place, not shifts due to decreases at other points. The increase in adult books is good, as it is not connected with school libraries at all, but looks like an actual larger use of books by adults, coming to the libraries. The decrease in use of books in the high school libraries, which classify as adult, is due to changes in teaching methods or changes in teachers and is likely to occur any year.

The children at the Emerson school did actually read 13544 more books than in 1925. In 1925 that school for the period Jan. through June had schoolroom libraries with a circulation of 5205 volumes and in the 1925 report this circulation was counted in grade schoolroom library figures. If this same 5205 is subtracted from the 16989 decrease shown in 1926 for grade schoolroom libraries, the decrease in the 1926 table becomes $11,784$. This 11,784 decrease occurred largely in schools where there were the more changes in teaching staff. Another factor might have been the fewer school visits made by the children's librarian, During 1926 the children's librarian did a large part of the instruction of eighth grade pupils and did not for that reason have so much time for other school visits. The record of the children's librarian work show that eighteen talks were given to groups of people interested in childyen's reading and thirtytmo visits were made to schools for book talks. rour hundred and fifty children came to the library in the small group to do the library work after the instruction at school.

This instraction mork takes much time and energy of librarians, but is a sound educational mork. The results arc noticeable more and more in use of the library by the younger adults out of school. The instraction was carried on in the high schools in all ninth and tenth year classes, as has been done heretofore.

The stations cidrculation of books is only slightly larger than in 1925. The hospital was 145 less, but not so large a loss as was expected on account of fewer readers in the maternity ward. Schenk's store station was faithfully attended by Miss Hough and shows a 483 increase. Wingra Park was 111 less. It is very doubtful whether the stations at the Franch Battery and the Telephone Co. serve enough people to werrant keeping books at either place.

Book Account --- The book account table shows a net gain of 4240 volumes. The figures for the main library are not accurate as again no inventory was taken of non $\begin{aligned} & \text { fiction books. We }\end{aligned}$ expected the new stacks would be in ond waited to take this inventory at that time to avoid the lifting of books twice. Taking inventory of books so crowded, as they now are on main library stacks, is a too time consuming task of hard manual labor to justify it.

Registration of Borrowers --- This shows the ever present shift in Madison population. The thousands of new people were present in 1926, as in previous years, and several thousands have evidently left the city. The library is giving only three months now for reregistration.

Music scores vere bought from the rent fund to amount of \$244. 29. These mere purchased from lists submitted by comrattee of the Civic Music Associntion, Mr.B.Q.Morgan, chairman. There was a twenty per cent increase in the use of music scores. 840 in 1926 against 698 in 1925. Victrola records were given library by the Wisconsin State Journal, most of them being the nucleus of a collection for the Eilliamson St. brench library.

The catalogue department had a busy year and a sheet is given showing by count of cards something of what was donc. This is only a. rough measure, but somewhat useful in showing the scope of the work. The librarians of both the Central School and the East Side High did the cataloguing for those libraries. The cramped quarters for the catalogue work continued until Dec. when the order and catalogue department was moved to Room A. Though the room is not ideal in its relation to other working rooms of the library, the odded spoce gives much expedites the work.

The report of 1925 gave much in detail information of working details of the library and that is omitted this year.

Staff -- Miss Moehlmann was granted a year's leave of absence to go to Honolulu. Hiss Reese resigned and her work was taken by Miss Mary Ayres. Miss Johnson resigned to be married and her work was taken by Mrs Cardiff with Mrs Filson as new assistant in the Central School, Mrs Merrill resigned as librarian a.t the Randall school and in Dec. Mrs Alice Levenich begen work there. The completion of so full a year's mork was due in large measure to the readiness with which new assistants took
up the duties of their predecessors, who left their work in excellent condition.

The librarian feels under obligation to the staff who have served the thole year, as well as those who left and those Who came during the year, for their responsibilty felt and accepted for giving the best service they could to the patrons of the library.

To the members of the Library Board, the librarian wishes to express again appreciation for cooperation and support in her work.
